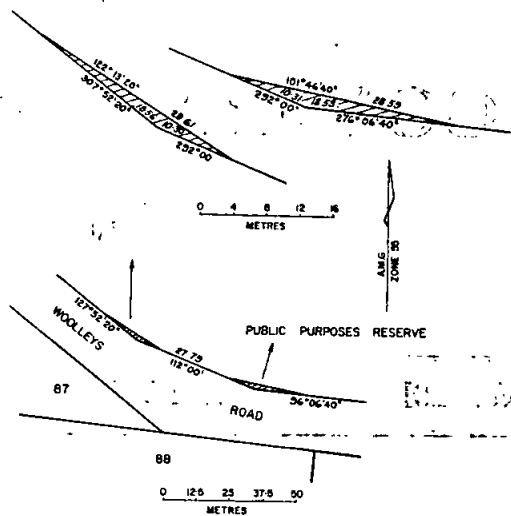

PROCLAMATION

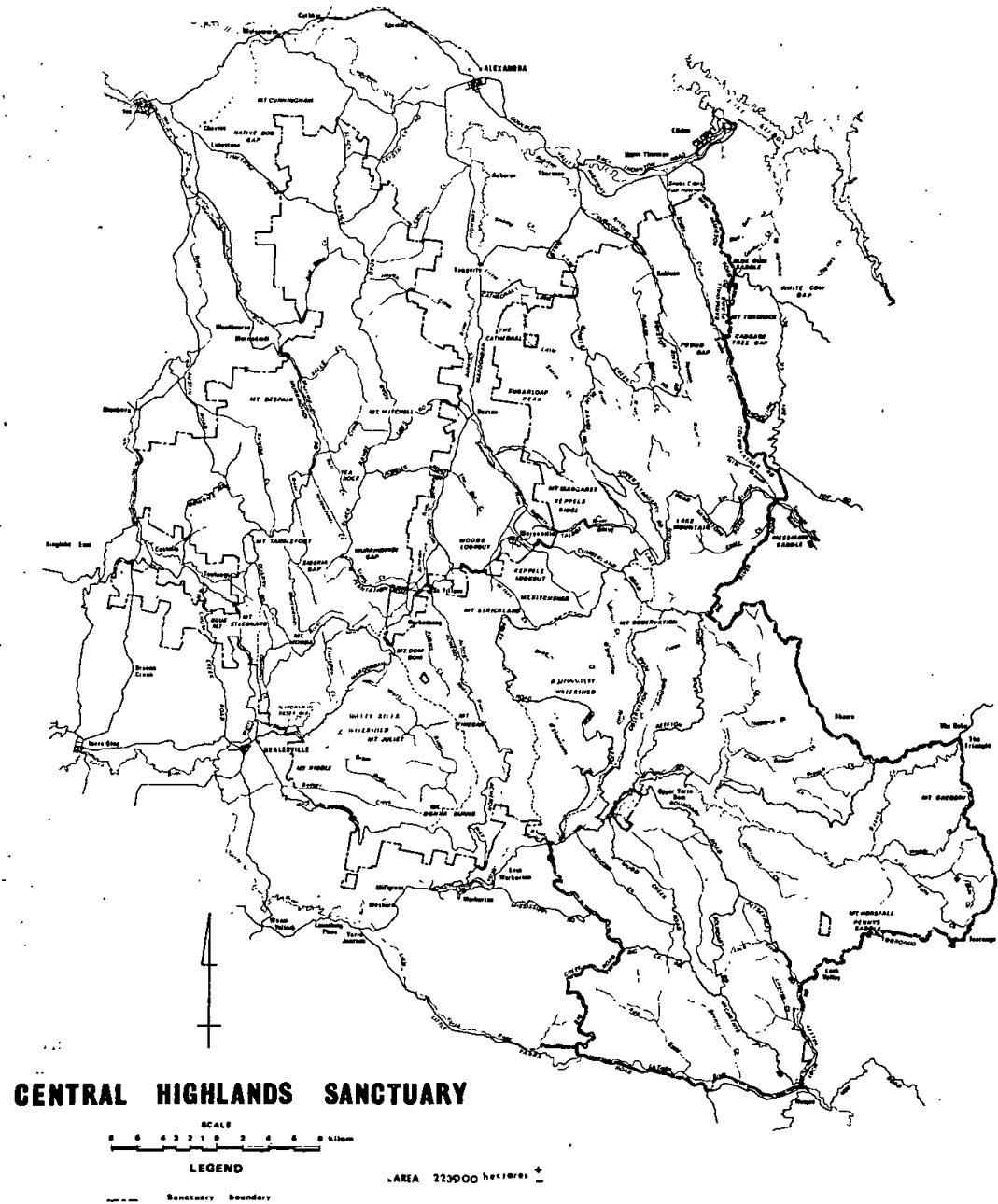
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, The Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Game Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the 6th day of June, 1912, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 19th day of June, 1912, directing that certain parts of Victoria described therein shall be localities in which from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the 3rd Schedule

to the Game Act 1890 and do in lieu thereof direct that the part of Victoria within the area hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the 3rd Schedule to the Game Act 1958.

