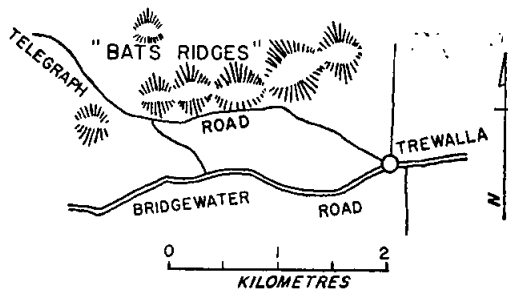

Fixing Charges for Water Supplied by Measure.

The Mooroopna Waterworks Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the following By-Law:—

1. This By-Law shall apply within the Mooroopna Urban District and shall take effect as hereinafter provided not withstanding the provisions of any previous By-Law.

2. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any property within the said Urban District shall be read once in every financial year as near as practicable to the same date and the quantity so measured having been supplied during the period (hereinafter called the "meter year") between any two successive such readings shall be basis of charges payable under this By-Law.

3. In respect of any property rated by the Trust:—

(a) the maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge shall be the quantity which if charged at—

(i) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three tenths cents per kilolitre, for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-Law, and

(ii) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three tenths cents per kilolitre, for any meter year beginning after the commencement of this By-Law,

would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the property for the financial year in which the meter year ended, and

(b) for all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge shall be—

(i) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three tenths cents per kilolitre, for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-Law, and

(ii) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three tenths cents per kilolitre, for any meter year beginning after the commencement of this By-Law.

4. In respect of any property not liable to any rate made for the Mooroopna Urban District in which such property is situated, the charge for water supplied by measure in any meter year, shall except where a special agreement with the Trust applied, be:—

(i) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three-tenths cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-Law.

(ii) Thirty-three cents per thousand gallons or seven and three-tenths cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after the commencement of this By-Law.

Provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be that which yields the minimum annual charge, if any, fixed by the Trust applying to the property at the end of the meter year.

5. The charge for water supplied by measure to the Mooroopna Hospital shall be:—

(i) Twenty-seven cents per thousand gallons or five and nine-tenths cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-Law.

(ii) Twenty-seven cents per thousand gallons or five and nine-tenths cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after the commencement of this By-Law.

6. The charges as set out in this By-Law shall be payable on demand at the Office of the Trust.

7. Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of four months from the date they become payable.

8. The Secretary of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust is hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said charges for water.

DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH, SPORT AND RECREATION OF VICTORIA.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 27 (1) of the *National Fitness Council of Victoria Act 1960*, No. 6713, the National Fitness Council at a meeting held on 27th July, 1976, revoked all rules previously made and made the following rules:—

RULES OF THE NATIONAL FITNESS COUNCIL OF VICTORIA.

Annual Meeting.

1. The Annual Meeting of the Council shall be held in the month of October of each year.

Business Year.

2. The financial year of the Council shall commence on 1st July of each year and shall end on 30th June of the following year.

Meetings of Council.

3. Ordinary meetings of the Council shall be held not less than three times in each year, on such dates and at such times as the Council may from time to time determine.

Notice of Meeting.

4. The Chief Executive Officer shall arrange that notice of all meetings of the Council and of Committees (stating the time and place thereof, and any special business to be considered) be sent to members. Notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if posted to the registered address of a member in time to reach such address in the ordinary course of post at the required time prior to the date of such meeting.

Quorum.

5. Should a quorum of the Council or any Committee, not be present within fifteen minutes of the stated time of commencement, the meeting shall lapse and any business shall be deferred until next meeting.

Agenda.

6. Subject to any motion of the particular meeting, the following shall be the order of the agenda of a Council meeting:—

- (a) Opening of meeting by Chairman.
- (b) Apologies.
- (c) Confirmation of Minutes.
- (d) Business Arising from Minutes.
- (e) Notice of Motion.
- (f) Correspondence.
- (g) Reports of Committees.
- (h) Other Business.
- (i) Date of next meeting.
- (j) Closure.

This rule shall also apply to Committees so far as appropriate.

Committees.

