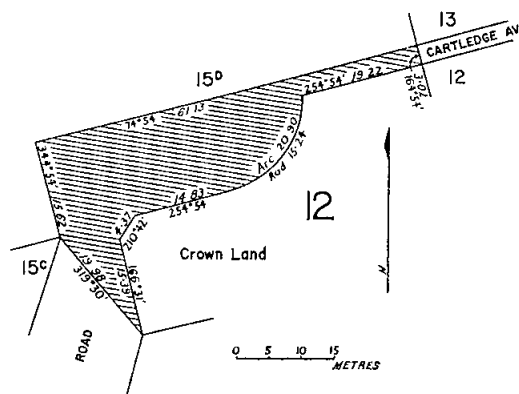

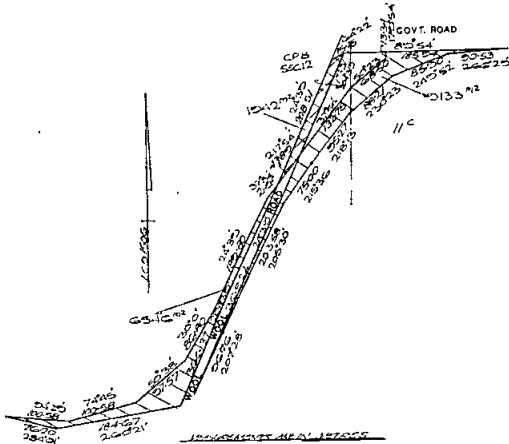

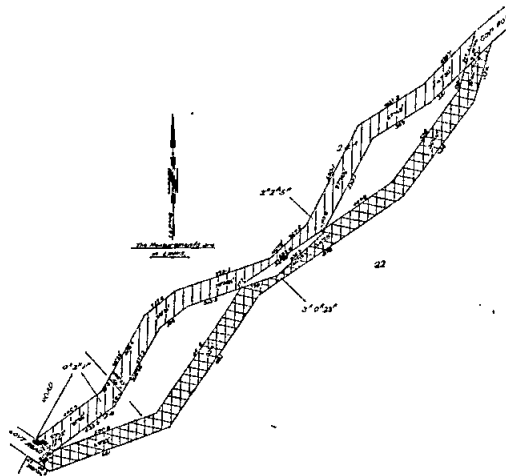

By-Law No. 12.

THE PORTLAND WATERWORKS TRUST in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-Law as follows:—

1. By-Law No. 11 of the Portland Waterworks Trust is hereby revoked.

2. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge under this By-Law is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at the rate per thousand gallons for any meter year shown in clause 4 of this By-Law would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed in accordance with the appropriate rate shown in clause 4 of this By-Law.

4. The basis of charging for the supply of water in any meter year to any lands or tenements shall be as follows:—

(a) Shipping supplied by the Portland Harbor Trust—
50 cents per 1,000 gallons.

(b) Property outside of Trust District—
45 cents per 1,000 gallons.

(c) Bowling Clubs, Tennis Clubs, Golf Clubs—
First 80,000 gallons—40 cents per 1,000 gallons
80,001 gallons and over—15 cents per 1,000 gallons.

(d) Portland and District Hospital—
15 cents per 1,000 gallons.

(e) All other consumers—
First 80,000 gallons—40 cents per 1,000 gallons.
80,001-2,000,000 gallons—35 cents per 1,000 gallons.
2,000,001-5,000,000 gallons—20 cents per 1,000 gallons.
5,000,001 gallons and over—15 cents per 1,000 gallons.

5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Eighteen Dollars (\$18) with consumption calculated in accordance with the appropriate rates set out in clause 4 of this By-Law.