MAGISTRATES (SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS) ACT 1975

PROCLAMATION

1. 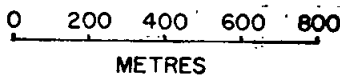
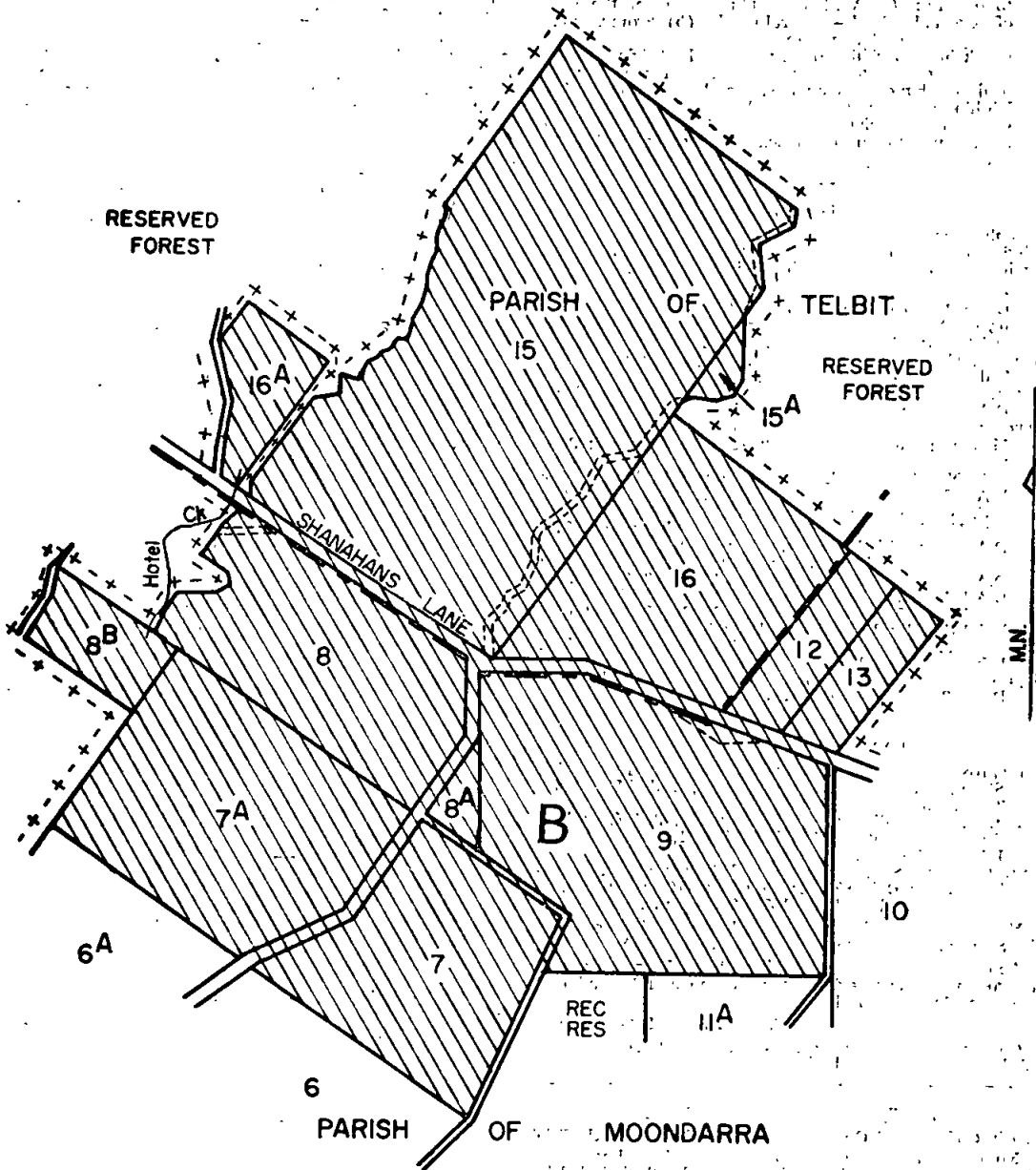

Legal Profession Practice Act
SOLICITORS' (AUDIT AND PRACTISING
CERTIFICATES) RULES

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 88 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* and of all powers thereunto enabling the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby makes the following rules of the Institute:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1978 and shall be read and construed as one with the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1965 and all rules amending those rules, which rules and these rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules.

