I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonn, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, pursuant to Section 184 of the Land Act 1958 (No. 6284), do hereby diminish The Mortlake United Town and Farmer's Common, proclaimed as such on the 7th March, 1864, and the 22nd May, 1871, by the excision therefrom of Crown allotment 7a in the Parish of Connewarren, containing 3.915 hectares.—(C.70656.)

Marine Act 1958. Sin-AMENDMENT TO PORT RULE (ACCOMMODATION OF VESSELS UPON PIERS AND JETTIES) 1973. PORT RULE 75D.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

&c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Part II. of the Marine Act 1958, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same (including the imposition of charges for the use of mooring sites and other facilities) and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public and private wharfs, and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed and other substituted in their stead:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the 12th day of December 1973 as amended by the Proclamation dated the 29th day of July 1975 as follows:—

1. This amendment may be cited as the Port Rule (Accommodation of Vessels upon Piers and Jetties) 1973 Amendment No. 1/1976, and shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, 1976.

2. Clause 6 of the Principal Port Rule shall be deleted and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"6. The fee payable in respect of a permit shall be-

(1) in respect of St. Kilda Pier davit sites:

(a) Annual rate per vessel \$43.50

(b) Concessional aged pension rate (on application)—one quarter of the full annual rate.

(2) in respect of Lorne Pier fishing boat sites:
Annual rate per vessel

.. \$43.50 "

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas:

I. It is provided by sub-section 2 of section 9 of the Juries Act 1967 that if pursuant to the powers con-tained in The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1958 or any other Act a redivision of the State into electoral districts for the Legislative Assembly is

adopted or is deemed to be adopted and such electoral districts are divided into subdivisions the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette determine which of such new electoral districts or subdivisions thereof shall comprise the jury district for each Supreme Court Town and County Court Town and Schedules 5 and 6 to the said Juries Act 1967 shall be deemed to be amended accordingly as from the date specified in such proclamation.

II. Pursuant to the powers contained in *The Constitution Act Amendment Act* 1958 a redivision of the State into electoral districts for the Legislative Assembly has been adopted and such electoral districts are divided into subdivisions.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation determine that as from the first day of January 1977 Schedules 5 and 6 of the Juries Act 1967 shall be deemed to be as set out hereunder—

PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 (1) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372) and section 5 (1) (b) of the Land Conservation Act 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Cann River Water Supply Catchment.

The area proclaimed is the catchment to an offtake pump constructed by the Cann River Waterworks Trust; on the Cann River, adjacent to Crown allotment 9c, Parish of Noorinbee, County of Croajingolong.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority acting under the provisions of section 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. 372 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.

POISONS ACT 1962.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 4 of the Poisons Act 1962 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to the said Act by adding to any of the said Schedules or removing therefrom any item:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Amend Schedule Two to the said \mbox{Act} by adding thereto the following items: —

CAMPHORATED OIL

NICLOSAMIDE for human therapeutic use.

NICODICODINE when compounded with one or more other medicaments in preparations containing 1 per centum or less of Nicodicodine.

- 2. Amend Schedule Three to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:
 - COCAINE—synthetic substitutes for—(having a solubility in water of more than 1 per centum) in ointments containing 0.5 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute.
 - COCAINE—synthetic substitutes for—(having a solubility in water of 1 per centum or less) in substances containing 2.5 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute and:—
 - Lozenges, pastilles, tablets, capsules, containing ½ grain or less of such Cocaine substitute in each;
 - (2) Suppositories containing 3 grains or less of such Cocaine substitute in each; and
 - (3) Substances for external use containing 10 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute.
 - PRESSOR Substances, including Adrenaline, Cyclopentamine, Methoxamine, Methoxyphenamine, Naphazoline, Noradrenaline, Phenylpropanolamine, Pholedrine, Tuaminoheptane.

and by adding thereto the following items: -

- ANAESTHETICS LOCAL—the following only—Benzocaine, Butylcaine, Butylcaine Picrate, Orthocaine, Benamine Lactate, and Lignocaine, when included in:
 - (a) lozenges, pastilles, tablets and capsules containing 30 milligrams or less of such substances in each;
 - (b) suppositories or bougies containing 200 milligrams or less of such substances in each;
 - (c) preparations for external use, other than eye drops, containing 10 per centum or less of such substances.

