Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II entitled the Country Fire Authority (Amendment) Act 1972 (No. 8257) it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day or respective days to be fixed by proclamation or successive proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my proclamation fix the eleventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three as the day on which sections 2, 3, 5, 6 and 15 of the said Country Fire Authority (Amendment) Act 1972 shall come into operation.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 65 of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958 it is provided that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of Victoria may be proclaimed a milk area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of section 65 of the said Act it is provided that the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister may revoke, amend or vary any such proclamation: And whereas by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 55 of the said Act it is provided that Part II of the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the milk areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine and Port Fairy on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture of the said State do by this my proclamation by this my proclamation-

I. Revoke on and after the eleventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three the proclamations made in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of section 65 of the said Act on the 6th August, 1968, the 7th October, 1969, the 25th May, 1971, the 18th April, 1972, and the 22nd August, 1972 and published in the Government Gazette of the 7th August, 1968, the 15th October, 1969, the 2nd June, 1971, the 19th April, 1972 and the 23rd August, 1972, respectively;

POISONS ACT 1962 (No. 6889).

- PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 4 of the Poisons Act 1962 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedules or removing therefrom any item:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by virtue of the provisions of the said Section and all other enabling powers, do by this Proclamation:

1. Amend Schedule Three to the said Act by adding thereto the following item:

HEXACHLOROPHANE in preparations, other than preparations for use on infants, containing 3 per centum or less of hexachlorophane for skin cleansing purposes when such preparations are labelled with the following warnings.

- (i) Do not use internally or on areas of burnt or damaged skin.
- (ii) Do not use on infants except under medical direction.
- (iii) Wash off the skin immediately after use.
- 2. Amend Schedule Four to the said Act by adding thereto the following item:

HEXACHLOROPHANE except-.

(a) when included in Schedule Three; or

(b) in preparations, other than for use on infants, containing 0.1 per centum or less of hexachlorophane as a preservative.

A By-law for the Amendment of Water Supply By-law 104.

Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the Trust) in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred on such Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958 and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf hereby makes the following By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

- 1. Sub-Clauses 4 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) 5 (a) and (b), Clause 6 and Sub-Clauses 9 (b) and (e) are deleted and the following Clauses substituted.
 - 4. (a) To the Geelong Harbor Trust for use in shipping other than that owned by the said Trust at the rate of 8-8 cents per kilolitre.
 - 4. (b) For parks (but excluding areas used at football or cricket ovals or sports grounds) gardens and rockeries under municipal control or the control of the Geelong Harbor Trust at the rate of 3·3 cents park kilolitra per kilolitre.
 - 4. (c) For sports grounds, football and cricket ovals to which no charge for admission is made at the rate of 3.3 cents per kilolitre provided that the minimum charge in any one year shall in no case be less than fifteen dollars.
 - 4. (d) For swimming pools under municipal or public control at the rate of 4.4 cents per kilolitre for the first 2,200,000 kilolitres consumed, 2.2 cents per kilolitre for the next 6,800,000 kilolitres consumed and 4.4 cents per kilolitre for all consumed and 9,000,000 kilolitres in any one year.
 - 4. (e) To public benevolent institutions not conducted for private profit but maintained for the charitable care of diseased, aged, infirm, incurable or delinquent persons at the rate of 4.4 cents per kilolitre for such quantity of water consumed in any one year as shall exceed an agreed allowance free of charge.
 - 4. (f) For churches at the rate of 4.4 cents per kilolitre provided that the minimum charge in any one year shall in no case be less than fifteen dollars.
 - 4. (h) In all cases other than the foregoing and those dealt with in clauses 5 and 9 herein at the rate of 7.7 cents per kilolitre.
 - 5. (a) For the purpose of calculating the quantity of water supplied by measure for domestic purposes to be charged in accordance with the previous clause a deduction relative to the net annual value of the property to which water was supplied shall be made from the measured quantity of water used in that year in accordance with the following table.

- 5. (b) For the purpose of calculating the amount payable for water supplied by measure for industrial, commercial and rural purposes a deduction shall be made from the amount of water used in any one year of 1 kilolitre for each 7.7 cents of water rate paid in respect of that year. The charge for water used in excess of any such deduction shall be 7.7 cents for each 1 kilolitre.
- 6. For the purpose of calculating the amount payable for water supplied by measure a deduction of 46 kilolitres in respect of 1 water closet, 78 kilolitres in respect of 2 water closets and 96 kilolitres in respect of 3 water closets shall be made from the annual consumption measured; provided however that the total deduction allowed shall not in any case exceed 96 kilolitres.

9. (b) Standpipes

The Trust may grant supplies of water for standpipes to municipalities within its water supply area for which a charge of 6.6 cents per kilolitre with a minimum annual charge of fifteen dollars shall be payable.

9. (e) Tappings
The following charges shall be payable in respect of tapping of the Trust's mains.

18 (5) (a) In Addition to the rates normally levied by the Trust in respect of any sewered property, the occupier of any premises from which is discharged trade waste which the Trust, pursuant to the provisions of this by-law has agreed to admit into its sewers shall, unless certain agreements made hereunder with the present occupiers of certain properties abutting the Barwon River and formerly constituting the Special Areas shall otherwise provide, pay on demand the amount of 5 cents for each kilolitre so admitted, but in any case not less than the total amount of twenty dollars in any one year: Provided that where an approved meter or approved apparatus for limiting the maximum possible rate of discharge is installed on any property and is maintained at all times in an efficient working condition by the occupier a discount of 5% will be allowed for every 5% by which the ratio of the maximum hourly discharge to the mean hourly discharge is less than four to one (4 : 1): Provided however, that the allowable discount in any case shall not exceed 50 per cent. For the purposes of this sub-clause, the maximum hourly discharge shall be either that permitted by the limiting apparatus installed, or where a meter is installed calculated by averaging the maximum hourly discharge recorded by the meter in each calendar month in the period for which charge is being made, and the mean hourly discharge shall be calculated by dividing the total volume discharge is being made by 160 times the number of weeks contained in such period. contained in such period.
