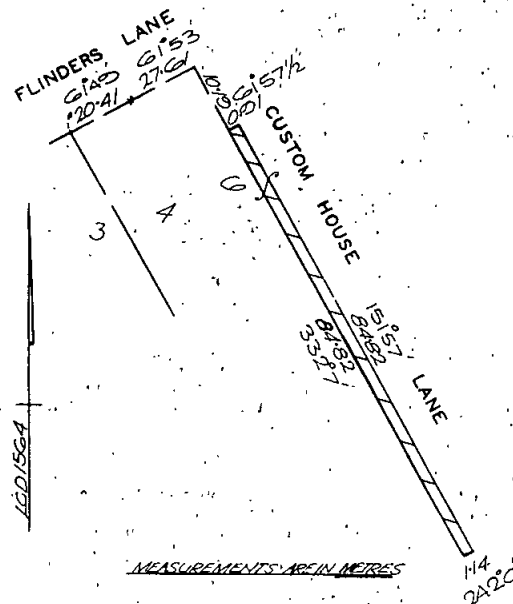

SHIRE OF DAYLESFORD AND GLENLYON.

BY-LAW No. 1.

A By-Law of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon, made under Section 800 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 1, for imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering upon the recreation reserves, playing areas or halls owned or controlled by the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon and also for regulating the conduct of persons using, or being upon, or in the said grounds.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon, order as follows:—

1. This by-law be known as the Council Reserves By-Law.

2. In this by-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Reserve” means and includes all land owned, occupied or leased by the Council and lands over which the Council is the Committee of Management. It also includes all buildings erected upon such lands.

3. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

4. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.

(d) Offer any article of food or drink, or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without the consent of the Council first being obtained.

(e) Obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.

(f) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.

(g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way, any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.

- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatsoever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person.
- (i) Light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Council.
- (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air-guns in the Reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Council.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the Consent of the Council.
- (l) Spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- (m) Erect any buildings, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of Council first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Council.
- (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog without the permission of the Council.
- (o) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained.

5. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Council, may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

6. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

7. The Council may let any portion of the Reserve to any Club, Association or person for the purpose of holding football, cricket, or other matches, fetes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for playing football, cricket, lacrosse, hockey or other athletic games, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with this by-law and may authorize any Club, Association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

8. No person shall practice, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve on Sundays, Anzac Day or Good Friday without obtaining consent of Council.

9. No Club, Association or person shall hold or take part in any organized sport, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve, without the written authority of the Council first obtained.

10. No Club or Association of any kind having for its objects physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practice or train or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained, unless any person is, at the time of playing, a member of any Club which is duly authorized by the said Council to play in the said Reserve at such time.

11. No person except the Council or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.

12. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Council, pay such a fee as is from time to time determined by such Council, not exceeding an amount deemed reasonable by the Council in respect of any such car or cycle for the use of parking areas on such days only as a charge for admission is being made, as hereinafter provided for.

13. No person shall take or put, or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve, any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or, being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

14. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

15. All animals and all poultry entering the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal or poultry that causes damage within the Reserve shall be responsible therefore.

16. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal, into the Reserve without the permission of the Council, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a person in charge.

17. No person shall drive, push, pull or place on the Reserve any motor car or motor cycle, trailer or other vehicle except in such places as are set aside for such purposes by the Council unless such person obtains the permission in writing of the Council.

18. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Council, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member or employee of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.

19. No person except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or flowers.

20. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce and, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

21. No club, association, or person renting or hiring the said Reserve or any part thereof on the occasion of any shows, cricket, or football matches, fetes, sports carnivals, or holiday amusements, shall have the right to use or occupy any of the stands, buildings, erections, or other enclosures on the Reserve (expecting sanitary conveniences) without the consent in writing of the Council, and in the case of renting or hiring, including any such buildings or erections, the hirer may be required to deposit with the said Council any sum not exceeding Forty Dollars (\$40) which the said Council may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the said Council in its absolute discretion may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring; and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by this By-Law, and by any order given by the Council or its officers.

22. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or by any Club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being to keep order, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such persons may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to prosecution for an offence against this By-Law.

23. No person shall camp in the Reserve other than at the specified camping area and after having duly paid the fees as may be determined by the Council from time to time.