CYCLOPENTAMINE in solutions for topical use.

IMIDAZOLINE DERIVATIVES with vasoconstrictor activity, including the following when used for application as decongestants—Naphazoline, Oxymetazoline, Phedrazine, Phenamazoline, Rinidol, Tetrahydrozoline, Trimizoline, Tymazoline, and Xylometazoline. METHOXAMINE for topical use.

METHOXYPHENAMINE

PHENYLPROPANOLAMINE

PHOLEDRINE

TUAMINOHEPTANE in solutions for topical use.

3. Amend Schedule Four to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items: —

ANTIBIOTICS, Penicillin, Penicillanic Acid, Streptomycin, Chloramphenicol, Tetracycline and any other antibiotic substances however derived and their chemical derivatives, except:—

- (a) when included in Schedule Six.
- (b) animal feedstuffs for growth promotion containing Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlortetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Flavomycin, Oleandomycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline, Tylosin and its salts and Virginiamycin and its salts in concentrations of 50 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle;
- (c) preparations containing 20 parts per million or less of Hygromycin B;
- (d) milk replacers for calves and starter rations for pigs containing Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlortetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline and its salts and Tylosin and its salts in concentrations of 100 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle.

ARSENIC, organic compounds of, for therapeutic use, except when included in Schedule Six.

CHLOROTHIAZIDE

- COCAINE—synthetic substitutes for (having a solubility in water of more than 1 per centum) and all preparations except ointments containing 0.5 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute.
- COCAINE—synthetic substitutes for (having a solubility in water of 1 per centum or less) and preparations containing more than 2.5 per centum of such Cocaine substitute except:—
 - (a) Lozenges, pastilles, tablets, capsules, containing 30 milligrams or less of such Cocaine substitute in each.
 - (b) Suppositories containing 180 milligrams or less of such Cocaine substitute in each.
 - (c) Preparations for external use containing 10 per centum or less of such Cocaine substitute.

DIPHENOXYLATE in preparations containing 2·5 milligrams or less of Diphenoxylate calculated as the base and not less than 25 micrograms of Atropine Sulphate per dosage unit.

- (a) when included in Schedule Three; or
- (b) in preparations other than for use on infants, containing 0·1 per centum or less of hexachlorophane as a preservative.

and by adding thereto the following items: -

AMILORIDE

ANAESTHETICS LOCAL being synthetic cocaine substitutes, except when included in Schedule Three.

- ANTIBIOTICS, Penicillin, Penicillanic Acid, Streptomycin, Chloramphenicol, Tetracycline and any other antibiotic substances however derived and their chemical derivatives, except:
 - (a) when included in Schedule Six;
 - (b) animal feedstuffs for growth promotion containing Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlortetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Flavomycin, Oleandomycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline, Tylosin and its salts and Virginiamycin and its salts in concentrations of 50 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle;
 - (c) preparations containing 50 parts per million or less of Hygromycin B;







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WARBY RANGES NATIONAL PARK.

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of, any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parishes of Glenrowen and Taminick were temporarily reserved pursuant to Orders in Council dated the 12th August, 1975, as sites for Public purposes

(National Park), (vide Government Gazette of the 20th August, 1975): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Acting Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Director of National Parks or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the management of the Reserve as a site of a National Park and for the control of the public within the Reserve.
- 2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of National Parks or his authorized officers, no person shall:—
 - (a) Camp within the Reserve or light or maintain any fire therein.
 - (b) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind within the Reserve.
 - (c) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, or any improvements or structures in the Reserve.
 - (d) Deposit on or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed, structure, or equipment. Any fence, shed, structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.
 - (e) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, or shoot at or kill or injure any animal, bird or other wildlife in the Reserve.
 - (f) Carry any poison, traps or snares in the Reserve.
 - (g) In the Reserve poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or have in his or her possession any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof which have been found in or removed from the Reserve.
 - (h) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
 - (i) In the Reserve pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind which have been found in or removed from the Reserve.
 - (j) Gather or cut dead wood or firewood in the Reserve.
 - (k) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (!) Drive any vehicle on the Reserve other than on a road or roads provided for the purpose.—
 (Rs. 10,125).