6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

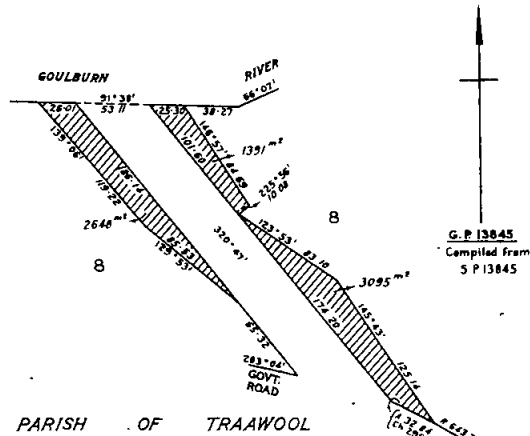

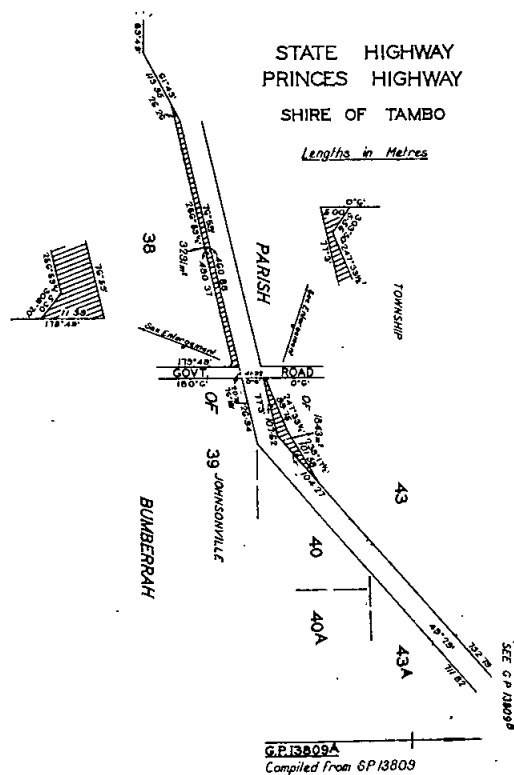

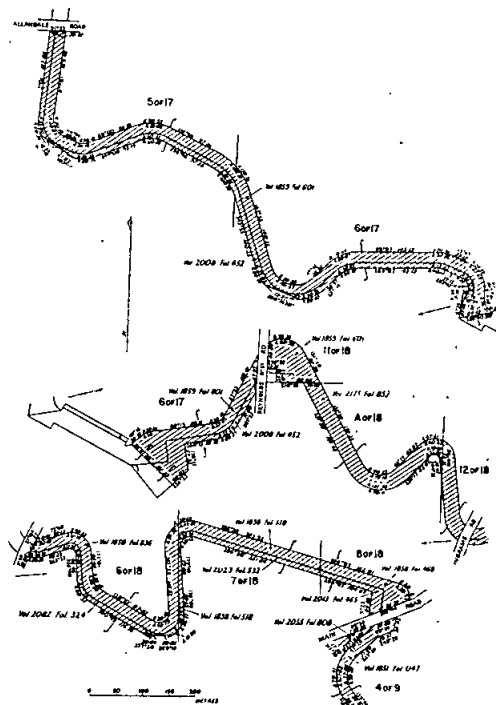

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby directs:—

- that the said portion of road which is shown by hachure and cross-hachure on the diagram hereunder shall be discontinued;
- that notwithstanding such discontinuance the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust shall continue to have and possess the same right title power authority or interest in or in relation to the land shown cross-hatched on the said diagram as it had or possessed prior to such discontinuance with respect to or in connection with any drains or pipes laid or erected in on or over such land for the purposes of drainage or sewerage;

CONSTITUTION OF COUNCIL TO MANAGE AND
CONTROL THE STATE COLLEGE OF VICTORIA—
INSTITUTE OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION.

Whereas sub-section (2) of section 31 of the *State College of Victoria Act 1972* provides that, where the governing body of an institution to which Division 5 of Part I of that Act applies makes an application in writing to the Minister for the incorporation of a council to manage and control the institution, the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Minister by Order published in the *Government Gazette* constitute a council by such name as is specified in the Order as a body corporate to manage and control the institution and exercise the several other powers set out in the said sub-section in relation to the council so constituted:

And whereas the State College of Victoria—Institute of Catholic Education (hereinafter called "the Institute") is an institution to which the said Division applies.

