### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria  
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of  
Victoria passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of  
Her Majesty Elizabeth II Queen of Australia, entitled the  
*Cattle Compensation (Amendment) Act 1975, No. 8714*,  
it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of  
the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed  
by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in  
the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,  
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice  
of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my  
Proclamation fix Saturday the first day of November,  
one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five as the date on  
which the said *Cattle Compensation (Amendment) Act*  
1975, No. 8714, shall come into operation.

day of October, in the year of our Lord One  
thousand nine hundred and seventy-five, and in

## MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its  
Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.,  
&c.

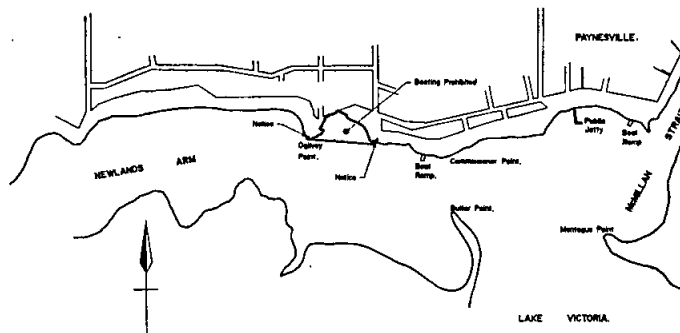
Whereas pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Motor  
Boating Act 1961* the Port Officer for the State of Victoria is the  
Authority over the waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes for the  
purposes of navigation:

And whereas the said Authority has recommended that the  
use of certain waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes be prohibited  
to all classes of boating or similar activity:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the  
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the  
Executive Council of the said State and upon the recommendation  
of the said Authority do by this my proclamation prohibit to all  
classes of boating or similar activity the use of those waters of

the Port Gippsland Lakes that are generally north of a line of red buoys, commencing at a sign on the foreshore situated at Ogilvey Point, Newlands Arm to a similar sign on the foreshore situated 250 metres west of the boat launching ramp at Commissioners Point, Paynesville, as delineated in the Schedule.

**GEELONG WESTERN PUBLIC CEMETERY.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the *Cemeteries Act 1958*, the Trustees of the Geelong Western Public Cemetery hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication every Rule and Regulation heretofore made by the said Trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded:

PART I.

*General.*

1. The Secretary, or other proper Officer duly appointed by the Trustees as referred to in these Rules and Regulations, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the Secretary or other proper Officer and such person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provision of the *Cemeteries Act* the direction of any such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid to the Trustees when applications are made or orders given, but any person who so desires may with the consent of the Trustees lodge with the Trustees a Bank Guarantee or such sum of money as may be estimated to be sufficient to cover the amount of fees and charges likely to be incurred by him during a period of one month and to the extent of

the sum so lodged on account for such fees and charges will be rendered to him monthly. In default of payment within three days after the rendering of the account such deposit shall be used by the Trustees to pay such fees and charges but without prejudice to the right of the Trustees to recover from such person any amount of fees and charges owing by him in excess of the sum so deposited.

3. (a) The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into sections:

(i) Denominational which shall be known as the General Section.

(ii) Undenominational which shall be known as the Lawn Section and shall allot graves within each section and shall cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves of the burial ground and shall sign and certify the plan when made. The plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference in the Office of the Secretary.

(b) No more than three corpses shall be buried in a grave in the General Section and no more than two corpses in a grave in the Lawn Section except where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has first been obtained.

(c) Plots of ground in the Lawn Section shall be allotted in rotation. Where a plot is purchased for immediate use for burial not more than one other plot may be reserved to the applicant except where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has first been obtained.

4. Any person desiring ground within the Cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or other erection or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees therefore giving to them his full name and address. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the First Schedule. No interment in any burial place within the cemetery (except in the Public Sections) shall be made until a Certificate of Right of Burial is given by the Trustees.

5. (a) No person being the owner of an exclusive Right of Burial shall transfer such right without the consent of the Trustees. Upon the Trustees having consented to such transfer the transferor shall deliver up the existing Certificate of Right of Burial to the Trustees who on being paid the charge prescribed by them shall issue a new Certificate to the transferee.

(b) The Trustees may at the request of the holder of a Certificate of Right of Burial repurchase the Allotment at the same price as that paid by the holder for same less the cost paid for the said Certificate.

6. Upon satisfactory evidence being produced to the Trustees that a Certificate of Right of Burial has been lost or destroyed the Trustees shall upon the request of the holder, and/or payment of the fees prescribed by the Trustees issue a new Certificate to the holder.

