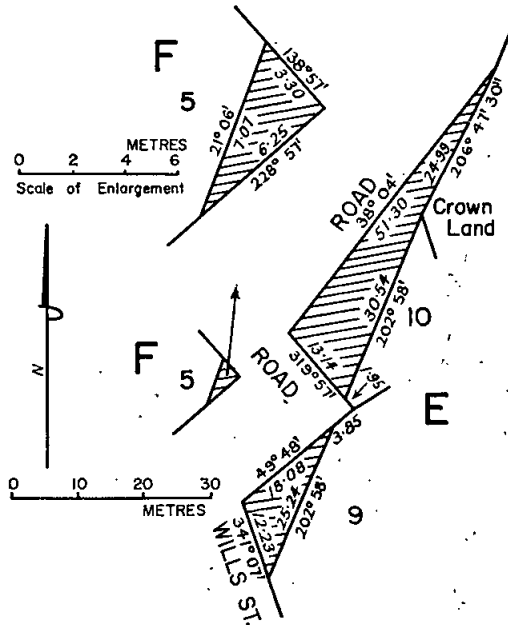

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of Section 4 (2) of the Richmond and Hawthorn Lands Act 1970, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke and make null and void, so far as it relates to the land indicated by hatching on the plan hereunder, the Order in Council of the 13th day of October, 1873, permanently reserving 63.23 hectares (156 acres 1 rood), more or less, of land in the Parish of Jika Jika (Town of Richmond in Order) as a site for Public Park and Recreation. (No. 8731).

DECLARATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 107.

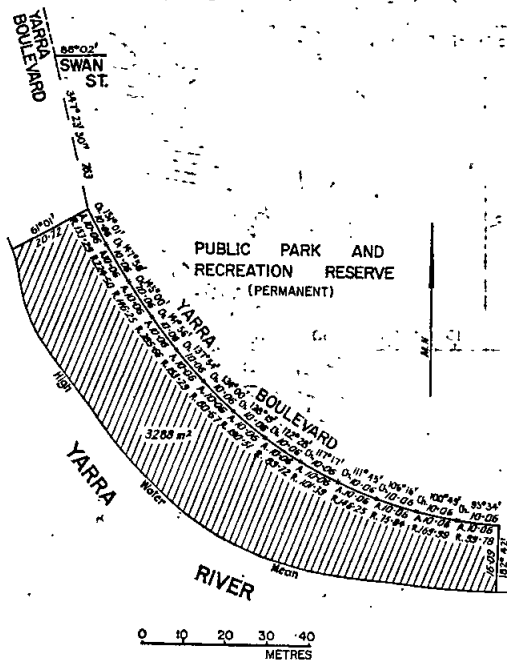
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.  
Whereas:

- I. It is provided by sub-section (2) of section 107 of the Magistrates (Summary Proceedings) Act 1975 that the Governor in Council may by proclamation declare another State or a Territory of the Commonwealth, being a State or Territory having laws providing for enforcement in that State or Territory of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a Magistrates' Court or other Court having a summary jurisdiction in Victoria against a body corporate in that State or Territory, to be a reciprocating State or Territory for the purposes of the enforcement in Victoria of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a Court having summary jurisdiction in the other State or in the Territory against a body corporate in Victoria.
- II. It is provided by sub-section (3) of the said section 107 that the Governor in Council may by proclamation declare a Court having summary jurisdiction in a reciprocating State or Territory for the purposes of the enforcement in Victoria of a fine payable under a conviction, or order of that Court against a body corporate in Victoria.
- III. The Governor in Council is satisfied that the State of Queensland is a State having laws providing for enforcement in that State of a fine payable under a conviction or order of a Magistrates' Court having summary jurisdiction in Victoria against a body corporate in that State.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that on and from the 1st day of July 1976—

- (1) the State of Queensland shall be a reciprocating State pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 107 of the Magistrates (Summary Proceedings) Act 1975 for the purposes of the enforcement in Victoria of any fine payable

under a conviction or order of a Court having summary jurisdiction in that State against a body corporate in Victoria; and

- (2) the Magistrates Courts of the State of Queensland, sitting at the places named in the Schedule hereto, shall be reciprocating Courts pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (3) of the said section 107 for the purposes of the enforcement in Victoria of any fine payable under a conviction or order of the said Courts against a body corporate in Victoria.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia, entitled the *Abattoir and Meat Inspection (Amendment) Act 1976*, No. 8874, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by Proclamation or successive Proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CORIO.

