ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN THE SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 67 of the *Public Service Act 1958*, Thursday, the twenty-seventh day of September, 1973 shall be observed as a public holiday throughout the municipalities mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act, including the Shire of Gisborne;

And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said day should not be a public holiday throughout the Shire of Gisborne;

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (3) of Section 67 of the *Public Service Act 1958*, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a public holiday throughout the Shire of Gisborne and appoint Monday, the twenty-fourth day of September, 1973 to be a public holiday throughout the Shire of Gisborne.

HEALTH ACT 1958 (No. 6270) SECTION 102.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 102 of the *Health Act 1958*, it is provided amongst other things that the Governor in Council in respect of any municipal district may by Proclamation define localities therein in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on any offensive trade specified in the Proclamation.

And whereas by paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of Section 389 of the *Health Act 1958*, it is provided that all Proclamations made under the *Health Act 1958* may be rescinded revoked amended or varied by like Proclamation.

And whereas by a Proclamation made by the Governor of the State of Victoria on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Health Acts*, and dated the twenty-ninth day of June 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of July 1954 certain areas including part of the municipality of the City of Sunshine were defined as localities in which it shall not be lawful hereafter to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on:—

- (a) any of the offensive trades specified in the Second Schedule to the *Health Act 1928* as amended by any Act;
- (b) any of the trades specified in the Proclamation, dated the fifth day of October, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of October, 1942, on page 3457, in connection with the reception and disposal of nightsoil;
- (c) the trades usually carried on in connection with fish curing establishments.

And whereas the Council of the City of Sunshine now desires that the whole of the City of Sunshine be defined as a locality in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on any offensive trade within the meaning of the *Health Act 1958*.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation:—

- (a) revoke the Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of June, 1954 in so far as it relates to the municipality of the City of Sunshine; and
- (b) define the whole of the City of Sunshine as a locality in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on any offensive trade within the meaning of the *Health Act 1958*.

HEALTH ACT 1958 (No. 6270) SECTION 102.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

By virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* (No. 6270) I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation define the following locality in the Municipal District in the Shire of Werribee, as being an area in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on an Offensive Trade within the meaning of the *Health Act 1958*.

The locality defined for the purposes of this Proclamation is:—

Commencing at the point where the Board of Works Outfall Sewer crosses the Kororoit Creek and following a line southward on the west side of the Kororoit Creek to the Princes Highway then continuing westward along the centre line of the Princes Highway to the point where the Board of Works Outfall Sewer crosses under the Princes Highway then continuing eastward along the south side of the Outfall Sewer back to the point of commencement at the junction of the Outfall Sewer and the Kororoit Creek.

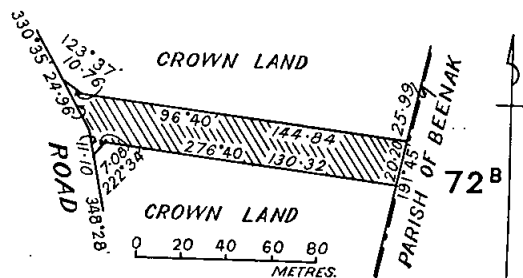

Metropolitan Fire Brigades Act 1958.

METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD— ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Metropolitan Fire Brigades Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare that that municipal district, or a specified part thereof, shall be added to and shall form part of the Metropolitan Fire District:

And whereas the council of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows has requested that the whole of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows be included within the Metropolitan Fire District:

And whereas a certificate has been received from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is desirable so to do:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 5 (1) of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portions of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder shall from the fifth day of September 1973, be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz.:—

AREA 1.

Commencing at the intersection of that section of the North-eastern Railway Line which lies between Broadmeadows and Craigieburn Railway Stations and Somerton Road; then southerly by that railway line to its intersection with an arc having a radius of 10 miles from the General Post Office, at the corner of Elizabeth and Bourke Streets, Melbourne; thence generally south westerly by that arc to its intersection with the boundary of the city of Broadmeadows; thence generally northerly and easterly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA 2.

Commencing at the junction of the Merri Creek with an arc having a radius of 10 miles from the General Post Office at the corner of Elizabeth and Bourke Streets, Melbourne; thence generally westerly by that arc to Hume Highway; thence northerly by that highway to Cooper Road; thence easterly by that road to the Merri Creek; thence southerly by that creek to the point of commencement.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958.

DECLARATION THAT THERE IS DANGER OF A PLAGUE OF THE AUSTRALIAN PLAGUE LOCUST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 5A of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) revoke the Proclamation made under the said section 5A on the 16th November, 1971, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th November, 1971, as altered by a Proclamation made on the 8th November, 1972, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th November, 1972;
- (b) declare that there is danger of a plague of the parasite *Chortocetes terminifera* (commonly known as the Australian Plague Locust) in that portion of Victoria comprising all those lands lying within fifty miles of the Murray River between the border with South Australia and the township of Tintaldra in the County of Benambra and the remaining part of the Shire of Walpeup;
- (c) require every occupier or owner of land in the said portion of Victoria to give notice of the presence of the said locust on the land of which he is the occupier or owner to the nearest of

the persons specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation immediately the occupier or owner becomes aware of the presence on the land of which he is the owner or occupier of any band of the locust in its wingless stages of existence with a density of twenty or more locusts per square foot covering an area of one-quarter acre or more of land, or of any swarm of the locust in its winged stage of existence covering an area of one acre or more of land, giving the following particulars:—