(a) If, having regard to the general appearance of the Cemetery, it is in the opinion of the Trustees, that a certain class or style of monument be erected in a particular section the Trustees shall have the right to nominate the type of memorial in that section.

7. Unless otherwise ordered by the Trustees the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. including Sundays and Public Holidays.

8. Every funeral entering the Cemetery shall pass through the Eastern gate and leave by the Western gate. No vehicle other than hearses and mourning coaches shall, without permission of the Trustees, enter or stand opposite the entrance gates save for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers. Breaking out of procession after entering the Cemetery is forbidden. No motor vehicle shall proceed at a faster pace than 15 km per hour; and no horse-drawn faster than walking pace within the Cemetery. No motor bicycle or push bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery except by special permission of the Trustees.

9. All persons driving motor or other vehicles in the Cemetery shall obey the directions of the Secretary or other Officer duly approved by the Trustees in every respect in regard thereto.

10. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees, enter or remain in the Cemetery except during the times provided in Regulation 7 hereof.

11. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees drive or propel any vehicle into or on any road or path within the Cemetery unless same is shod with pneumatic tyres.

12. (a) Except tradesmen, no person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees, in or by means of a vehicle carry into or on any road or path within the Cemetery a greater net weight than the next mentioned, that is to say:

- (i) For each wheel or any two wheeled vehicle a net weight of .75 tonnes.
- (ii) For each single wheel of any four-wheeled vehicle, a net weight of .75 tonnes.
- (iii) For each double wheel or any four-wheeled vehicle, a net weight of 1 tonne.
- (iv) For each wheel of any vehicle having more than four wheels, a net weight of .75 tonnes.

(b) Tradesmen shall enter and leave the Cemetery by the Western gateway only.

13. No person:—

- (a) Shall affix any bill, or stencil mark to any tree, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, pillar, railing, kerbing, or memorial erection in the Cemetery or its approaches.
- (b) Shall cut, break, remove, or deface any of the statuary, trees, shrubs, plants, seats, gates, posts, fences, or erections in the Cemetery.
- (c) Shall write upon any of the statuary, trees, shrubs, plants, seats, gates, posts, fences, or erections in the Cemetery.
- (d) Shall cut, pluck, gather, take or injure any of the plants, flowers, or fruit in the Cemetery.

(e) Shall interfere with or injure any of the grass plots, trees, shrubs, flowers, vases, labels, fish, birds, animals, or other property in the Cemetery.

(f) Shall do any injury or damage to any road or pathway in the Cemetery.

(g) Shall remove or interfere in any way with or injure any article whatsoever attached to the land or built or placed on or in any grave or burying place or land in the Cemetery.

(h) Shall climb any of the trees or shrubs in the Cemetery or climb or jump over any of the seats or fences therein or stand or lie on any of the seats therein.

(i) Shall behave in an improper or offensive manner, or use bad language, or commit any act of indecency within the Cemetery.

(j) Shall drive or cause to be driven any motor vehicle within the Cemetery at a speed in excess of 15 km per hour.

(k) Shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle except on the defined main road of the Cemetery.

(l) Shall carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling or promote or advertise the same by any means whatsoever.

(m) In the employ of the Trustees shall whilst in the Cemetery canvas the engagement of any monumental mason or sculptor, stone-cutters, or other to erect or repair monuments or to do any other work in the Cemetery.

(n) Other than relatives of the deceased therein interred or the owner for the time being of the Certificate of Right of Burial or his relatives, shall dress or decorate any grave within the Cemetery without first obtaining the written authority of the Trustees so to do. Such authority shall be subject to such conditions as the Trustees may direct from time to time.

(o) Shall distribute any handbill, card, circular, or advertisement in the Cemetery.

(p) Shall disturb any funeral service being conducted at any grave.

(q) Shall cause or permit or suffer any animal to trespass or stay or be at large within the Cemetery.

(r) Shall do any work in close proximity to a grave where a burial service is being conducted.

(s) In the employ of the Trustees, shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than wages received from the Trustees, in the normal course of his employment and any person employed under the Trustees accepting any such gratuity, or becoming pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

(t) Shall carry firearms, pea rifles, or other offensive weapons, within the Cemetery.

(u) Being a female shall enter any enclosure set apart for exclusive use of males.

(v) Being a male above the age of seven years shall enter any enclosure set apart for exclusive use of females.