2. These rules shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1978.

3. Rules 5, 16 (1), 16 (1) (a) and 16 (1) (A) of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules are repealed and the following Rules are substituted in lieu thereof:—

5. (1) Subject to the Act and these rules any Solicitor may employ any practising public accountant to examine or audit his trust accounts.

(2) The Council may require a solicitor to terminate the appointment of an auditor if the Council is of the opinion that the auditor for any reason may not properly perform his duties, provided that both the solicitor in question and the auditor should be first given an opportunity to show cause why the Council should not require the appointment to be terminated.

(3) Unless the Council otherwise approves, no person shall be appointed or continue as an auditor of a solicitor's trust account, if he carries out work for that solicitor other than—

- (a) the auditing of any other accounts conducted by that solicitor in his practice whether on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person; or
- (b) advisory or consulting duties consequential on his function as an auditor.

16. (1) In carrying out any audit under the Act (excluding audits or examinations pursuant to Section 74 of the Act) the auditor shall in the first place be required—

- (a) to carry out such audit making such checks as will enable him to give an opinion as to whether the solicitor has, during the period covered by the audit, complied with the requirements of the Act and these Rules relating to the trust account.

(1A) For the purpose of making checks and the general test examination referred to in paragraphs (a) and (c) of the last preceding sub-rule, the auditor shall be entitled to examine such number of dealings representative of every phase of the solicitor's practice as the auditor shall in the circumstances consider reasonable.

4. Rule 23 of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules which became inoperative on 1st July, 1948 is repealed and the following Rule is substituted in lieu thereof:—

23. (1) A solicitor shall not maintain in his or his firm's name or in the name of any partner or partners an interest bearing account or deposit to the credit of which he has paid money held by him in trust for more than one person unless the money is held in trust for two or more persons jointly;

(2) Where a solicitor pays to the credit of an interest bearing account or deposit any money held by him in trust for any person, he shall forthwith open an account in his trust ledger designated as that person's interest bearing account or deposit and shall make appropriate entries in his trust ledger to record the balance of such account or deposit and the client for whom the account or deposit is held.

5. Rules 27 (c), 29A and 30 of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules are repealed and the following Rules are substituted in lieu thereof:—

27. (c) The register of securities, register of investments and mortgage register.

29A. The register of securities, register of investments and mortgage register shall form part of the solicitors' trust accounts within the meaning of Rule 16 hereof and shall be subject to audit accordingly.

30. Every solicitor shall retain every volume of his register of securities, register of investments and mortgage register for at least two years after the date of the last disposal entry made therein.

6. After Rule 30 the following Rule shall be inserted:—

30A. (1) Every solicitor shall keep a register to be known as the register of investments, in which he shall record, or in which he shall cause to be recorded, details of every investment of trust monies for or on behalf of any person for which there is no security held by the solicitor which is required pursuant to Rule 28 to be entered in the register of securities;

(2) The details to be entered in the register of investments shall include in relation to each investment:—

- (a) the name of the person for whom the investment is made;
- (b) the amount invested;

- (c) the date upon which the investment is made;
- (d) a description of the investment;
- (e) details (including the cheque number or other means of identification) of the payments whereby the investment is made sufficient to identify the payment in the trust books of account;
- (f) a statement as to whether any certificate or other document evidencing the investment or security therefor is held by the solicitor; and
- (g) when the investment matures or is realized and the proceeds are received by the solicitor for or on behalf of any person, a reference to the cash receipt record in the trust books of account.

7. Rules 32A (1) and (2) of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules are repealed and the following Rules are substituted in lieu thereof:—

32A. (1) Every solicitor shall at the end of every calendar month prepare a statement reconciling the balances in his trust ledgers with the balances of his trust bank accounts and shall keep the reconciliation statement for each month in some appropriate book.

(2) It shall be a sufficient compliance with this rule if the list of ledger balances in the statement comprises merely the separate amounts standing to the credit of each ledger account in the same sequence as they appear in the ledger and the total of such balances without setting forth the names of the respective clients on whose behalf such monies are held.

