MURDER

REWARD.

Notice is hereby given that a reward of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) will be paid, in accordance with the conditions set out hereunder, for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of John Ronald Gill on or about 24th September, 1976.

The body of John Ronald Gill was found in a drainage creek on the western side of the Springvale Crematorium on 27th September, 1976. The last known sighting of the deceased prior to his death was at about 9.15 p.m. on 23rd September, 1976, when he left the Kilkenny Inn Hotel in King Street, Melbourne, with the intention of travelling to his home in East Oakleigh by train.

CONDITIONS.

1. The person or persons giving information leading to the apprehension and conviction of a person or persons guilty of the above-mentioned crime will receive such amount or amounts not exceeding \$20,000 as shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

2. The person or persons entitled to any reward and the amount or amounts payable to such person or persons shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

Any information, which will be treated as confidential, may be given at any time of the day or night, to the Officer in Charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Russell Street, Melbourne (telephone 662 0911) or to the Officer in Charge of any Police Station.
