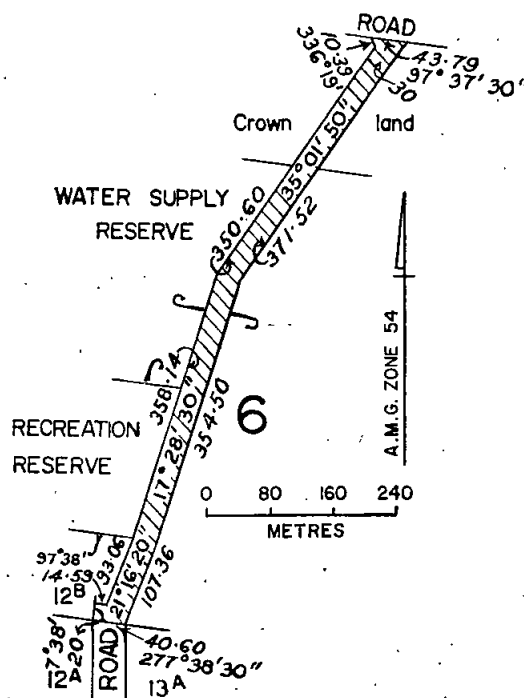
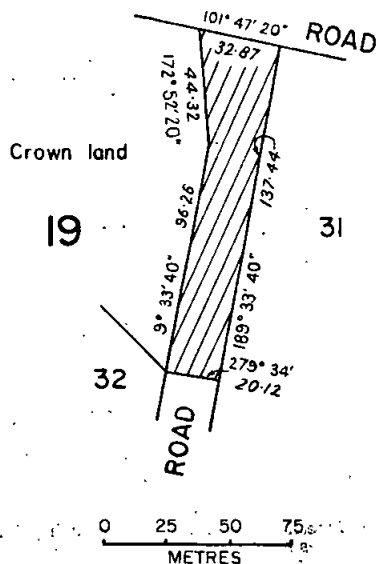

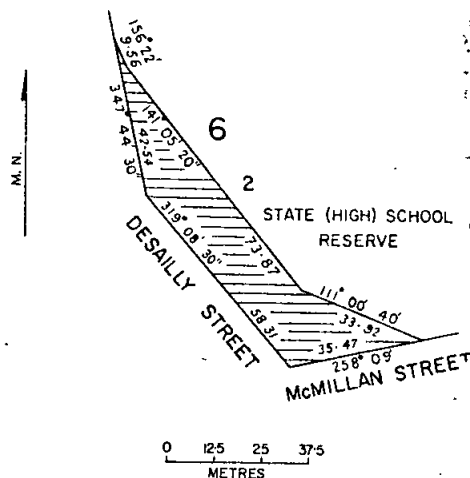
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