And whereas the governing body of the Institute has applied in writing to the Minister for the incorporation under the *State College of Victoria Act 1972* of a council to manage and control the Institute:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Minister, doth by this Order provide as follows:—

CONSTITUTION OF COUNCIL.

1. There shall be a council to be known as the Council of the State College of Victoria—Institute of Catholic Education (hereinafter called "the Council") which shall be a body corporate to manage and control the Institute.

2. (1) The Council shall consist of not more than twenty-four members of whom—

- (a) one shall be a person appointed from time to time as occasion arises by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne to be Chairman of the Institute;
- (b) one shall be the person who is for the time being the Vicar for Tertiary Education of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne or his nominee;
- (c) not more than three shall be appointed by the Governor in Council;
- (d) one shall be a person appointed by the Minister of Education;
- (e) one shall be the person who is for the time being the Director of the Victorian Catholic Education Office or his nominee;
- (f) one shall be a person appointed by the Victorian Commission for Catholic Education;
- (g) four shall be the persons who are for the time being the Principals of—
 - (i) Christ College, Oakleigh;
 - (ii) Mercy College, Ascot Vale;
 - (iii) Aquinas College, Ballarat; and
 - (iv) Christian Brothers Teachers College, Box Hill—

(hereinafter called "the colleges conducted by the Institute").

- (h) where there is an Academic Board (whether called by that or any other name) of the Institute one shall be a member of the Board appointed by the board from amongst its members who are members of the academic staff of the colleges conducted by the Institute;
- (i) in the case of each of the colleges conducted by the Institute, one shall be elected by the academic staff thereof from amongst their number in a manner determined by the Council;

(k) not more than four shall be persons having a special interest in education from time to time appointed by co-option by the Council; and

(l) two shall be students of the Institute elected annually in a manner determined by the Council of which—

(i) in the year 1975 and every second year thereafter—one shall be elected by the enrolled students of each of the colleges referred to in sub-paragraphs (i) and (iii) of paragraph (g) of sub-clause (1) of this clause from amongst their number; and

(ii) in the year 1976 and every second year thereafter—one shall be elected by the enrolled students of each of the colleges referred to in sub-paragraphs (ii) and (iv) of paragraph (g) of sub-clause (1) of this clause from amongst their number.

(2) A member appointed by the Governor in Council may be removed by the Governor in Council.

(3) Members of the Council (other than the members referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), (e), (g) and (l) of sub-clause (1) of this clause) shall be entitled to hold office for four years from the dates of their respective appointments and elections: Provided that, in the case only of the first appointments, not more than two of the members appointed pursuant to paragraph (c) of sub-clause (1) and not more than two of the members appointed pursuant to paragraph (k) of sub-clause (1) may be appointed to hold office for two years.

(4) A member of the Council shall be eligible to be re-appointed or re-elected (as the case may be) but a member (other than a member appointed pursuant to paragraph (d) of sub-clause (1) of this clause) shall not be elected or appointed for more than three successive terms unless he is appointed by co-option for a further term under paragraph (j) or paragraph (k) of sub-clause (1).

(5) If a member of the Council—

(a) resigns his office by writing under his hand directed to the Chairman;

(b) becomes of unsound mind or becomes a person whose person or estate is liable to be dealt with in any way under the law relating to mental health;

(c) becomes bankrupt;

(d) is convicted of any indictable offence;

(e) without special leave previously granted by the Council absents himself from four consecutive meetings of the Council;

(f) ceases to hold any qualifications required for his becoming or being a member of the Council;

(g) being a member appointed by the Governor in Council is removed from office; or

(h) dies—

his office shall become vacant so as to create a casual vacancy.

(6) A member appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall be entitled to hold office for the unexpired portion of the original term of office only.

(7) A casual vacancy shall not be filled if it occurs within three months before the expiration of the term of office concerned.

(8) Where for any reason the Council appoints a person to be Acting Principal of a college conducted by the Institute, the person so appointed shall, while holding that office, be entitled to attend and vote at any meeting of the Council and for that purpose shall have the rights and privileges of the Principal.

