INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

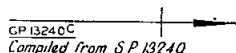

STATEMENT OF PLANNING POLICY No. 7.—GEELONG.

Whereas the Town and Country Planning Board on the 3rd day of November, 1972, adopted a Statement of Planning Policy:

And whereas in the preparation of the said Statement the said Board conferred with the State Planning Council:

And whereas a draft of the proposed Statement was submitted to the said Council, and the Geelong Regional Planning Authority for consideration and comment:

And whereas comments were received from the Geelong Regional Planning Authority and were forwarded to the Minister with the adopted Statement:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth by this Order approve the said Statement with modifications so that the Statement as modified shall be as set out hereunder, that is to say:

1. This Statement of Planning Policy under part I. of the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* applies to the area of the Geelong Regional Planning Authority—

- 1.1 The region centred on Geelong shall be promoted and planned as a location for large scale urban growth including business, industry and housing.
- 1.2 The region shall be planned to accommodate a greatly increased share of the expected growth in the Port Phillip area to the optimum limits determined by regional planning studies.
- 1.3 The planning of the region shall ensure that acceptable environmental standards are achieved and shall have regard to the high quality of the environment generally and the coastal areas in particular and to the need to preserve established recreation opportunities.
- 1.4 The planning of the region shall include proposals to stimulate growth and for the establishment of priorities for works by public authorities.

2. The principal factors influencing this Statement of Planning Policy are—

- 2.1 The need to relieve the pressure on the physical resources which sustain urban settlement in the Melbourne Metropolitan area and the steps which may have to be taken to limit its population growth.
- 2.2 The need for growth centres removed from the Metropolitan area but capable at short notice of absorbing substantial development.
- 2.3 The restraints imposed by Statement of Planning Policy No. 2 (Mornington Peninsula), No. 3 (Dandenong Ranges) and No. 4 (Yarra River) and the consequent need to provide alternative outlets for growth.
- 2.4 The need to develop and apply special measures to implement the Government's policy to stimulate growth on a large scale in appropriate parts of the State, outside the metropolitan area.
- 2.5 The potential of the Geelong region to sustain substantial urban growth in that—

- (a) Geelong is a city with established social and economic traditions and is a well known trading and manufacturing centre which together provide a firm base for further growth;
- (b) the city has a large and steadily growing workforce and is an established and extensive consumer market;
- (c) the quality of the natural environment is comparable to the most attractive parts of the Melbourne area and is not likely to be deleteriously affected by further planned growth;
- (d) the ready availability of access to recreation resorts of a high standard;
- (e) there is good access to market and employment opportunities available in Melbourne;
- (f) there are good communications, with potential for further development, in the port facilities and in the road and rail connexions with other parts of the State;
- (g) the capacity in the existing servicing structure would permit an immediate and substantial increase in growth; and
- (h) social agencies and social planning within the community are well developed.

3. To implement this Planning Policy it will be necessary for the Regional Planning Authority to give special attention to the following:—

- 3.1 The evaluation of the social, economic and natural resources capable of sustaining substantial urban growth in the region.
- 3.2 The assessment of the suitability and capacity of land for development, paying due regard to—
 - (a) the value of areas for nature conservation, recreation, water catchment, farming and mineral extraction;

- (b) an efficient urban servicing structure; and
(c) social service requirements of the community.
- 3.3 The formulation of special policies designed to encourage growth and including—
- measures designed to ensure that existing community services are not detrimentally affected by accelerated growth;
 - measures aimed at improving the attractiveness of Geelong as a centre for growth;
 - measures aimed at achieving high standards in the urban and rural environment and avoiding any detriment to the ecology of the region;
 - proposals for improved communications particularly telecommunications, road, rail and air links to other centres and development of port facilities; and
 - determination of the extent and the level of services including the full range of social services necessary for stimulating urban growth in the region and particularly the level to which State instrumentalities and semi-Government authorities should be committed.
- 3.4 The implications of any measures introduced with Government authority to regulate and improve the pattern of distribution of people and activities within the State.

And the Honorable Alan John Hunt, Her Majesty's Minister for Local Government for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 267 (T.T. 56).

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends Regulation 9 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations as follows:—

REGULATION 9.

Rescind Regulation 9 and substitute therefor the following new Regulation:—

REGULATION 9.