8. Part 6 of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules is repealed and the following Rules are substituted in lieu thereof:—

PART 6—TRUST RECORDS

33. Every solicitor shall for each sum of trust account money received by him forthwith write a consecutively prenumbered receipt for such money specifying therein:—

- (a) the date of payment
- (b) the identity of the person making the payment
- (c) whether the payment was by cash, cheque or bank cheque
- (d) the amount of the payment
- (e) the person for whose benefit the money was received
- (f) brief particulars of the subject matter or purpose in respect of which the money was received in sufficient detail to identify the relevant transaction,

and shall at the same time make a legible carbon duplicate of such receipt which shall be identically numbered with its original and shall retain such duplicate in the book into which they are bound.

34. Unless so requested by the person making the payment a solicitor shall not be required to give the original receipt to the person making the payment, but, subject as aforesaid he shall retain both the original and duplicate receipts in the book into which they are bound.

35. Every solicitor shall for each sum of trust account money paid by him complete his cheque butt in relation to such payment by specifying therein:—

- (a) the date of payment
- (b) the trust ledger account to which the payment is to be debited
- (c) the person to whom the payment is paid and whether by cash, cheque or bank cheque
- (d) the amount of the payment
- (e) brief particulars of the subject matter or purpose for which the payment was made.

and shall retain such cheque butts in the book into which they are bound.

36. In respect of all payments made in cash the solicitor shall obtain and retain a proper receipt therefor, and where paid by an open cheque such cheque shall be endorsed by the recipient before being handed over by the solicitor.

37. Sufficient details shall be entered in both the cash receipts book and cash payments book to enable adequate details of the transaction to be posted into the trust ledger account.

38. In respect of the transfer of any sum of money from the trust ledger account of any person to the trust ledger account of any other person details of the transfer shall be entered into a journal giving at least the following information:—

- (a) the date of entry
 - (b) the trust ledger account from which the money is transferred
 - (c) the trust ledger account to which the money is transferred
 - (d) the purpose for the transfer of the money
- and shall retain such journal entries in a bound book.

39. Sufficient details shall be posted into the trust ledger to enable the nature of the transactions to be clearly understood.

40. Trust account records shall be retained for not less than:—

- (a) Trust ledger accounts—indefinitely.
- (b) Cash books and journal—seven years.
- (c) Copy of receipts issued—seven years.
- (d) Cheque butts—seven years.
- (e) Bank statements—seven years.
- (f) Files relating to trust transactions—seven years.

41. Whenever at any audit or examination of a solicitor's trust accounts the auditor so requires, the solicitor shall produce to the auditor all books of receipts used and unused supplied to the solicitor.

42. Any solicitor who ceases to carry on his practice shall forthwith deliver to the secretary any unused trust account receipt forms in his possession and the said forms shall be disposed of as the Council thinks fit.

43. Upon the death of any solicitor practising by himself and not in partnership, his auditor shall as soon as possible take charge of any unused trust account receipt forms, and shall forthwith deliver the said forms to the secretary, and the said forms shall be disposed of as the Council thinks fit.

9. Rule 43A of the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules is repealed.

10. After Rule 51 the following Rule shall be inserted:—

52. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, the Council may, on the advice of a practising public accountant and subject to such conditions as the Council may impose, excuse compliance by a solicitor with any of the provisions of these Rules. The Council may, at any time, vary any such conditions and may, at any time, revoke any provision so granted.

11. Form 2 of the Schedule to the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules is amended by replacing paragraph 7 with the following paragraph:—

7. That the trust accounts of the said *
have

have not been regularly kept and properly written up and the accounting systems and records maintained by the said *
are adequate having regard to the nature of the practice.

12. Form 2 of the Schedule to the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules is amended by the addition of the following paragraphs 10 and 11:—

10. That in my opinion the said *
has complied with the requirements of the Act and of the Rules relating to trust accounts.

11. That I do not, and have not during the period covered by this report, carried out any duties for or on behalf of the said *
other than duties in connexion with the audit or duties which have been approved by the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria.