PROCLAMATION

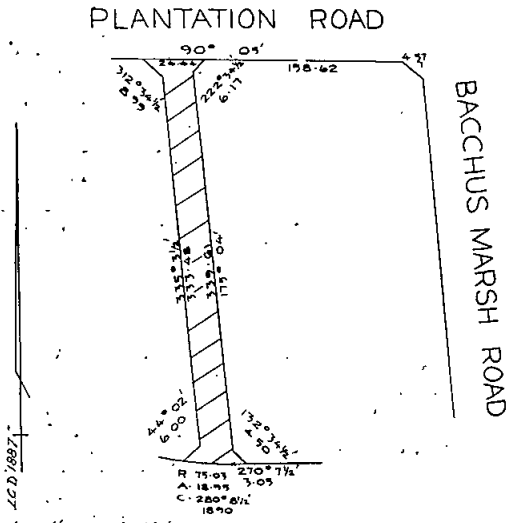
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right of way or any street road lane

or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under sub-division (3) of Division 9 of Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Corio has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating such street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under sub-division (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this proclamation declare that Lincoln Street, Corio shown by hachure on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

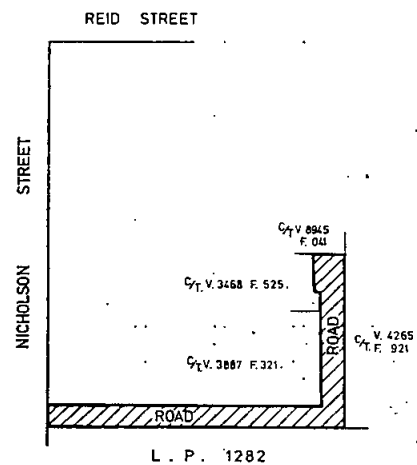

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF KINGLAKE NATIONAL PARK.**

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands, as stipulated in the Schedule hereunder, are deemed to be temporarily reserved as sites for a National Park: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve"), have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

**SCHEDULE.**

- (a) The land being allotment 13d, Parish of Kinglake, surrendered to the Crown (the surrender being registered at the Office of Titles, Melbourne on the 3rd September, 1974), and deemed, under the provisions of section 5 (5) of the *National Parks Act 1970*, to be temporarily reserved as a site for a National Park.
- (b) The land being Lots 17 and 25 on P/S 15857, and forming part of allotment 40, Parish of Kinglake, surrendered to the Crown (the surrender being registered at the Office of Titles, Melbourne on the 3rd September, 1974), and deemed, under the provisions of section 5 (5) of the *National Parks Act 1970*, to be temporarily reserved under the *Land Act 1958* as a site for a National Park.
- (c) The land being Lot 26 on P/S 11104 and forming part of allotment 39, Parish of Kinglake, surrendered to the Crown (the surrender being registered at the Office of Titles, Melbourne on the 18th December 1974), and deemed, under the provisions of section 5 (5) of the *National Parks Act 1970*, to be temporarily reserved under the *Land Act 1958* as a site for a National Park.—Rs.3611.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Director of National Parks or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the management of the Reserve as a site of a National Park and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist, therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any Regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish, of any kind on any land to which such Regulation relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "FRESHWATER LAKE RECREATION RESERVE"**

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Panyyabyr was temporarily reserved pursuant to Order in Council dated the 7th July, 1970 as a site for Public Recreation (vide *Government Gazette* of 15th July, 1970, page 2402): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed

under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for public entertainment, fetes or sports on any of which occasions a fee as may be determined by the Committee from time to time may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

2. Any person, club, association or other combined body of persons desiring to use the Reserve may do so subject to the payment of such fees and the observance of such conditions as may be determined by the Committee from time to time.

3. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) introduce any banned species of fish into the Reserve;
- (c) climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, shrubs or flowers nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish therein except in receptacles provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall unless authorized in writing by the Committee—

- (a) cut, dig, saw, move or displace any trees or plants in the Reserve;
- (b) remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve;
- (c) light or cause to be lit any fires in the Reserve except in any place or places which may be provided for the purpose by the Committee;
- (d) erect any booth or other structure, nor offer for sale or hire any article or commodity within the Reserve or within any structure thereon;
- (e) put or allow to remain in the Reserve any sheep, cattle, horses, goats, pigs or any other animals;
- (f) break glass, deposit or leave any bottles, glass, paper, fruit, peel, litter or rubbish or refuse of any kind except in receptacles provided for the purpose by the Committee;
- (g) bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain or leash and any dog found in the Reserve except as herein provided may be seized and disposed of by the Committee;
- (h) carry, use or discharge any firearm, air rifle or other lethal weapon in the Reserve except as hereinafter provided;
- (i) disturb, interfere with or destroy any animal or bird or its lair or nest in the Reserve except for the shooting of game in the open season, provided that the required permits for such shooting are first obtained.—(Rs.7654.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any Regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which such Regulation relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

“public reserve” shall mean any area reserved for the use of the public of which the management is vested in the Council and shall include all parks and gardens and any footways, paths, crossings or paved or concreted surfaces forming part of such areas.

3. No child shall use a skateboard on those roadways named in the schedule hereto if any part of those roadways is being used by any pedestrian or vehicle.

4. No child shall use a skateboard or other like toy on any roadway or public reserve if such use interferes with the use of the roadway or public reserve by any pedestrian or other vehicle.

5. No child shall use a skateboard or other like toy vehicle on any roadway or public reserve if such use causes annoyance or inconvenience to any person using or residing adjacent to the roadway or public reserve.

6. Every child who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40.00 and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day in which the offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by the Court.

- (3) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector and preparation of records plans, a fee of Twelve Dollars (\$12) plus Six Dollars (\$6) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (4) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Twelve Dollars (\$12) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Six Dollars (\$6) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (5) For general engineering supervision by the Authority's Engineer, a fee of Three Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3.50) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation.
- (6) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.