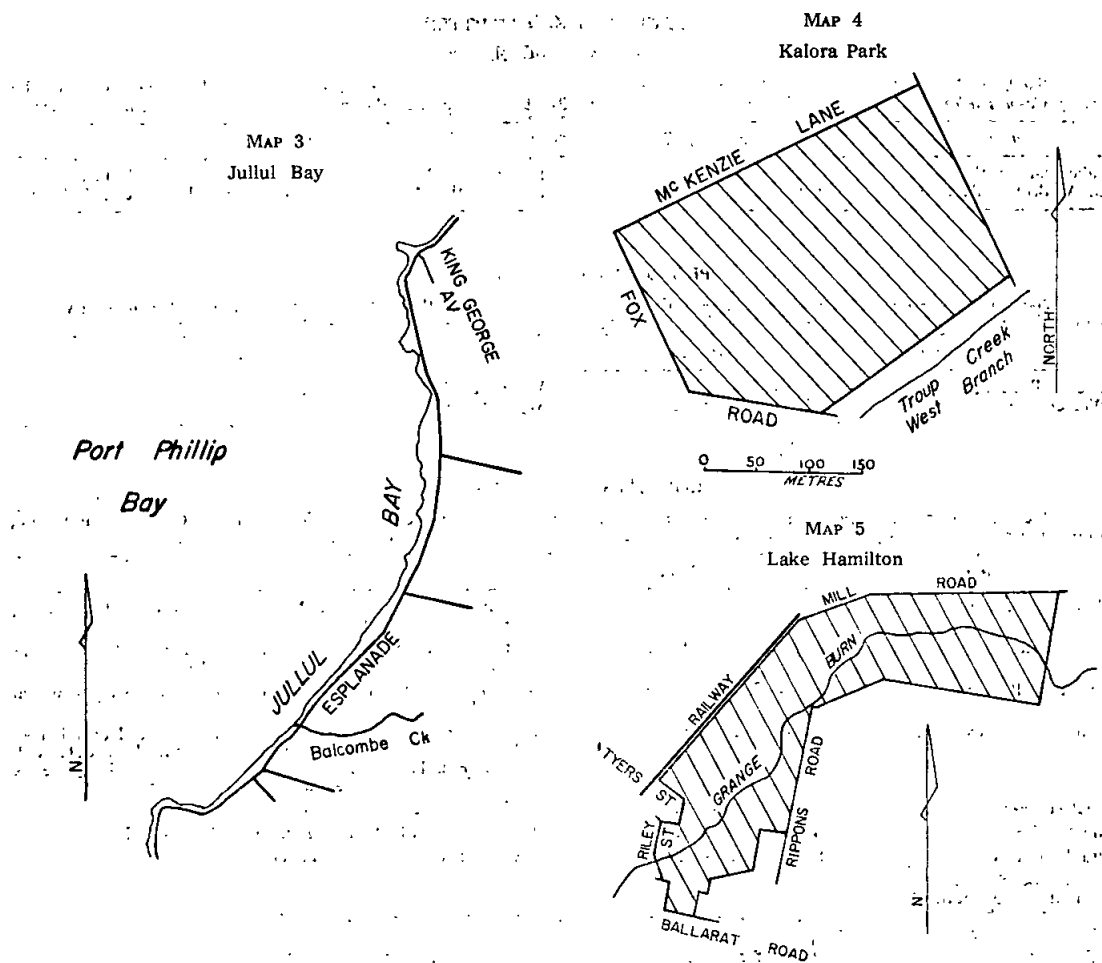

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "HERNES OAK RECREATION RESERVE"**

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Narracan, at Hernes Oak was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 18th October, 1977 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 26th October, 1977): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the *Land Act* 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the Care, Protection and Management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

**REGULATIONS**

1. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions or all of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, picnic or other recreational activity and from time to time grant to any person, club, association of clubs or organization upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the ground or grounds so set apart.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication or whilst under the influence of drugs, nor bring into, consume or sell any drugs in the Reserve;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- (d) remove or displace or damage in any way whatsoever the whole or any part of any notice or sign or of any board, tablet, plate or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice, sign or Regulations in the Reserve and fixed or set up by the Committee;
- (e) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve;
- (f) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (g) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve;
- (h) bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (i) bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (j) do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for any commercial purpose without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (k) on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee;
- (l) hawk or sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any goods, fruit or merchandise or anything else whatsoever, or solicit or gather money therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee;
- (m) play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind, or sing any

sacred or secular song, or enter into any public assemblage on the Reserve except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained;

- (n) cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee;
- (o) in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare any bird or other native game, or have any dead bird or other native game or the skin or pelt thereof in his or her possession;
- (p) park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve, except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, or bring a caravan into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

3. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding eight (8) kilometres per hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control vehicular traffic in the Reserve.

4. The use of mini bikes, trail bikes and similar recreational vehicles shall not be permitted on the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

5. Without the consent, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officers, no person shall—

- (a) deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind in the Reserve;
- (b) interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any track, building, water control structure, earthen bank, wildlife shelter belt or any other improvement or structure in the Reserve;
- (c) deposit on or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed, structure or equipment, and any fence, shed, structure or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve;
- (d) interfere with the flow of any water into, out of or within the Reserve, nor remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial;
- (e) in the Reserve pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind.

6. For the purpose of good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse the admission of any person to the Reserve.

7. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or a Crown Lands Bailiff, to leave the same.

8. Every person infringing these Regulations in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable—(Rs.10400).

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes, or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any Regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which such Regulation relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "APOLLO BAY FORESHORE (BOAT RAMP AREA) RESERVE"**

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township of Apollo Bay as is shown coloured red and hatched red on plan marked "A/11.3.77" attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.4917 was reserved for Public Purposes: And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the *Land Act* 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

**REGULATIONS**

**Definitions**

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Act" means the *Land Act* 1958.

"Authorized Officer" means any person appointed, in writing, by the Committee as an authorized officer for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force or any Bailiff of Crown Lands.

