AMENDMENT OF PROCLAMATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES OF LEATHER GOODS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SECTION 34 OF THE ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 34 of the *Consumer Protection Act 1972*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, specify articles of leather goods for the purposes of the said section and may from time to time amend any such Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamation on the 6th June 1974 certain articles of leather goods were specified for the purposes of the said Section:

Now, therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State; do by this my Proclamation amend my Proclamation dated the 6th June 1974 by specifying that the articles of leather goods specified in the said Proclamation for the purposes of the said Section shall not include—

- (a) articles of leather goods having a total outside area measurement of less than 155 square centimetres; or
- (b) straps.

in the *Government Gazette* declare that the municipal district of the municipality or any part thereof shall be a district to which the said section applies.

And whereas the Council of the Municipalities of the Shires of Donald and Bacchus Marsh and the City of Oakleigh has made application to have their municipal districts declared to be districts to which the said section 3b applies.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation declare that the municipal districts of the Shires of Donald and Bacchus Marsh and the City of Oakleigh shall be districts to which the provisions of section 3b of the *Litter Act 1964* shall apply.

POISONS ACT 1962 (No. 6889).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 4 of the *Poisons Act 1962* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedules or removing therefrom any item:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by virtue of the provisions of the said Section and all other enabling powers, do by this Proclamation—

1. Amend Schedule One to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:—

BROMINE as such.

OPIUM in preparations containing 0.2 per centum or less of morphine calculated as anhydrous morphine, except in preparations containing 0.01 per centum or less.

POTASSIUM CHLORATE as such.

and by adding thereto the following items:—

BROMINE (LIQUID) excluding its salts and derivatives.

POTASSIUM CHLORATE

2. Amend Schedule Two to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:—

CHLOROFORM and substances containing more than 20 per centum of Chloroform.

COCAINE—synthetic substitutes for—(having a solubility in water of more than 1 per centum) in ointments containing 0.5 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute.

ETHER and substances containing more than 10 per centum of Ether if not excepted under Schedule Five.

OPIUM in preparations containing 0.01 per centum or less of morphine calculated as anhydrous morphine.

and by adding thereto the following item:—

CHLOROFORM and substances containing more than 20 per centum of Chloroform, except when included in Schedule Four.

ETHER and substances containing more than 10 per centum of Ether if not excepted under Schedule Five, and if not included in Schedule Four.

3. Amend Schedule Three to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:—

PRESSOR substances including Adrenaline, Cyclophenamine, Isoprenaline, Methoxyamine, Methoxyphenamine, Naphazoline, Noradrenaline, Phenylpropanolamine, Pholedrine, Tuaminoheptane.

PROPYLHEXADRINE in approved appliances for inhalation in which the substance is suitably absorbed and protected by inert solid material. and by adding thereto the following items:—

DIMETHISOQUIN in preparations for topical use.

ISOPRENALINE—

(a) in nebulizer solutions containing one per centum or less of Isoprenaline except when in metered aerosols.

(b) in metered aerosols delivering 80 micrograms or less of Isoprenaline per metered dose.

PRESSOR substances including Adrenaline, Cyclopentamine, Methoxamine, Methoxyphenamine, Naphazoline, Noradrenaline, Phenylpropanolamine, Pholedrine, Tuaminoheptane.

PROPYLHEXEDRINE in approved appliances for inhalation in which the substance is suitably absorbed and protected by inert solid material.

VIPRYNIUM

4. Amend Schedule Four to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:—

SULPHANILAMIDE and SULPHONAMIDES except when included in Schedule Six.

"Commencing at the intersection of Punt Road and Wellington Street, in an easterly direction along the centreline of Wellington Street to the intersection of Crimea Street, in a southerly direction along the centreline of Crimea Street to the intersection of Alma Road, in an easterly direction along the centreline of Alma Road to the intersection of Chapel Street, in a southerly direction along the centreline of Chapel Street to the intersection of Carlisle Street, in a westerly direction along the centreline of Carlisle Street to the intersection of Barkly Street, and a northerly direction along the centreline of Barkly Street to the commencement at the junction of Punt Road and Wellington Street."

