PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 34 of the *Consumer Protection Act 1972*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, specify articles of wearing apparel (including boots and shoes) for the purposes of the said section:

Now, therefore, I, Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the following articles of wearing apparel for the purposes of the said section:—

any garment which is—

- (a) an article of nightwear, including pyjamas, overgarments of pyjama style, nightdresses and dressing-gowns, but not including any article of headwear, footwear or handwear; and
- (b) of any of the sizes 0 to 14 inclusive as defined by A.S.1182-1972 being the Australian Standard Size Coding Scheme for Infant's and Children's Clothing approved for publication on behalf of the Council of the Standards Association of Australia on 14th July 1972.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituled the *Evidence Act 1972, No. 8327*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Friday the 1st day of March One thousand nine hundred and seventy-four as the day upon which the *Evidence Act 1972 No. 8327* shall come into operation:

CONSTITUTION OF MEAT AREAS.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

By virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 (No. 6270), I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the constitution of all meat areas in Victoria; and
2. Constitute as meat areas the areas described as follows:—

MENTAL HEALTH ACT 1959, No. 6605.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section twenty-four of the *Mental Health Act 1959*, it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim one or more buildings or places provided by the State for the treatment of the mentally ill or the intellectually defective or any part of such building or place to be:—

- a psychiatric hospital;
- a mental hospital;
- a training centre; or
- a repatriation mental hospital:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section twenty-four it is provided that any Proclamation made under Section twenty-four may at any time be varied or revoked by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council:

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made, pursuant to Section thirty-four of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1928* (No. 3721) and dated the ninth day of June, 1953, all buildings on certain land in the Parish of Keelbundora, County of Bourke, shown on a plan annexed to such Proclamation were proclaimed as a mental hospital, to be known as the Mental Hospital, Larundel:

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made, pursuant to sub-section (3) of Section thirty-eight of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1958* (No. 6314) and dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, the Proclamation dated the ninth day of June, 1953, was revoked in so far as it applied to certain buildings then known as Wards F1, F2, F3, M1, M2, M3, and the Male and Female Hospital Block:

And whereas by the same Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, and pursuant to Section forty-four of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1958* (No. 6314) the buildings then known as Wards F1, F2, F3, M1, M2, M3 and the Male and Female Hospital Block was proclaimed and constituted as from the first day of July, 1959, as a receiving house, to be known as the Receiving House, Larundel:

And whereas by the *Mental Health Act 1959* (No. 6605) it is provided that unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter any reference in any other Proclamation to a receiving house shall be taken to refer to a psychiatric hospital:

And whereas the buildings referred to in the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of May, 1959, as the Male and Female Hospital Block are now known as Wards A, B and C:

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor in Council made pursuant to sub-section (2) of Section twenty-four of the *Mental Health Act 1959* (No. 6605) and dated the twenty-second day of April, 1964, the buildings then known as Wards A, B, C, F1, F2, F3, F4, M1, M2, M3, and were proclaimed and constituted as from the first day of May, 1964, as a Psychiatric Hospital to be known as the Psychiatric Hospital, Larundel:

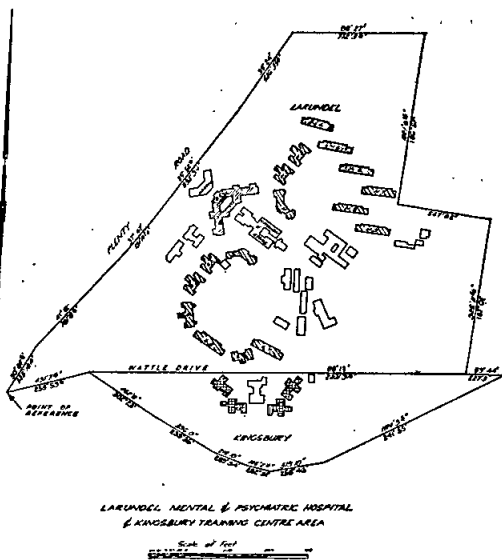
And whereas the buildings referred to in the Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of April, 1964, as Wards F1, F2, F3, F4, M1, M2, M3 and M4, are now known as Wards N1, N2, N3, N4, S1, S2, S3 and S4 respectively:

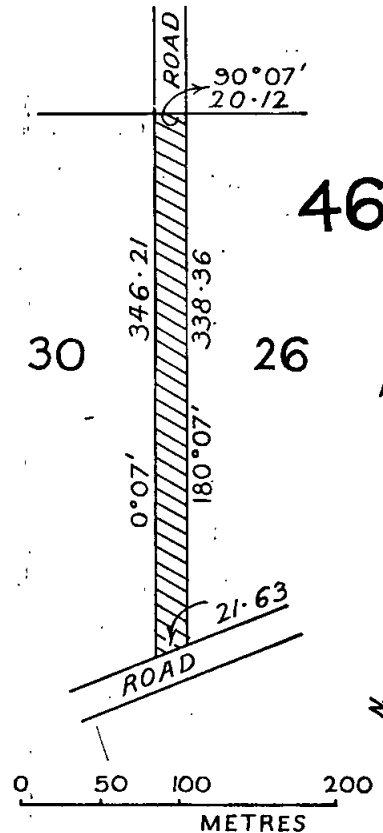

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOUNT DOOBOOBETIC RESERVE".

