

SANCTION TO TRANSFER OF PORTION OF BENDIGO LEGACY CLUB PATRIOTIC FUND No. 66 TO THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND TRUSTS CORPORATION FOR THE DIOCESE OF BENDIGO.

THE DIOCESE OF BENDIGO.

Whereas sub-section (1) of section 12A of the Patriotic Funds Act 1958 provides inter alia that, where in the opinion of the trustees of a patriotic fund (not being a patriotic fund administered by the Patriotic Funds Council of Victoria) it would more successfully accomplish the purposes for which the fund was established if any portion of the patriotic fund were transferred to a corporation having charitable objects, the trustees may with the sanction of the Governor in Council transfer the portion of the patriotic fund to the corporation to be held by it upon such trusts as are specified by the Governor in Council, whereupon the portion of the patriotic fund shall vest in the corporation to be held and applied by it accordingly; accordingly;

And whereas the Bendigo Legacy Club Patriotic Fund No. 66 is a patriotic fund of the kind hereinbefore referred

And whereas the Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Bendigo is a corporation constituted under an Act of the Parliament of Victoria and having charitable objects;

And whereas the trustees of the said patriotic fund have signified their opinion that it would more successfully accomplish the purposes for which the fund was established if an amount of \$16,000 were transferred to the said cor-

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order give his sanction to the transfer by the Trustees of Bendigo Legacy Club Patriotic Fund No. 66 to the Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Bendigo (hereinafter called "the Corporation") of an amount of \$16,000 from the said patriotic fund to be held by the Corporation on the following trusts:—

- (1) To apply the said amount toward the cost of erecting and equipping of four units in the Home for the Aged at Eaglehawk known as St. Laurence Court, Bendigo.
- (2) To return the amount to the trustees of the said fund (and any income received therefrom) if the proposed units are not completed and occupied within two years of the transfer or such further time as is allowed by the trustees of the said fund of the said fund.
- (3) To keep the buildings fully insured and to take all necessary steps to ensure that any requirements arising under the law of the Commonwealth relating to social services and social security, the Hospitals and Charities Act 1958 or any other similar law are complied with in respect thereof.
- (4) To make four units available in perpetuity for aged widows of ex-servicemen upon the follow-ing conditions—
  - (a) The Bendigo Legacy Club shall have the right to nominate qualified persons as soon as the proposed units are ready for occupation;

- (b) When any of the nominated occupants dies or vacates a unit, the Club shall have the right to nominate a qualified person to take her place, but if the Club fails to nominate a person within a reasonable time, the Corporation shall have the right to fill the vacancy from the general public, but the Club shall have the right to nominate a qualified person for the next vacancy;
- (c) The procedure shall be followed in perpetuity;
- (d) The Corporation shall advise the Club of the date of admission and the date of discharge of any nominated occupant
- (e) Any qualified person occupying a unit otherwise than upon the nomination of the Club made as provided by these trusts shall not be regarded as having been provided with accommodation in accordance with these trusts;
- (f) The Corporation shall not be obliged to accept a nominated person who does not comply with the ordinary condi-tions for payment or undergo any interview or examination ordinarily required for admission;
- (g) Any fees or charges to be paid in respect of accommodation in the Home of any nominated person shall be agreed upon between the nominated person and the Home authorities; and
- (h) A nominated person shall be required to vacate a unit if declared unable to care for herself by a doctor.

# SHOPPING TROLLEYS BY-LAW.

A By-Law of the City of Footscray made under the provisions of paragraph (xia) of sub-section (1) of Section 197 and Sections 212 and 213 of the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and all other powers it enabling thereto and numbered 294 for and with respect to suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray HEREBY ORDERS as follows

- 1. This By-law shall be known as the Shopping Trolleys By-law.
- 2. This By-law shall come into operation upon its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole Municipal district.
- 4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Council" means the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray.
    "Municipal district" means the Municipal District of
  - the City of Footscray.

- "Proper Officer" means any person appointed by the Council pursuant to the provisions of Section 158 of the Local Government Act who assists in the execution of By-laws made under such Act.
- "Person" shall include a corporation unless there is something repugnant to or inconsistent with that interpretation.
- "Public Place" means-
  - (i) any street, road, lane or passage;
  - (ii) any park, public reserve or other place of public resort or public recreation;
  - (iii) any railway station, platform or carriageway;
  - (iv) any open place (including a car park) to which the public whether upon or with-out payment for admittance have or are permitted to have access;
  - (v) any public place within the meaning of the words "public place" whether by virtue of this By-Law or otherwise;
- "Street" includes any highway and any public bridge and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not, not-withstanding that it may be formed on private property.
- "Trolley" means a wheeled cart designed to carry goods commonly provided or used at self-service super-markets stores or shops for the convenience of customers making purchases there.
- 5. No person shall leave a trolley standing in a public place.
- 6. Any trolley left standing in a public place may be removed by the proper officer and taken to any pound or such other place as the Council appoints for the purpose where it may be retained subject to this By-law.

