Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407). DECLARING PROCLAIMED AREAS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407), it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any tree, plant or vegetable specified and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit flies or any package which has or is reasonably suspected of having contained such fruit or vegetables and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation thereby—

- 1. Declare those portions of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be proclaimed
- 2. Prohibit the removal from any place within a proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation or any package which has contained or is reasonably suspected of having contained such fruit or vegetables unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit or vegetables passing through a proclaimed area may leave that proclaimed area without such instruction if such fruit or vegetables are completely enclosed within a fly-proof cover and the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within that proclaimed area except as required by traffic regulations.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land, not being a commercial orchard, in a proclaimed area to— $\,$
 - (a) Thoroughly spray all trees and plants of the kinds and species named in the Second Schedule of this Proclamation at intervals of not more than fourteen days commencing at the time fruit has set and continuing until the fruit is harvested with a solution containing either:—
 - (i) Six hundred (600) parts of fenthion to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.06 per cent),

- (ii) Six hundred (600) parts of dimethoate to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.06 per cent).
- (b) Pick up from the said land before noon each day all fallen fruits of the kinds and species specified in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation, and dispose of all such fruits as prescribed in paragraph 4 (c) below.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in a proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an Inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
 - (a) To remove and destroy all plants of:remove and destroy all plants of:—
 Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
 Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
 Egg Plant (Solanum melongena),
 Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
 Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
 Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
 Brambles (Except cultivated varieties),
 Box thorn (Lycium sp.), provided that where
 box thorn is grown as a hedge along a

boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

- (i) that the hedge is cut back forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet, and
- exceeding two (2) feet, and

 (ii) that when such a hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0·2 per cent) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit, refrain from planting such plants while

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

- (b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all fruits and vegetables of the kinds and species named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force in force.
- (c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables a dust containing 1 per cent, of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies.

 (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the
- (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land not being a commercial orchard as provided under Section 3 (a) of this Proclamation, or in the case of a commercial orchard with a power spraying plant approved by an Inspector, with a solution containing six hundred (600) parts of fenthion or dimethoate to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0 06 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding fourteen days during the time specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the same notice and at times specified therein.
- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees and plants known or suspected by an Inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an Inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.
- (f) To reduce the size and height of trees and plants (except for fruit trees growing in a commercial orchard) to a size and height which will in the opinion of an Inspector enable effective spraying, stripping and other treatment of such trees and plants to be carried out.
- (g) To apply to an Inspector for a permit to remove from any place within a proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area any plant or soil and to refrain from such removal until a permit is granted.
- 5. Require occupiers and owners of land in a proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an Inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an Inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.












(e) The area situated in Scott Street as shown by hachure on Plan M/73/634 hereunder.



- 4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be. Not more than one body shall be retained on the premises of the contractor. - 3. Any person appointed by the Teachers Tribunal to the classified roll of State School Teachers in the Division in the period from 1st July 1972 to 30th June 1973, both dates inclusive, shall be registered as a teacher in the Division and his name shall be entered in the Register accordingly.
- 4. Any person appointed by the Teachers Tribunal as a temporary teacher in the Division in the period from 1st July 1972 to 30th June 1973, both dates inclusive who—
- (a) is qualified under the Regulations made by the Teachers Tribunal under the Teaching Service Act 1958 for the time being in force for permanent appointment to the Division

- (b) has successfully completed an approved course of teacher training and successfully completed the first year of an approved course of tertiary study—
- shall be registered as a teacher in the Division and his name shall be entered in the Register accordingly.
- 5. Any person desiring to become a registered teacher or a provisionally registered teacher in the Division and who is not otherwise registered pursuant to the Act or the Regulations shall make application to the Board on the form prescribed by
- 6. The Board shall grant registration to an applicant who-(1) has successfully completed
 - course of teacher training; (a) an approved degree together with an approved

(b) the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate awarded under Regulation XXXIII (O) of the Education Department Regulations 1962;

(c) prior to 1st January 1976 the Trained Trade
Instructor's Certificate awarded under
Regulation XXXIII (P) of the Victorian Education Department Regulations 1962;

or

- (d) the Trained Trade Instructor's Certificate awarded under Regulation XXXIII (P) of the Education Department Regulations 1962 and—
 - (i) an approved Trade Technician Course;

or

(ii) approved studies at or above Form V Secondary Level;

or

(iii) approved equivalent studies;

or

 (e) the Trained Technician Instructor's Certificate awarded under Regulation XXXIII (Q) of the Education Department Regulations 1962;