(9) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the other provisions of this Order—

(a) a person who when this Order takes effect is a member of the unincorporate governing body of the Institute appointed or elected to serve for a fixed term and who does not become a member of the Council under sub-clause (1) of this clause shall, subject to the provisions other than paragraph (f) of sub-clause (5) of this clause, be a member of the Council for the unexpired portion of the term for which he was appointed or elected to be a member of the unincorporate governing body; and

(b) no such member shall be taken into account in determining the total number of persons who may under sub-clause (1) of this clause

become members of the Council, or the question of whether any person may under that sub-clause become a member in any particular capacity.

(10) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in sub-clause (1) of this clause, the said Council shall be properly constituted where there is a deficiency in the number of members or of members of any class whether originally or as the result of the occurrence of a vacancy.

(11) A member of the staff of the Institute who is also a member of the Council shall withdraw from that part of any meeting at which applications are considered for appointment or promotion of a person to a post senior to that of his or the suspension, dismissal or retirement of a person holding such a post is considered.

(12) A member of the staff of the Institute who is also a member of the Council shall withdraw from that part of any meeting at which there is consideration of his promotion, suspension, dismissal or retirement.

(13) A student of the Institute who is also a member of the Council shall withdraw from that part of any meeting at which there is consideration of the appointment, promotion, suspension, dismissal or retirement of any member of the staff of the College.

PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL.

3. The following provisions shall apply to the Council of the Institute:—

(a) twelve members of the Council shall constitute a quorum at any meeting;

(b) at every meeting of the Council the Chairman or (in his absence) the Vice-Chairman shall preside, but if both be absent the members present shall elect a person to preside at the meeting; for the first four years the Vice-Chairman shall be the member appointed under paragraph (b) of sub-clause (1) of clause 2 but thereafter the Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the Council.

(c) the Council shall meet at least six times in each year;

(d) the decision of the majority of those present at any meeting of the Council shall be the decision of the Council;

(e) in the event of equality of votes on any question, the person presiding shall have a second or casting vote;

(f) the Council shall provide for the safe custody of the Seal, which shall only be used by authority of the Council, and every instrument to which the Seal is affixed shall be signed by two members of the Council and shall be countersigned by the Secretary (if any) of the Council or by some other person appointed by the Council for that purpose: Provided that the affixing of the Seal to all diplomas certificates and other awards shall be evidenced by their being signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the Principal only;

(g) any member who has a pecuniary interest whether directly or indirectly in any business of the Council or of any Committee thereof or in any joint committee of the Council and officers of the Institute shall declare the nature of his interest on every occasion when any business in which he has such interest is being considered, and no member shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Council or any Committee thereof or any such joint committee on any subject in which he has a direct pecuniary interest and if any such member does vote on any such subject his vote shall be disregarded.

POWERS OF COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall have power to—

(a) appoint from amongst the Principals of the colleges conducted by the Institute or remove a Principal of the Institute who shall be responsible to the Council for the conduct and management of the Institute except as regards any matter pertaining to a particular college conducted by the Institute and shall for all purposes be a member of the academic staff of the Institute;

(b) appoint or remove a Principal of each college conducted by the Institute on the recommendation of the Advisory Board thereof, who shall be responsible to the Council for the conduct and management of the college, and shall for all purposes be a member of the academic staff of the Institute;

