# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.


WHEREAS by Section 15 of the Archaeological and Aboriginal Relics Preservation Act 1972, it is amongst other things enacted that where the Governor in Council is satisfied with respect to any land—

- (a) that is necessary to reserve the land for the preservation of relics therein;
- (b) that for the preservation of relics therein it is necessary to control the entry of persons upon that land;
- (c) that satisfactory arrangements have been made or will be made for the management of the land as an archaeological area and for controlling the entry of persons upon the land; and
- (d) that all consents required by the Act have been obtained—

he may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette declare the land to be an archaeological area:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on being satisfied on the

matters aforesaid do by this my proclamation declare all that piece of land being parts of Crown Allotments 19, 20 and 21, Parish of Carisbrook, County of Talbot as indicated on the plan contained herein to be an archaeological area.


I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 22 (1) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372) and Section 5 (1) (b) of the Land Conservation Act 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Nicholson River Water Supply Catchment.

The area proclaimed is the catchment to an offtake weir constructed by the Lakes Entrance Waterworks Trust, on the Nicholson River, adjacent to Crown allotment 22, Parish of Sarsfield, County of Dargo.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority acting under the provisions of Section 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. S-195 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101

# AVOCA WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENTS.



I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 (1) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372) and section 5 (1) (b) of the Land Conservation Act 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment areas to be known as the Avoca Water Supply Catchments.

The areas proclaimed are the catchments to the Avoca Waterworks Trust storages, on Sugarloaf Creek adjacent to Crown allotments 49A, 50 and 51 in the Parish of Yehrip, and on Lead Creek in Reserved Forest adjacent to Crown allotment 28 of H in the Parish of Glenmona.

The use of land within these catchments is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of Section 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The areas described are indicated on Plan No. S-220 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.

- (a) be set aside as water skiing access lanes, and
- (b) be prohibited for all classes of boating.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice

of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act* 1961 and on the recommendation of the said Authority do by this my proclamation-

- (1) Set aside two water ski access lanes, adjacent to the Public Reserve on the Eastern foreshore being those portions of Pykes Creek Reservoir within an offshore distance of 60 metres between 2 green floating buoys, for the purposes of motor boating and water skiing, and specified on Plan Number 124108 in the offices of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at 590 Orrong Road, Armadale.
- (2) Prohibit the use of the waters of Pykes Creek Reservoir as described in the Schedule hereto for all classes of boating.

Spillway and Embankment.

The waters north of the spillway and embankment to a line and the extensions thereof, intersecting two or more red buoys in the water.

Swimmer's Cove.

The waters of Swimmer's Cove east of a line and the extensions thereof, intersecting two or more red buoys in the water.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION. By-Law No. 5751.

SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.— WIMMERA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Wimmera Waterworks District and shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1975.
- 2. By-law No. 5723 relating to the subject matter herein 2. By-law No. 5723 relating to the subject matter herein shall be and the same is hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-law for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrograte or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or to apprograte or untilists the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-law hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.
- 3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.
- 4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement or if it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the absence of any specific means of measurement or during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be innaccurate or not registering shall be computed by accounting a watering as being a volume of water 100 millimetres in depth over the area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water 100 millimetres in depth over the area watered. watered.
- 5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation all lands shall on and from the 1st day of September, 1975, be Three dollars for each and every megalitre of water supplied. Provided that the minimum annual charge for each year commencing 1st July shall be equal to One dollar and Twenty-five cents for each and every megalitre of water allocated under permit or Ten dollars, whichever is the greater and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of December in each and every year. day of December in each and every year.
- 6. Interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum will be charged on all minimum annual charges remaining unpaid after the 15th day of April in the ensuing year.
- 7. Charges for water used in excess of the amount of the minimum annual charge shall be due and payable on the 1st day of June in each and every year.
- 8. Interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum will be charged on such amounts raised under the preceding clause remaining unpaid after the 1st day of September in the same year.
- 9. The charges as set out in this By-law shall be payable at the offices of the Commission at Horsham or Murtoa.

- 10. Such person, or persons, as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said charges.
- 11. A "megalitre" of water is 1000 cubic metres and means such volume of water as would cover an area of 1 hectare to a depth of 100 millimetres.
- 12. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made, in writing, to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorised by the Commission to receive applications.
- 13. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times in such order and in such manner as the Commission may direct, any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an
- 14. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the District or such other officers as may be authorised by the Commission; any person not so authorised who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission or with any registering appliance in connection therewith shall be guilty of an offence.
- 15. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction.