2. In this Order unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Building" means any structure whether temporary or permanent or any part thereof and includes outbuildings, but does not include works.

"Consent" means the consent of the Responsible Authority as evidenced by the grant of a permit in the prescribed form which may contain such conditions as the responsible authority may think proper.

"Development" in relation to land means the construction of any buildings or works on, over or under the land.

"Land" means land of any tenure and includes works, building and parts of buildings whether the buildings are divided horizontally or vertically or in any other way.

"Responsible Authority" as regards the enforcement and carrying out of this Order means the Council of the City of St. Kilda.

"Subdivision" means the division of a parcel of land into two or more allotments or parts for the purpose of enabling any of the allotments or parts to be disposed of separately in fee simple.

"Works" means any construction other than a building and includes:—

(a) fences, walls, dams, channels and paving not appurtenant to a building and lighting, heating, power, water supply, drainage and sewerage installation not so appurtenant, and

(b) any alteration of the natural condition or topography of land.

3. Within the area to which this Order applies no land shall be used, developed, or subdivided except with the consent of the Responsible Authority.

4. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall be construed as regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting:—

(1) The carrying out by public authorities or municipalities supplying water, sewerage, drainage, electricity or gas services of any of the following developments for the purpose of those services—

(a) development of any description at or below the surface of the ground;

(b) the installation of any plant or works inside a building;

(c) alterations to or extensions of buildings or works constructed before the coming into operation of this Order;

(d) the construction of transmission lines operating at a voltage of 66,000 volts or less;

(e) the construction of service reservoirs on land acquired or in process of being acquired for the purposes thereof before the coming into operation of this Order, where not less than two months notice of the proposed construction is given to the Responsible Authority.

(2) The carrying out by public authorities or municipalities of any of the following developments:—

(a) improvement of any road, including any minor widening, re-alignment or relocation of such road;

(b) construction of bridges, culverts and levees;

(c) installation of fire plugs and hydrants;

(d) development of gardens and plantations.

- (3) The exercise of any power conferred by Sections 510, 535, 539, 548, 554, 554A, 555 (1), 556, 557, 576, 593, 601, 602, 603, 605, 660 and 695 of the Local Government Act.
- (4) The construction or display of advisory or advertising signs or notices by public authorities or municipalities being traffic control items, warning devices, direction signs or identification signs.
- (5) The construction or display of advertising signs or notices required by law.

5. Every application for consent under the provisions of this Order shall be made in the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority at the Town Hall, St. Kilda, Vic. 3182.

BY-LAW No. 95.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under Section 197 (1) (xi) of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and any and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 95, for controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended, and any and every other power thereunto it enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:

1. By-law No. 50 of the City of Nunawading printed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* No. 50, dated 21st June 1961, is hereby repealed.
2. This By-law operates:
  - (a) from the day after:
    - (i) this By-law; or
    - (ii) notice of its making is published in the *Government Gazette* of the State of Victoria;
  - (b) throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.
3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter
  - (a) words of singular number include the plural number and vice-versa;
  - (b) words of one gender include the other two genders;
  - (c) the word "Council" means the Council of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.
4. Where any premises have been used in such a way as to make an objectionable noise at an unreasonable time, an officer of the Council may
  - (a) make enquiries of the occupier or person apparently in charge of the premises for the purpose of ascertaining the use of the premises and the source of the said objectionable noise;
  - (b) serve a notice in writing upon the occupier or any person who has caused or permitted or suffered the said premises to be used as to make the said objectionable noise; specifying—
    - (i) the address and general use of the said premises;
    - (ii) the apparent source of the said objectionable noise;
    - (iii) that the person to whom the said notice is addressed is required not to cause or permit or suffer the said premises to be used as to make the said objectionable noise at the times stated in the said notice (such times being unreasonable times having regard to the nature and volume of the noise and the nature of the locality in which the said premises are situate) after the expiration of seven (7) days from the date on which the said notice is served.

