



FORREST WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 9.

The Forrest Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a by-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously, and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereafter called "The meter year") shall be the basis of the calculations of charges payable under this by-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of the meter year the quantity of water measured as having

been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9 cents per 1000 gallons) for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect to the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in Paragraph (a) of this Clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9 cents per 1000 gallons).

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 18 cents per kilolitre (81.9 cents per 1000 gallons).

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the minimum annual charge imposed by the Trust for any land or tenement.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owners or occupiers at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 4, 5, and 6 of this by-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.



RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS. WHEREAS:

- I. The Governor in Council on 27th November, 1973 and 28th January, 1976 made Orders, pursuant to section 4 of the *Foreign Judgments Act 1962* which Orders were published in the *Government Gazette* on 5th December, 1973 and 4th February, 1976 respectively.
- II. The Governor in Council is empowered by sub-section (5) of the said section 4 to revoke any order previously made under that section.
- III. Sub-section (2) of the said section 4 provides that if the Governor in Council is satisfied that, in the event of the benefits conferred by Part II. of the said Act being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of any Commonwealth country not including the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia, or given in the superior Courts of any foreign country, substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within that Commonwealth country or in that foreign country, as the case may be, of judgments given in the superior courts of Victoria, he may by Order direct that the said Part II. shall extend to that Commonwealth country or to that foreign country and that such courts as are specified in the Order shall, be deemed superior courts of that Commonwealth country or of that foreign country for the purposes of the said Part II.
- IV. The Governor in Council is satisfied that, in the event of the said Part II. being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order, substantial reciprocity of treatment will under the laws of those countries be assured as respects the enforcement therein of judgments given in the superior courts.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that—

- (a) the Orders made on 27th November, 1973 and 28th January, 1976, pursuant to the provisions of section 4 of the *Foreign Judgments Act 1962* be revoked;







2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves or in any portion thereof or in any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

3. No person shall damage in any way any of the footpaths, water pipes, drinking taps, tools, appliances, seats, buildings, fences, walls or other properties or erections, or trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserves.

4. No person shall in any of the Reserves—

(a) Climb or jump over or upon any of the fences, monuments, gates, buildings, or trees.

(b) Place any bill, placard, or other document on, or write or paint on, or otherwise mark any gate, fence, structure, building, seat, wall or tree without the written consent of the Committee first obtained.

(c) Scatter about or throw down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers or any like matter.

(d) Distribute or give out to any person or persons any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers, programmes or any like matter, except with the written consent of the Committee.

(e) Throw, place or leave any glass, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish or any like matter.

(f) Roll, place or discharge any stone or other missile.

5. No person shall put or take or allow to wander into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals, without the written permission of the Committee.

8. No person shall take part in any tennis entertainment, amusement or meeting whatsoever in any of the Reserves without the written permission of the Committee.

9. No person shall, in any of the Reserves, spit or expectorate on the footpaths or on any structure, building or erection therein or on the floors thereof.

10. When any sports, entertainments or the like purposes are held in any of the Reserves and any person, club or organization uses, rents or hires any stand, building, structure, erection or enclosure thereon the Committee may require such person, club or organization to deposit with it a sum not exceeding Two hundred dollars by way of guarantee that no damage will be done to such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein and such sum may be used at the absolute discretion of the Committee in making good any damage which may have been done to such stand, building, structure, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, or to any other property in the Reserve, or for any losses otherwise sustained by the Committee by reason of such renting or hiring and any person so renting or hiring shall conform to these Regulations and to any lawful order or direction which may be given by the Committee.

11. All persons using any grandstand or other building in any of the Reserves shall observe any and every lawful order or direction given by the Committee or by any body renting, using or hiring any such stand or building.

12. No person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, engage in tennis or any other game or amusement in any of the Reserves, nor shall any band play therein, without such written permission.

13. No person shall, without the authority of the Committee, enter upon any portion of the Reserves set apart for tennis, or any other game, or for children's playgrounds.

14. Any person, organization or club renting or hiring the Reserves or any part thereof, including any stand, structure, erection or enclosure thereon, for any approved purpose shall pay to the Committee such annual or other charge as the Committee may consider fair and reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

15. No person shall enter, leave or park in any of the Reserves any horse, vehicle, motor car, motor conveyance, motor cycle, bicycle, or other like conveyance at places other than those as may be appointed or set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

16. No person shall, in any of the Reserves erect or remove any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building or structure without the written consent of the Committee.

17. No person shall, whilst in any of the Reserves be in a state of intoxication or behave in a disorderly manner, or sing any obscene song or ballad, or write or draw any indecent or obscene word, figure, or representation, or use any profane, indecent or obscene language or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with any games, sports or amusements or use any threatening, insulting or abusive words or gestures or otherwise misbehave.

18.
