### MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 2 (1) (b) of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission is the Authority over the waters of Loch Garry:

And whereas the said Authority has recommended that the waters of Loch Garry:—

- (a) be prohibited to a specified class of boating;
  (b) be prohibited to all boating at certain times; and
  (c) in a certain part, be prohibited to all boating:

Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance

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of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 and on the recommendation of the said Authority do by this my proclamation:—

- 1. Prohibit the use of the waters of Loch Garry to all motor boats which are capable of developing more than eight kilowatts of power.
- 2. Prohibit the use of the whole of the said waters when the Goulburn River has exceeded the 11 metres level at the Shepparton Gauge and the bars have been removed from the Regulator of Loch Garry.
- 3. Prohibit to all classes of boating those waters of Loch Garry which are west of an imaginary line between a notice inscribed with the words "Stop, Boating beyond this point prohibited" erected on the levee bank approximately 30 metres north-east of the Regulator and a similar notice erected on the levee bank approximately 30 metres south-east of the said Regulator.



## QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, Ian Winton Smith, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be ninety-six point zero one per centum.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of June, 1975.

- 4. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at twenty-five cents per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. (a) An annual charge of twenty-five dollars will be payable for the period first January, 1975 to thirty-first December, 1975 in respect of each of the properties which are not within the Boolarra Waterworks District and are supplied with water by this Trust. These charges will become due and payable on the same day as the general rate of the Trust.
- (b) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied without further charge to any of the aforesaid properties is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of twenty-five cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the charge levied on such property for the said year.

- (c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any of the aforesaid properties in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in section 'B' of this clause is hereby fixed at twenty-five cents per 1,000 gallons.

By-law No. 4.

The Skipton Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a by-law as follows:—

- 1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date on which it was read previously, and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two such successive readings (hereinafter called the meter year) shall be the basis of calculating of charges under this by-law, provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year, the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculation of such charge.
- 2. Subject as hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust:—
  - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 7.5 cents per kilolitre for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.





IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers Compensation Act 1958 and all other powers him thereunto enabling His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):-

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Workers Compensation (Insurers Guarantee and Compensation Supplementation Fund) Regulations 1975 and shall come into operation on the 28th day of May, 1975.
- (2) In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Act" means the Workers Compensation Act 1958.
  - "Fund" means the Insurers Guarantee and Compensation Supplementation Fund.
  - "Insurance Commissioner" means the Insurance Commissioner appointed for the purposes of the State Insurance Office Act 1975.
- 2. For the purposes of sub-section (2) of Section 92 of the Act the prescribed surcharge shall be 25 per cent of the statutory premium element.
- 3. For the purposes of sub-section (1) of Section 93 of the Act every statement shall be in or to the effect of the form contained in the First Schedule.
- 4. Every insurer who may be required to pay an additional amount on behalf of an employer as compensation by virtue of sub-section (3) of Section 2A in respect of an injury arising out of or in the course of employment of a worker before the first day of July, 1975, shall furnish the following information to the Treasurer by notice lodged with or forwarded to the Insurance Commissioner and the insurer shall certify that the information supplied by him is true and correct.

- 5. (1) Every application to the Treasurer for recompense from the Fund for an additional amount paid on behalf of an employer as compensation by virtue of sub-section (1) of Section 2c of the Act in respect of an injury arising out of or in the course of the employment of a worker before the first day of July, 1975, shall be lodged with or forwarded to the Insurance Commissioner and shall be in or to the effect of the Second Schedule.
- (2) It shall be sufficient compliance for the purposes of this Regulation if any part of the information required is furnished by the insurer in writing or in the form of a computer print-out or a print-out from any other recognized information storage system attached to the relevant application.

Clause 4 (3) of the contract between the Board and dairy farmers provides that the Board shall be entitled to deduct from the price of the milk purchased under such contract, such amount per gallon as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost incurred in transporting the said milk from the farm of the vendor to the point of sale by the Board.

The prices prescribed in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above, make provisions for the cost of transport of the said milk from the premises of the Authorised Agent of the Board to the premises of the dairyman to whom such milk is normally sold by the Board, but from each of such prices the Board shall be entitled to deduct such sum per gallon as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost of transport of the milk from the farm of the vendor to the premises of the Authorised Agent.

In respect of any milk, additional to its normal requirements which the Board may purchase from a dairy farmer to meet a demand in an area other than that in which the said dairy farmer's milk is normally marketed, the Board shall also be entitled to deduct from the appropriate price herein prescribed, such further sum per gallon as it may determine in respect of any cost (in excess of that for which allowance has already been made in this determination) of transporting such milk from the premises of its Authorised Agent to the premises of the dairyman purchasing such milk.

In respect of payments for milk made by the Milk Board to dairy farmers, the Board shall deduct an amount of .033 cents per gallon or such other amount, not exceeding .04 cents per gallon as may from time to time be imposed as a levy on wholemilk pursuant to the provisions of the Dairying Research Levy Act 1972 of the Commonwealth of Australia.





REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "HIRD SWAMP GAME RESERVE".

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 218 of the Land Act 1958, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Macorna temporarily reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Conservation of Wildlife) pursuant to Order in Council dated the 15th January, 1974, together with the land permanently reserved as a site for Public Purposes pursuant to Order in Council dated the 25th September, 1973, and so much of the land permanently reserved for Public Purposes pursuant to Order in Council dated the 23rd May, 1881, as abuts on to the first mentioned reservation.

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorised officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

- 2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorised officers, no person shall—
  - (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into out of, or within the Reserve or remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
  - (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
  - (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
  - (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958 any holders of current Shooters' Licences having the appropriate Game stamps affixed may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.

    (e) Pluck, cut. dig. pick up. damage or otherwise
  - (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrub, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
  - (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fire-place which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further, no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
  - (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
  - (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
  - (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by Section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
  - (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird or

other wildlife: except the holder of a current Shooter's Licence having the appropriate Game Stamp affixed may, subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958, use a shotgun as defined under the Game Act 1958.

- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power.
- (1) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed, structure or equipment. Any fence, shed, structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the reserve.
- (m) Notwithstanding anything in clauses (i) and (j) the holder of a current Shooter's Licence having the appropriate Game Stamp affixed may carry a shotgun and or have a dog in his or her control during the twenty-four (24) hour period immediately prior to the open duck season.—(Rs.9754.)





Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 14, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

#### 2. Other matter.

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
- (c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.
- (d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