- (c) from time to time determine the terms and conditions on which students of the Institute may be accepted and on which they and any other persons may attend classes or make use of any premises or equipment of the Institute;
- (d) employ members of the academic staff of the Institute on such terms and conditions as are for the time being fixed in respect of them by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Senate of the State College of Victoria;
- (e) employ members of the administrative technical and other staff of the Institute on such terms and conditions as are for the time being fixed in respect of them by the Senate of the State College of Victoria;
- (f) from time to time define the duties of members of the academic administrative technical and other staff of the Institute;
- (g) suspend or dismiss any member of the academic administrative technical or other staff of the Institute (but, in the case of dismissal of a member of the academic staff, only on a resolution of the Council passed by a majority consisting of not less than two-thirds of the total number of members of the Council);
- (h) charge fees in connexion with education provided, examinations held and any other services provided by the Institute;
- (i) from time to time hold examinations in the several subjects and courses offered by the Institute, and award diplomas certificates and other awards (except degrees) to students who reach the required standard in any subject or course;
- (j) grant scholarships on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit;
- (k) purchase take on lease or in exchange or hire, and sell mortgage lease or dispose of any real or personal property (which power to sell mortgage lease or dispose of property may, in the case of any real property for the purchase acquisition or development of which or the erection of any building on which any public moneys have been provided, be exercised only with the consent of the Senate of the State College of Victoria) and enter into agreements for the supply of services for the Institute;
- (l) engage architects and other professional advisers or experts in any field and enter into contracts for the erection of buildings, the making of improvements or alterations or the carrying out of repairs, on any land or buildings vested in or occupied or used by the Institute;
- (m) borrow on overdraft of current account at any bank, or raise money and secure the payment thereof or of any past debt or obligation of the Institute with interest and other charges by mortgage or charge or other security of upon or over the whole or any part of the property present or future of the Institute upon such terms and in such manner as the Council thinks fit or without any such security and purchase redeem or pay off any such security;
- (n) invest any moneys of the Institute not immediately required for its purposes in any securities which are authorized investments within the meaning of any law relating to trustees or, with the consent of the Senate of the State College of Victoria, in any other manner;
- (o) accept gifts of real or personal property to the Institute;
- (p) delegate, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, any powers vested in the Council to any member or committee of members of the Council, any officer or committee of officers of the Institute, any joint committee of members of the Council of the Institute and officers of the Institute or the Advisory Board of any college conducted by the Institute;
- (q) do all such things as advance the interests of the staff and students of the Institute;
- (r) do all such things as may be required to be done in order to render the Institute eligible to receive grants under any law of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Victoria which provides for the making of grants to educational institutions; and

- (s) do all such things as are necessarily incidental to the proper management and control of the Institute or the effective exercise of the powers conferred on the Council.

DUTIES OF COUNCIL.

5. The Council shall exercise the powers conferred on it by this Order in such a way as to further the objects of the Institute.

6. (1) The Council shall ensure in relation to each college conducted by the Institute that there is an Advisory Board to tender advice to the Council as regards matters particularly affecting the college.

(2) In exercising its powers in relation to any matter particularly affecting any college conducted by the Institute, the Council shall take into account any advice tendered to the Council in relation thereto by the Advisory Board of the College.

7. It shall be the duty of the Council to invite tenders by publishing an advertisement in a newspaper circulating generally throughout Victoria for the supply of any goods or services or the carrying out of any work the cost of which is estimated by the Council to exceed \$5,000 except in regard to the engagement of architects consultants and other professional advisers whose charges are normally made at rates fixed and published by professional or statutory bodies.

8. The Council shall cause minutes to be duly entered in books provided for that purpose—

- (a) of the names of the members present at each meeting of the Council of any committee thereof;
- (b) of all resolutions and proceedings at any meeting of the Council or any committee thereof; and
- (c) of all declarations made by any member of his pecuniary interest in any business of the Council or of any committee thereof.

And the Honorable Lindsay Hamilton Simpson Thompson, Her Majesty's Minister of Education for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

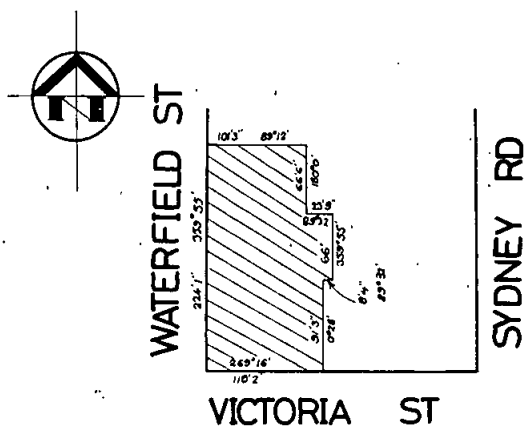

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WEST PORT FORESHORE RESERVE, CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed or vested in trustees, and