14. The Trustees shall have the power to remove from any burial allotment or memorial any unsightly ornament such as glass/plastic bottles, jars, milk bottles, tins, decayed and broken wreaths, dead flowers, plastic flowers and wreaths and/or any article which in the opinion of the Trustees lowers the standard of the Cemetery. Fresh flowers are authorized and encouraged but must be placed in the bronze or other specified flower containers, the type of which the Trustees shall from time to time authorize and which the Trustees shall supply at reasonable cost.

15. Any workman whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the Cemetery be subject to the supervision, directions and control of the Secretary or other Officer duly appointed by the Trustees, and shall obey all such directions, and may be removed from the Cemetery upon any breach of the Regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

16. All decorations which have been allowed to fall into decay, and present a dilapidated and unsightly appearance also all trees and shrubs, etc. which the Trustees may consider unsuitable, unsightly or overgrown, or which may appear to be causing injury to any erection, may be removed by the Trustees at any time after the expiration

of 30 days after notification in writing has been given to the owner of such grave. A notice sent by prepaid post to the last known address of such owner shall be deemed to be sufficient notice under this regulation.

17. All rubbish is to be placed in the receptacles provided in the Cemetery for that purpose.

18. All fees and other charges which the Trustees are by these Rules and Regulations authorized to impose may be sued for and recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

19. The Trustees may charge and receive the fees and charges as laid down by the Trust and approved by the Governor in Council from time to time.

#### INTERMENTS.

20. Every application for interment in the Cemetery shall be made at the Office of the Trustees and shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Right of Burial and such particulars as are set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, and no order for interment shall be issued until such particulars and all fees, costs, and charges as fixed by these Rules and Regulations are paid to the Trustees. No corpse shall be interred or deposited in the Cemetery contrary to this regulation unless special permission in writing is given by the Trustees.

21. The undertaker or person making application for an order for interment shall place full particulars as provided by Regulation 20 in the hands of the Secretary or Officer in Charge within such time prior to the interment as is limited hereunder that is to say:—

For interments on Monday morning, particulars as aforesaid shall be given before 11 a.m. on the preceding Saturday.

For interment on the morning of Tuesday to Saturday, inclusive particulars as aforesaid shall be given before 1.30 p.m. on the day preceding the interment.

For interments on the afternoon of Monday to Saturday, inclusive particulars as aforesaid shall be given not later than 8 a.m. on the day of the interment.

For interments on Sundays, particulars as aforesaid shall be given before 10 a.m. on the preceding Saturday.

Where less than eight working hours notice has been given for any interment in a new grave and where less than six working hours notice has been given for an interment in an existing grave an additional charge as prescribed by the Trustees may be made against and may be payable by the undertaker or person making application as aforesaid.

For interments on Award Holidays particulars as aforesaid shall be given not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day preceding such holiday except when such holiday falls on Monday when the aforesaid particulars shall be given not later than 12 noon on the preceding Saturday.

An order from the Secretary or Authorized Officer shall be proper authority to the Officers of the Cemetery for the interment of every corpse mentioned in such order.

22. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead, copper or other approved plate, with the name of the deceased distinctly stamped or engraved thereon.

23. Every undertaker or person bringing a body for interment shall make such interment under the direction of the Secretary or Officer in Charge.

24. Any person desiring to reopen a grave or a vault for the purpose of an interment shall not less than eight hours prior to the time fixed for such interment, remove the head and foot stones, kerbing slabs, and/or monuments necessary to permit such interment, and shall immediately after the interment duly and properly replace same in the positions in all respects (subject to the approval of the Trustees) in which the same were standing prior to removal aforesaid.

25. Notwithstanding the last preceding regulation the Trustees may, if they think fit, upon the request of the person desiring the reopening and upon payment by him shall remove and replace the head and foot stones, kerbing slabs, and/or monuments when graves or vaults are required to be opened, but the Trustees whilst taking reasonable care shall not be legally liable for any damage which may occur in the performance of such work.

26. The hours during which funerals may arrive at the Office in the Cemetery are as follows:—

Monday to Friday, inclusive	9 a.m. till 4 p.m.
Saturday	9 a.m. till 11 a.m.
Sundays and holidays (for which special permission must be given)	9 a.m. till 11 a.m.

27. The time appointed for any funeral to arrive at the Cemetery shall be notified to the proper Officer at least eight working hours before the time appointed for such

arrival and such time shall be punctually observed. An extra fee to be determined from time to time by the Trustees for each half hour or portion thereof shall be charged in the event of any funeral arriving after the time appointed therefore.