"Camp" without limiting the generality of the verb includes:—

(a) erect, occupy or use any tent or any temporary, make-shift or similar form of accommodation, or

(b) park, occupy or use any caravan or other moveable form of accommodation.

"Firearm" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol, gun or like thing using gas cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow or cross bow, and any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring or destroying animal life.

"Permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued under the Act or these Regulations.

"Vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, cart, horse-drawn vehicle, trailer or water craft.

**Behaviour**

2. No person shall—

(a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;

(b) commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public or any persons lawfully in the Reserve whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in any building, tent or other structure or in any enclosed or unenclosed space in the Reserve, or do or suffer to be done any act which in the opinion of an authorized officer is or is likely to be to the annoyance or disturbance of any person using the Reserve;

(c) play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to others using the Reserve.

**Shooting, &c.**

3. No person shall in the Reserve except in accordance with a written permit—

(a) shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;

(b) have in his possession or carry or use any firearm, poison, trap or snare.

4. (a) Any person carrying or using any firearm, poison, trap or snare in the Reserve without a permit shall surrender the same on demand to any authorized officer who shall issue a receipt therefor.

(b) The person apparently entitled to any such article may collect it from the office of the Committee, after completion of investigations and legal proceedings (if any) by the Committee in relation to any offence alleged against the person who surrendered the same.

**Damage**

5. (a) No person, except with a permit, shall in the Reserve remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower or other vegetation, or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure or any other thing of a like nature.

(b) No person shall dig up or remove from or bring into the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell-grit, sand, soil or loam.

**Missiles**

6. No person shall roll or throw any stone or any other substance or missile within the Reserve.

**Camping**

7. No person shall camp in any part of the Reserve.

**Refuse and Litter**

8. No person shall within the Reserve deposit or cause to be deposited, except in a receptacle provided for the purpose, any bottle, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.

9. No person shall clean or gut fish within the Reserve.

**Glass**

10. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserve.

**General**

11. No person shall in any part of the Reserve except in accordance with and upon the terms of a permit in writing—

(a) sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever;

(b) give out, distribute, erect, leave, set up or display any handbills, placards, notices, pamphlets, books, papers, advertising matter or any like thing;

(c) occupy, use or enter any building, booth, shed, stand or enclosure unless the same is set aside for public use;

(d) solicit or collect money or orders for goods or services;

(e) take part in or advertise any entertainment for gain;

(f) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind, or use any amplifier, public address system, loud hailer or similar device;

(g) let for hire any article, device or thing;

(h) take photographs for gain or commercial purposes;

(i) ply any vehicle for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward;

(j) conduct any school or provide any form of instruction for gain;

(k) advertise for sale or trade or hire any article, device, service or thing.

**Dogs**

12. No person shall cause, suffer or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge—

(a) to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog is and continues to be at all times under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and is effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from damaging or interfering in any way with any property in the Reserve;

(b) to be brought into or enter or remain in any portion of the Reserve prohibited to the entry of dogs and indicated by notice.

**Horses**

13. No person shall ride, drive or lead any horse upon the Reserve.

*Animals Generally*

14. (a) Save as aforesaid, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve without a permit.

(b) Any animal found in the Reserve contrary to these Regulations may be seized by an authorized officer and impounded or destroyed, and the owner or custodian thereof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such animal to any property in the Reserve.

*Enclosures*

15. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee, enter any area in the Reserve which is enclosed for the plantation of young trees, shrubs or grass plots or for the growth or preservation of native flora.

*Fires*

16. No person shall without a permit light a fire within the Reserve except in a fire place provided by the Committee for the purpose and any person who lights a fire in the Reserve shall take all reasonable and proper precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control; nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly or negligently do, make or permit any act or omission which may result or be likely to result in damage by fire to anything growing or being on the Reserve.

*Roadways, &c.*

17. No person shall unless authorized by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas as are set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position where it may cause undue or unreasonable obstruction to the lawful passage of others.

*Parking*

18. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserve except—

- (a) in an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs;
- (b) as and where directed or authorized by the Committee or an authorized officer;
- (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

*Stranded Vehicles*

19. An authorized officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken-down vehicle from any roadway or area within the Reserve provided that the removal of any vehicle—

- (a) shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry to the Reserve; and
- (b) may be effected in such manner as the authorized officer deems fit.

*Abandoned Vehicles*

20. Any vehicle left unattended within the Reserve for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours may be removed by the Committee at the risk and expense of the owner.

*Directions by Sign*

21. (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserve or any part thereof.

