WARRACKNABEAL - RAINBOW ROAD

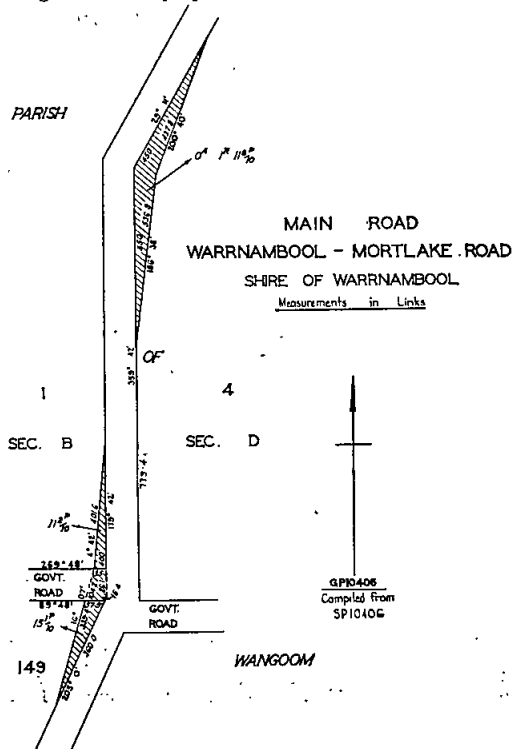

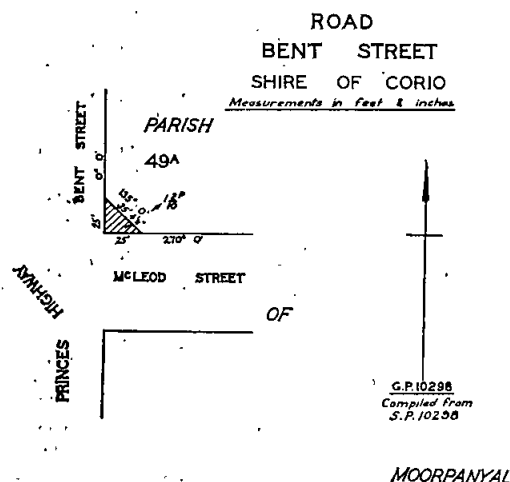

*Cemeteries Act 1958.***RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE YARRAWONGA PUBLIC CEMETERY.**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cemeteries Act, the Trustees of the Yarrowonga Public Cemetery hereby make the following rules and regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette* and from and after such publication every rule and regulation heretofore made by the said Trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded.

PART ONE.—GENERAL.

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter.

"Cemetery" means Yarrowonga Public Cemetery.

"Trustees" means the Trustees of the Yarrowonga Public Cemetery.

"Lawn Section" means that portion of the Yarrowonga Public Cemetery planted to lawn.

"Memorial Work" means manual work (including the writing of inscriptions in connexion with any building, tomb, vault, tombstone, kerbing or other structure erected or placed on or in any place of burial).

2. No vehicle may be driven on any part of the Lawn Section without prior consent of the Trustees being obtained.

3. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in the Cemetery unless the planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and shrubs are planted in accordance with the terms of approval.

4. The Trustees shall have the power to remove from any burial allotment or memorial any unsightly ornaments such as bottles, glass/plastic, jars, tins, decayed and broken wreaths and/or any article which in the opinion of the Trustees, lowers the standard of the Cemetery.

5. All flowers, wreaths &c. remaining on any grave in the Lawn Section seven days after the date of burial shall be removed by the Officer in Charge with the exception of those placed in containers provided by the Trustees.

PART TWO.—MEMORIAL WORK.

6. The only type of memorial permitted on a grave in the Lawn Section shall be of marble, granite or other material approved by the Trustees with a maximum height of 2 ft. 6 in. above ground level with a base measuring not more than 3 feet long by 18 inches wide by 7 inches high.

7. The Trustees may order the removal or alteration of any monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, vault, railing or other erection, or the erasure of any inscription, which has been erected or placed in the burial ground in contravention of the Regulations of the Yarrowonga Public Cemetery.

PART THREE.—INTERMENTS.

8. Plots of ground in the Lawn Section will be allotted in rotation and be restricted to two plots per application and provided that one plot is used immediately for burial.

9. The grave allotments in the Lawn Section shall be 10 feet long by 4 feet wide.

(a) water any garden, plantation or other land comprising public parks, sports grounds, public and club bowling greens and any public or club tennis courts within the specified area except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. or between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. of the same day and then only by means of a hose, can or other vessel held in the hand;

(b) wash any vehicle of any description whatsoever by means of a hose or other mechanical device;

(c) fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

4. Any person by whose act or by or in the consequence of whose order any water supplied by the Trust is used or consumed or allowed to run, and any person who

permits or suffers any such water to be used or consumed or run, and the occupier of any premises on or in which any such water is used or consumed or allowed to run in contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall severally be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

5. Every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding in any case One hundred dollars (\$100) for any breach thereof, and in cases of continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding Ten dollars (\$10) for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act.

 - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at twenty cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
 - (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 20 cents per thousand gallons for the first five million gallons, 15 cents per thousand gallons for quantities in excess of five

million gallons and 11 cents per thousand gallons for quantities in excess of ten million gallons.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 20 cents per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Six Dollars.

5. The charge for water supplied for market garden use is hereby fixed at 25 cents per thousand gallons.

6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the Office of the Trust during normal business hours.

7. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

1. In this regulation unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter "Engineer" means the Engineer for the time being of the City of Waverley. "Contractor" means the person carrying out the works of construction of the crossing. "Council" means the Council of the City of Waverley.

2. Any person constructing a crossing over a footway or channel in accordance with subdivision (4) of Part 1 of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* shall do so in accordance with the specifications and plans set out in the schedule hereto.

3. Every person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$40.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

4. Any person proposing to construct or constructing a crossing may obtain a copy of the specifications contained in this regulation upon application to the Engineer.

5. This regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Waverley.

SCHEDULE.

Specification for Construction of Concrete Crossing.

1. Nature of Contract:

The Contractor shall construct a concrete crossing five (5) inches in depth, properly tamped and floated to a true, even surface. The crossing shall be true to shape, grade and section as shown on the standard plan and to the entire satisfaction and approval of the City Engineer.

N.B. Commercial crossings to be of concrete 6" in depth.

2. Barricades and Lights:

The Contractor shall provide the barricades and lights necessary for the safety of the public and to protect the work from damage. Barricades shall be lit from sunset to sunrise.

3. Excavation:

The ground is to be excavated and neatly trimmed to provide after consolidation by tamping, a clear depth of 7" or 8" below the finished level of the concrete. The excavation is to be approved by the City Engineer or his representative prior to the spreading of crushed rock or screenings. All excavated material shall be removed from the road reserve.

4. Foundation Bed:

After approval of excavation the Contractor shall spread a layer of approved crushed rock of sufficient thickness to give a finished depth of two inches (2") after consolidation by tamping and watering.

5. Existing Concrete:

(a) Existing kerb and channel to be removed and repoured as an integral part of crossing.

(b) Where 3" concrete footpath exists which will form part of the crossing, this to be replaced with 5" thickness.

(c) Where an existing crossing entry is located other than at the proposed crossing covered by this permit, the existing crossing including the concrete channel shall be removed completely and concrete kerb and channel constructed in lieu.

6. Material Storage:

The Contractor shall not place or dump construction materials on the road pavement, kerb and channel or footpath and shall keep such places clear at all times.

7. Aggregate:

Fine Aggregate—shall be clean hard sand, free from soft flaky particles, lumps, loam and clay. It shall have a silt content of not more than 3%. Approved Basaltic Stone Dust may be used in lieu of sand.

Coarse Aggregate—is to consist of stone screenings not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ " ring gauge of approved quality basalt. It shall be free from dirt, silt or any extraneous matter and have a French co-efficient of wear not less than (6).

8. Concrete:

Concrete shall consist of a mixture of cement, sand or stone dust and screenings together with the minimum amount of water that will give a workable mix. The proportions shall be as follows:—

- 4 parts by volume of screenings
- 2 parts by volume of sand
- 1 part by volume of cement.

The proportions of fine and coarse aggregate may at any time be varied by the City Engineer provided that proportion of cement to total aggregate remains unchanged. The screenings, sand and cement for each batch shall be measured separately by volume in approved batch boxed before being fed to the mixer.

9. Mixing and Placing:

The Contractor shall not mix concrete materials on the surface of the road reserve and shall not cause cement or polluted water to fall or run onto the road reserve except for the area of the crossing.

The Contractor shall use an approved batch mixer mechanically operated. Concrete shall be mixed and placed in a manner to the approval of the City Engineer so as to ensure a dense well compacted concrete five (5) inches thick true to line, shape and grade. The Contractor shall notify the City Engineer of the time he will be mixing and placing concrete.

10. Consistency of Mix:

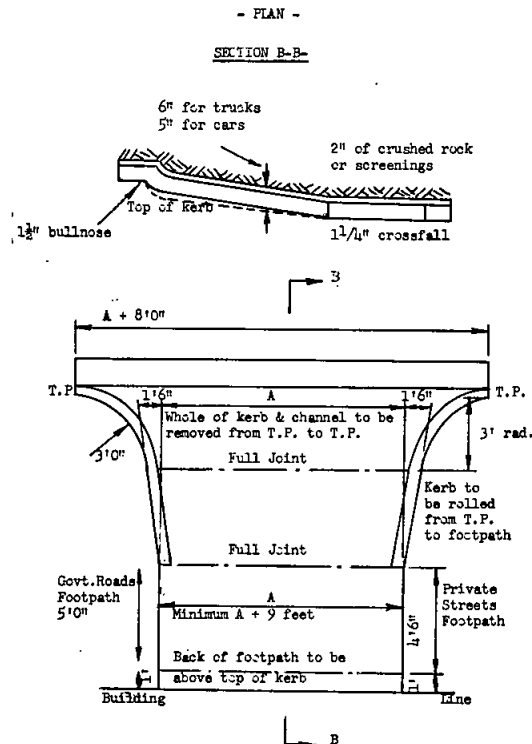
The consistency of the concrete shall be such that the slump shall be not greater than 3" or less than $1\frac{1}{4}$ ".

11. Concrete Tests:

The Contractor shall be held responsible for the correct gauging of the aggregate and weighing of the cement and as the work proceeds and during construction or after completion, the City Engineer may take samples of concrete and such samples shall be subject to analytical and-or compression tests. The compressive strength of the concrete shall be not less than 3,000 lbs. per square inch when tested after 28 days. Should the tests reveal that the specification has not been complied with, the City Engineer will instruct the Contractor to pull up and remove the concrete and replace same with approved concrete at his own expense.

12. Cleaning Up:

Upon completion of the work, the Contractor shall clean the surface of the existing road reserve of any materials associated with the crossing construction.