24. Every person infringing this By-Law in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

25. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon.

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SHIRE OF DAYLESFORD AND GLENLYON.

By-Law No. 3.

A By-Law of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 3 for prohibiting the use of motorised vehicles for recreation purposes on certain land.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon orders as follows:—

1. In this By-Law "motorised vehicles for recreational purposes" means and includes all mini-bikes, trail bikes, motor bikes, motor cars, motor scooters, go-carts and any other vehicle which may be propelled by a motor or a recreation vehicle within the meaning of the *Recreation Vehicles Act 1973* and, which is normally used for recreational purposes.

2. No person shall use any motorised vehicle for recreation purposes on any land including any public place within the meaning of the *Recreation Vehicles Act 1973* within the municipality of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon not being a highway or private street or road or public land within the meaning of the *Land Conservation Act 1970* without the written consent of the Council first obtained.

3. Any person applying for such written consent from the Council under Clause 2 hereof shall—

- (a) make application in writing to the Council.
- (b) state the place of which such vehicle or vehicles is or are to be used.
- (c) the times during which such vehicle or vehicles will be used.
- (d) the names, addresses and age or ages of any person or persons who will be using such vehicle or vehicles at such time.
- (e) describe such vehicle or vehicles stating its make, engine size and whether or not it is registered.
- (f) whether or not the consent of the owner of the land has been obtained.
- (g) supply such other information that the Council may require.

4. The Council in giving its consent under Clause 2 hereof can impose any condition which it considers appropriate to the use of such vehicles.

5. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

6. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$100.00 and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

SHIRE OF DAYLESFORD AND GLENLYON.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-Law of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon made under Section 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 4 for regulating the management and use of the Municipal Swimming Pool within the said Shire and for fixing the amount to be charged for admission to and for the use of same or any part thereof.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Daylesford and Glenlyon order as follows:—

1. That this By-Law will be known as the Council Swimming Pool By-Law.

2. No person shall enter upon any part of the Pool without having paid the fees chargeable or being otherwise authorized by the Council.

3. No person shall use soap in any portion of the Pool other than in the cleansing shower baths provided for that purpose.

4. No person shall at any time while being in the Swimming Pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such Swimming Pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers.

5. No person shall use the Swimming Pool whilst in an uncleanly condition, nor any portion of the Pool while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease.

6. No person shall wilfully interfere with the use and enjoyment by any person of the Pool, and any person so doing or otherwise behaving in an unseemly, offensive, insulting, or improper manner shall immediately leave the Pool upon being requested to do so by the officer in charge of the Pool, or any officer of the Council, and such officer may refuse to sell a ticket of admission to any person whom he may consider undesirable.

7. All persons (other than children, whom the officer in charge may exempt) using the Swimming Pool must wear proper bathing trunks or drawers, or bathing gowns.

8. Betting or playing cards or any other game of chance for money is strictly prohibited in any portion of the Pool.

9. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the Pool whilst in a state of intoxication, and no person shall at any time introduce into the Pool or consume or cause to be consumed any spirituous or intoxicating liquor in any portion of the Pool.

10. No person shall wilfully and improperly foul, pollute, or defile the water in the Swimming Pool, or wilfully and improperly soil, or defile or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing gown.

11. Every person supplied with any towel, bathing trunk or drawers, or bathing gown shall, before leaving the Pool, return them to the Attendant.

12. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipework, engine or machinery in connection with the Pool, or carelessly or negligently defile, injure, or destroy any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any dressing room, closet, box or compartment, and shall not by cutting or writing thereon deface any wall fittings or any portion of the Pool.

13. No person shall at any time while being upon any portion of the Pool, use any indecent, insulting, or offensive language, or behave in any indecent, insulting, offensive or riotous manner.

14. No person shall spit in the Swimming Pool or on the floors or walls of any portion of the Pool.

15. No person shall dispose of any cigar, cigarette, pipe ash, or match within the Pool except in the receptacles provided for same.

16. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in any portion of the Pool.

17. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any portion of the Pool shall at once deliver the same to the officer in charge who shall thereupon register a description of same in a book kept for that purpose, and any person claiming such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership receive such article from the officer in charge upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred.

18. No person shall bring into the Pool any radio or television set, without the consent first being obtained from the officer in charge.