(b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.

(c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

*Directions to Leave*

22. (a) Any authorized officer may direct any person, who, in his opinion, offends against these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserve or any place therein.

(b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and may be removed from the Reserve or any place therein.

*Giving of Name*

23. If, in the opinion of an authorized officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and

any person who refuses when asked by such officer to furnish his name and address or who furnishes an incorrect name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence.

*Obstruction of Officers*

24. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any authorized officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserve.

*Vehicles*

25. No person shall—

- (a) damage any vegetation or interfere with or disturb any sand, stone, gravel, rock, clay, or earth by driving any vehicle or by any other means;
- (b) drive any vehicle in a manner dangerous to the public;
- (c) drive any vehicle so as to cause noise which is unreasonable in the circumstances.

*Boat Launching Ramps*

26. The Committee may—

- (a) set apart any portion of the Reserve as a boat launching ramp;
- (b) fix and collect such fees or other charges as it may from time to time determine for the use of such boat launching ramp.

*General Powers*

27. The Committee may—

- (a) provide and maintain any conveniences, facilities or amenities of any description in any part of the Reserve or arrange for the provision and maintenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof; provided nevertheless, that the provision of any conveniences, facilities or amenities shall require the approval of the Minister of Lands;
- (b) make such arrangements as it deems necessary or desirable for or in connection with the proper and efficient management and operation of the Reserve or any portion thereof.

28. No person shall in any part of the Reserve except in accordance with and upon the terms of a permit, in writing and with the approval of the Minister of Lands, erect or place therein any building, booth, shed or other structure.

*Permits*

29. (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine, either generally or in the particular case.

(b) No permit shall be transferable.

(c) Any permit may be revoked or withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee.

(d) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.

(e) any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by an authorized officer and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit—(Rs.4917).

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN CROWN RESERVES IN THE CITY OF RICHMOND, PARISH OF JIKA JIKA**

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any Public Purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the City of Richmond were reserved for various Public Purposes as stipulated in the Schedule hereunder: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserves") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but have been placed under control of a Committee of Management, being the Corporation of the City of Richmond (hereinafter referred to as the "Council"): And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of such lands and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the said lands in lieu of all previous Regulations relating thereto which are hereby rescinded:—

**SCHEDULE**

1. (a) The land in the City of Richmond, Parish of Jika Jika temporarily reserved as a site for a Children's Playground by Order in Council dated the 21st June, 1955 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 29th June, 1955) and known as the "Ailan Bain Reserve"—(Rs.7363).

(b) The land in the Parish of Jika Jika temporarily reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Children's Playground) by Order in Council dated the 21st November, 1967 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 29th November, 1967) and known as the "C. H. Evans Reserve"—(Rs.8889).

(c) The remaining portion of the land in the City of Richmond temporarily reserved as a site for Recreation Purposes by Order in Council dated the 16th July, 1918 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 24th July, 1918) and known as the "McConchie Reserve"—(Rs.1802).

(d) The land in the City of Richmond temporarily reserved as a site for Public Gardens by Order in Council dated the 20th December, 1900 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 28th December, 1900) and known as the "Barkly Gardens Reserve"—(Rs.1621).

(e) The land in the City of Richmond, Parish of Jika Jika permanently reserved as a site for Recreation Purposes by Order in Council dated the 21st January, 1925 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 28th January, 1925) and known as the "City Reserve"—(Rs.3042).

(f) The land in the City of Richmond, Parish of Jika Jika permanently reserved as a site for Recreation Purposes by Order in Council dated the 21st January, 1925 (*vide Government Gazette* of the 28th January, 1925) and known as the "Richmond Union Bowling Club Reserve"—(Rs.3042).

(g) The land in the City of Richmond, Parish of Jika Jika temporarily reserved as sites for Public Park and Recreation by Orders in Council dated the 4th July, 1906, the 8th January, 1952 and the 4th June, 1957 (*vide Government Gazettes* of the 11th July, 1906, the 16th January, 1952 and the 12th June, 1957, respectively) and forming part of "Richmond Park"—(Rs.152).

**REGULATIONS**

1. No person other than a member of the Council or an officer or employee of the Council on duty shall enter the Reserves when a charge or entrance fee is made for admission thereto as hereinafter provided without first paying such charge unless such person is excused by the Council in writing from paying such charge or entrance fee.

2. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days and at such hours as the Council may by resolution set aside as days on which charges or entrance fees may be received and collected from any person entering in or upon the Reserves or any specified part or parts thereof, and on any of such days such charges or entrance fees which the Council may by resolution specify may be so received and collected.

3. The Council may grant permission in writing to any person, club, organization or group of persons to use the Reserves provided such use accords with the purposes of the reservations.

4. No person shall interfere with or break or damage or remove any tree, plant, shrub or flower in or upon the Reserves or walk on the flower beds or borders, or climb, jump or get upon or over any fence, gate or building or part thereof or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, walls, seats or other structures in the Reserves, or roll or throw stones or missiles, or leave in the Reserves or in any part thereof or in any building therein any bottle, can, broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided, or spit or expectorate upon or otherwise foul any path or structure, or remove, displace, disfigure or damage any noticeboard, scoreboard or other erection in or upon the Reserves.

5. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserves or shoot, snare or destroy or attempt to shoot, snare or destroy any bird or animal therein or thereon except by the written authority of the Council.

6. No person, club, organization or group of persons shall engage in, play or practise cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse, golf or any like games in or upon the Reserves without written authority of the Council and then only on payment of such sum or sums as may be set out by resolution of the Council: provided, however, that the provisions of this Regulation shall not be applicable to children under the age of fourteen years when occupied in playing ball games on areas displaying a notice erected by the Council announcing that ball games or other games are permitted to be played on such areas.

7. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling in the Reserves without the written authority of the Council and all other relevant authorities, or engage in any unseemly, disorderly or indecent conduct or otherwise interfere with the comfort or enjoyment of any other person or persons within the Reserves.

8. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt any employee of the Council or person authorized by the Council engaged in any duty in the Reserves.

9. No person shall sell, expose or offer for sale within the Reserves any article whatever or operate or cause to be operated any amusement for which a charge is made or make a collection of money for any purpose without the written authority of the Council.

10. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any fight or disturbance or use any indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency by means of dress, language or conduct in the Reserves and no person shall enter or remain in the Reserves whilst in a drunken or intoxicated condition or whilst under the influence of drugs.

11. No person other than a player, official or competitor at any sports match or sports gathering duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations shall enter or remain within or upon any playing arena in the Reserves during the progress of such sports match or sports gathering or otherwise interfere with the game or interrupt or interfere with any employee of the Council or person authorized by the Council in the proper execution of his duty or work.

12. No person shall remain in the Reserves at any time when lawfully directed to leave the same by any police officer or officer or employee of the Council or person authorized by the Council notwithstanding that a fee or charge for admission may have been paid.

13. No person other than an officer or employee of the Council or person authorized by the Council shall enter any plots or areas which are set aside for the planting or growing of flowers, trees or shrubs in the Reserves.

14. No person other than an officer or servant of the Council shall ride or drive any horse, motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle or any bicycle into or upon the Reserves except for the purpose of parking such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle or other vehicle in any parking area set aside for that purpose by the Council, provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the wheeling of bicycles, prams, invalid wheelchairs, child or baby carriages and children's toys along any delineated footpath in the Reserves.

15. No person shall permit or suffer any animal owned by him or of which he is in charge to be in or upon the Reserves unless such animal be controlled by a leash, chain or other restraining device.

16. In any portion of the Reserves where a children's playground has been established by the provision of playground equipment such as swings or by notice that such portion is a children's playground:—

- (1) No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon or remain on such an area or use any of the swings or other playground equipment therein; provided, however, that parents or other persons in charge of children shall not be prohibited from entering upon or remaining on the area or from using any seating which may be provided to watch over or supervise children in their charge.
- (2) No person shall use any swing or other playground equipment erected in such an area for a longer period than five minutes if any other person is waiting to use such appliance.
- (3) No person shall enter or remain in a children's playground after the hour of sunset and before the hour of sunrise unless authorized by the Council.

17. Every person being on the Reserves shall obey the directions of any police officer, officer of the Council or person authorized by the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.

18. No person whilst in or upon the Reserves shall fly or permit to be flown any model aeroplane over such Reserves.

19. No person shall camp or pitch, erect or occupy any camp, tent or temporary shelter in or upon the Reserves nor remove therefrom any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel without the written consent of the Council.

20. No person shall without the written consent of the Council and the observance of all statutory restrictions which may be in force light any fire or permit any fire to remain alight in the Reserves except in a fire-place or barbecue provided by the Council.