# INCINERATORS AND NUISANCES BY-LAW.

A By-law of the City of Footscray made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered ... 295 for the purpose of preventing and extinguishing fires and suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows—

- 1. This By-law shall be known as the Incinerators and Nuisances By-law and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Footscray.
- 2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Authorised Officer" means and includes the Town

    "Clerk, all Health Inspectors and By-law Officers
    employed by the Council and any other employee
    of the Council for the time being authorized by it
  - in that behalf.

    "Barbecue" includes any device or contraption used or adapted for use for cooking food in the open air.
  - "Building" includes a dwelling and any building whether temporary or permanent and any part thereof and includes outbuildings.
  - "Council" means the Council of the City of Footscray.

- 3. No person shall light any fire or burn any matter material or substance on any land or premises except in an incinerator.
- 4. No person shall use any incinerator or keep or allow to be kept any incinerator in which it is proposed to burn any matter material or substance on any land or premises unless such incinerator is:
  - (a) fitted with a lid and a spark arrestor and is so constructed or covered as to prevent the emis-sion of sparks or burning material or the spread of fire therefrom,
  - (b) constructed of brick, stone, concrete, cement metal or other material approved by the Council or an Authorized Officer, and
  - (c) (i) distant at least 1.8 metres from the nearest point of any fence or the boundary of any adjoining allotment or any street,
    - (ii) distant at least 3 metres from the nearest point of any building whether on the same or adjoining land,
    - (iii) surrounded for a distance of at least 1.8 metres in all directions by open ground which is free of all combustible material. Provided that such specified distances may in any particular case be modified varied or waived by the Council.

- 5. No person shall light or cause to be lit or burn or cause to be burned any matter material or substance on any land or premises, in such a manner or to such an extent as shall cause quantities of smoke, fumes, odours or ash to be emitted from the said land or premises as would cause a nuisance to any person upon any land or premises or upon any street or road.
- 6. Any person who in the opinion of an Authorised Officer is causing or permitting or suffering to exist on any land or premises a nuisance or danger shall immediately extinguish all burning matter if so directed by the Authorised Officer.
  - 7. Nothing in this By-law shall prohibit:
    - (a) the bona fide use of a barbecue for the cooking of food,
    - (b) the lighting of a fire inside a building in a fire-place, stove or other suitable device,
    - (c) the lighting of a fire or the burning of any material in respect of which a written permit has been issued by the Council or an Authorised Officer provided that there has been full compliance with the conditions (if any) stipulated in such permit.
- 8. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

  - (b) requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 1 metre of any portion of a fence within 9 metres of the junction of any streets or roads;

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and every and any other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall be known as the Fencing at Intersections By-law, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Footscray
- 2. By-Law No. 140 of the City of Footscray is hereby repealed.
- 3. No person shall use any private property situated at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree, shrub or hedge abutting on any such street or road, or within 3 metres therefrom, unless for a distance of 9 metres from the corner of such private property each part of such tree, shrub or hedge is kept at a height not preseter than 1 metre above that point on the surface level. greater than 1 metre above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub or hedge.
- part of such tree, shrub or hedge.

  4. Where any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads is used contrary to the provisions of clause 3 hereof, the Council of the said City of Footscray at any time by notice, in writing, under the hand of an officer of the said City may require the owner or occupier of such private property within the time specified in such notice to lop all trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1958) growing contrary to clause 3 hereof on such private property where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 3 metres of any such street or road in such manner that each part of such trees, shrubs or hedges shall be kept at a height not greater than 1 metre above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such trees, shrubs or hedges.
- 5. No person shall cause or permit a fence to remain on private property at a greater height than 1 metre within 9 metres of the junction of any streets or roads.
- 6. Where any fence within 9 metres of the junction of any streets or roads exceeds 1 metre in height contrary to the provisions of clause 5 hereof, the Council of the said City of Footscray at any time by notice, in writing, under the hand of an Officer of the said City may require the owner or occupier of the property upon which such fence exists, within the time specified in such notice, to reduce the fence in height.
- reduce the fence in height.

  7. Should default be made by any owner or occupier in complying with any notice under clause 6 hereof within the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Council may by its engineer enter upon such private property so situate as aforesaid, with a sufficient number of workmen and reduce any fence in height as required by such notice and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council, and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 8. In the event of any owner or occupier failing to comply with the directions contained in a notice served on such owner or occupier under the provisions of clauses 4 or 6 hereof within the time therein limited then such owner or occupier shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 9. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100, and to a further penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any
- 10. In this By-law the word "corner" shall mean the point at which the building lines of any private property abutting on the streets or roads at the junction of which such private property is situate, meet, or if extended, would meet and the words "surface level" shall mean:—
  - (a) where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved, the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.
  - (b) If such footway is not paved by the level of the street or road abutting on such private property but has been fixed in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part XIX of the Local Government Act 1958 or any previous or subsequent Act of Parliament of a like nature, the level as so fixed of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question.
  - (c) Otherwise the actual level of that part of the street or road nearest to the private property in question.