QUALIFICATIONS OF TEACHERS IN THE TECHNICAL
SCHOOLS DIVISION.

1. (a) The academic qualifications required for the promotion or appointment (as the case may be) of teachers in the classes in the Technical Schools Division shall be those prescribed under the headings indicated in this Regulation or approved equivalent or higher qualifications.

(b) In this Regulation unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter or otherwise specified—

“Approved” means approved by the Teachers Tribunal.

“Tertiary study” means a sequential course of post sixth form study undertaken at an approved university, an approved college of advanced education, or any other approved institution.

“Approved industrial experience” means experience of two years in duration or of one year in the case of a woman who has completed an approved three year diploma.

2. *Fully Qualified for All Classes.*

(a) Four years of approved tertiary study including an approved course of teacher training and, where appropriate, approved industrial experience;

or

(b) the qualifications prescribed in the appropriate sub-clause of clause 3, together with an approved fourth year of study or, in the case of the Diplomas of Agricultural Science, Horticultural Science, Fashion Design and Production, and Foods and Food Service, a minimum of five years of approved industrial experience;

or

(c) the Trained Technician Instructor's Certificate or an approved equivalent;

or

(d) the Trained Trade Instructor's Certificate, together with an approved trade technician course or an approved equivalent program of post-apprenticeship studies;

(e) for teachers of instrumental music, speech, or drama, the licentiateship of an approved examining body in the practising art, together with an approved course of teacher training.

3. *Qualified for Permanent Appointment in the Assistant Class and for Posts of Responsibility.*(a) *Agriculture and Horticulture—*

(i) Two years at tertiary level of an approved course of study, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

(ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in the appropriate field.

(b) *Architecture, Building, and Quantity Surveying*—

- (i) Two years at tertiary level of an approved course of study, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in the appropriate field;

or

- (iii) corporate membership of an approved professional institution secured through approved studies, together with five years of approved industrial experience and an approved course of teacher training.

(c) *Art*—

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study, together with an approved course of teacher training and approved experience in the practice of art;

or

- (ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in art.

(d) *Business Studies*—

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in business studies;

or

- (iii) the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate in business studies;

or

- (iv) an approved certificate course, together with a minimum of six years of approved industrial experience and an approved course of teacher training;

or

- (v) corporate membership of an approved professional institution secured through approved studies, together with five years of approved industrial experience and an approved course of teacher training.

(e) *Engineering and Applied Science*—

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study in the appropriate branch of applied science or engineering, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) corporate membership of an approved professional institution secured through approved studies, together with five years of approved industrial experience and an approved course of teacher training.

(f) *Humanities*—

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study including appropriate sub-majors, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate including approved studies in humanities.

(g) *Home Economics, Nutrition, Foods, Catering, Needle-crafts, and Fashion—*

- (i) Two years at tertiary level of an approved course of study, together with an approved course of teacher training and approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in the appropriate field;

or

- (iii) the Trained Trade Instructor's Certificate in the appropriate field;

or

- (iv) an approved certificate course, together with a minimum of six years of approved industrial experience and an approved course of teacher training;

or

- (v) extensive and appropriate supervisory or executive experience in the area concerned, together with a sound knowledge of contemporary developments in that area and an approved course of teacher training.

(h) *Mathematics and Science—*

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study including the mathematics and/or science subjects appropriate to the course, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of a diploma course, approved industrial experience;

or

- (ii) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate in mathematics and science including mathematics and science subjects at approved levels;

or

- (iii) the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate including mathematics and science subjects at approved levels.

(i) *Music—*

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study, together with an approved course of teacher training and, in the case of arts degree or diploma courses, approved experience and performing ability in the relevant field;

or

- (ii) for teachers of instrumental music, ability as a performer to the level of the licentiateship of an approved examining body in the practising art, together with five years of approved experience in the appropriate field and an approved course of teacher training.

(j) *Speech, Drama, Film, and Television—*

- (i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study, together with an approved course of teacher training and approved experience and performing ability in the relevant field;

or

- (ii) In the case of speech and/or drama, ability as a performer to the level of the licentiateship of an approved examining body in the practising art, together with

five years of approved experience in the relevant field and an approved course of teacher training;

or

(iii) in the case of film and/or television, appropriate experience and proved performance, together with a sound knowledge of contemporary developments in the area and approved course of teacher training.

