REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN-SHIP OF BERWICK RESERVED AS A SITE FOR A PUBLIC PARK

PUBLIC PARK

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township of Berwick, Parish of Berwick, was temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Park by Order in Council dated the 18th July, 1978 (vide Government Gazette of the 26th July, 1978): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of such land and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore, I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
  - 2. No person shall-
    - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
    - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication or whilst under the influence of drugs, nor bring into, consume or sell any drugs in the Reserve;
    - (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
    - (d) offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale in the Reserve or bring intoxicating liquor thereon without the written consent of the Committee first obtained;
    - (e) remove or displace or damage in any way whatsoever the whole or any part of any notice or
      sign or of any board, tablet, plate or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed
      or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any
      notice, sign or Regulations in the Reserve and
      fixed or set up by the Committee;
    - (f) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person em-ployed on the Reserve;
    - (g) climb, jump on or get over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats or other structures in the Reserve;
    - (h) interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck flowers, destroy or cut grasses in the Reserve;
    - (i) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatsoever in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person;
    - (j) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Com-
    - (k) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any animals or birds thereon;
    - (1) bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee;
    - (m) spit or expectorate on the paths or on any struc-ture in the Reserve;
    - (n) erect any building, tent or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee;
    - (o) bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
    - (p) do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent; in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

(q) remain in the Reserve between sunset and sun-rise without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

- 3. For the purpose of good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to
- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or any Crown Lands Bailiff, to leave the same.
- 5. No club or association shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor car within the Reserve except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the pur-
- 8. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals, except as hereinbefore provided, without the written consent of the Committee.
- 9. The owner of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 10. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding five (5) kilometres per hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control vehicular traffic therein.
- 11. The use of mini bikes, trail bikes and similar recreational vehicles shall not be permitted on the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- 12. The Committee shall have the right to charge or, subject to such terms and conditions as it deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, to authorize any club, association or person to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve for picnics or other recreational activities—(Rs.10529).



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "G, J. KENNEDY PARK RESERVE", TOWNSHIP OF COBRAM

RESERVE", TOWNSHIP OF COBRAM

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township and Parish of Cobram was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation and Camping Purposes by Order in Council dated the 21st August, 1973 (vide Government Gazette of the 29th August, 1973): And whereas the Crown land in the said Township and Parish as is indicated by red colour on plan marked "C/15.12.76" attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.9758 was permanently reserved for Public Purposes by Order in Council dated the 23rd May, 1881 (vide Government Gazette of the 27th May, 1881): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested

in trustees but have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve or any portion thereof may be set apart for any purposes consistent with the purposes of the reservation on any of which occasions the Committee or any organization granted the use of the Reserve or any portion thereof, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine, may charge such fee or fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time for the admission of every person to the Reserve or any portion thereof: Provided, nevertheless, that any person desirous of occupying a camp or caravan site in the Reserve shall pay such fees as are provided for in Regulation No. 15 hereof.

  2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 3. No person shall climb on any of the buildings, fences or gates in the Reserve or in any manner deface, damage or interfere with any buildings, fences, gates, structures, fixtures, fittings, equipment, posts, trees, shrubs or flowers
- 4. Any person, club or society, having obtained permission of the Committee to use any dressing shed, pavilion or other structure or enclosure on the Reserve shall maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition and no-room fitted with lock and key shall be left unlocked after use.
- 5. No person shall bring into or discharge any firearm or air-gun in the Reserve.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain or cord and any dog found therein except as provided in this Regulation or any goats, pigs or poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed destroyed.
- 7. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone or other substance in the Reserve, or play football, cricket, hockey or any other game with a hard or semi-hard ball except in portions of the Reserve set apart for the purpose.
- 8. No person shall ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the
  - 9. No person shall on the Reserve-
  - (a) light a fire or burn any material except with the consent of the Committee or in any place set apart for the purpose by the Committee or its duly appointed officer;
  - (b) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons;
  - (c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin, can, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind except in any receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.
- 10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve while in a state of intoxication.
- 11. No person shall play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind or sing any sacred or secular song or enter into any public discussions or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserve except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.
- 12. No person shall erect any tent, booth or other structure in the Reserve, nor offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or in any tent, booth or other structure thereon without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained Committee first obtained.
- 13. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a caravan
- 14. No person shall park a caravan or camp on or use any portion of the Reserve except such portion or portions thereof as are specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose and then only in such places as directed by the Committee's authorized officer.

