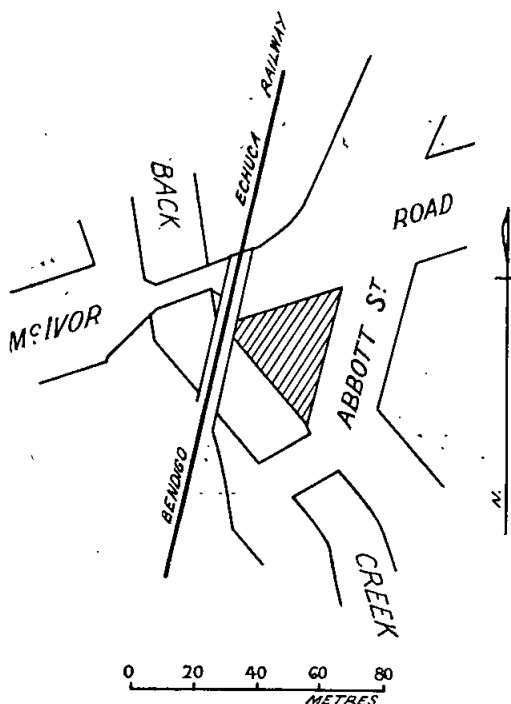

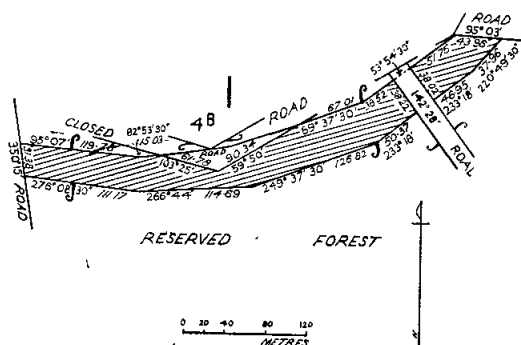

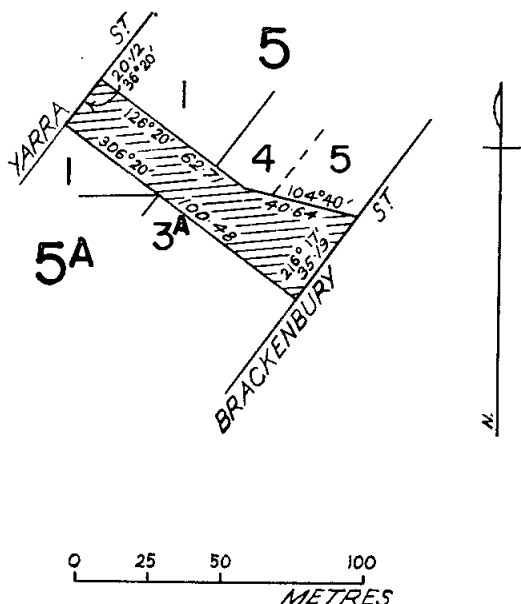

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

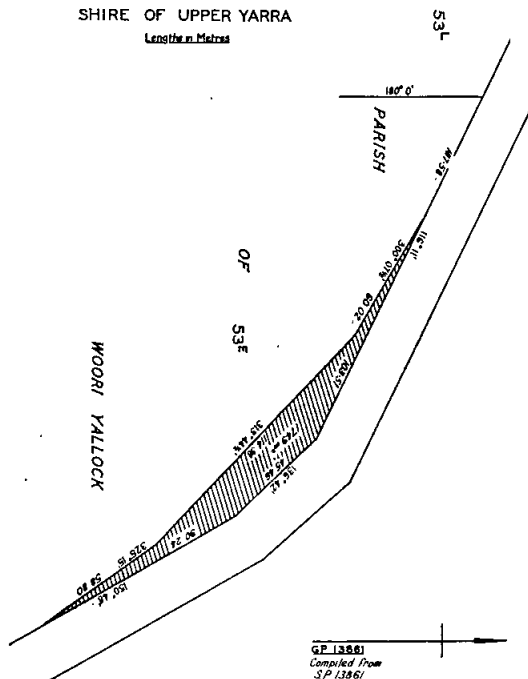

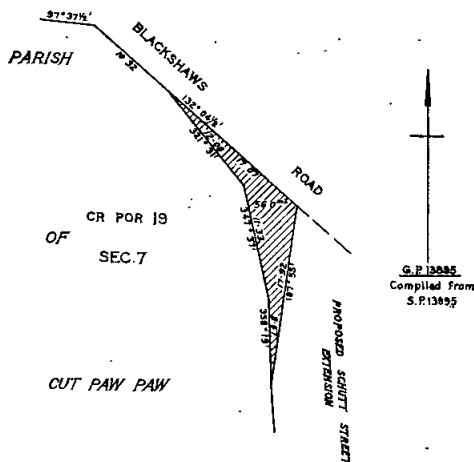
MAIN ROAD

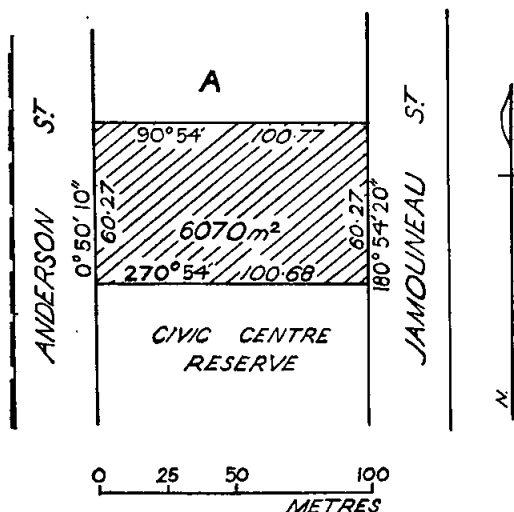
PROPOSED REVOCATION OF TEMPORARY RESERVA- TION OF LAND BY ORDER IN COUNCIL.

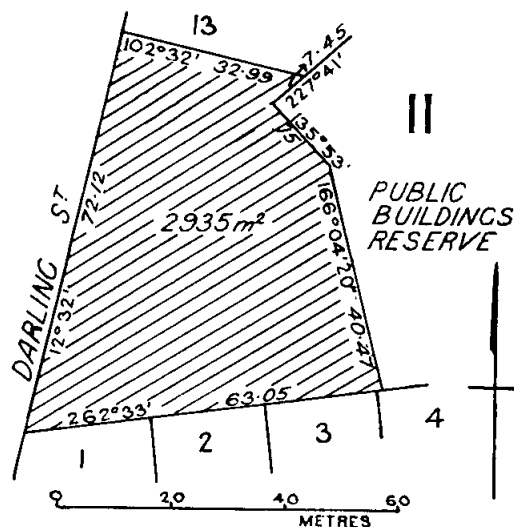

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL)
REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT NO. 311 (T.T.10).

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Teaching Service Act 1958, hereby amends Regulation 23 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations as follows:—

Regulation 23.

In Regulation 23 insert the following new heading and clause 22:—

"MATERNITY LEAVE AND PATERNITY LEAVE.

22. (a) Subject to the conditions specified in sub-clause (b) a married member who submits an application accompanied by a certificate from a legally qualified medical practitioner stating that she is pregnant and specifying the day on which it is expected that she will be delivered shall be entitled to maternity leave with pay as follows:—

- (i) for a period commencing six weeks prior to the expected date of delivery and for a period of six weeks after either the expected or the actual date of delivery whichever is the later; or
- (ii) if the birth occurs more than six weeks prior to the expected date of delivery, for a period of twelve weeks commencing from the actual date of delivery.

Provided that the qualifying period of 13 weeks' service for which salary was received must have occurred within a continuous period of employment as a member of the Teaching Service immediately prior to the commencement of confinement leave.

- (ii) A member shall be paid at the prevailing rate equivalent to that which she was actually receiving on the day before the commencement of confinement leave.

Provided that where part-time service is included in either the period of 13 weeks immediately prior to the commencement of confinement leave or the 26 weeks' period referred to in paragraph (i) she

shall be paid at the rate appropriate to the time-fraction for which her service was the longest in the aggregate during either of these periods, whichever is the more advantageous.

- (iii) In this sub-clause "confinement leave" means leave of absence without pay granted in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 8, Teaching Service (Governor in Council) Regulations, except that where a member has not commenced confinement leave before the expected date of delivery, any reference to "the commencement of confinement leave" shall be taken to refer to the commencement of the period of six weeks immediately preceding the expected date of delivery.

(c) A married member, on the production of satisfactory evidence of his wife's confinement or expected confinement, shall be entitled to paternity leave with pay for a period not exceeding one week, or for periods that in the aggregate do not exceed five working days, for the purpose of caring for such child and/or wife, provided that such leave shall be taken in the period commencing one week prior to the expected date of delivery of the child and concluding six weeks after the actual date of delivery of the child.

(d) Leave granted under this clause shall be regarded as service for all purposes."

