REWARD

Notice is hereby given that a reward of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) will be paid by the Government of Victoria in accordance with the conditions set out hereunder for information leading to the location of Douglas McDonald Barr, aged 29 years and his wife, Helen Victoria Barr, aged 27 years, and to the apprehension of any person or persons who may have committed an offence connected with their disappearance.

It is believed that Mr. and Mrs. Barr motored to Eildon, Victoria, at about 8.20 a.m. on Saturday, 15th February, 1975. They were last seen together near their off-white coloured Mini-Minor motor car, Registered No. JXC-049, on the banks of the Lake Eildon Boat Harbour at Eildon, at about 2.00 p.m. on that day.

On the 16th February, 1975, their car and a rug, together with some items of male and female clothing, were found on the shore of the pondage which is below the Eildon Dam Wall.

Conditions.

The allocation of this reward will be at the sole discretion of the Chief Commissioner of Police, Melbourne and it should be noted that no reward will be paid where death has occurred other than through foul play.