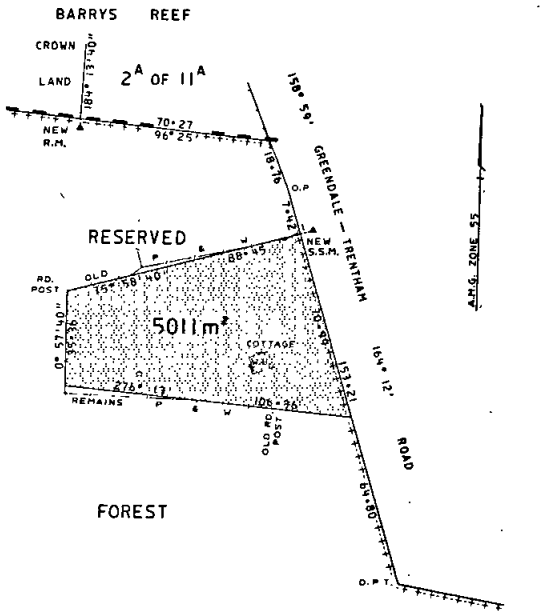

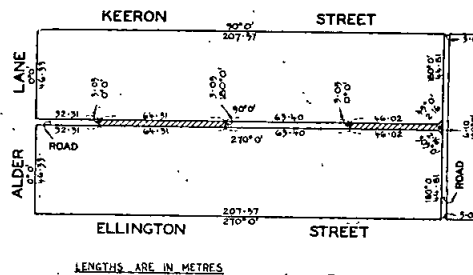
PARTS OF A ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF CAULFIELD

Whereas it is provided in section 528 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958, that where a road (whether or not a public highway but not being a road set out on land of the Crown) or any part thereof is not required for public use, the Governor in Council on the request of the council of the municipality in which such road is situated made not less than one month after publishing in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posting to the registered proprietor (if any) of the land and the owners and occupiers (if any) of the lands abutting or immediately adjacent to the road notice of intention to make such a request may by Order published in the Government Gazette direct that such a road or part thereof shall be discontinued and thereupon such road or part thereof shall be discontinued accordingly.

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby repeals the *Teaching Service—Primary Schools Division (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation* and makes the following Regulation, to take effect on the 12th March, 1978.

TEACHING SERVICE—PRIMARY SCHOOLS DIVISION
(CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES, AND ALLOWANCES) REGULATION

1. This Regulation may be cited as the "Teaching Service—Primary Schools Division (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation".

2. *Interpretation.*

The term "subdivision" in this Regulation means salary subdivision and represents a point of a salary scale on which, unless specified elsewhere in this Regulation, a member must serve for a minimum of one year before being eligible to progress to any higher subdivision within the range prescribed for the appropriate qualifications or position held.

3. *Salaries and Allowances.*

- (a) Unless otherwise indicated all salaries and allowances referred to in this Regulation and specified in Schedule "A" are annual rates.
- (b) Within the salary ranges prescribed, a member, subject to satisfactory service, shall proceed by annual increments from the minimum to the maximum of the range.

Provided that, subject to qualifications and/or experience, the Tribunal shall determine the minimum and maximum subdivisions of the salary range applicable to an individual member.

4. This Regulation provides for the following classes:—

Special;
Senior Teacher;
Assistant.

Within these classes specified positions shall be available as follows:—

Class.	Specified Position.
Special	Principal, Special Grade School; Vice-Principal, Special Grade School.
Senior Teacher	Principal, Grade I. School; Vice-Principal, Special Grade or Grade I. School; Senior Teacher.
Assistant	Principal, Grade II. School; Vice-Principal, Grade I. or Grade II. School; Assistant in receipt of a responsibility allowance; Head Teacher, Grade III. School; Assistant.

5. Schedule of Rates.

(a) Salaries.

The several classes and positions set out in clause 4 shall be paid in accordance with the salaries specified in Section I of Schedule "A", Part I.

(b) Allowances.

A member of the Assistant Class who is appointed to one of the positions detailed in Section 1 of Schedule "A", Part II, shall receive, in addition to his salary, the allowance or allowances specified in that Section.

Provided that, except where prescribed by way of higher duties allowances in sub-clause 14 (d), the responsibility allowance shall be paid only to permanent members eligible to proceed to subdivision 12 or higher.

(This proviso should be read in conjunction with sub-clause 1 (c) of Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.)