- (a) preventing and extinguishing fires; and
- (b) suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Springvale order as follows:—

1. In this Bylaw unless inconsistent with the context—
“Dwelling” has the same meaning as in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

“Barbecue” includes any device or contraption used or adapted for use for cooking food in the open air.

2. Bylaw No. 142 of the City of Springvale is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall burn on any land or premises any matter, material or substance liable to give rise to the emission of offensive smoke or odours.

4. No person shall use any incinerator or keep or allow to be kept any incinerator in which it is proposed to burn any matter, material or substance on any land or premises unless such an incinerator is distant—

- (a) at least 3.048 metres from the nearest point of any building, whether on the same or adjoining land;
- (b) at least 1.219 metres from the boundary of any side-street or road to which the land has on abuttal;
- (c) at least 3.048 metres from the boundary of any street or road (other than a side street or road) to which the premises have a frontage; and
- (d) at least 1.219 metres from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.

5. Every incinerator shall be so constructed or covered as to prevent the emission of sparks or burning material or the spread of fire therefrom.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 3 (a) of this Bylaw, an incinerator may be constructed appurtenant to Flats or Apartments subject to the design and location being approved by the Building Surveyor and the design incorporating a chimney conforming to the provisions of Clause 2311 of the Uniform Building Regulations.

7. No person shall use any Barbecue (other than a Barbecue built into the exterior of a building) on any land or premises unless such Barbecue is sited in accordance with the minimum distances prescribed in Clause 3 (a), (b), (c) and (d) of this Bylaw.

8. Every Barbecue erected or constructed in a fixed position shall be enclosed at the back and on both sides to a distance above the grate or cooking plate of not less than half the width of the grate or cooking plate.

9. No person shall use in any Barbecue fuel which may cause sparks to emit or fire to spread therefrom.

10. Every person carrying on sawmilling, joinery or similar operations shall forth-with cause to be destroyed all sawdust produced in the course of such operations.

11. Every person who destroys sawdust by burning shall—

- (a) burn such sawdust in an incinerator so designed and constructed as to prevent the emission of sparks or burning material therefrom;
- (b) place or construct such incinerator in a position where there will be no risk of fire spreading therefrom;
- (c) keep a space 4.572 metres wide around such incinerator clear of all sawdust and other burnable material so as to minimise the risk of fire spreading from such incinerator;
- (d) take such other precautions as may in the circumstances be necessary to minimise the risk of fire spreading from such incinerator; and
- (e) provide and keep in a fit state for immediate use such fire buckets, chemical extinguishers, and other appliances for preventing and extinguishing fires as shall be required and in such a position as is determined by either the Engineer to the Council of the City of Springvale or the Proper Officer appointed under the Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

12. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

13. This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Springvale.

1 (a) the mover shall propose it without speaking to it and shall shortly state its nature; and

(b) the seconder shall indicate that he seconds it.

2. A motion or amendment which is not seconded lapses.

3. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be deemed to have spoken thereon.

C. For Clause 20 (2) there shall be substituted the following Clause:

(2) If any Councillor indicates opposition to a motion or amendment which has been seconded:

(a) the mover shall address the Council upon it,

(b) The Councillor who has indicated opposition to it may address the Council upon it,

(c) the seconder shall address the Council upon it,

(d) it shall then be open to debate.

D. For Clause 11 there shall be substituted the following Clause:

11 (a) When minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of Council the first business of that meeting shall be the confirmation of the minutes and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings;

(b) where that next meeting is to be held thirteen or more days after the meeting to which those minutes relate then a copy of the minutes shall be given to each Councillor not later than ninety-six hours before the time fixed for the holding of that next meeting and the minutes shall not be read at such meeting;

(c) where that next meeting is to be held less than thirteen days after the meeting to which those minutes relate then a copy of the minutes shall be given to each Councillor before the time fixed for the holding of that next meeting and unless the meeting decides otherwise the minutes shall not be read at such meeting.

E. For the word "any Councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or" appearing at the commencement of Clause 29 there shall be substituted the words "any Councillor desirous of proposing or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be required to rise to do so but if"

F. In Clause 33 there shall be substituted the following Clause:

At the conclusion of the item being dealt with at the hour of 11.30 p.m. at any meeting, no further item of business shall be dealt with at that meeting except such as shall be agreed to be dealt with in accordance with a motion to that effect duly moved and seconded and passed by a majority of the members of the Council then present. All items of business not dealt with at that meeting shall be dealt with at the next meeting and immediately following the confirmation of minutes."

2. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Springvale.
