Bees Act 1971

IMPORTATION ETC. OF BEES, HONEY, HONEYCOMB OR APPLIANCES INTO VICTORIA

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (3) of section 4 of the Bees Act 1971 it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the Government Gazette prohibit either absolutely or subject to conditions the importation, introduction or bringing into the State either generally or from any other State or country or place of any bees, honey, honeycomb or other thing of any nature or kind whatsoever which in his opinion is likely to introduce any disease into the State or is likely to spread such disease.

And whereas by sub-section (4) of section 4 of the Bees Act 1971 it is provided that the Governor in Council may at any time alter or revoke any proclamation under this section:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the State of Victoria do hereby alter the Proclamation made under the Bees Act 1971 on the 18th day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two as follows:—

(1) At the end of the First Schedule there shall be added the following proviso:—

"Provided also that in cases where extracted honey is to be introduced by an owner agent or person who is unable to complete the declaration to the effect of the form set out in the Second Schedule in accordance with paragraph

(a) of the First Schedule solely on account of the disease European Foul Brood, that such owner agent or person in charge of the extracted honey shall—.

- (d) make a declaration, in duplicate, in the form or to the effect of the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto stating—
  - (i) the processing plant in Victoria' that the extracted honey is to be forwarded to; and
  - (ii) the proposed date of consignment of the honey to the said processing plant; and
  - (iii) the method of transport of the honey;
  - (iv) all the honey is from an apiary which was free from disease excepting European Foul Brood at the time the honey was removed from the hives;
- (e) obtain a certificate, in duplicate, on the same form from a Government Apiary Inspector or from a person authorized in that capacity in the State or Territory of Origin that, after due enquiry—
  - (i) the processing plant in Victoria is approved by the Chief Veterinary Officer of Victoria for the receipt of such honey; and
  - (ii) there is no reason to doubt the correctness of the declaration made; and
- (f) forward the original and duplicate in accordance with paragraph (c) of this Schedule."



## Police Regulation Act 1958 POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA

### DETERMINATION No. 280 OF THE POLICE SERVICE BOARD

The Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Police Regulation Act 1958, hereby makes the following Determination (that is to say):—

- 1. The Determination No. 179 of the Police Service Board of 14th December, 1971, and published in the Government Gazette of 25th January, 1972, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—
  - (a) In Sub-Division II., under the heading "Allowances for Uniform", by deleting paragraphs 16-19 and substituting therefor the following new paragraphs:—
    - "16. During his first year after date of appointment or re-appointment a member performing his duties in uniform or who is required by the Chief Commissioner to have and maintain a uniform in connexion with his duties, shall be paid the following allowances by way of reimbursement:—

(a) Upon production of accounts, duly certified by the Officer in Charge, Police Training Academy, or Officer or Sub-Officer under whom he is serving, for the purchase by him of the following items of uniform clothing or for expenditure upon drycleaning or laundering thereof or repairs thereto, the cost thereof but not exceeding \$491.

(a) In each year of service after their first year, all Sub-Officers, Senior Constables and Constables stationed at the Melbourne District Traffic and Patrol Division who have qualified at the Melbourne District Traffic Training School, while performing active foot duties, upon production of an account duly certified by the Officer or Sub-Officer under whom he is serving, shall be paid an allowance by way of reimbursement for the purchase by him of an additional uniform and extra pair of trousers—the amount of the cost thereof but not exceeding \$205.00. Such allowance is to be in addition to any other allowance under this Sub-Division.
- (b) If such member ceases to be a member before the expiration of six months after receipt of such payment, one-half of the amount so received shall be repayable and be repaid by him to the Police Department.
- 19. A Police Cadet shall be paid the following allowances by way of reimbursement:—
  - (a) During the first year after his appointment including any service subsequent to transfer to a Recruit Training Squad, upon production of accounts duly certified by the Officer in Charge Police Training Academy or by the Officer under whom he is serving, for the purchase by him of the following items of uniform clothing or for expenditure upon drycleaning or laundering thereof or repairs thereto, the cost thereof, but not exceeding \$512.

If he ceases to be a Police Cadet for any reason other than by transfer to a Recruit Training Squad, before the expiration of six months after appointment, one-half of the amount so received by him shall be repayable and be repaid by the Police Cadet to the Police Department.

- (b) After his transfer to a Recruit Training Squad and upon production of accounts duly certified by the Officer in Charge, Police Training Academy, or the Officer under whom he is serving, for the purchase by him of one uniform and extra pair of trousers and one white helmet—the amount of the cost thereof, but not exceeding \$225.00.
- (c) After his first year's service as a cadet the member shall, during any subsequent year in which his service is wholly or partly as a cadet, be paid an allowance of \$399.
- (d) During each year of service after completion of the last year of his service which included service wholly or partly as a cadet for the purposes of subparagraphs (a) or (c) above a member shall qualify for payment of allowances by way of reimbursement pursuant to paragraph 17 above."
- (b) In Sub-Division III., under the heading "Civilian Clothing Allowance", by deleting paragraph 20 and substituting therefor the following new paragraphs:—

"20. Each member who is required or directed by the Chief Commissioner to perform duty in civilian clothes shall be paid an allowance at the following rates:—

- (a) Male members .. \$345.00 per annum.
- (b) Female members \$690.00 per annum.

