



FORREST WATERWORKS TRUST. By-LAW No. 9.

The Forrest Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a by-law as follows:—

'1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously, and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereafter called "The meter year") shall be the basis of the calculations of charges payable under this by-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of the meter year the quantity of water measured as having

been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

- Subject as hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—
 - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9 cents per 1000 gallons) for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect to the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said metal water water and the said metal to the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
- "(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in Paragraph (a) of this Clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9) .05 cents per 1000 gailons).
- 3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9 cents per 1000 gallons).
- .4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the minimum annual charge imposed by the Trust for any
- 5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owners or occupiers at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.
- 6. The provisions of Clauses 4, 5, and 6 of this by-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.





Town and Country Planning Act 1961, (Twelfth Schedule). LAKE CAIRN CURRAN PLANNING SCHEME. . . .

NOTICE THAT A PLANNING SCHEME HAS BEEN PREPARED AND IS AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION.

Notice is hereby given that the Town and Country Planning Board in pursuance of its powers under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 has prepared a Planning Scheme for land around the lake in the Shires of Maldon, Newstead and Tullaroop, for the purpose of controlling the use or development of land. A short purport of the scheme is as follows:—

"The Scheme has been prepared so as to achieve the orderly planning of the area around Lake Cairn Curran by nominating (by the use of zonings) those areas which are, or are planned to be, rural areas, urban areas, areas of scenic attraction and special use areas. The Scheme provides for the limitation of land development and use within the different zones so that the land uses in each within the different zones so that the land uses in each zone will accord with the uses appropriate to each zone and achieve the two main aims of the Scheme, namely:

- 1. To protect the lake and its immediate catchment from any type of development which could lead either immediately or indirectly to a deterioration in quality of the stored water; and
- 2. To maintain the rural use and character of the surrounding land.

The zones provided for in the Scheme are Rural, Rural Scenic, Rural Highway, Township, Forest and Special Uses. In the Rural Zone, agriculture, animal husbandry and certain other uses are permitted.

Other uses are subject to permit and others are prohibited. In the Rural Scenic and Rural Highway Zones, agriculture, animal husbandry and home occupation are permitted whilst other uses are subject to permit or are prohibited to a greater degree than in the Rural Zone. In the Township Zone a house and certain other uses are permitted. Certain other uses are restricted or prohibited in the Forest Zone forestry is permitted and all other uses prohibited. In the Special Uses Zone particular purposes indicated on the Planning Scheme Map are permitted.

Reservations for public open space and public purposes are provided for in the Scheme.

Roads are specified as main, secondary or minor roads and this specification, in some cases regulates adjoining

Ison uses.

Special provision is also made in the Scheme for planning controls affecting provision for drainage disposal, termination of drains and effluent lines in relation to full supply level of the Lake and water courses, height of buildings, subdivision in the Rural Rural Scenic and Rural Highway Zones, houses on existing allotments, buildings lines in the Rural Highway Zone, development in the Rural Highway Zone, advertising signs, blocks of flats and residential buildings, camping areas, caravan parks, extractive industries, limited access roads, motels, parking of vehicles, sawmills, service stations and existing non-conforming uses. Persons who might be effected by the Scheme must appreciate that the Purport set out above is not in any way, to be taken as a substitute for the Scheme or any part thereof. Because of the need to make the statement of purport concise it has not been possible to deal with a number of exceptions and requirements applicable to particular uses or in particular circumstances. References must always be made to the Scheme."

A copy of the scheme has been deposited at the office of the Town and Country Planning Board, 235 Queen Street, Melbourne, and, as to so much of the scheme as relates to land in their respective municipal districts, at the offices of the Shire of Maldon, Maldon; the Shire of Newstead, Newstead; and will be open for inspection thereat during office hours by any person, free of charge.

Sub-section (2) of the said section 4 provides that if the Governor in Council is satisfied that, in the event of the benefits conferred by Part II. of the said Act being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of any Commonwealth country not including the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia, or given in the superior Courts of any foreign country, substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within that Commonwealth country or in that foreign country, as the case may be, of judgments given in the superior courts of Victoria, he may by Order direct that the said Part II. shall extend to that Commonwealth country or to that foreign country and that such courts as are specified in the Order shall, be deemed superior courts of that Commonwealth country or of that foreign country for the purposes of the said Part II.
- IV. The Governor in Council is satisfied that, in the event of the said Part II. being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order, substantial reciprocity of treatment will under the laws of those countries be assured as respects the enforcement therein of judgments given in the







- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves or in any portion thereof or in any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any-disturbance.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way any of the footpaths, water pipes, drinking taps, tools, appliances, seats, buildings, fences, walls or other properties or erections, or trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserves.

- 4 No person shall in any of the Reserves—
 (a) Climb or jump over or upon any of the fences,
 monuments, gates, buildings, or trees.
- ... v(b) Place any bill, placard, or other document on, or which further or paint on, or otherwise mark any gate, so fence, structure, building, seat, wall or tree without, the written consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (c) Scatter about or throw down handbills, placards, notices advertisements, books, pamphlets, · divergraphers or any like matter.
- (d) Distribute or give out to any person or persons many handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers, programmes or any like matter except with the written consent of the Committee.
 - (e) Throw, place or leave any glass, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish or any like matter.
 - (f) Roll, place or discharge any stone or other missile. ii (g) Interfere with or in any way damage any notice, placard, sign or regulations.
 - (h) Light 'any' fires without the written permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 5. No person shall put or take or allow to wander into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the written permission of the Committee.
- 6. No person shall take into any of the Reserves any dog which is not led or controlled by a leash, chain or cord and no vicious dog shall be taken therein unless securely and efficiently muzzled.
- the Committee, camp in any of the Reserves or erect therein any tent or building, booth or other structure, and no person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, hawk or offer any articles for sale in any of the Reserves.
- 8. No person shall take part in any tennis entertainment, amusement or meeting whatsover in any of the Reserves without, the written permission of the Committee.
- 9. Notperson shall, in any of the Reserves, spit or expectorate on the footpaths or on any structure, building or erection therein or on the floors thereof.

 15. No person shall enter, leave or park in any of the Reserves any horse, vehicle, motor car, motor conveyance, motor cycle, bicycle, or other like conveyance at places other than those as may be appointed or set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
- 16. No person shall, in any of the Reserves erect or remove any post, rail, "fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building or structure without the written consent of the Committee.

17. No person shall, whilst in any of the Reserves be in a state of intoxication or behave in a disorderly manner, or sing any obscene song or ballad, or write or draw any indecent or obscene word, figure, or representation, or use any profane, indecent or obscene language or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with any games, sports or amusements or use any threatening, insulting or abusive words or gestures or otherwise misbehave.

18. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserves for any lawful game or sport, and may from time to time grant to any person, organization club or combination of clubs the use of such portion so set apart upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

19. No person shall wilfully obstruct, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper and lawful use of the Reserves, or of any part thereof, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee, or any person appointed by it, in the execution of his official duty.
