PROCLAMATION VARYING THE AREA OF AN URBAN FIRE DISTRICT

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 15 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Authority, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, proclaim parts of the country area of Victoria as fire control regions for the purposes of the said Act, proclaim the whole or parts of any such region as urban fire districts for the purposes of the said Act and abolish or in any way vary the area of any such region or district:

And whereas by proclamation issued on the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four and published in the Government Gazette on the eleventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four among other things the Wodonga Urban Fire District was proclaimed as part of the Twenty-Fourth Fire Control

And whereas the said Authority has reported that it is expedient to vary the area of the said Wodonga Urban Fire District:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 15 of the said Act and all other powers me thereunto enabling and having considered a report by the said Authority, do by this my proclamation vary the area of the said Wodonga Urban

Fire District by proclaiming the herein described part of the Twenty-Fourth Fire Control Region to be an urban fire district for the purposes of the said Act (that is to say):—



 - "Pilot" means a member who is a pilot (fixed wing) in the Police Air Wing.
 - "Senior Pilot" means a pilot, designated by the Chief Commissioner as Senior Pilot and who is required to carry out duties associated therewith in addition to flying duties in the Police Air Wing.
 - "Training Pilot" means a pilot, other than a Check Pilot, who is appointed to perform route endorsing and/or training duties.
 - "Year of Service" means year of service as a pilot in the Police Air Wing.
- (B) There shall be paid to a member, appointed by the Chief Commissioner to the Police Air Wing to perform the duties of a Pilot (fixed wing), and whilst occupying that position, an allowance (inclusive of any other special duties allowance) equivalent to the amount by which the salary for the appropriate classification of aircraft as set forth below and the year of service as a pilot of aircraft of that classification, as defined and fixed from time to time by the Award exceeds the salary and allowances, except the allowances for uniform, prescribed or hereafter to be prescribed for the rank of such member by any Determination of the Police Service Board.

Classification

Single Engine Aircraft (other than commuter)-

Zero pounds—Up to but not including 3,000 pounds all up weight.

3,000 pounds—Up to but not including 12,500 pounds all up weight.

Multi-Engine Aircraft (other than commuter) -

(C) A member to whom the provisions of paragraph (B) of this part applies shall first receive the allowance, if any, as determined by the formula provided in that paragraph, based upon the salary prescribed for the first year of service as a pilot of the Police Air Wing for the highest classification of aircraft for which he holds a valid endorsement and is usually required to pilot. He shall receive thereafter by way of increments to that allowance, the additional amounts prescribed for the higher classification of aircraft on which he may be required to become endorsed and usually pilot for the Police Air Wing, for the first year of service on that classification of aircraft, and he shall further receive thereafter by way of increments to that allowance, the yearly increments applicable to the highest classification of aircraft for which he holds a valid endorsement and is usually required to pilot.

- (D) Additional Allowances. In addition to the salary and allowance or allowances referred to in paragraphs (B) and (C) above of this part (v), the following allowances shall be paid to the member as applicable:
 - (i) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Class One or Class Four Instrument Rating as defined by the Award—an allowance as prescribed for that Rating by the Award;
 - (ii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Training Pilot—a further allowance to that prescribed in paragraph (D)
 (i) above, calculated at the rate of 5 per cent. of the sum of his salary per annum applicable to his year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraph (D) (i) above;
- (iii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check Pilot—a further allowance to that prescribed in paragraph (D) (i) above calculated at the rate of 7 per cent. of the sum of his salary per annum applicable to his year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraph (D) (i) above;
- (iv) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot a further allowance to that prescribed in paragraph (D) (i) above calculated at the rate of 8% of the sum of his salary per annum applicable to his year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraph (D) (i) above:
- (v) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot or as Senior Pilot—a further allowance to that prescribed in paragraph (D)
 (i) above calculated at the rate of 5% of the sum of his salary per annum applicable to his year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraph (D) (i) above;
- (vi) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and/or Training Pilot and who is also Chief or Senior Pilot—a further allowance to that prescribed by paragraph (D)
 (i) above calculated at the rate of 10% of the sum of his salary per annum applicable to his year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraph (D) (i) above;

Provided that:

- (a) No pilot shall at any one time, receive in addition to the additional allowance prescribed in paragraph (D) (i) above more than one of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (D) (ii) (vi) inclusive, above; and
- (b) Each of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (D) (ii)-(vi) inclusive, above, shall be calculated upon the salary prescribed in the Award for the highest classification of aircraft the member is usually required to pilot and his year of service for that classification.
- (vi) Rotary Wing Aircraft
 - (A) Definitions. For the purposes of part (vi) of paragraph 12 (b) of this Determination, unless the context otherwise requires:

- "Senior Pilot (Helicopters)" means a helicopter pilot, designated by the Chief Commissioner as Senior Pilot (Helicopters) and who is required to carry out duties associated therewith in addition to flying duties in the Police Air Wing.
- "Training Pilot (Helicopters)" means a helicopter pilot, other than a Check Pilot (Helicopters), who is appointed to perform training duties.
- (B) There shall be paid to a member, appointed or seconded by the Chief Commissioner to the Police Air Wing to perform the duties of a helicopter pilot and whilst occupying that position, an allowance (inclusive of any other special duties allowance) equivalent to the amount by which the salary for the appropriate classification of helicopter flying experience as, set forth below as fixed from time to time by the Award exceeds the salary and allowances, except the allowances for uniform, prescribed or hereafter to be prescribed for the rank of such member by any Determination of the Police Service Board.