Such allowance shall not be paid to any member who is required by the Chief Commissioner to have and maintain a uniform in connection with his or her duties.

20A. Where a male member is qualified to receive an allowance pursuant to paragraph 20 above, in any year in which the Assistant Commissioner (Personnel) certifies that the member cannot reasonably be fitted with a standard manufactured suit for use on duty the member shall in addition to the said allowance for that year be entitled to be paid by way of reimbursement the amount, not exceeding \$75, by which the cost of one custom tailored suit for that purpose exceeds the cost of one manufactured suit of equivalent quality. Provided that such additional allowance shall be paid only upon the certificate of the officer under whom the member is then serving that accounts and such other documentary and other material required by the said Officer to support the above facts have been produced to him and to his satisfaction."

2. This Determination shall come into operation on and from the 9th day of October, 1977.

  - (i) the illegal importation of drugs;
  - (ii) the illegal exportation of drugs;
  - (iii) the illegal production of drugs; and
  - (iv) the illegal trafficking in drugs;
- (b) the places where drugs mentioned in paragraph (a) are produced or from which they are obtained and the places to which those drugs are sent;
- (c) the extent to which-
  - (i) drugs are illegally used;

  - (ii) drugs lawfully obtained are diverted to illegal trafficking or illegal uses; or (iii) drugs are misused in so far as such misuse is relevant to the illegal use of drugs;
- (d) the extent (if any) to which the illegal activities mentioned in paragraph (α) or the illegal use or the diversion mentioned in paragraph (c) are engaged in, directly or indirectly, by persons who engage, on an organised basis, in other illegal activities, whether or not related to drugs:
- (e) the adequacy of existing laws (including the appropriateness of the penalties) and of exist-ing law enforcement (including arrangements for co-operation between law enforcement agencies) in relation to the prohibition, restric-tion or control of the importation, exportation, production, possession, supply or use of, or trafficking in, drugs; and
- (f) whether new laws should be enacted or other measures taken (including the taking of initia-tives for the making or revision of international agreements) to remedy any inadequacies found to exist under paragraph (e);

And by this Order and for the purposes of the Commission doth further direct that:—

- the expression "drug" means a narcotic or psychotropic substance and includes every drug or substance specified in any of the schedules to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs or the Convention on Psychotropic Substances
- 2. a reference to a drug includes a reference to an article or substance containing a drug;
- 3. a reference to the production of a drug includes a reference to the manufacture of a drug by any means and also includes a reference to the cultivation or production of any plant or substance from which a drug is capable of being derived; and

4. a reference to the importation or exportation of, or to trafficking in, a drug includes a reference to the importation or exportation of, or to trafficking in, a plant or substance referred to in paragraph (3) or of a seed from which such a plant can be cultivated;

And by this Order doth still further direct that to the extent that alcohol may be regarded as a narcotic substance, the Commissioner shall have regard to it only in so far as it is necessary to do so for the purpose of establishing the extent of the illegal use, or of the misuse of other drugs in accordance with paragraph (c);

- 1. No person shall camp on any road within the Municipal District of the Shire without the written consent of the Council.
- 2. (a) No person shall place cause or permit to remain on any private property within the Municipal District at the same time three or more caravans without first obtaining the written consent of the Council.

- (b) The preceding sub-paragraph shall not apply to the commercial display of caravans for lease sale or hire or to the normal operation of any camping ground or caravan park lawfully permitted by the Planning Ordinance/s of the Shire.
- 3. (a) No person shall use allow or permit to be used any caravan for any habitation or residential purposes on any private property within the Municipal District for a cumulative period of or in excess of six months without the written consent of the Council.
- (b) The Council may grant its consent referred to in sub-paragraph (a) hereof subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Council may from time to time deem
- (c) Any written consent granted by the Council to any person pursuant to this paragraph shall be conditional upon compliance with the provisions of this By-Law and may be revoked by the Council upon any wilful breach of any provision of this By-Law by any such person to whom the consent has been given or in the event of any such conditions or restrictions imposed by the Council not being complied with.
  - 4. In this By-Law,
    - (a) "Caravan" shall mean and include a caravan and any object or structure having the general characteristics of a caravan, notwithstanding that any of the wheels or axles thereof have been removed or that it is resting directly on the ground or is placed on blocks or other supports.
    - (b) "The Shire" means The President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington.
  - (c) "The Council" means the Council from time to time of the Shire.
  - (d) "Private Property" shall mean any privately owned land within the Municipal District of the Shire,
  - Municipal District" means the Municipal District of the Shire from time to time as notified in the Victorian Government Gazette. (e) " Municipal
  - Camp" shall mean the encampment or lodging in a caravan tent or other temporary structure or vehicle not permanently erected on land.
  - Road" means any road highway or private street within the Municipal District of the Shire.
- 5. Any person found guilty of a wilful contravention of this By-Law shall be liable,
  - (a) In the case of a first offence, to a penalty of not more than \$100.00;
  - (b) In the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00;
  - (c) And in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offences continue after a conviction or order of any court in relation thereto.
- 6. This By-Law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
- 7. This By-Law shall come into force on the day of the publication of the notice of the making hereof in the Government Gazette as provided for in Section 212 of the Local Government Act 1958.