- 15. No person shall park a caravan on or use any camping area or any building or convenience appurtenant to such camping area without the permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer and then only on the payment of such fees as may be fixed by the Committee from time to time and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 16. Any person occupying a site in any caravan park area shall keep such site in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition and when vacating such site shall collect and place all refuse, litter or garbage thereon in the receptacle provided for the purpose.
- 17. No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Reserve shall bring a caravan therein, nor shall any person sublet a caravan therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained.
- 18. No person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for a period of more than 28 days at any one time, unless with the special consent, in writing, of the Committee and no person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for more than two periods of 28 days in any one calendar vear.
- 19. Every person holding or purporting to hold any written receipt or permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or any authorized Officer thereof or by any member of the Police Force, produce such written receipt or permission.
- 20. No person, except workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees, shrubs or grass.
- 21. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt by conversation or otherwise any workmen or employees engaged in their work in the Reserve.
- 22. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve or in any of the buildings, structures or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—
  - (a) Crossing or trespassing on any playing ground during any sports or during practice thereat by any person or member of any sports club for the time being occupying the Reserve or any portion thereof, without the consent of the Committee any portion the Committee.
  - (b) Behaving improperly or riotously.
  - (c) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any sports or holiday amusement or any practice thereat.
  - (d) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.
- 23. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force, to leave the same.
- 24. Any person committing any breach of these Regulations and who refuses to state his name and place of abode or who states a false name or place of abode to any member of the Committee or to any employee of such Committee shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations Regulations.
- 25. No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal in the Reserve at a speed in excess of 15 kilometres per
- 26. The owner or driver of any vehicle shall park such vehicle within the Reserve in such place and manner as directed by the duly appointed officer of the Committee (Rs.9758)

DIVISION 1: REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ORDINARY MEETINGS OF COUNCIL

## Business

1. No business shall be conducted at an ordinary meeting of the Council unless it is business of which notice has been given by inclusion in the agenda or in any report accompanying the agenda or as provided for in clauses 5 and 6 hereof.

#### Agenda

2. A copy of the agenda of business for any ordinary meeting of the Council shall be posted or delivered to every Councillor not later than 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

#### Order of Business

- 3. After the reading of the prayer and the confirmation of the minutes and the signing thereof the business of an ordinary meeting of Council shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable but that for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect: effect:
  - (i) apologies;
  - (ii) declaration by Councillors of any direct or in-direct pecuniary interest in any item on the agenda;
  - (iii) resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting;
  - (iv) dealing with correspondence referred to in Clause 4 hereof and considering and ordering thereon;
  - (v) reception and reading of petitions, joint letters and memorials;
  - (vi) presentation of reports and the authorizing of payments;
  - (vii) business not elsewhere included;
  - (viii) Orders of the Day including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings;
- . (ix), reports from delegates appointed by Council to other bodies:

- (x) other motions of which previous notice has been given;
- (xi) Notice on Motion;
- (xii) urgent business.

#### Correspondence .

4. The correspondence received by the municipality shall be opened by the Town Clerk or some other persons as directed by him. #### Notice of Motion

Provided that the Council may resolve by a two-thirds majority of those present, to admit (without such notice) an item considered to be urgent business, not being a matter where the law otherwise requires that notice shall be given.

19. In all cases not otherwise provided for herein, resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council and its commiftees.

- 20. The minutes of any meeting of the Council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.
- 21. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting the first item of business thereat shall be—
  - (a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each Councillor at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or
  - (b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings

#### Addressing Meeting

22. Any Councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman and, subject to Clause 23

hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order then he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

#### Moving Motions or Amendments

- 23. (a) Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the meeting thereon.
- (b) Before the proposer speaks to a motion or amendment the chairman shall call for a seconder. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until the seconded except that a Councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by drawing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- (c) By proposing or seconding a motion or amendment, a Councillor shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion or amendment.
- (d) Upon the seconding of any motion or amendment the chairman shall call upon the mover to address the meeting. Thereafter the seconder shall be entitled to speak after, which the chairman shall call upon any Councillor who wished to speak in opposition and, if no Councillor speaks in opposition, the chairman may put the motion. If the motion is not then put, any other Councillor may be called upon to speak.