5. Any person who—  
(a) fails to or refuses to answer any such enquiry or makes any false answer to any such enquiry,  
(b) fails to comply with the provisions of any such notice—  
shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) or more than one hundred dollars (\$100) and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10) for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

7. In addition to any penalties any expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law shall be paid by the person committing such breach.

## BY-LAW No. 119.

## Nuisances By-law.

A Bylaw of the City of Sunshine made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act, 1958* and Numbered 119 for:

- (a) Controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times.
- (b) Suppressing nuisances.
- (c) Prohibiting or minimising noises in public highways.
- (d) Prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths.
- (e) Prohibiting or regulating the soliciting or collection in any road or street or from house to house adjacent thereto waste materials or gifts of money or of subscriptions for any purpose.
- (f) Controlling the use of footways or roadways by children using skates trucks scooters or other like toy vehicles.
- (g) Prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.
- (h) Regulating the driving of cattle in or along any street and prohibiting the driving of cattle in or along any specified street in the municipal district.
- (i) Regulating or prohibiting the writing painting printing stencilling placing or affixing of any letter figure device poster sign or advertisement upon any footpath street or road or upon any building fence or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council thereof.

(j) Prescribing the distance from any adjoining land or from any street or public place or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to deposit such combustible materials as are specified herein.

(k) Generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Sunshine orders as follows:—

1. This Bylaw shall be known as the Nuisances Bylaw.

2. In this Bylaw unless the context otherwise requires "Instrument" means any instrument device or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loud-speaker amplifier broadcasting set wireless receiving set television set gramophone piano player piano or other instrument or device.

3. No person shall in any public highway cause or permit or suffer to be caused any noise:—

(a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing; or

(b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument so as to be an annoyance or nuisance.

4. No person shall in or upon any land house building or place make or cause or permit or suffer to be made or caused such a volume of amount of sound or noise to any other person being in or upon any other land house building or place or in or upon any public highway:—

(a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing; or

(b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument.

5. No person shall in or upon any premises use or operate any instrument or any machinery or plant in such manner as to cause any objectionable noise at any unreasonable time.

6. No person shall on any street or road use on any vehicle any brake which is calculated to cause noises.

7. No person shall drive upon any street any vehicle which is loaded or partly loaded with steel or iron or other material of any sort or description which is likely to cause noise unless such steel or iron or other material is so packed or stowed by being separated by sacks or bags or some other appropriate means so as to prevent such steel iron or other material from producing noise in such street.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath.

9. No person shall use any street or road for the purpose of washing painting or (save in case of emergency) repairing dismantling or assembling any vehicle.

10. No person shall at any time obstruct or annoy passers by along any street or road by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or road.

11. No person shall on any premises owned or occupied by him burn or cause or permit to be burned any substance in such manner or to such an extent as shall cause smoke to be emitted from the said premises as will cause a nuisance to any other person upon any other land or upon any public highway.

12. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

13. No person shall without the prior consent in writing of the Council write paint print stencil place or affix any letter figure device poster sign or advertisement upon any footpath street or road or upon any building fence or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council.

14. No child shall on any footway use any skates truck scooter or other like toy vehicle in such manner as to interfere with the passage of or cause annoyance to persons being lawfully upon such footway.

15. No person shall store or deposit any timber or any wooden or cardboard boxes or cases or any paper hay or straw within 6 feet (1.828 metres) or a distance equivalent to the height of such timber or any wooden or cardboard boxes or cases or any paper hay or straw whichever shall be the greater of any adjoining land or from any building.

16. This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

17. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$40.00 or more than \$100.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

Resolution for passing this Bylaw agreed to by the Council of the City of Sunshine on the 10th day of September, 1973, and confirmed on the 9th day of October, 1973.