7. (a) There shall be the following Committees appointed by the Council at its Annual Meeting—Executive, Finance, Programmes and Services, Camps Administration and Camps Development.

(b) The Finance Committee shall, subject to the direction of the Council, scrutinize all accounts and make such recommendations to the Council or the Executive Committee thereon as it thinks fit as to the payment thereof. It shall also receive from other Committees all proposals for the expenditure of monies, and shall, after consideration of such proposals, make such recommendations as it deems fit to the Executive Committee or Council.

The Finance Committee shall ensure that the assets of the Council are adequately covered by insurance. The Finance Committee shall review the salaries paid to the members of the staff of the Council and shall subsequently make such recommendations as it deems fit regarding increments and the like to the Executive Committee or the Council. The Finance Committee shall for each financial year cause to be prepared a budget of receipts and expenditure for submission to the Executive Committee or Council. The Finance Committee shall carry out such other duties as the Executive Committee or Council shall allot to it from time to time.

(c) The Programmes and Services Committee shall, subject to the direction of the Council, be responsible for all matters concerning the programmes organized and/or conducted by the Council including training for volunteers and other related services offered by the Council. The Programmes and Services Committee shall carry out such other duties as the Council or the Executive Committee shall allot to it from time to time.

(d) The Camps Administration Committee shall, subject to the direction of the Council, be responsible for all matters concerning the care and maintenance of camps owned, leased or occupied by the Council and shall scrutinize all applications for the hire of the camps and shall allocate such dates as it deems fit to such applicants as may be approved. The Camps Administration Committee shall cause to be compiled and maintained a register of applications so approved. The Camps Administration Committee shall carry out such other duties as the Council or Executive Committee shall allot to it from time to time.

(e) The Camps Development Committee shall, subject to the direction of the Council, be responsible for all matters concerning the development of camps and camp properties owned, leased or occupied by the Council or Executive Committee as it deems fit in regard to improvements of those properties. The Camps Development Committee shall carry out such other duties as the Council or Executive Committee shall allot to it from time to time.

8. (a) Nominations for Committees shall be lodged at the Council office addressed to the Chief Executive Officer and clearly marked "Nomination for Office" before noon of the 10th day prior to the Annual Meeting. Nomination forms shall be signed by the nominator and by the person nominated (indicating willingness to stand). Retiring members of all Committees shall be deemed to have been nominated and to have accepted nomination, unless by the closing time herein provided they notify the Chief Executive Officer to the contrary.

(b) Nominations of members for Committees shall be set out in the notice convening the Annual Meeting. In the event of the number of nominations received by the time appointed in paragraph (a) thereof being less than the number of persons to be elected, further nominations may be received at the Annual Meeting.

Notice of Motion.

9. No resolution which involves any change in the previously resolved policy of the Council shall be considered by the Council unless notice thereof has been given to members in the notice convening the meeting at which it is to be considered.

Voting.

10. Unless otherwise decided, voting shall be on a show of hands except in the case of election of Committees which shall be by ballot.

Debating Procedure.

11. At a meeting of Council:—

- (a) Any member proposing a motion shall have the right to address the meeting in support of such motion and shall be entitled to speak a second time before the debate is closed.
- (b) A member seconding a motion shall be entitled to reserve the right to address the meeting of the motion later in the debate.

(c) No person (other than the mover of the motion) shall speak a second time on the motion, except by way of personal explanation, or with the express leave of the Chairman.

Address of Members.

12. Each member shall give to the Chief Executive Officer an address for service of notices which shall be kept in a special register and shall be deemed to be that member's registered address.

Annual Report and Balance-Sheet.

13. (a) The Chief Executive Officer shall prepare and submit to the Executive Committee, at a meeting prior to the Annual Meeting of each year, a draft of the general report in respect of the last preceding financial year of the proceedings and activities of the Council and each of the Committees thereof.

(b) The Chief Executive Officer shall submit to the Executive Committee at a meeting prior to the Annual Meeting of the Council each year, a draft account of the receipts and expenditure and of funds, investments and properties of the Council and a draft Balance Sheet.

Seal.

14. (a) There shall be a seal of the Council which shall be in the following form:—

Legal Seal.