#### Debate

24. Any Councillor, except the mover of the original motion may propose or second an amendment. Any Councillor may address the meeting on an amendment whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

#### Right of Reply

25. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair; however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

#### Amendments

- 26. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 27. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
- 28. If an amendment be negatived or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at any time.
- 29. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

# Withdrawal of Motions

30. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

#### Use of Titles

31. The Councillors and Officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

#### Order of Speaking

32. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

#### Chairman may Speak

33. The chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

#### Speaking Twice

34. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion, except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood or as provided for in clauses 24 and 25 hereof.

#### Points of Order ·

35. The chairman when called upon to decide on points 35. The chairman when caused upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

### Speaking to Subject-matter

36. No Councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate; and all

imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to clause 39.

#### Call to Order

37. A Councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

#### Disorderly Expressions

38: Wherever any Councillor makes use of any expression that is disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor the Councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the meeting.

39. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language and having been twice called to order or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

guilty of an offence.

#### Strangers Disorderly Conduct

40. Any person not being a Councillor who, having been admitted to a meeting of the Council is guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when requested by the Chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

#### Removal

41. Any person referred to in clause 40 who being requested by the chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any member of the police force or any person requested by the chairman so to do, may remove such person.

#### Adjournment

42. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting; but if on being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

### Lapsed Question

43. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded or a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by the number of the Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may at the next meeting, be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted. interrupted.

#### Demand Documents

44. Any Councillor may of right demand at a meeting the production of any of the documents of the municipality applying to the motion under discussion.

#### Voting

45. When called upon the Councillors present at any meeting shall vote by a show of hands and any Councillor present and not voting, not being debarred by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### Questions How Determined

- 46. (a) The chairman shall in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in
- (b) Questions shall be decided upon by open voting and, unless otherwise specifically provided, by the majority present.

#### Casting Vote

- (c) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the chairman at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a Councillor, have a second or casting vote except in the case of any election of the chairman of any municipality or of any meeting.
- (d) A decision on a motion to revoke or alter a resolution of the Council shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 185 of the Local Government Act 1958.

#### Division

47. Where a division is demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and the result be declared by the chairman.

#### . Suspension of Regulations

- 48. Any one or more of regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the meeting.
- 49. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-Law he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding \$100.

#### Seal

50. (a) The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in safe custody by the Town Clerk and shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of the Council.

(b) The affixing of the seal shall be witnessed by-

(i) the chairman of the municipality and any other Councillor or, in the absence of the chairman, by two Councillors; and

(ii) the Town Clerk or some other officer authorised by the Council to act in the absence of the Town Clerk.

#### PART I.—INTRODUCTION

- 1. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the subject matter "Dog" includes bitch but shall not include any pup less than twenty (20) weeks old.
- 2. In this By-Law, unless inconsistent with the subject matter "cat" means a cat of either sex over the age of sixteen (16) weeks.
- 3. For the purpose of this By-Law all areas within the Municipality other than areas:

  Zoned "Agricultural" under the Shire of Flinders Planning Scheme 1962 and amendments thereof and shown severally on the Planning Scheme Maps held at the offices of the Shire of Flinders are hereby declared to be populous or residential

#### PART II.—KEEPING OF DOGS AND CATS

- 1. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two (2) dogs or four (4) cats as defined in Part I. hereof on any property or premises within an area declared to be a populous or residential area without being the holder of a permit in writing from the Council.
- the holder of a permit in writing from the Council.

  2. Upon receipt of an application in writing to the Council in the form of the First Schedule hereto seeking the consent of Council, the Council may grant in writing a permit to keep more than the number of dogs or cats specified in Clause 1 Part II. of this By-Law. Any permit may at any time be revoked or cancelled by the Council if in its opinion the property to which it relates by reason of the keeping of the dogs or cats permitted, becomes offensive, injurious to health or dangerous or by reason of the reduction in area of the property the Council is of the opinion that the number of dogs or cats permitted is too great or if the person to whom the permit is granted shall be convicted of an offence against this By-Law.

3. The Applicant may be required, at the discretion of the Council, at the time of making application, to notify adjoining or adjacent residents who may be injuriously affected, that an application is to be made to the Council for a permit to keep more dogs or cats than prescribed in this By-Law under Clause 1.

#### PART III.—GENERAL

1. Any person who shall commit any wilful act or default contrary to any provisions of this By-Law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.