6. Specified Ranges—Assistant Class.

(a) According to qualifications, members of the Assistant Class shall be paid the salaries specified in Section I (c) of Schedule "A", Part I, within the following ranges:—

Qualifications (including an approved course of teacher training)	Subdivisional Range
(i) Certificate A comprising a four-year course of study for which the pre-requisite was Higher School Certificate or an approved equivalent	7-14
(ii) Certificate A comprising a four-year course of study for which the pre-requisite was Leaving Certificate or an approved equivalent	6-14
(iii) Certificate B comprising a three-year course of study for which the pre-requisite was Higher School Certificate or an approved equivalent	5-12
(iv) Certificate B comprising a three-year course of study for which the pre-requisite was Leaving Certificate or an approved equivalent	4-12
(v) Certificate C comprising a two-year course of study for which the pre-requisite was Leaving Certificate or an approved equivalent	2-9
(vi) Lesser approved qualification	1-9

Provided that a member who possesses Certificate A including an approved four-year university degree, an honours degree, or postgraduate qualifications approved by the Tribunal may receive a total credit not exceeding two subdivisions of the schedule during his current service. This proviso may be applied on initial appointment or at any subsequent time or times.

Provided further that the Tribunal shall determine the appropriate subdivisional range where specific provision is not made in this Regulation.

- (b) An exit student who has not successfully completed an approved course of teacher training shall be paid a salary at a point on the subdivisional range as determined by the Tribunal and shall not progress beyond that subdivision. On completion of an approved course of teacher training his salary shall be re-assessed in accordance with the qualification held and he shall be paid the salary subdivision to which he would have progressed on the appropriate scale.
- (c) Subsequent to appointment a member who acquires additional qualifications other than teacher training which entitle him to a subdivisional range with a higher maximum shall receive an adjustment to the next higher salary subdivision.
- (d) Irrespective of credit for approved teaching experience received on appointment, a member who held qualifications entitling him to commence on the lowest subdivision of any of the three salary ranges set out in the table in Section 1 (c) of Schedule "A", Part I., and who subsequently gains additional qualifications which would have entitled him to commence one subdivision higher on the same range shall receive an adjustment to the next higher salary subdivision of that range.
- (e) It shall be the responsibility of the member to make application for any adjustment under sub-clauses (c) or (d). Unless otherwise determined by the Tribunal the adjustment shall be effective from the 1st January of the year following the gaining of the additional qualification.

Except where special circumstances exist, the Tribunal will not authorise a retrospective adjustment with effect from a date earlier than the 1st January of the year in which application is made.

- (f) In addition to any adjustment under sub-clauses (c) or (d) a member shall, on his existing incremental date, receive any increment to which he is entitled and shall, where applicable, retain that incremental date.

Provided that a member receiving an adjustment under sub-clause (c) who had reached the maximum of his previous subdivisional range shall, where applicable, receive his subsequent increments on the anniversaries of the adjustment.

7. Recognition of Previous Service.

- (a) The commencing salary of a member who possesses qualifications entitling him to proceed to salary subdivision 12 or beyond may receive a credit for approved teaching experience in accordance with the provisions of sub-clause (b).
- (b) The years of approved teaching experience less one shall, for the purpose of determining the commencing salary, be counted as if the appointee had been employed in the Education Department for the full period and this Regulation (including the provisions of sub-clauses 6 (c) and 6 (f), had been in force over that period.

Provided that—

- (i) Experience with qualifications which entitle payment within the Certificate B range shall be counted from subdivision 3.
- (ii) Experience with qualifications which entitle payment within the Certificate A range shall be counted from subdivision 5 for

all qualifications other than approved graduate qualifications or the Fellowship Diploma of Art in which cases the experience shall be counted from subdivision 7.

(iii) Experience gained with qualifications which entitle payment within the Certificate C or Lesser Qualification ranges shall not be included in the calculation of credits.

(c) A member who possesses Certificate C or a lesser teaching qualification together with at least two years' approved teaching experience shall commence on the salary subdivision prescribed in the following table:—

Number of years	Subdivision within appropriate range	
	Range 1-9	Range 2-9
2 or 3	2	3
4 or 5	3	4
6 or more	4	5

(d) For the purpose of this clause the term "approved teaching experience" shall be interpreted on the basis of completed years of relevant full-time teaching experience gained subsequent to an approved course of teacher training.

(e) In special cases the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director-General may approve credit for experience other than that set out in this clause.

8. A teacher who is transferred from another division to the Assistant Class in the Primary Schools Division shall be classified in a subdivision corresponding to his previous classification and shall be eligible for any subsequent increment at the date of his former entitlement.

9. A teacher appointed as a principal by the Committee of Classifiers shall be remunerated as follows:—

(a) Where he is located at the school concerned from the commencement of the school year—

(i) If appointment becomes effective before the 1st March—salary and allowances appropriate to the position from the 1st January.

(ii) If appointment becomes effective at any date on or after the 1st March—salary and allowances appropriate to his former position from the 1st January until the appointment becomes effective;

or

if his former remuneration exceeds that applicable to the position to which he has been appointed—salary and allowances appropriate to the position from the 1st January.