- (i) the exact description of the place where each band or swarm was observed;
 - (ii) the estimated area of land covered by each band or swarm;
 - (iii) the time when each band or swarm was observed;
 - (iv) the direction in which each band or swarm was moving; and
 - (v) the kind of plants being attacked by each band or swarm; and
- (d) require every occupier or owner of land in the said portion of Victoria to spray with—
- (i) maldison at the rate of sixteen ounces of active ingredient per acre, or fenitrothion at the rate of four ounces of active ingredient per acre; or
 - (ii) with the written authority of an officer of the Department of Agriculture, lindane at the rate of three and one-half ounces of active ingredient per acre—
- any band of the locust in its wingless stage of existence present on the land of which he is the occupier or owner with a density of fifty or more locusts per square foot covering an area of one-quarter acre or more of land within forty-eight hours of becoming aware that such band is so present.

BY-LAW No. 496.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under section 12 of the *Melbourne Wholesale Fruit and Vegetable Market Act 1968* and numbered 496 to further amend By-law No. 477.*

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned enactment and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne orders as follows:

1. (1) This By-law may be cited as the City of Melbourne Wholesale Fruit and Vegetable Market (Amendment) By-law 1973.

(2) In this By-law, the City of Melbourne Wholesale Fruit and Vegetable Market By-law 1969, By-law No. 477, as amended by By-laws Nos. 478, 480, 485, 486, and 490, is referred to as the Principal By-law.

2. Clause 2 of the Principal By-law is amended in sub-clause (1) by inserting in the definition of "agent" after the expression "agent" the expression "and commission agent" each.

3. Clause 9 of the Principal By-law is amended—

(a) by—

(i) inserting after the expression "9." the expression "(1)"; and

(ii) inserting after the words "First Schedule" the expression "as modified by Schedule 1A"; and

(b) by inserting at the end the following sub-clause:

"(2) Nothing in this By-law shall operate to prevent any person from entering or remaining in the main cafe in the Market (being the cafe in that part of the Market designated on the plan in the Fifth Schedule as "Cafe") during such periods as that cafe is open for business."

4. Clause 12A of the Principal By-law is amended—

(a) by inserting after the expression "12A." the expression "(1)"; and

(b) by inserting at the end the following sub-clause:

"(2) No person of any particular class of persons specified in Schedule 1A shall on any day from Monday to Saturday both inclusive between midnight and 4 a.m. enter or remain in any part of the Market or the Market concourse from which persons of that particular class of persons are during that period (being the period between midnight and 4 a.m.) excluded by that schedule."

5. Clause 45 of the Principal By-law is amended by repealing sub-clause (1) and substituting for it the following sub-clause:

"(1) Every person—

(a) who does not do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by or under this By-law; or

(b) who, being a person to whom a stand, a store, or a transport stand has been leased or let, fails to comply with any of the terms or conditions set out—

(i) in the Second Schedule; or

(ii) in a leasehold agreement executed by him pursuant to clause 16 of that schedule—

shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law."

6. The First Schedule to the Principal By-law is repealed and the following schedules are substituted for it:

'FIRST SCHEDULE.

(CLAUSES 9, 12A, AND 17).

Hours of admission to and departure from, and hours of trading at, the Market.

1. In this schedule, unless the context otherwise requires—

"carrier agent", "carrier merchant", and "grower" have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by the Second Schedule;

"country-transport operator" means a person to whom a transport stand has been allotted and let;

"midnight" in relation to any day means the midnight at which that day begins;

"produce-delivery vehicle" means a vehicle that delivers fruit or vegetables or both to the Market for sale in the Market; and

any reference to persons of a particular class of persons shall be read and construed as a reference to those persons and their employees (if any) and vehicles (if any).

2. The hours of admission to and departure from, and the hours of trading in fruit and vegetables at, the Market and various parts of the Market are, subject to Schedule 1A. as follows:

A. Hours of admission to, and departure from, the Market
(1) *All parts of the Market, except the Market concourse—*

(a) Admission on each day Sunday to Friday both inclusive—

7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Carrier agents from outside the area within a radius of 100 miles from the General Post Office at the corner of Bourke Street and Elizabeth Street, Melbourne, carrier merchants from outside that area, growers from outside that area, and country-transport operators from outside that area may enter for either or both of the purposes of parking their vehicles and leaving their loads of fruit or vegetables or both in the Market.

(b) Admission on each day Monday to Saturday both inclusive—

(i) Midnight Carrier agents, carrier merchants, growers, country-transport operators, commission agents, merchants, tenants of banks, cafes, and shops and stores in or at which shops and stores neither fruit nor vegetables are sold, and produce-delivery vehicles may enter.

(ii) 3 a.m. Buyers may enter.