(b) The seal of the Council shall be kept in safe custody in the office of the Council and shall be attached to any document only on the resolution of the Council or of the Executive Committee:

(c) The seal may be affixed only in the presence of the Chief Executive Officer of the Council and two members of the Executive Committee.

Signature of Cheques.

15. Cheques on the Council's account shall be signed by one signatory who shall be:—

(a) A member of the Finance Committee; or

(b) The Chief Executive Officer (or in his absence, his deputy)

in accordance with directions given by the Executive Committee or Council.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BLOWHARD RECREATION RESERVE".

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Ascot was temporarily reserved as a site for Public recreation purposes (Public Recreation) by Order in Council dated the 17th December, 1974 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 8th January, 1975): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times from sunrise to sunset and such other times as permitted by the Committee free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and also on such days (not exceeding fifteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows,

sports, fêtes, cricket, football or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One Dollar may be charged and taken by the Committee for admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- (b) Bring any intoxicating liquor onto the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (c) Climb, jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, shrubs, flowers, gates, fences, seats or any equipment therein, nor leave or deposit therein any papers, glass, straw, manure or any rubbish, nor roll, throw or discharge or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged any stone, brick or any other substance or missile.
- (d) Discharge any firearm in any part of the Reserve so as to be a danger or annoyance to any other person using the Reserve.
- (e) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (f) Remove or displace any board, plate, fitting or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notices fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
- (g) In the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty of work therein.
- (h) Affix, print, post, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters or figures to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee.
- (i) Break anything made of glass in the Reserve.
- (j) Permit any broken glass object to remain in the Reserve.
- (k) Use the sanitary conveniences, structures or any part of the same in the Reserve for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.
- (l) Being a male, other than a boy under the age of seven years, enter or use any playground, oval, place, room or building set apart for the use of females in the Reserve.
- (m) Being a female, enter or use any playground, place, room or building, set apart for the use of males in the Reserve.

3. No person while in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained—

- (a) Occupy or use any building, house, booth, shed or any other structure therein.
- (b) Erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part thereof.
- (c) Solicit or gather money or other thing.
- (d) Take part in any public entertainment of any sport.
- (e) Preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public.
- (f) Carry on any trade or business or the calling of a bookmaker.

4. Any written permission granted or ticket or receipt issued in pursuance of these Regulations shall if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorised by the Committee to demand the production of same.

5. Any person driving or bringing any vehicle of any kind whatsoever into the Reserve shall be under the absolute direction of the Committee or body hiring the Reserve. The Committee or hiring body may, at its discretion, prevent any vehicle from entering the Reserve.

6. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained cause or suffer any greyhound, whippet, cattle, horses or sheep to enter or remain in the Reserve. Any dog other than a dog of the kind described in this Regulation may be brought into the

Reserve provided such dog is and continues to be at all times under proper control on a chain, cord or leash and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering with the Reserve in any way.

7. Any dog found in the Reserve except as provided in these Regulations shall be dealt with in a manner provided in the Dog Act 1958 or any amendment thereof, and the owner of any dog or other animal who causes or suffers such dog or other animal to enter or remain therein except as provided in these Regulations shall, in addition to any other lawful penalty, be liable to make compensation for any damage or interference done to the Reserve or any property therein by such dog or other animal.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in such portion or portions as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee and upon payment of such charges and the observance of such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time. This permission to camp therein may be withdrawn by the Committee at any time from any person.

9. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any person, club or association of clubs the use of the portion or portions so set apart subject to the observance of such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations.

10. Persons or bodies occupying or hiring any stand, building or enclosure in the Reserve on the occasion of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements shall, by a written undertaking, take full responsibility for any damage done to any such stand, building or enclosure during such occupancy or hiring and shall make good such damage to the satisfaction of the Committee, and all persons so occupying or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any lawful order given by the Committee, and in addition the persons or bodies so hiring or occupying shall be required to lodge a deposit or a sum not exceeding Two hundred dollars with the Committee by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building or enclosure.

11. No person shall enter, cross, intrude or trespass on any playing ground area, oval, enclosure or course or any part thereof in the Reserve while any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of any event except players, competitors and officials connected with such sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement.