(b) Where he is engaged in duties not connected with the school to which he has been appointed—remuneration as determined by the Tribunal.

10. Temporary Teachers.

(a) (i) Except where otherwise provided in this Regulation temporary teachers shall be paid in accordance with the salaries and conditions prescribed for the Assistant Class.

Provided that an appointee who has not completed an approved course of teacher training shall be paid a salary at a point on the subdivisional range as determined by the Tribunal and shall not progress beyond that subdivision. On completion of an approved course of teacher training his salary shall be reassessed in accordance with the qualifications held.

- (ii) A temporary teacher employed on the basis of half-time or more shall be paid the proportional rates of prescribed annual salary, and, where applicable, proportionate remote school allowance.
 - (iii) A temporary teacher on appointment to the classified service shall receive no adjustment to his salary, and, where applicable, shall retain his existing incremental date.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (i) of sub-clause (a), a temporary teacher employed on the basis of less than half-time shall be paid the rates for an emergency teacher as described in sub-clause (c):
- (c) (i) A temporary teacher, appointed to meet a sudden emergency for periods of not more than thirty school days, shall be paid the rate specified in Section 2 (a) of Schedule "A", Part I. for each day of actual teaching duty.
- Provided that in special cases approved by the Director-General, the period of service may be extended beyond thirty school days.
- (ii) A temporary teacher appointed to meet a sudden emergency, who is employed for half a school day, shall be paid the rate specified in Section 2 (b) of Schedule "A", Part I.
 - (iii) A temporary teacher employed part-time as an instructor in special classes shall be paid the rate specified for each session in Section 2 (c) of Schedule "A", Part I.

11. Rural School Aides.

Rural school aides shall be paid the salaries specified in Section 3 of Schedule "A", Part I.

12. Teachers Undertaking Overtime.

Teachers undertaking overtime shall be paid the rates specified in Section 4 of Schedule "A", Part I.

13. Persons Employed to Conduct Approved Courses.

- (a) Members of the Teaching Service employed to conduct courses approved by the Director-General shall be paid at the hourly rate specified in Section 5 of Schedule "A", Part I. for lectures or tutorial duties performed outside their normal hours of duty, subject to the prior approval of the Director-General for such employment and for the nature of the tutorial duties involved.
- (b) Persons other than members of the Teaching Service may in special circumstances and with the prior approval of the Director-General be employed to assist in conducting approved courses and shall be paid at such rates as are approved by the Tribunal from time to time.

14. Higher Duties Allowance.

- (a) Where the Director-General assigns a member of the Teaching Service to a position for which the remuneration prescribed is higher than that applicable to his current position he shall be paid a higher duties allowance in accordance with the terms and conditions of this clause if such assignment is for a period of more than one week.
- (b) No member shall be assigned the duties of a position unless at least one half of the duties of such position are to be performed.
- (c) Where less than the full duties of a position are performed payment of the allowance shall be proportionate to the extent of the duties carried out.

(d) Notwithstanding the proviso to sub-clause 5 (b), a member may be assigned the duties of a higher position if he is eligible to progress to subdivision 12. However, where the needs of a school permit, the duties of a higher position shall be assigned to an appropriately qualified permanent member. A member who is ineligible to proceed to subdivision 12 may, be assigned the duties of Head Teacher of a Grade III. school only.

(e) Assignments shall commence from the date of taking up duty and shall cease at the conclusion of the school year.

Provided that a member carrying out the duties of a higher position to which he has been assigned for at least one month prior to the end of the school year shall be paid to the 31st December of that year.

Provided further that if the member is re-assigned the duties of that position as from the first day of the succeeding school year he shall be paid the appropriate higher duties allowance from the 1st January of that year.

(f) Subject to sub-clause (c) higher duties allowances shall be calculated on the following bases:—

(i) *Positions in respect of which Responsibility, Head Teacher, or Principal allowances are paid:*

Allowances appropriate to the position in addition to the salary of the assignee.

(ii) *Other positions:*

An allowance which will raise the member's remuneration to the minimum salary prescribed for the position.

(g) In special cases the Director-General may, with the prior approval of the Tribunal, assign duties to a member on conditions other than those provided in this clause.

15. Salary Loading Allowance.

(a) A member other than a student in training who is employed on the 30th June of any year and who has at that date completed one year of full-time service for which salary has been received commencing on the 1st July of the preceding year shall be entitled to receive an annual salary loading allowance equivalent to 17½ per cent. of four weeks of the normal fortnightly total emolument to which he is entitled at that date or the maximum amount specified in Section 2 of Schedule "A", Part II, whichever is the lesser.