(k) *Physical Education*—

(i) An approved diploma in physical education, together with an approved course of teacher training;

or

(ii) the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate in physical education;

or

(iii) approved special qualifications in physical education, together with five years of approved experience in physical education and an approved course of teacher training.

(l) *Technician and Trade Subjects*—

(i) The Trained Trade Instructor's Certificate;

or

(ii) the Trained Technician Instructor's Certificate;

or

(iii) extensive and appropriate supervisory or executive experience in the area concerned, together with a sound knowledge of contemporary developments in that area and an approved course of teacher training.

(m) *Teacher-Librarian*—

(i) Two years of an approved course of tertiary study, together with approved experience in library work and an approved course of teacher training; or

(ii) the Registration Certificate of the Library Association of Australia, together with approved experience in library work and an approved course of teacher training.

4. (a) Teachers of other than trade subjects who were employed at the 31st December, 1973, and who at that date had completed the qualifications required by the Regulation then in force or were currently undertaking and completed prior to the 1st January, 1978, approved studies directed specifically towards the gaining of such qualifications shall be regarded as qualified for promotion up to and including the 1st January, 1978.

(b) (i) Teachers of trade subjects who were employed at the 21st May, 1972, and who at that date possessed the Trained Trade Instructor's Certificate shall be regarded as qualified for promotion if, by the 1st January, 1978, they have completed additional qualifications amounting to the equivalent of 560 hours of fifth form secondary subjects;

In the case of student instructors undergoing training at the 21st May, 1972, such additional qualifications must be gained following the completion of an apprenticeship course.

(ii) Teachers of trade subjects who were employed at the 31st December, 1972, and who at that date had completed the qualifications required by the Regulation then in force shall be regarded as qualified for promotion up to and including the 1st January, 1978.

Provided that this clause shall apply only to members who have continuous service from the appropriate dates specified in the clause.

5. In addition to the qualifications prescribed in the foregoing clauses, special qualifications may, when necessary, be specified for any position on the recommendation of the Director-General, and with the approval of the Tribunal.

6. (a) If there are no qualified applicants for any advertised or consequential vacancy in any class, the Committee of Classifiers may appoint to such vacancy any teacher who may be considered to have sufficient literary or special qualifications.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, the Committee of Classifiers for the Technical Schools Division may promote to any class a teacher who is a discharged serviceman and who has the qualifications prescribed for permanent appointment, provided that such teacher has a very good record of service and submits to the Tribunal satisfactory evidence that he is suffering from disabilities as the result of his war service which prevent him from obtaining the necessary qualifications, and that the Committee of Classifiers or the Tribunal is satisfied that he is capable of carrying out the duties of the higher position.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, members of the teaching service who were appointed under the provisions of the *Education (Army Apprentices School) Act 1969* (No. 7918) may be regarded as eligible for promotion to positions at Balcombe Army Apprentices School if the Committee of Classifiers considers that prior experience and satisfactory performance of duties at that school compensate for lack of the appropriate formal qualifications. No member shall receive the benefit of this sub-clause on more than one occasion.

(d) (i) For special positions in areas directly related to vocational training at the trade technician or middle levels of instruction, provided that the Tribunal is satisfied that there is no applicant in the teaching service who is qualified for appointment, a person who lacks teacher training may be appointed.

(ii) Such an appointment may be made at the Assistant, Post of Responsibility, or Senior Teacher level, but the appointee shall not be eligible for progression from the level at which appointed until he has completed an approved course of teacher training.

BY-LAW No. 193.

Municipal Buildings, Reserves and Playgrounds By-Law.

A By-law of the City of Springvale made under the provisions of Sections 197 and 800 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 193 for the purpose of:—

- (a) Preserving public decency.
- (b) Suppressing nuisances.
- (c) Controlling and managing and preserving commons and public reserves of which the management is vested in the Council.
- (d) Providing for the protection and control of—
 - (i) tree reserves and gardens, garden plots, lawns and ornamental plantations in or upon any street or road;
 - (ii) trees shrubs and plants planted and tree guards statues monuments fountains and seats erected in or upon any street or road.
- (e) Preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council and preventing damage to such building and the furniture and fittings thereof.
- (f) Imposing collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon any pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation on land purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council for the providing of such grounds or places and also for the regulation of the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Springvale orders as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be known as the *Municipal Buildings Reserves and Playgrounds By-Law*.