Whereas certain land in the City of Port Melbourne, Parish of Melbourne South, being Crown allotment 5, section 67A and known as the "West Port Foreshore

Reserve" hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve", has been temporarily reserved pursuant to Order in Council dated the 11th June, 1974, as a site for public recreation, and

Whereas such lands have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and

Whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made:

Now therefore, I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands, in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the City of Port Melbourne as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

Definitions.

1. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the Land Act 1958.

"Authorised Officer" means any person appointed, in writing, by the Committee as an authorised officer for the purpose of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force and any bailiff of Crown lands.

"Building" means any tent, marquee, stall, booth, shed, bathing box, boat shed, swing boat, merry-go-round, ocean wave, toilet block or other structure or erection.

"Committee" means the Committee of Management appointed pursuant to the Act to manage the Reserve.

"Firearms" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol, or like thing using, gas, cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow or cross bow and any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring or destroying animal life.

"Permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued under the Act or these Regulations.

"Person" means and includes a person, a group of persons, members of any Club, Society or any organisation or any member thereof and any firm or corporation (where the context so permits).

"Vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, cart, trailer, caravan; horse drawn vehicle, trailer and water craft.

For the purpose of these Regulations words purporting the singular number shall mean and include the plural and words purporting the masculine gender shall mean and include the feminine gender where the context requires or admits.

Behaviour.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct;

(b) commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public or any person lawfully in the Reserve whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in a public or private building or other structure or in any enclosed or unenclosed space in the Reserve or do or suffer to be done any act which in the opinion of an authorised officer is or is likely to be to the annoyance or disturbance of any person using the Reserve;

(c) Except in an area set apart for the purpose, play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to other persons using the Reserve.

Shooting, &c.

3. No person shall in the Reserve except in accordance with a written permit have in his possession, carry or use any firearms, poison, trap or snare.

4. (a) Any person carrying or using any firearm, poison, trap or snare in the Reserve without a permit shall surrender the same on demand to any authorised officer who shall issue a receipt therefor.

(b) The person apparently entitled to any such article may collect it from the office of the Committee after completion of investigations and legal proceedings (if any) by the Committee or the Police in relation to any offence alleged against the person who surrendered the same.

Damage.

5. (a) No person, except with a permit issued by the Committee, shall in the Reserve, remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower, or other vegetation or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure or any other thing of the like nature to any of the foregoing.

(b) No person shall without a permit from the Committee, dig or remove from or take into the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell grit, sand, soil or loam.

Missiles.

6. No person shall roll or throw any stone or other substance or missile within the Reserve.

Camping.

7. No person shall camp in any part of the Reserve.

Refuse and Litter.

8. No person shall within the Reserve deposit or cause to be deposited (except in a receptacle provided for the purpose) any bottles, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.

Glass &c.

9. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserve and in the event of breaking any glass, bottle or other container shall immediately gather the pieces up and place them in a receptacle provided for refuse.

Dogs.

10. No person shall cause, suffer or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash and unless such dog be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from damaging, or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee.

Animals Generally.

11. (a) Save as aforesaid, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve without a permit.

(b) Any animal found in the Reserve contrary to these Regulations may be seized by an Authorised Officer and impounded or destroyed, and the owner or custodian thereof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such animal to the property of the Committee.

Enclosures.

12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be set aside for plantations of young trees, shrubs or plants.

13. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as may be set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

Fireworks.

14. No person shall throw or set fire to any fireworks within the Reserve.

Roadways, &c.

15. No person shall—

- (a) unless authorised by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position obstructing the lawful passage of others;
- (b) drive any vehicle in a manner dangerous to the public;
- (c) drive any vehicle so as to cause noise which is unreasonable in the circumstances.

Parking.

16. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserve except—

- (a) In an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs; or
- (b) as and where directed or authorised by the Committee or an Authorised Officer;
- (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

Recreation Vehicle.

17. No person shall drive or ride a recreational vehicle (as defined under the *Recreational Vehicles Act 1973*) in or on the Reserve.

Use of Facilities.

18. No person shall—

- (a) Use any kitchen, laundry, change room, shower, toilet or other convenience or facility or any part thereof in the Reserve, except for its proper purpose and upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed;
- (b) enter or use or permit any child under his care or control to enter or use any place, room, convenience or structure set apart for the use of the opposite sex; provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under the age of six years when accompanied by an adult of the opposite sex;
- (c) if above the age of fourteen years, use any swings or play equipment provided for children, or (save whilst in charge of a child under that age) enter any children's playground.

Boatsheds, &c.

19. (a) The Committee may set aside sites on the Reserve for bathing boxes, boatsheds and other buildings or structures.

(b) No person shall occupy any such site or erect or maintain any such structure without a written permit from the Committee.

(c) The Committee may at any time cancel the permit given in which case the bathing box, boatshed or other structure shall be removed and in the event of it not being removed by the person to whom the permit had been given for such occupation, the Committee may cause the bathing box, boatshed, or other structure to be removed from the Reserve.

(d) No bathing box, boatshed or similar structure shall be used at any time for residential purposes and in the event of the Committee being satisfied that such bathing box, boatshed, or similar structure is being used contrary to this Regulation, the permit may be cancelled.

Direction by Sign.

20. (a) The Committee may, by notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserves or any part thereof.

(b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.

(c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

Permits.

21. (a) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.

(b) Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by an Authorised Officer and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit.

Direction to Leave.

22. (a) Any Authorised Officer may direct a person who in his opinion offends any of these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserve or any place herein.

(b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and may be removed from the Reserve or such place.

Giving of Name.

23. If, in the opinion of an Authorised Officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations, then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and any person who when asked by such Officer refuses to furnish his name and address or who furnishes an incorrect name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence.

Obstruction to Officers.

24. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with an Authorised Officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserve.

General.

25. No person shall in any part of the Reserve, except in accordance with and upon the terms of a permit, in writing, by the Committee—

- (a) Sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever;
- (b) give out, distribute, erect, leave, set up or display any handbills, placards, notices, pamphlets, books, papers, advertising matter or the like thing;
- (c) Occupy, use or enter any building, booth, shed, stand or structure unless the same is set aside for public use;
- (d) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, or other structure;
- (e) solicit or collect money or orders for goods or services;
- (f) take part in or advertise any entertainment for gain;
- (g) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind or use any amplifier, public address system, loud hailer or similar device;
- (h) let for hire any article, device or thing;
- (i) take photographs for gain or commercial purposes;
- (j) ply any vehicle for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward;
- (k) conduct any school or provide any form of instruction for gain;
- (l) advertise for sale or trade or hire any article, device, service or thing.

26. Every person found to be under the influence of alcohol in the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

27. No person shall commit any nuisance or behave in a disorderly manner in the Reserve.

28. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the Reserve open to public view.

29. No person shall play any game or take part in any activity in or on any portion of the Reserve to the danger, inconvenience or annoyance of the public or any member of the public.

30. No club, association or person shall, without written authority of the Committee, hold any entertainment, performance, sports or ceremony in any part of the Reserve.

31. Any permits required to be issued by the Committee shall be issued by the Secretary of the Committee or other Authorised Officer of the Committee.

32. Every person granted permission to use the Reserve or part thereof or any structure therein shall make good any damage caused to the Reserve or structure or any other improvement therein during the period of the permissive occupancy granted by the permit.

33. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

General Powers.

34. The Committee may—

- (a) Provide and maintain conveniences, facilities and amenities of any description in any part of the Reserve; or arrange for the provision and maintenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof;
- (b) make such arrangements as it deems necessary or desirable for or in connexion with the proper and efficient management and operation of the Reserve or any portion thereof.

Permits.

35. (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine either generally or in a particular case.