Provided that no payment shall be made in respect of service prior to resignation.

Provided further that pro rata payment in respect of service at ½ time fraction or greater shall be made in the case of—

(i) members who die or members who retire on account of age or ill health—at their final salary rates.

or

(ii) members who have completed a minimum of ninety days service within the twelve months preceding the 30th June. For the purpose of payment under this paragraph the allowance shall accrue at the rate of one quarter of the entitlement for each completed ninety days of service and in the case of part-time service the rate of payment shall be determined by the time fraction for which service within the preceding twelve months was the longest in the aggregate.

(b) For the purposes of this clause, a temporary member shall be deemed to retire—

- (i) on account of age—if on or after attaining the age of 60 years he ceases to be employed;
- (ii) on account of ill health—if he produces to the Tribunal satisfactory evidence that his ceasing to be employed is due to ill health which is likely to be permanent.

16. Training Allowance.

(a) Teachers engaged in the training of students shall be paid the allowance per year or per term specified in Section 3 (a) of Schedule "A", Part II.

Provided that no allowance shall be paid to members of the Special Class.

(b) An allowance per year or per term as specified in Section 3 (b) of Schedule "A", Part II, shall be paid to full-time teachers in charge of a library or an art/craft centre if the member is qualified in the appropriate field and is engaged in the training of students.

17. Special Schools Allowance.

Teachers employed in Special Schools as listed in Regulation 14 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and in other cases determined by the Tribunal shall be paid the allowance specified in Section 4 of Schedule "A", Part II.

18. Relieving Allowance.

(a) Special Class Relieving Principals shall be paid the allowance specified in Section 5 (a) of Schedule "A", Part II, at the end of each term of relieving service.

(b) Other relieving teachers shall be paid the allowances specified in Section 5 (b) of Schedule "A", Part II.

19. Students in Training.

(a) Students recruited to pursue an approved course shall be paid the allowances specified in Section 6 (a) of Schedule "A", Part II, according to the year of course undertaken.

(b) The following terms and conditions shall apply to students recruited to pursue an approved course or courses who have completed one or more years of the appropriate course without cost to the teacher training schemes of the Victorian Education Department or of any other State or Commonwealth Education authority:—

- (i) The completed years of course at date of recruitment shall be as determined by the institution which the studentship holder will attend.
- (ii) University courses for graduates or undergraduates shall be as approved by the Director-General but other courses shall be as approved by the Tribunal.
- (iii) Former students in training whose studentships were terminated shall not be entitled to the rates set out hereunder unless the Director-General considers that special circumstances led to such termination.
- (iv) The Tribunal may determine special rates for students who have completed approved courses other than those of a recognized university.
- (v) The allowances paid under this sub-clause shall be as specified in Section 6 (b) of Schedule "A", Part II.

- (c) Notwithstanding the allowances referred to in sub-clauses (a) and (b)—
- (i) a student living away from home who is in receipt of an allowance not exceeding the amount specified in Section 6 (c) (i) of Schedule "A", Part II, shall be paid an additional allowance as specified in that Section.
 - (ii) a student having a spouse or child wholly dependent shall be paid a minimum allowance as specified in Section 6 (c) (ii) of Schedule "A", Part II.
- (d) Former students in training who have been readmitted by the Director-General to the second, third, fourth, or fifth year of any approved course shall be eligible to receive the allowance appropriate to the year of the course in which they are engaged.
- (e) Students in training who enter upon courses at the beginning of an academic year shall be paid allowances from the 1st January of that year.
- Provided that where a studentship has been terminated under circumstances within the control of the student the allowances payable under any subsequent studentship award shall commence from a date to be determined by the Director-General.
- (f) Any reference to 1st year of course in this clause is to the year of study following Form VI level or the preliminary year of a diploma course, or the equivalents of such years.

20. Adult Migrant Education.

- (a) Holders of positions in Adult Migrant Education shall be paid the salaries specified in Section 6 (a) of Schedule "A", Part I.
- (b) Instructors who do not possess the qualifications required for appointment to a classified position in the Victorian Education Department shall not proceed beyond subdivision 4 of the Instructor scale.
- (c) When "time off" in lieu of duty in excess of 38 hours a week cannot be granted, such excess time shall be paid at the overtime rate per hour specified in Section 6 (b) of Schedule "A", Part I.

This rate shall apply to persons engaged in Continuation Classes in English for Adult Migrants.