28. Except as provided in the next rule no interment shall be permitted in any private grave, vault, or other erection without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial.

29. The written consent of the owner or the legal holder for the time being of the Certificate of Right of Burial shall be given for any interment in a private grave, vault, or other erection of any body in all cases where in the opinion of the Trustees the applicant for interment has no right to apply for such interment or in all cases where the Certificate of Right of Burial cannot be produced.

30. Any person desiring a brick grave, vault, or other similar erection shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the directions of the Secretary or other proper Officer and on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron.

31. Any person desiring to erect any memorial or other construction within the Cemetery or to kerb land in respect of which he is the holder of an exclusive right of burial shall make or cause to be made application for a permit, in writing, authorizing such work to be carried out.

32. In the case of erections and/or kerbing, renovations, alterations, the engraving or inscriptions or any other work permitted under these Rules and Regulations, all such applications shall be made to the Trustees and the owner's consent, in writing, to the carrying out of such work shall be submitted with the application.

33. All applications shall be made in the form of the third Schedule of these Regulations, and all information required by the Trustees as indicated on such Schedule shall be furnished by the applicant.

34. All applications shall be lodged with the Secretary at his Office.

35. A copy of every proposed inscription and drawing of every proposed memorial, erection, and kerbing, drawn to scale or with figured overall measurements thereon, and a statement of the approximate weight of such memorial shall be submitted to the Secretary and approved by him prior to the cutting or erection of the same.

36. Each application form and copy of proposed inscription shall be printed, typed, or completely written in ink, and the drawing tendered shall be drawn in ink, and every form, copy of inscription, or drawing not complying with this regulation, or which is soiled, unclear, or dilapidated, shall be rejected.

37. All information furnished by a monumental mason on the application form shall be correct, and he shall sign the application form in verification of its correctness.

38. Every permit issued by the Secretary for the erection or carrying out of work must be delivered to the Secretary or Officer in Charge, or lodged at the Office of the Secretary before such work is commenced. If for any reason work which is commenced is left incomplete the site and surroundings must be left thoroughly clean and tidy to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

39. All persons (other than employees of the Trustees) who have obtained a permit authorizing the carrying out of any work in the Cemetery shall commence work not earlier than 8 a.m. on a working day (being Mondays to Saturdays, both inclusive, only, and not including Cemetery Employees Award Holidays) during which the Cemetery is open and shall work not later than 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 11 a.m. on Saturdays.

40. All materials required in construction of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken in to the Cemetery.

41. No material with a fault of any description shall be used in any erection or construction within the Cemetery.

42. No material of any description shall be delivered to the Cemetery or placed on any portion therein by any person without the consent of the Secretary or Officer in Charge, and all materials so delivered shall be deposited only where directed by such Secretary or Officer in Charge, and such Secretary or Officer in Charge shall have the right to order the removal of any materials deposited on any site without such consent or contrary to such direction.

43. No memorial work shall be taken from the Cemetery for the purpose of making alterations or additions thereto without the consent of the Secretary or Officer in Charge having first been obtained.

44. No stone or other material shall be rolled or levered along roads or pathways or over lawns, but must be moved by being placed upon a hand-truck and where considered necessary by the Secretary or Officer in Charge the hand-truck must be drawn over planks.

45. Stones from a vehicle shall not be unloaded on to a roadway except on to pads placed in position.

46. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out such work and he shall immediately repair and make good, to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Officer in Charge, all damage caused by him in the execution of such work.

47. The Trustees may, in such portions of the Cemetery as they see fit, disallow the construction of concrete and granolite kerbs and headpieces.

48. Specifications for all concrete work and foundations shall be as laid down by the Trustees from time to time.

49. Foundations for all materials on allotments 2.44m x 1.22m or multiples thereof shall be carried to the full depth of the grave.

50. The Officer in Charge may insist on deep foundations for all work in portions of the Cemetery where the ground is unstable or where it is considered that ordinary foundations would be unsuitable.

51. For monuments, vaults, or special designs proper foundations constructed to suit the design shall be carried to the full depth of the grave.

52. Before any foundation work is commenced approval must first be obtained from the Secretary or Officer in Charge as to the type and manner of construction of same and such decision shall be faithfully obeyed in the execution of such work, which shall be carried out under the direction and supervision of the Trustees Officers.

53. Kerbing and memorials, including all projections, shall not project beyond the boundary of the allotment, and shall be set in line, plumb and level.