21. No person without the written permission of the Council and a permit to sell or supply liquor issued pursuant to the Liquor Control Act shall supply or sell any alcoholic liquor to any person or persons in the Reserves.

22. No person without the written permission of the Council shall consume alcoholic liquor within any pavilion, structure, tent or temporary building in the Reserves.

23. No person shall damage or cause to be damaged any pavilion, structure, tent or temporary building erected in the Reserves—(Rs.7363, Rs.8889, Rs.1802, Rs.1621, Rs.3042, Rs.152).

Regulations Nos. 1, 6 and 27 shall be amended to read:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, determined by the Committee (not exceeding 52 in any one year) when a charge for admission to the Reserve may be made by the Committee or an approved organization subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by such Committee. Provided nevertheless, that any person desirous of occupying a caravan site in the Reserve shall pay such fees as are fixed for the purpose by the Committee.

6. (a) No person shall bring or allow to enter into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be led on a chain, cord or leash.

(b) Any dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, or any goats, pigs or poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Regulation, the Committee or any authorized officer or employee may direct that any dog, whether or not led by a chain, cord or leash, shall be removed from any portion of the Reserve set apart for the purpose of a caravan park pursuant to the provisions of Regulation No. 13, if in their opinion such dog is behaving in a manner detrimental to the well-being of campers therein.

27. No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal in the Reserve at a speed in excess of ten (10) kilometres per hour—(Rs.8419).

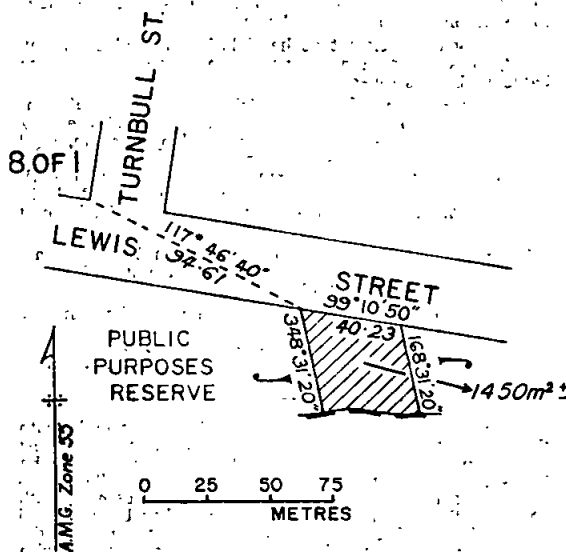

  - (c) by repealing paragraphs (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule.
5. Paragraphs (b) and (d) of the Second Schedule to the Principal By-law are repealed and the following paragraphs are substituted for them :

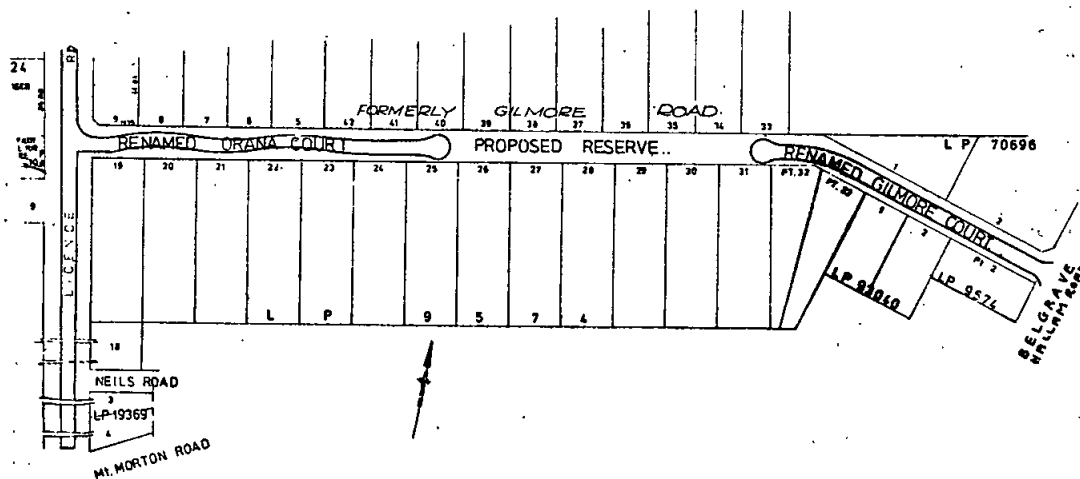

## 1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 15, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

## 2. Other matter

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matters for publication will be accepted by telephone.