or

- (f) an approved course of teacher training and at least one of the following:—
 - (i) three years of approved tertiary studies;
 - (ii) an approved Diploma of Music;
 - (iii) an approved Diploma of Physical Education;
 - (iv) the requirements for the Registration Certificate of the Library Association of Australia.
- (2) has successfully completed at a Victorian educational institution or institutions an approved course of teacher training and an approved diploma awarded by a college of advanced education or other approved institution and has approved industrial experience.
- (3) has successfully completed a Technical Studentship or Student Instructorship and whose name is included in a list of names provided for this purpose by the Principal of the State College of Victoria at Hawthorn at the request of the Board.
- (4) has obtained any qualification or qualifications approved as equivalent to the requirements of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) of sub-regulation (1) or subregulation (2) or the Technical Studentship or Student Instructorship referred to in sub-regulation (3).
- 7. The Board shall grant provisional registration-
- (1) (a) operative for the period up to and inclusive of 30/6/74 to all those who have been employed continuously as teachers in the Division since prior to 1/1/70 and who are not otherwise granted any registration pursuant to these regulations;
 - (b) operative for the period up to and inclusive of 2/2/74 (unless sooner extended by the Board) to temporary teachers employed in the Division on 30/6/73 who are not otherwise registered pursuant to these regulations:

Provided however that any person employed in a technical school to undertake non-teaching duties shall not be continued in provisional registration after the expiration of any initial period of provisional registration granted pursuant to this sub-regulation.

- (2) to any applicant who-
 - (a) has successfully completed an approved course of teacher training and requires no more than one year's full time study to qualify for registration;
 - (b) is undertaking an approved course of teacher training the successful completion of which will entitle him to registration;

or

- (c) has successfully completed an approved course of primary teacher training and such other requirements as the Board may determine from time to time;
- (d) is the holder of a Technical Studentship or Student Instructorship and whose name is included in a list of names provided for this purpose by the Principal of the State College of Victoria at Hawthorn at the request of the Board.
- (3) in special circumstances to an applicant whom the Board is satisfied possesses competence in a particular field gained through long professional or industrial experience. Provided however that any registration granted pursuant to this provision shall be limited to the particular field of experience.
- 8. Notwithstanding anything in the Regulations (other than the provision in sub-regulation (1) of regulation 7) the Board may extend the provisional registration of any teacher provisionally registered prior to June 1973 subject to any conditions the Board thinks fit.

The foregoing Regulations were approved by the Board on the Seventeenth day of October 1973 as witnessed by the signatures of the members of the Board present.

Teaching Service Act 1958. TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 285 (T.T.70).

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act* 1958, hereby amends Preliminary and Regulations 1, 3, 4, 7, 10, 11, and 13 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations as follows:—

In clause 2 delete the words "Standard salary" means salary as prescribed in Parts I., II., III., V., VII., VIII., IX., X., and XI., of the Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulations and does not include any allowances."

Education Act 1958.

SECONDARY TEACHERS REGISTRATION BOARD REGULATIONS 1973.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act* 1958 and all other powers it thereunto enabling the Secondary Teachers Registration Board doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Secondary Teachers Registration Board Regulations 1973.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Act" means the Education Act 1958.
 - "Board" means the Secondary Teachers Registration Board.
 - "Chairman" means Chairman of the Board.
- 3. (1) The Board shall grant registration to any person who has obtained the Higher Diploma of Teaching (Secondary) as defined in Regulation XXXIII (R) of the Education Department Regulations 1962 or an approved equivalent qualification or qualifications (as the case requires).
- (2) The Board may grant registration for the period ending 30th June, 1975, to any person who has obtained the Diploma of Teaching (Secondary) as defined in Regulation XXXIII (S) of the Education Department Regulations 1962 or an approved equivalent qualification or qualifications (as the case requires).
- (3) For the purposes of parts (1) and (2) of this Regulation "approved equivalent qualification" or "approved equivalent qualifications" (as the case requires) means—
 - (a) where the qualification or qualifications has/have been obtained wholly in the State of Victoria—any qualification deemed equivalent by the Secondary Teachers Registration Board;
 - (b) where the qualification or qualifications was/were obtained interstate or overseas any qualification deemed equivalent by the Teacher Registration Council.
- 4. The provisions of Regulation 3 shall in no way derogate from the powers of the Board to grant provisional registration pursuant to the Act.
 - 5. No person who after the 1st day of July 1973 has been granted permission to teach by the Chairman of the Board pursuant to Section 52L of the Act, shall continue to teach after the next meeting of the Board unless the Board has approved his registration or provisional registration at that meeting.
 - 6. On the recommendation of a constituent college of the State College of Victoria the Secondary Teachers Registration Board shall register graduates of that College who have held Education Department studentships and who have completed the qualification prescribed in Regulation 3 above.
 - 7. That any person desiring to be registered or provisionally registered by the Secondary Teachers Registration Board who is not registered either under the provisions of Section 52N of the Education (Teacher Registration) Act 1971 or Regulation 6 above, shall make application to the Board on the form prescribed by the Board.
 - 8. That this Board shall register teachers made permanent within the Secondary Schools Division from the 1st July 1972 to the 30th June 1973, both dates inclusive.