54. Rock-faced work shall not project more than 4 cm beyond the arris or pitch level.

55. When a kerbing or memorial is erected the whole space between the new kerbing and the adjoining kerbing shall be filled with concrete to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge. Concrete laid in the form of paving shall be not less than three inches thick and shall be of the same specification as the concrete for foundations as specified in clause 48.

56. The minimum thickness of any kerbing for allotments 2.44m x 1.22m or multiple thereof shall be 15 cm. and for allotments 2.44m x .91m or multiples thereof 10 cm.

57. No ledger or covering slab shall be less than 5 cm. thick.

58. Every ledger or covering slab shall have a bearing not less than 1.3 cm. wide on the kerbing.

59. A continuous metal railing around an allotment shall have a continuous stone kerbing under it.

60. When graves are to be covered with concrete and chippings or pebbles such concrete coverings shall be not less than 5 cm. thick and shall be composed of four parts bluestone or granite screenings, two parts clean sharp sand to one part first quality cement. A brick or concrete support shall be placed in each corner.

61. No wooden memorialization shall be permitted.

62. Concrete coverings shall be set within the kerbing and shall not be made in the form of ledgers projecting above the kerbing.

63. All works shall be solidly and substantially built and properly finished to the satisfaction of the Secretary or the Officer in Charge. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations the Secretary or Officer in Charge may order the removal of any work which in his opinion is shoddy, flimsy or where inferior materials have been used, or where faulty workmanship has been performed.

64. The designer's or Mason's name and address, may, with the owner's consent be placed upon memorial work provided that the lettering is not more than 2 cm. size. In case where firms have trade name plates of approved design the area of such plate shall not exceed 80 sq. cm.

65. When any vault, monument, tablet, gravestone, monumental inscription, kerbing, railing, or other construction has been erected built, or placed in the Cemetery contrary to these Regulations or without the order of the Trustees contrary to the terms and conditions of authority to erect, build, or place the same, the Trustees may take down and remove such vault, monument, tablet, gravestone, monumental inscription, kerbing, railing, or other erections.

66. Touting for business within the Cemetery area is strictly forbidden, and Cemetery employees are not permitted to act as agents for monumental masons, directly

or indirectly, or to receive gratuities or commissions of any kind. Any employee of the Trust not complying with this regulation will be subject to summary dismissal.

67. No Monumental Mason or his employees shall enter the Cemetery for business purposes on any Saturday unless he shall have notified the Secretary of the Cemetery beforehand of a definite appointment with a client or unless he shall have brought such client to the Cemetery.

68. No soil shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any Grave except by permission of the Secretary or Officer in Charge.

69. No body (including the body of a stillborn child) or portion of a body shall be buried in a grave unless it is fully encased in a coffin of wood or other approved material.

## PART II.

Regulations made by the Trustees of the Geelong Western Public Cemetery, for the Management of the Cemetery.

1. The Trustees shall hold regular Meetings of the transaction of the business of the Cemetery, and shall hold at least 10 such meetings each year.

2. The Trustees at the first meeting in each second year shall elect one of their number as Chairman and one as Deputy Chairman. Should the Office of Chairman become vacant at any time the vacancy should be filled by the Deputy Chairman who shall hold Office for the residue of the term for which the Chairman was first appointed.

3. All meetings shall be held at such times and places as the Trustees shall by resolution direct, and two clear days notice of such meetings shall be served on each Trustee by delivering it to him personally or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter addressed to him at his usual last known place of abode.

4. At such meeting of Trustees three shall form a quorum. No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present, and if within half an hour of the time appointed for the meetings a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned to a day to be fixed by the Secretary.

5. In the absence of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman at any such meeting of Trustees the Trustees shall appoint one of their number to be Chairman.

6. The Secretary shall, at the request of the Chairman or of any two of their number, convene a special meeting of the Trustees. Notice shall be given to the Trustees of such meeting specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

7. All questions arising at any Meeting of the Trustees shall be decided by a show of hands, or, if demanded by any Trustee by a division. Each Trustee, including the Chairman, shall have one vote. In the event of the numbers being equal, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

8. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings of the Trustees.

9. No resolution of the Trustees shall be varied or rescinded for one calendar month after such resolution has been passed except at a special meeting of the Trustees called upon for the purpose or by an absolute majority of the whole of the Trustees.

10. The Trustees shall keep proper books of record of the business transacted by them.

11. The Trustees shall prepare in due course and in proper form Abstracts of Accounts, Declaration and Returns, which the Trustees are required by law to prepare, and to publish or transmit to the Commission of Public Health or otherwise.

