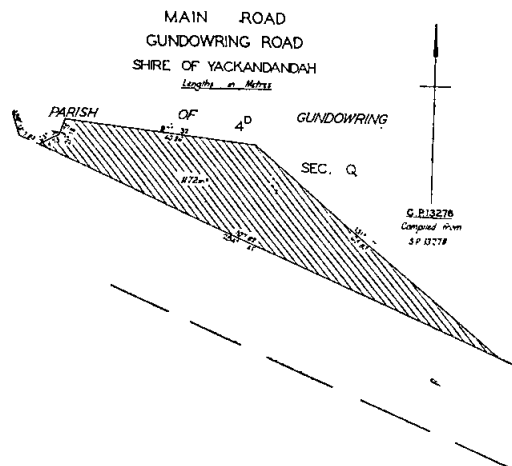
MAIN ROAD

Lengths in Metres



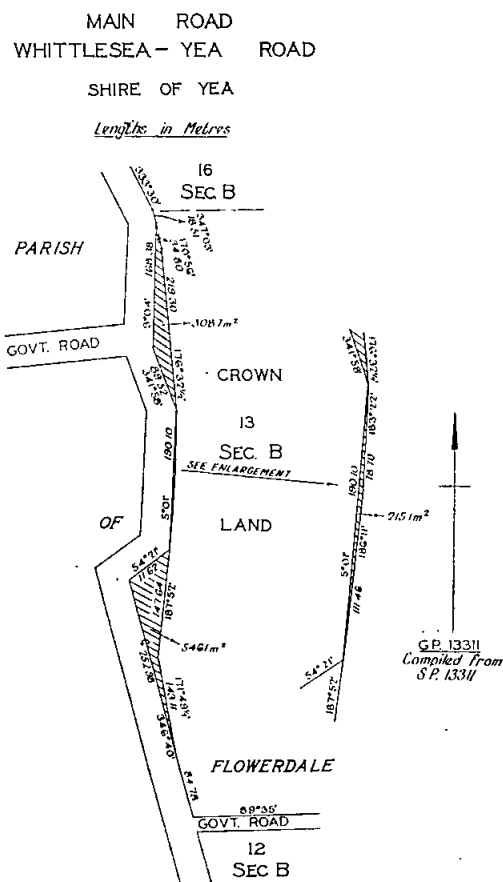

Estate Agents Act 1958.

ESTATE AGENTS (COMMISSION AMENDMENT No. 2) RULES 1975.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the *Estate Agents Act 1958* the Estate Agents Committee may with the consent of the Governor in Council make Rules for or with respect to prescribing or regulating the various matters and things set out in paragraph (c) of Sub-section (1) of the said Section:

And whereas the Governor in Council has consented to the making of the following Rules:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers aforesaid the Estate Agents Committee hereby makes the following Rules (that is to say):—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Estate Agents (Commission Amendment No. 2) Rules 1975, and shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of March, 1975.

(2) In these Rules the *Rules of the Estate Agents Committee 1964 are called the Principal Rules.

2. Paragraph (f) of Item No. 1 in the First Schedule to the Principal Rules is hereby amended as follows—

(a) in sub-paragraph (iii) for the expression "5 per cent" there shall be substituted the expression "6 per centum"; and

(b) in sub-paragraph (iv) for the expression "2½ per cent" there shall be substituted the expression "3½ per centum".

2. The proposed routes of the pipelines are as follows—

APPLICATION NO. 1. A SYSTEM OF THREE PIPELINES FROM ALTONA TO SOMERTON.

Line 1. A steel pipeline 33.8 km long with a nominal bore of 350 mm commencing at a pumping station inside the area of the refinery operated by Petroleum Refineries (Australia) Pty. Ltd. at Altona, Parish of Cut Paw Paw and proceeding in an easterly direction for approximately 300 metres to Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Altona rail line, crossing Kororoit Creek Road *en route*; thence turning to continue in a northerly direction within such property to the Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Geelong rail line; thence turning to continue in an easterly to northerly direction to Newport railway station, crossing an M.M.B.W. outfall drain, Maddox Road and Champion Road *en route*; thence entering and crossing balance of Lots 2 and 3 on Plan of Subdivision 42833 and Part Allotment 13, section 7, Parish of Cut Paw Paw; thence entering Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Newport rail line; thence continuing in a generally northerly direction to a point opposite High Street, Newport; thence entering and crossing through the south-eastern corner of a playground owned by the Williamstown City Council to McRobert Street; thence continuing in a northerly direction along such street for a distance of approximately 122 metres; thence diverting into property owned by the Country Roads Board and continuing in a northerly direction for approximately 243 metres passing under the Melbourne Road (new) overpass at Blackshaws Road; thence turning to re-enter Victorian Railways property to cross the Newport-Sunshine rail line to the eastern side and enter the Victorian Railways Spotswood Workshops; thence turning to continue in a northerly direction within and adjacent to the boundary of the workshops with the Newport-Sunshine rail line to Birmingham Street, Spotswood; thence re-entering the Victorian Railways property containing the Newport-Sunshine rail line and continuing in a north-westerly direction within such property to the Geelong Road overpass crossing Brunel Street, passing beneath the Lower Yarra Freeway and crossing Francis Street *en route*; thence entering property vested in the Country Roads Board and passing beneath the Geelong Road to re-enter Victorian Railways property and continue in a generally north-westerly direction parallel to the Newport-Sunshine rail line to the Sunshine Railway Station, crossing Somerville Road and Sunshine Road *en route*; thence diverting in a northerly direction to enter and cross property owned by the Sunshine City Council and pass beneath the Hampshire Road-Monash Street overpass; thence re-entering Victorian Railways property containing the Sunshine-St. Albans and Sunshine-Broadmeadows rail lines and continuing in a north-westerly direction to the Western Highway immediately to the north of Albion Railway Station, crossing Anderson Street *en route*; thence entering Country Roads Board property to pass beneath the Western Highway overpass and across St. Albans Road to re-enter Victorian Railways property and cross such property in a north-westerly direction to the northern side of Victorian Railways property containing the Sunshine-Broadmeadows rail line and the Melbourne-Albury standard gauge line; thence continuing in a generally north-easterly direction within such property across McIntyre Road to a point approximately 305 metres south of the Maribyrnong River; thence leaving railway property to enter Lot 3, Plan of Subdivision No. 54879, Parish of Cut Paw Paw and continue through such property to cross the Maribyrnong River and enter allotment 2A, section 10, Parish of Doutta Galla; thence at a point approximately 244 metres north of the Maribyrnong River re-entering Victorian Railways property containing the Albion-Broadmeadows and the Melbourne-Albury standard gauge and continue in a north-easterly direction within such property to the Calder Highway passing beneath a State Electricity Commission transmission line *en route*; thence diverting to enter Country Roads Board property and pass beneath the highway

