LICENSING POLL REGULATIONS 1974.

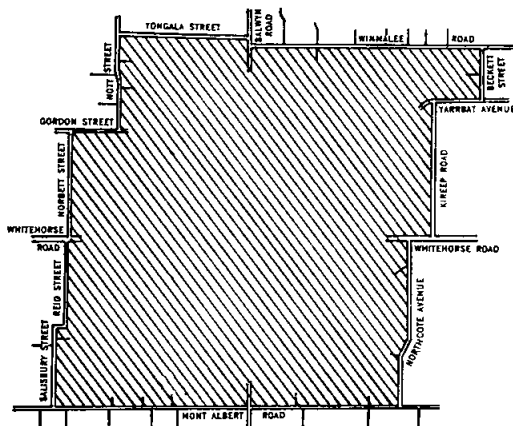
LICENSING POLL AT BALWYN, TO BE HELD ON  
SATURDAY, 12TH APRIL, 1975.

In the matter of an application by ALEXANDER GEORGE BRIGGS, Secretary of the Balwyn Returned Services Club, for a Club Licence under the *Liquor Control Act 1968*, for premises situate at 101 Balwyn Road, Balwyn, in the State of Victoria.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 50 of the *Liquor Control Act 1968* and the Licensing Poll Regulations 1974, I, Eric Lawrence Richardson, the Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Victoria, hereby give public notice that, in relation to the vote of electors ordered by the Liquor Control Commission to be taken in the neighbourhood surrounding the proposed site viz., 101 Balwyn Road, Balwyn, in respect of which application has been made for a Club Licence, the following arrangements will apply to the taking of the poll, namely:—

(A) *The duly delineated neighbourhood—*

(i) comprises the area shown in hachure on the plan hereunder—



(ii) and is more particularly described as being—

"That part of the City of Camberwell within the area bounded as follows:— Commencing at the intersection of Mont Albert Road and Salisbury Street; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by Salisbury Street and Reid Street to Whitehorse Road; thence easterly by Whitehorse Road to Norbert Street; thence northerly by Norbert Street to Gordon Street; thence easterly by Gordon Street to Nott Street; thence northerly by Nott Street to Yongala Street; thence easterly by Yongala Street to Balwyn Road; thence southerly by Balwyn Road to Winmalee Road; thence easterly by Winmalee Road to Beckett Street; thence southerly by Beckett Street to Yarrbat Avenue; thence westerly by Yarrbat Avenue to Kireep Road; thence southerly by Kireep Road to Whitehorse Road; thence westerly by Whitehorse Road to Northcote Avenue; thence southerly by Northcote Avenue to Mont Albert Road; and thence westerly by Mont Albert Road to the point of commencement."

In the above description wherever the boundaries described run along a road, street or avenue the centre of such road, street or avenue shall be taken to be the boundary line.

(B) *The Resolution to be submitted to the vote of the electors at the poll shall be:—*

"That a Club Licence be granted in the neighbourhood of premises at 101 Balwyn Road, Balwyn, in the City of Camberwell, State of Victoria."

(C) *Persons Entitled to Vote at the Poll.*—All Legislative Assembly electors enrolled in respect of their residence within the delineated neighbourhood who were so enrolled as at the 11th February, 1975.(D) *Voting is Compulsory.*—Penalty for failing to vote—Not exceeding Four dollars.(E) *The Polling Day is Saturday, 12th April, 1975. Polling Hours—8 a.m. until 8 p.m.*(F) *Two Polling Places will be opened on polling day, viz.:—*

All Hallows Catholic School, Brenbeal Street, Balwyn,  
Primary School, Balwyn Road, Balwyn.

- (G) *Postal Voting Arrangements* will be similar to those operating at Legislative Assembly elections. Electors who are ill or incapacitated, &c., or who will be absent from the neighbourhood on polling day are eligible to vote by post.

Applications for postal ballot-papers must be addressed to the Returning Officer, State Electoral Office, Old Treasury Building, Spring Street, Melbourne, 3000.

- (H) *Inspection of Rolls: Application Forms for Postal Voters.*—The official rolls for the poll may now be inspected at the State Electoral Office, Melbourne,

or at the office of the Electoral Registrar, 1 Princess Street, Kew. Application forms for postal ballot-papers are also available at both such offices.