12. Persons or bodies renting or hiring the Reserve or part thereof for any purpose whatsoever and who make any charge to the public for admission thereto, shall pay to the Committee a fee for the use of the Reserve or part thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee from time to time.

13. No building shall be constructed in the Reserve until plans and specifications have been submitted and approved by the Committee and written permission given by it for such construction.

14. The Committee shall be at liberty at any time to authorize any building or erection in the Reserve to be altered, removed, renovated or repaired and no building shall be altered or removed without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall, except by special leave or direction of the Committee, light, use, cause or permit fires to be lit on the Reserve except in the fireplaces constructed and provided by the Committee for such purposes.

16. Every person infringing these Regulations in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve or from any property therein, in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable and no person shall remain in the Reserve or any property therein when lawfully directed by any officer, employee or member of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or a Crown Lands Bailiff, to leave the same.—(Rs.9986).

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Stawell was temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 21st January, 1975 as a site for Public purposes (Show purposes), (vide *Government Gazette* of the 29th January, 1975): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public for sporting events, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding \$1.00 may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall be fires be lighted therein except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose by the Committee.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills, thereon, or cut names on or any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
6. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee and then only on the payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as are determined by the Committee.
8. No person or organisation shall erect any structure in the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or footpaths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. Persons occupying or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit a sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding \$100, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during

such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so occupying or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any lawful order given by the Committee.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve, or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

14. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter or rubbish in the Reserve, except in a place provided for the purpose by the Committee and indicated by notice-board.

15. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
- (b) Being under the influence of liquor.
- (c) Entering, crossing, being on or trespassing on any playing-ground area, enclosure or course or building, room or structure or any part thereof whilst any sport, game, competition, race or entertainment is in progress, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene or unseemly language.
- (e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly, offensively or riotously.
- (g) Interfering with or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

16. No person shall remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance.

17. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

18. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—

- (a) have obtained permission, in writing, of the Committee on payment of a fee, not to exceed \$10, for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve, and
- (b) wear a ticket or have a bag with his name thereon which shall be visible to the public during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker.

19. No club, association or person shall, without the consent of the Committee first had and obtained, hold any football, cricket or other matches, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports, lacrosse, hockey or athletic or physical training within the Reserve and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as the Committee may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, provided however, that the Committee may authorise any club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.— (Rs.8626).

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township of Baker, Parish of Warraquil was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 29th August, 1967, (vide Government Gazette of the 6th September, 1967): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) bring into or sell or distribute in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor unless authorized in writing by the Committee, and holding a licence or permit as required pursuant to the provisions of the Liquor Control Act 1968, and then only in such place or places or portion of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
 - (d) climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or posters thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage, mark or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 - (e) remove, deface or displace any board, plate or fitting, written or printed notice for exhibition of any Regulations, or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
 - (f) light fires in the Reserve except at places as are set apart for such purpose by the Committee.
 - (g) do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
 - (h) bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, dogs or other animals nor permit the same to enter, without the permission of the Committee being first obtained, provided that all dogs must be at all times controlled by a chain or leash.
 - (i) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or on any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (j) play, practise or engage in any organized game, sport or entertainment in the Reserve at any time without the consent, in writing, of the Committee having been first obtained and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
 - (k) on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee
- and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.
 - (l) remain within the Reserve or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Committee.
 - (m) hawk or sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any goods, fruit or merchandise or anything whatsoever, or solicit or gather money therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
 - (n) in or upon the Reserve kill, wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare any bird or other native game or have any dead bird or other native game or the skin or pelt thereof in his possession.
 - (o) dig up or remove any sand, soil, stone or other material from the Reserve.
 - (p) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons in the Reserve.
 - (q) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin, can, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind in the Reserve except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.
 - (r) play or perform in any band of music or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, or enter into any public assemblage on the Reserve except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

 - (x) park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve, except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, or bring a caravan into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (y) spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any building, structure or erection in the Reserve.
 - (z) enter, cross, be on or trespass on any playing ground area, enclosure or course or building, room or structure or any part thereof in the Reserve whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of any event without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