(b) No permit shall be transferable.

(c) Any permit (other than a permit granted by or pursuant to a document under seal) may be revoked or withdrawn.—(Rs.6000.)

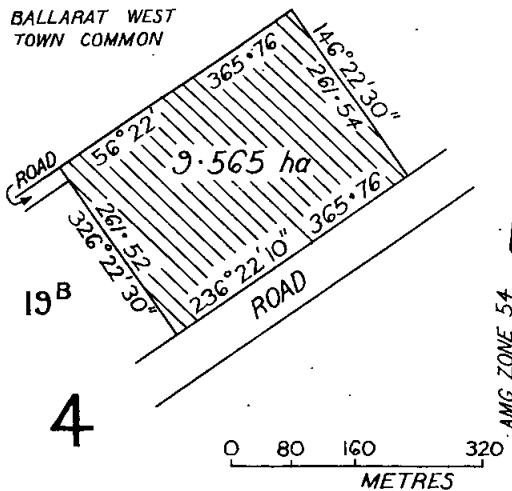
Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958 for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty Dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such regulations and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or any member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One Hundred Dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which this section relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

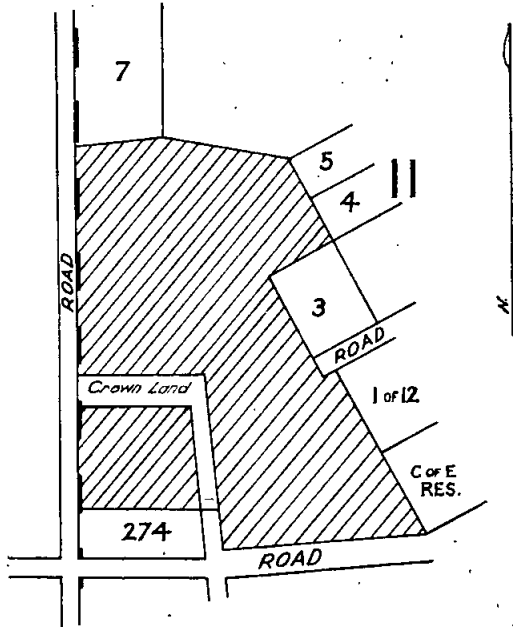

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Traralgon. "Frontage" means the boundary line between private property and the street upon which such private property abuts and where such property abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the said property and the street to which any building that may be erected thereon fronts. 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon.

4. A person shall not place or permit to be placed—

(a) More than one caravan on any private property in the one ownership or occupation.

(b) Any caravan on any private property in such a position that any part of the caravan is within a distance of eight (8) metres from the frontage to such property or is within a distance of one and one half (1.5) metres from any other boundary of the said property.

Provided however the Council may permit more than one caravan to be placed on any private property and within lesser distances from the frontage or other boundary of the said property upon application in writing by the owner or occupier of such property.

5. A person shall not occupy any caravan placed on any private property without the consent of the Council in writing.

6. (a) Every person applying to the Council for the placing of or for consent to occupy any caravan under this By-law shall make application in writing and supply all reasonable information required by the Council including the reasons for seeking such consent, the number, age and sex of the persons proposing to occupy the caravan, the size and location of the caravan and the sanitation facilities to be provided in respect thereof.

(b) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to any such application as it thinks fit.

6. (c) Should the Council give its consent then the permit issued thereon shall be for a period not exceeding six months and be conditional upon the number of persons to occupy a caravan not exceeding the number set out in the permit and upon proper sanitation facilities being provided to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Council and being available at all times to the occupants of the caravan.

(d) Should such sanitation facilities cease to be available during the period of the permit and not be restored within twenty-four (24) hours after notice in writing has been given by the Health Inspector to the owner or occupier of the caravan or of the premises on which the caravan is placed then any permit granted hereunder shall at the expiration of the period of notice be immediately cancelled.

7. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars (\$10) or more than twenty dollars (\$20) and to a further penalty

of not more than ten dollars (\$10) for each day upon which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have force throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of the Health Acts.