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 218 of the Land Act 1958 do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Charlton West temporarily reserved pursuant to Order in Council dated the 3rd April, 1973 as a site for Public Purposes (Public Park, Public Recreation and Trigonometrical Survey Station) and hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve".

The Reserve has, pursuant to the provisions of Section 221 of the Land Act 1958, been placed under the Control of the Corporation of the Shire of Charlton as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days as the Reserve or portions thereof may be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, fêtes, sports or holiday or other amusements on any of which occasions a charge, deemed to be reasonable by the Committee, may be made and taken for admission thereto.

2. Any person, club or association desiring to use the Reserve or portion thereof for any organized games, sports or entertainments may do so subject to the observance of such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time.

3. No person shall:—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, behave in a disorderly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs;
- (c) enter, cross, be on or trespass on any playing ground area, enclosure, course, building, room or other structure whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, amusement or practice thereat is being played, conducted or carried on or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (d) climb, jump or get upon, on or over or under any fences or gates of the Reserve or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the buildings, seats, equipment, trees or shrubs, provided that authorized survey parties may clear away the natural timber for survey lines;
- (e) erect any structure on any part of the Reserve before reference is made to the Department of Crown Lands and Survey and particularly to the Geodetic Division;
- (f) plant any ornamental trees other than low shrubs;
- (g) make any excavation without the permission of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey;
- (h) mark, write on, deface, damage or interfere with any survey beacon or ground marks;
- (i) stick bills or advertisements or writings on any fences, gates, buildings, seats, equipment or trees in the Reserve;
- (j) dig up or remove any sand, soil, turf or loam in or from the Reserve.
- (k) light a fire in the Reserve;
- (l) enter or remain in any plots which may be set aside for the plantation of young trees, shrubs or plants in the Reserve;
- (m) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind in the Reserve;
- (n) carry or discharge any firearms, air gun or other lethal weapon in the Reserve or snare, trap, catch or destroy or interfere in any way with any bird, fish or game in the Reserve;
- (o) bring into the Reserve a dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash;
- (p) give out, distribute or throw down any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers;
- (q) ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to the circumstances of the case, or on any area other than that set aside by the Committee for the particular purpose, and no horse, bicycle, motor cycle, motor vehicle or any other vehicle shall be left or parked in the Reserve for a period longer than twenty four hours;
- (r) remove, displace or disfigure any board, plate or tablet or any support, fastening or fitting used or constructed for the exhibition of any regulation or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve;
- (s) wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work;

- (t) remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member of the Police Force, Bailiff of Crown Lands or any officer or servant of the Committee to leave the same;
- (u) make a wager for money or play any unlawful game in the Reserve.
- (v) bring into the Reserve any cattle, sheep or other animal except as provided in clause (q) above;
- (w) throw or discharge any missile in the Reserve to the damage, danger or annoyance of any person in the Reserve.

4. No person shall without the consent in writing of the Committee:—

- (a) camp in the Reserve;
- (b) sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement or erect any tent, booth, building or other structure;
- (c) assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind or for meetings of a like character;
- (d) make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance or sound or play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Reserve;
- (e) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the Reserve;
- (f) drive, ride, lead or cause to be ridden, driven or led any horse or other animal, on, over or through the Reserve;
- (g) enter or use any building, dressing pavilion or other like building in the Reserve, except those parts of such building or pavilion as are set aside for public use;
- (h) consume in or bring or cause to be brought into the Reserve any intoxicating liquor;
- (i) bring a caravan into the Reserve;
- (j) play, practise or engage in any organized game, sports, or entertainments in the Reserve.

5. No person over the age of fourteen years shall use any of the equipment set up by the Committee in any children's playing area in the Reserve.—(Rs.9731.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BERWICK SPORTS GROUND".

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Berwick temporarily reserved pursuant to Order in Council dated the 30th June, 1959, as a site for Public Recreation and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") appointed pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the *Land Act 1958* with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set

apart for cricket, football, outdoor and holiday amusements on any of which occasions a charge may be made and taken for admission of each person to the Reserve.

2. The Committee may allow any club, association or person to use the Reserve or portion thereof for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports, athletic training, or other physical recreation provided that the Committee shall determine the conditions and the fees payable for such use.

The Committee may authorise any club, association or person to make a charge for admission to the Reserve or (as the case may be) the portion thereof which such club, association or person has been authorised to use.

3. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or creates or takes part in any disturbance.
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- (c) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.
- (d) climb, jump on or climb over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.
- (e) interfere with or break or damage or cut any of the trees, shrubs, plants, flowers or grasses in the Reserve.
- (f) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass or any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind in the Reserve nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein or leave anything that might injure a person.
- (g) light fires in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (h) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds thereon;
- (i) spit or expectorate on the paths or on or in any structure in the Reserve;
- (j) remove any sand, soil, rock or other materials from the Reserve;
- (k) bring into the Reserve a dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash;
- (l) enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without first paying the fees chargeable for admission;

4. No person shall without the written consent of the Committee—

- (a) offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity for sale;
- (b) bet publicly in the Reserve, (subject to any statutory requirements);
- (c) erect any building, tent or other structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve, and then only subject to the observance of such conditions and the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time;
- (d) park any motor vehicle, caravan, trailer or other vehicle in the Reserve, and then only subject to the observance of such conditions and the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time;
- (e) take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals and the owners of any animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations;
- (f) play, practise or train or engage in any organised game or sport on the Reserve;
- (g) enter or remain in any building or trespass upon any arena whilst any organised game or sport is being conducted in such building or arena.

5. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding 5 miles per hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control vehicular traffic in the Reserve.

6. Persons renting or hiring any of the facilities in the Reserve may be required by the Committee to deposit a sum not exceeding Two hundred dollars (\$200) with the Committee by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such facilities and the Committee may in its absolute discretion retain all or part of the said sum to compensate it for any damage caused to any of the facilities by the hirer and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

7. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force or by a Bailiff of Crown lands to leave the Reserve.—(Rs.1372.)

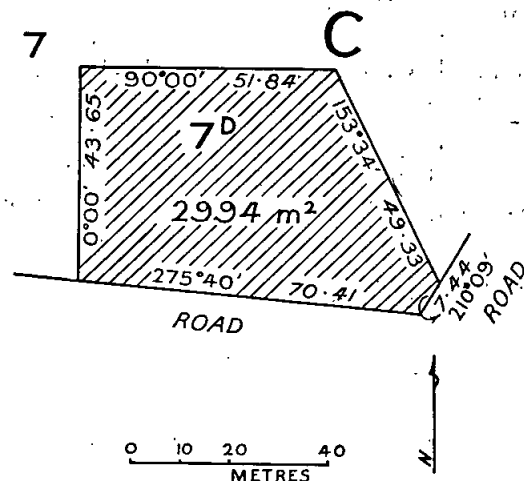

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the purchased land in the Parish of Fingal, being Lots 1 and 2 on Plan of Subdivision Number 71626 and Lot 2 on Plan of Subdivision Number 71624 and Lot 82 on Plan of Subdivision Number 53153, deemed to be temporarily reserved pursuant to Section 5 (5) of the *National Parks Act 1970*, (Lands Department reference number Rs.9854), and hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

- (e) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird or other wildlife in the Reserve.

- (f) Carry any poison, traps or snares in the Reserve.
- (g) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or have in his or her possession any skin, egg, feathers, or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (i) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees, or plants of any kind.
- (j) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (k) Drive any vehicle on the Reserve other than on a road or roads provided for the purpose.—
(Rs.9854.)

(1) An officer shall, in respect of recreation leave taken after 31st December, 1973 be entitled to be paid, in addition to amounts payable by way of salary as prescribed by these Regulations and other approved emoluments, the greater of the two amounts calculated in accordance with the following (a) or (b)—

(a) an allowance at the rate of 17½ per cent. of the salary of the officer for the period of recreation leave taken, subject to salary for the purposes of calculating this allowance being deemed to

be the salary of the officer as at the 1st January of the year in which recreation leave is taken;

(b) an allowance equal to any additional payments to which an officer would be entitled for shift, Saturday or Sunday duty not in excess of prescribed weekly hours which he would be required to perform if he was not proceeding on approved recreation leave;

Provided that—

(i) the maximum amount of allowance payable under paragraph (a) of this sub-regulation shall not exceed an amount calculated in accordance with paragraph (a) in respect of the salary rate prescribed in these Regulations for Grade 309, Technical and General Division, at the 1st January of the year in which recreation leave is taken;

(ii) where an officer commences employment after 1st January of any year his salary for the purposes of this Regulation shall be the 1st January equivalent of the salary payable to him at the date of the commencement of his employment, or such other salary rate as the Board may determine;

(iii) where an officer is entitled to payments pursuant to paragraph (a) of this sub-regulation while on recreation leave he shall not receive additional payments by way of allowance for shift duty, or rostered time of ordinary duty for work performed during weekends or on public holidays or additional payments of a like nature.

(2) Salary for the purposes of calculating the payment to an officer under paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation shall include the salary payable to the officer as prescribed by these Regulations and other additional payments approved by the Board from time to time.

(3) Where it is necessary to calculate a daily rate of allowance for purposes of determining the amount of allowance payable to an officer under paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation, such daily rate shall be one-twentieth of the recreation leave allowance payable to an officer for four weeks leave of absence.

(4) The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to an officer in the Technical and General Division in the Mental Hygiene Branch of the Department of Health who is in receipt of an allowance in accordance with Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulation 157.”