2. By-laws Nos. 151 and 177 of the City of Springvale are hereby repealed.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Building" means a building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Springvale.

"Children's Playground" means and includes every reserve or portion of a reserve specified by notice on the same to be a Children's Playground or set aside as playgrounds for children by the provision of swings slides and similar equipment.

"Fire prevention appliance" means any appliance, fixture, plant, machinery or thing whether attached to or placed in any building and used or intended to be used for the purpose of preventing controlling or extinguishing fire, and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes hoses, taps, hydrants, sprinklers or portable fire extinguishers.

"Garden" means and includes any tree reserve, garden, garden plot, lawn or ornamental plantation in or upon any street or road and trees shrubs and plants planted and tree guards statues monuments and fountains and seats erected in or upon any street road or land.

"Reserve" means and includes any land purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given to the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation.

"Sports Ground" means and includes every portion of the reserves described in the 1st Schedule hereto which are specified by notice on the same to be a sports ground or are declared from time to time by Council resolution to be a Sports Ground.

4. Except as hereinafter provided all reserves shall be open to the public every day from sunrise to sunset.

5. In the case of Sports Grounds the Council by Resolution may from time to time—

- (a) vary the days and hours during which the same shall be open,
- (b) determine the days and hours upon which charges or entrance fees may be collected and received for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon the same,

- (c) determine the amount of deposit to be paid by any club association or person granted a permit to use the same,
- (d) determine the fee to be charged for a permit to use the same,
- (e) determine the fee to be charged for a permit to use any building upon the same,
- (f) determine the periods during which organised sport or forms of sport may be played upon the same.

6. No person other than members of the Council, persons authorised in writing by the Council, officers of the Council and employees of the Council on duty shall be entitled to enter any sports ground during any time a charge authorised by the Council is made for admission thereto without first playing such charge.

7. (1) Every club, association or person to whom a permit to use a sports ground is granted shall be responsible to see that the sports ground is left in a clean and sanitary condition and that all refuse and rubbish deposited therein as a result of the use of the sports ground is removed to the satisfaction of the Engineer to the Council no later than by the end of the day following the day of such use.

(2) If such person fails to comply with the provisions of sub-clause (1) hereof then the Council shall be entitled to take all steps necessary to place the sports ground in a clean and sanitary condition and to deduct the cost of so doing from the deposit paid by the holder of the permit.

8. No person shall—

- (i) interfere with or break or damage or remove any tree plant shrub or flower in or upon any reserve or garden;
- (ii) walk on the flower beds or borders or climb jump or get upon or over any fence gate building or part thereof (other than seats set aside for the public) in or upon any reserve or garden;
- (iii) post bills or advertisements on any of the fences gates walls seats or other structures in or upon any reserve or garden;
- (iv) roll or throw stones or missiles in or upon any reserve or garden (except as may form part of the reasonable use of a sports ground);
- (v) leave in any reserve or garden or part thereof or building therein any bottle can broken glass paper fruit skins or peel or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever otherwise than in the receptacles provided.

9. Except with the written authority of the Council no person shall carry firearms in or through any reserve or shoot attempt to shoot snare attempt to snare destroy or attempt to destroy any bird or animal therein or thereon.

10. No person shall—

- (a) expectorate upon any passageway, stairway, floor or wall in; or
- (b) cut mark deface write or scribble on; or
- (c) otherwise damage or injure—
any building or any part thereof or the furniture and fittings thereof.

11. No person shall—

- (a) stand upon any chair seat or table in; or
- (b) stand or sit on any windowsill, parapet, roof, gutter, gable, exterior balcony or cornice of—
any building.

12. No person shall use the handrail of any stairway otherwise than for support or assistance by hand in ascending or descending such stairway.

13. No person shall in any way interfere with destroy damage or injure any fire prevention appliance in any building.

14. Except with the written authority of the Council no person shall attach fix or paint any bill device poster sign or advertisement on any of the buildings fences seats or other structures in any reserve or on any building.

15. (a) No person Club Association or group of persons shall engage play or practice in any organized game or practice session of cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse or golf or any like games or any other organized sport in or upon any reserve without the authority of the Council.

(b) No person shall play any type of ball game in a childrens playground which contains a notice erected by the Council announcing that ball games are not permitted.

16. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling in any reserve without the written authority of the Council and all other relevant authorities or by any unseemly or indecent conduct interfere with the comfort or enjoyment of other persons within any reserve.

17. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employee of the Council engaged in any duty in any reserve.

18. Except as may be provided under or pursuant to the *Hawkers and Pedlar's Act 1958* no person shall sell expose or offer for sale within any reserve any article of food or drink or any other article or operate or cause to be operated any amusement for which a charge is made or make a collection of money for any purpose without the written authority of the Council.

19. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create any fight or disturbance or use any indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency by means of dress language or conduct in any reserve and no person shall enter or remain in any reserve whilst in a drunken or intoxicated condition or whilst under the influence of any drug to such an extent as to cause a disturbance to other persons in the reserve.

20. (1) Except as hereinafter provided no person other than an officer or servant of the Council shall ride or drive any horse or any motor vehicle motor cycle or bicycle into or upon any reserve.

(2) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to—

- (a) the driving in or upon any reserve of motor vehicles motor cycles or bicycles in accordance with the terms of any permit in writing by the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk authorising any club association or person upon conditions therein specified to allow the same;
- (b) the parking of motor vehicles motor cycles and bicycles in any parking area set aside for that purpose by the Council;
- (c) the wheeling of bicycles prams invalid wheel chairs child or baby carriages and children's toys along any delineated footpath in any reserve.

21. (1) No person shall—

- (a) fly any model aeroplane or any similar device;
- (b) use any turf cricket wicket provided by the Council—
in or on any reserve without the written permission of the Council.

(2) No person shall—

- (a) practice or engage in the game of golf; or
- (b) without the consent of the Council take any animal or allow or permit any animal to be;
- (c) take into or consume any intoxicating liquor except in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Acts any permit thereunder)
in or on any reserve or building.

(3) No person shall use any reserve for—

- (a) the racing of any horse or any greyhound, whippet or other dog used for coursing;
- (b) motor car racing, motor cycle racing, go-kart racing, bicycle racing or similar sporting activities—
without the consent in writing of the Council.

(4) No person shall bring into or ride any bicycle motor cycle mini bike or horse in or on any reserve or within any building.

22. No person other than a player official or competitor at any sports match or sports gathering held in accordance with any permit to use a sports ground granted by the Council in accordance with the provisions of the By-law shall enter or remain within or upon the playing arena in any sports ground during the progress of such sports match or sports gathering or otherwise interfere with the same or interrupt or interfere with any employee of the Council in the proper execution of his duty or work.

23. Any person found offending against any of the provisions of this by-law who fails to obey a direction of any police officer or officer or employee of the Council to leave a reserve shall notwithstanding that a fee or charge for admission may have been paid by him, be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

24. No person other than an officer or employee of the Council shall enter any plots or areas which are set aside for the planting or growing of flowers trees or shrubs in any reserve.

25. (i) Except as hereinafter provided no person shall permit or suffer any animal owned by him or of which he is in charge to be in or upon any reserve.

(ii) No person shall bring allow or have any dog in any reserve unless such dog be controlled by a leash chain or cord or unless such dog is taking part in sheep dog trials or dog obedience trials or training sessions in accordance with the written authority of the Council for the use of the reserve for that purpose.

26. (i) No person above the age of fourteen years other than a person in charge of a child or children using the same shall enter any Children's Playground.

(ii) No person shall use any swing or other equipment erected in a Children's Playground for a longer period than five minutes if any other person is waiting to use such equipment.

27. No person shall ride lead train or exercise any horse or dog on any garden.

28. No person shall camp or pitch erect or occupy any camp tent or temporary shelter in or upon any reserve without the written consent of the Council.

29. No person shall without the written consent of the Council and the observance of all statutory restrictions which may be in force—

(i) light any fire or permit any fire to remain alight in any reserve save in a fire-place provided by Council;

(ii) let off any fireworks in any reserve

Provided that this clause shall not apply to the use of properly constructed gas bar-b-ques stoves or heaters which comply with any regulations affecting the same.

30. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100.00.

31. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Springvale.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended) and every other power it thereunto enabling for the purpose of:—

(a) providing for the protection and control of—

(i) tree reserves and gardens garden plots lawns and ornamental plantations in or upon any street or road;

(ii) trees shrubs and plants planted and tree-guards statues monuments fountains and seats erected in or upon any street or road;

(b) controlling and managing and preserving commons and public reserves of which the management is vested in the Council; and

(c) adopting certain of the provisions of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended and any and every other power thereunto it enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alexandra order as follows:—

1. The provisions of Clauses 3 to 6 of Part IV (2) of the Fifteenth Schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted by the Council namely—

(3) The gardens under the management and control of the Council and ground appertaining thereto, herein called "the gardens", shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

(4) No person shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb damage or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

(5) No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare or destroy any wild-fowl either in the gardens or in any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as may be fixed by any regulation of the Council to be made on that behalf in such water.

(6) No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven through the gardens.

2. No person shall except on any road or parking area laid out marked and set aside for vehicular traffic:

(i) drive,

(ii) ride,

(iii) propel, or

(iv) otherwise use or permit to run by its own weight or momentum or by engine power

any truck, car motor cycle, mini-bike, billy cart, bicycle or other vehicle (howsoever propelled) onto across or along any garden or reserve or any path thereover.

3. No person shall deface or damage any tree-guards, statues, monuments fountains or seats erected in or upon any street or road.

4. Subject to Clause 8 hereof, no person shall engage in any sport or practice therefor on any garden or reserve except:

(i) upon any area thereof set aside for the playing or practice of any such sport,

(ii) in the case of children under the age of 12 in any area thereof set aside as a playground for children, and

(iii) between sunrise and sunset.

5. No person shall use or carry on any activity in any garden or reserve in such a manner as to injure any person or destroy, deface or damage any property, flora, fauna, building or equipment therein or thereon.

6. No person shall in any garden or reserve:

(a) interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employee servant contractor or agent of the Council engaged in any duty or work under the direction of or for the Council;

(b) behave in a disorderly or offensive manner or create or take in any fight or disturbance or commit any nuisance;

(c) enter or remain in any garden or reserve whilst intoxicated by or under the influence of alcohol or any other drug;

(d) interfere with hinder or obstruct any sport or game being lawfully carried on in an area designated or used as an arena, sports ground, swimming pool or playing area;

(e) bring or allow into or have in any garden or reserve any dog which is not controlled by a leash;

(f) remain in any garden or reserve having been directed to leave the same by a duly authorized officer, servant or employee of the Council, or by any member of the police force;

(g) remove any soil, tree, plant, sand, stone or gravel from any garden or reserve;

(h) deposit any litter or rubbish of any nature whatsoever except in receptacles provided for that purpose.

7. No person shall without the written permission of the Council or its duly authorized officer in any garden or reserve—

(a) sell, expose or offer for sale any article of food or drink;

(b) operate an entertainment for which a charge for admission or viewing the same is or is sought to be made;

- (c) camp in any tent, caravan or temporary shelter or bring such tent, caravan or temporary shelter on to any garden or reserve;
 - (d) bring any horse or cattle or allow any horse or cattle to remain or graze on any part of any garden or reserve;
 - (e) remain on any garden or reserve after sunset.
8. (a) Any person or persons desiring to organize carry on or engage in any sporting event or sport on any garden or reserve after sunset on any day may apply in writing to the Council giving details of the activity proposed, the date and times, the area and the approximate number of persons proposed to take part in such sporting event or sport. The Council may refuse the application, or at its discretion grant its permission whether subject to conditions or in full, save that any such permission must always be subject to the condition set out in subclause (b) hereof.

(b) Any permission granted pursuant to Clause 8 (a) shall be in writing signed by the Shire Secretary and shall be subject always to the condition that such permission shall not impose any responsibility upon the Council for any injury or damage to any person or property arising from or consequent on the sport or event for which such permission is given.

9. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$20.00 nor more than \$100.00; and any person guilty of a continuing offence against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is committed after a conviction or order against him in respect thereof by any Court.

10. In this by-law the words and phrases set out hereunder shall (unless inconsistent with their context) have the following meanings:—

"The Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Alexandra;

"Garden or Reserve" shall mean:

- (i) tree reserves and garden plots, lawns, trees, shrubs and ornamental plantations in or upon any street or road, and
- (ii) all commons and public reserves of which the management is vested in the Council.

"Cattle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in Section 3 (1) of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

11. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