(c) Departure—

(i) On Sunday—9 p.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, growers, and country-transport operators who entered the Market between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall leave by 9 p.m., leaving their vehicles or their loads or both in the Market, if they so wish.

(ii) On each day Monday to Friday both inclusive—

(I) 2 p.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, growers, buyers, and produce-delivery vehicles shall leave by 2 p.m.

(II) 5 p.m. All persons and vehicles shall leave by 5 p.m., when the Market shall close.

(III) 9 p.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, growers, and country-transport operators who entered the Market between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall leave by 9 p.m., leaving their vehicles or their loads or both in the Market, if they so wish.

(iii) On Saturday—Noon All persons and vehicles shall leave by noon, when the Market shall close.

(2) *Market concourse—*

(a) Admission on each day Sunday to Friday both inclusive—

7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Carrier agents from outside the area within a radius of 100 miles from the General Post Office at the corner of Bourke Street and Elizabeth Street, Melbourne, carrier merchants from outside that area, and growers from outside that area may enter for either or both of the purposes of parking their vehicles and leaving their loads of fruit or vegetables or both in the Market concourse.

(b) Admission on each day Monday to Saturday both inclusive—

(i) Midnight Carrier agents, carrier merchants, growers, commission agents, merchants, tenants of banks, cafes, and shops and stores in or at which shops and stores neither fruit nor vegetables are sold, and produce-delivery vehicles may enter.

(ii) 4 a.m. Produce-delivery vehicles may enter up to, but not after, 4 a.m.

Market concourse opens, and buyers (but not their vehicles) and country-transport operators (but not their vehicles) may enter.

(iii) 9 a.m. Produce-delivery vehicles may re-enter.

(c) Departure—

(i) On Sunday—9 p.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, and growers who entered the Market concourse between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall leave by 9 p.m., leaving their vehicles or their loads or both in the Market concourse, if they so wish.

(ii) On each day Monday to Friday both inclusive—

(I) 4.30 a.m. All produce-delivery vehicles shall leave, and be clear of, the Market concourse by 4.30 a.m.

(II) 10.15 a.m. All buyers and country-transport operators shall leave by 10.15 a.m.

(III) 11 a.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, and growers shall leave by 11 a.m.

(IV) 2 p.m. All produce-delivery vehicles shall leave by 2 p.m., when all deliveries of fruit and vegetables shall cease.

(V) 5 p.m. All persons and vehicles shall leave by 5 p.m., when the Market shall close.

(VI) 9 p.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, and growers who entered the Market concourse between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall leave by 9 p.m., leaving their vehicles or their loads or both in the Market concourse, if they so wish.

(iii) On Saturday—

(I) 4.30 a.m. All produce-delivery vehicles shall leave, and be clear of, the Market concourse by 4.30 a.m.

(II) 7.45 a.m. All buyers and country-transport operators shall leave by 7.45 a.m.

(III) 8.30 a.m. All carrier agents, carrier merchants, and growers shall leave by 8.30 a.m.

(IV) Noon All persons and vehicles shall leave by noon, when the Market shall close.

B. Hours of trading in fruit and vegetables

(a) 4 a.m. Buying and selling may begin at, but not before, 4 a.m.; but fruit and vegetables sold between 4 a.m. and 5 a.m. shall not be delivered to buyers before 5 a.m.

(b) 5 a.m. Delivery of fruit and vegetables by sellers to buyers may begin.

(c) 7.30 a.m. Buying and selling shall cease.

- (i) any transport stand;
- (ii) any part of the Market within a distance of 50 feet from any transport stand;
- (iii) any part of the Market within a distance of 16 feet from the exterior of—
 - (1) any external brick wall of the Market concourse; or
 - (2) any doorway or other opening in that wall; or

(iv) either of the parts of the Market concourse designated as "AREA A1" and "AREA A2" on the plan in the Fifth Schedule and known jointly and severally as the "Merchants and Agents Area", Area A1 being the whole of that part of the Market concourse north of the centre line of the east-west road separating stands numbered 1 to 80 inclusive from shops and shop spaces numbered 15 to 21 inclusive, stores (type B) numbered 161 to 200 inclusive, and shops and shop spaces numbered 34 to 39 inclusive, and Area A2 being the whole of that part of the Market concourse south of the centre line of the east-west road separating stands numbered 561 to 640 inclusive from shops and shop spaces numbered 40 to 46 inclusive, stores (type B) numbered 201 to 240 inclusive, and shops and shop spaces numbered 61 to 67 inclusive;

3. Nothing in clause 2 of this schedule shall operate to prevent a person of any class of persons specified in that clause from—

- (a) entering or remaining in any part of the Market concourse that is a bank, a cafe, or a shop or a store in or at either of which neither fruit nor vegetables are sold; or

(b) moving by the most direct route to or from that part of the Market concourse when proceeding from or returning to some other part of the Market concourse or some part of the Market outside the Market concourse.

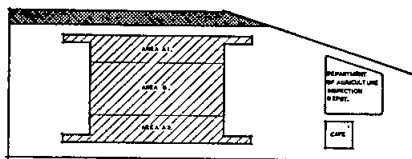