overpass to re-enter Victorian Railways property and continue within such property in a generally north-easterly direction to Lancefield Road; thence diverting to enter Country Roads Board property and pass beneath the Lancefield Road overpass to re-enter Victorian Railways property and continue within such reserve to a point approximately 55 metres south-west of the Tullamarine Freeway; thence diverting to enter Coventry Street, Tullamarine and continue along such street beneath the Tullamarine Freeway overpass; thence at a point approximately 80 metres north-east of the freeway re-entering Victorian Railways property and continuing within such property parallel to the rail tracks to a point approximately 61 metres west of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence leaving Victorian Railways property to enter and cross allotment part lot 4 on plan of subdivision No. 53163, Parish of Tullamarine; thence crossing the Moonee Ponds Creek to enter allotment Crown portion 1, Parish of Will Will Rook; thence at a point approximately 244 metres east of Moonee Ponds Creek re-entering Victorian Railways property and continuing in a generally north-easterly direction parallel to the rail tracks to Pascoe Vale Road and Jacana Railway Station, crossing Augustine Street *en route*; thence at a point approximately 610 metres north of such railway station diverting to enter part Crown portion 6, Parish of Will Will Rook and continue in a generally northerly direction along the western boundary of such property to Camp Road, Broadmeadows; thence diverting to re-enter Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Albury rail lines and continue in a northerly direction within such property to Somerton Road crossing Barry Road *en route*; thence crossing such road at a point approximately 640 metres north of Somerton Road and adjacent to the eastern boundary of allotment 9, section 6, Parish of Yuroke, diverting to enter such property and terminate at a valve approximately 5 metres from the south-west corner of such property.

Line 2.—A steel pipeline 1.2 km long with a nominal bore of 200 mm commencing at a valve on the Geelong-Newport white petroleum products pipeline located on Victorian Railways property, Altona, at a point approximately 490 metres west of the Millers Road overpass over the Melbourne-Geelong rail line; thence proceeding in an easterly direction for approximately 200 metres parallel to the rail line to a point adjacent to the junction with the Melbourne-Altona rail line; thence turning to proceed in a southerly direction within Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Altona rail line for a distance of approximately 700 metres; crossing Kororoit Creek Road *en route*; thence at a point opposite a pumping station within the refinery owned and operated by Petroleum Refineries (Australia) Pty. Line 3.—A steel pipeline 1.5 km long with a nominal bore of 150 mm commencing at a valve located inside the oil storage installation of Esso Australia Ltd., Simcock Avenue, Spotswood; thence proceeding in a westerly direction to Hall Street; thence turning to continue in a southerly direction along the western side of such street to Craig Street, crossing a Victorian Railways spur line *en route*; thence turning in a westerly direction to enter and cross Victorian Railways property containing the Melbourne-Williamstown rail line; thence entering McLister Street to continue in a westerly direction along the southern side of such street to the Melbourne-Williamstown Road; thence crossing such road to enter and continue along the southern side of Birmingham Street to Victorian Railways property; thence entering such property to terminate at a valve connection on Line 1.

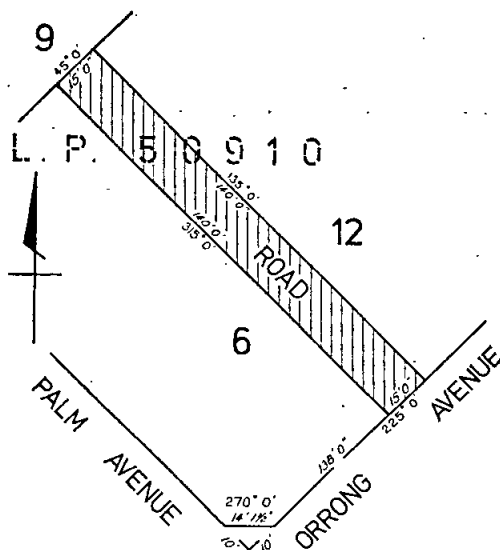

- (e) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, or shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird or other wildlife in the Reserve.
- (f) Carry any poison, traps or snares in the Reserve.
- (g) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or have in his or her possession any skin, egg, feathers, or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (i) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees, or plants of any kind.
- (j) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (k) Drive any vehicle on the Reserve other than on a road or roads provided for the purpose.—(Rs.1620).