12. The Trustees shall keep all books and registers which the Trustees are by law required to keep.

13. The Secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the Trustees and issue the official receipt forthwith. No receipt shall be valid unless on the form supplied by the Trustees and signed by the Secretary or other person authorized by the Trustees so to do.

14. All moneys received shall be deposited in the bank where the Trustees' account is kept, to their credit.

15. All accounts shall be paid by cheque and every cheque drawn on behalf of the Trustees shall be signed by two Trustees or by the Secretary and one Trustee.

16. No payments shall be made without the authority of the Trustees.

17. Cheques shall not be drawn by the Secretary except for moneys the payment whereof has been duly authorized by the Trustees.

18. A Statement showing the income and expenditure for the previous Month shall be furnished by the Secretary at each Meeting of the Trustees, and the Bank book showing the balance at the end of the previous Month shall also be produced at each Meeting.

19. One cheque book only shall be used, which shall be numbered consecutively, and shall be produced at each Monthly Meeting.

20. A list of accounts payable shall be submitted at each Monthly Meeting.

21. All Certificates of Right of Burial shall be signed by three Trustees and by the Secretary.

22. An Auditor shall at the first Meeting in each year be appointed to audit the books and accounts of the Cemetery of each year and to report upon same to the Trustees through their Chairman.

23. The Secretary and other Officers appointed by the Trustees shall make themselves thoroughly conversant with the Rules, Regulations, and By-Laws, and shall enforce such Rules, Regulations and By-Laws without respect of persons and with civility and forbearance.

24. No workman, other than those employed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to remain in the Cemetery after 5 p.m.

25. The Trustees shall have power to appoint all Officers, servants and employees necessary for the management of the Cemetery, and such Officers, Servants and employees shall hold Office at the will of the Trustees and under such terms and conditions, and at such remunerations, as the Trustees may approve.

(1) **First Division.**—A Flood Protection Rate of 8.0 cents in the dollar of the rateable value of all lands in the First Division, being the lands included within the red border on the plans of such district signed and sealed by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission and lodged at the office of the Commission at Melbourne, excepting and excluding all lands in the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Divisions as described hereunder.

(2) **Second Division.**—A Flood Protection Rate of 6.0 cents in the dollar of the rateable value of all lands in the Second Division marked on the aforesaid plans in the manner shown opposite the words "Second Division" in the legend thereto.

(3) **Third Division.**—A Flood Protection Rate of 4.0 cents in the dollar of the rateable value of all lands in the Third Division marked on the aforesaid plans in the manner shown opposite the words "Third Division" in the legend thereto.

(4) **Fourth Division.**—A Flood Protection Rate of 2.0 cents in the dollar of the rateable value of all lands in the Fourth Division marked on the aforesaid plans in the manner shown opposite the words "Fourth Division" in the legend thereto.

(5) **Fifth Division.**—No rate is made or shall be levied in respect of the lands marked on the aforesaid plans in the manner shown opposite the words "Fifth Division" in the legend thereto.

Provided that the sum of Two Dollars shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any land or tenement liable to be rated in the said district.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 8 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 8 cents per kilolitre.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at \$10.00.

5. The charge for water for those properties supplied from the Willung Road Main pipeline outside the Urban District is fixed in accordance with the following Schedule:—

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at \$5.

5. The aforesaid charge shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

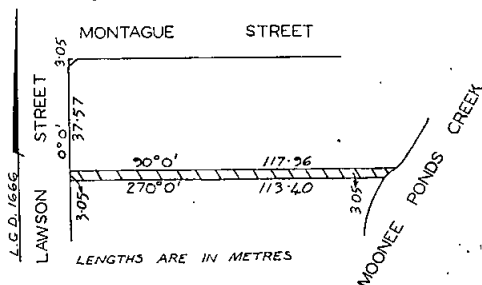

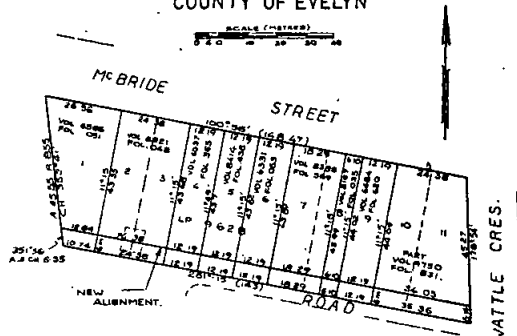

Attention is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the *Government Gazette*:—

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

##### 1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 14, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

##### 2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matters for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