 - (h) Deposit in the Reserve any rubbish, litter or refuse of any kind except in receptacles provided by the Committee for the purpose, nor post bills on or cut or mark or paint names, letters or other matter on any of the fences, gates, posts or trees in or around the Reserve or otherwise deface same, nor break, cut, dig-up, damage or injure in any way or remove the damage or injure in any way or remove the whole or any portion of any tree, shrub, plant, seed, scrub, undergrowth, fern, flower, soil or any other vegetation or property in the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall unless authorised in writing by the Committee—
 - (a) Carry or bring into the Reserve any trap, poison, snare, firearm or any other weapon capable of discharging a missile;
 - (b) Bring into the Reserve any seed or any portion of any plant or tree;
 - (c) Offer or expose for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or any other merchandise;
 - (d) Remove, displace or damage any board or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice or Regulations in the Reserve and fixed or set up by the Committee;
 - (e) Ride or drive any motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve except on the road-ways provided and then only at a speed not exceeding twenty-five (25) kilometres per





REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN-SHIP OF YEA RESERVED AS A SITE FOR PUBLIC

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township and Parish of Yea was temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Park by Order in Council dated the 21st December, 1976 (vide Government Gazette of the 7th January, 1977): And whereas that portion of the Crown land as is shown by green colour on plan marked "Y/ 16.3.77" attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.10271 was reserved for Public Purposes by Order in Council dated the 23rd May, 1881 (vide Government Gazette of the 27th May 1881): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore 1, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

 - (h) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatsoever in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person;



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN LAND IN THE PARISH OF KANIVA RESERVED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES (TOURIST CAMPING AND FAUNA PARK PURPOSES).

(TOURIST CAMPING AND FAUNA PARK PURPOSES).

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown Lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Kaniva was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Tourist Camping and Fauna Park Purposes) by Order in Council dated the 12th July, 1977 (vide Government Gazette of the 20th July, 1977): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times-subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time.
- 2. The Committee may from time to time set aside such portion or portions of the Reserve as may be required for the holding of any public entertainment, games, sports, camping or the parking of vehicles and no person shall use any such portion or portions other than for the purpose or purposes for which it has been set apart and then only subject to such terms and conditions and on the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the Committee.
 - 3. No person shall:---
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or
 - (b) commit any nuisance in the Reserve;
 - (c) climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, rubbish or other unwanted material or thing therein except in receptacles provided for the nurpose. purpose;
 - (d) light any fire in the Reserve except in any place or places which may be provided for the purpose by the Committee;
 - (e) remove any sand, soil, gravel or rock from the Reserve:

- (f) damage any vegetation or interfere with or disturb any sand, stone, gravel, rock, clay or other earth in the Reserve by driving any vehicle or by any other means;
- (g) Drive any vehicle in a manner dangerous to the public in the Reserve;
- (h) drive any vehicle in the Reserve so as to cause noise which is unreasonable in the circumstances:
- (i) drive any vehicle in the Reserve at a speed greater than twelve (12) kilometres per hour;
- (j) enter or remain in the Reserve while in a state of intoxication.
- 4. No person, unless authorized, in writing, by the Committee and then only subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be prescribed by the said Committee, shall—
 - (a) set up or occupy within the Reserve a camp or caravan:
 - (b) bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain or leash and any dog found in the Reserve except as provided, shall be seized and disposed of by the Committee;
 - (c) bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats or other animals except as hereinbefore provided;
 - (d) sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article or any other commodity whatsoever;
 - (e) organize or take part in any public entertainment, game or sport in the Reserve;
 - (f) in the Reserve, carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, or shoot at or kill or injure any animal, bird or other wild life; provided that, subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958, the holder of a current game licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season may:—
 - use a shot gun as defined under the Game Act 1958; and
 - carry a shot gun during the twenty-four (24) hour period immediately prior to said open season.
 - (g) operate an aircraft on any part of the Reserve.
 - (h) erect any structure whatsoever on any part of the Reserve.

- 15. The owner or driver of any vehicle shall park such vehicle within the Reserve in such place and manner as directed by the duly appointed officer of the Committee to control vehicular traffic in the Reserve.
- 6. No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Reserve shall bring a caravan therein, nor shall any person sub-let a caravan therein without the permission, in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 7. No person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for a period of more than 28 days at any one time, unless with the special consent, in writing, of the Committee, and no person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for more than two periods of 28 days in any one calendar year.
- 8. Every person holding or purporting to hold any written receipt or permission issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or any authorized officer thereof, or by any member of the Police Force or by a Bailiff of Crown Lands, produce such written receipt or permission.
- 9. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force or by a Bailiff of Crown Lands, to leave the same.
- 10. Any person committing any breach of these Regulations and who refuses to state his name and place of abode or who states a false name or place of abode to any member of the Committee or to any employee of such Committee shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations—(Rs.10372).
