MURDER

REWARD.

Notice is hereby given that a reward of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) will be paid by the Government of Victoria for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the murder of Noel Richard McCoy at Rosanna, Melbourne, Victoria, on or about the 14th October, 1975.

The body of Noel Richard McCoy was found in premises situated at 285 Lower Plenty Road, Rosanna, and the deceased had suffered multiple wounds to the head and chest, together with multiple bruising and contusions to head, chest and arms.

CONDITIONS.

1. The person or persons giving information leading to the apprehension and conviction of a person or persons guilty of the above-mentioned crime will receive such amount or amounts not exceeding \$10,000 as shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

2. The person or persons entitled to any reward and the amount or amounts payable to such person or persons shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.
