VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION OF THE FOOTWEAR TRADES AS APPRENTICESHIP TRADES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas Section 13 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958 provides, inter alia, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades and that the Governor in Council (whether with or without any recommendation of the said Commission) may by Proclamation at any time revoke, amend or vary any such Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamation on 12th January, 1932 the following trades were proclaimed to be apprenticeship trades in so far as they were carried on in the bootmaking industry in the Metropolitan District:—

Clicking Stuffcutting Making Finishing

And whereas by Proclamation on the 16th March, 1955 the trade of Patterncutting was proclaimed to be an apprenticeship trade in so far as it was carried on in the footwear manufacturing industry in the Metropolitan District:

And whereas by Proclamation on 27th July, 1965 the abovementioned trades were proclaimed to be apprenticeship trades in so far as they are carried on in the footwear manufacturing industry anywhere in the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District:

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria has recommended to the Minister that the said proclamations be varied in the manner following:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by substituting for the trades proclaimed thereby the following trades:—

Footwear Design and Patterncutting Footwear Making and Finishing Clicking and Stuffcutting Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, the twenty-first day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-five, and in the twenty-third year of the reign of Her Majesty, Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God, Queen of Australia and Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth.
