- (c) Where the master of a vessel of 500 tons gross or more gives to a small vessel required under this Rule to keep out of the way a signal under paragraph (b) the master or person in charge of the small vessel shall forthwith take his vessel out of the way of the vessel giving the signal.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SHRINE OF REMEMBRANCE RESERVE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE

Whereas certain land in the City of Melbourne, Parish of Melbourne South, was permanently reserved as a site for a Monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance by Order in Council dated the 23rd October, 1933 (vide Government Gazette of the 25th October, 1933): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") is vested by Crown Grant Volume 5876, Folium 006 in the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees (hereinafter referred to as the "Trustees"): And whereas section (6) of the Shrine of Remembrance Act 1978, No. 9167, provides that the Trustees may, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make Regulations with respect to the care, protection and management of the Reserve and the preservation of good order and decency therein: And whereas it is expedient that the Regulations for the Reserve be amended: Now therefore, the Trustees, by virtue of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve in lieu of all previous Regulations relating to the said land which are hereby rescinded: Whereas certain land in the City of Melbourne, Parish

REGULATIONS

- 1. (i) These Regulations may be cited as the Shrine of Remembrance Regulations 1979.
- (ii) For the purposes of these Regulations "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Trustees and "official custodians" shall mean any person or persons appointed by the Trustees from time to time.
- 2. In these Regulations, "Inner Shrine" means that part of the monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance which is contained within the inner walls of the ambulatory and the central feature of which is the Stone of Remembrance.
 - 3. No person shall smoke in the Inner Shrine.
- 4. (1) The Trustees, Secretary, official custodians, or members of the Victoria Police Force may—
 - (a) refuse admission to the Inner Shrine to any person who by reason of his dress, conduct, or demeanour—
 - (i) is likely to be offensive to other visitors to the Inner Shrine; or
 - (ii) is disrespectful to the honoured memory of the men and women whose sacrifice and service is commemorated by the
 - (b) require any person who is in the Inner Shrine and who by reason of his dress, conduct or demeanour—
 - (i) is offensive to other visitors to the Inner Shrine; or
 - (ii) is disrespectful to the honoured memory of the men and women whose sacrifice and service is commemorated by the Shrine—

to leave the Inner Shrine forthwith.

- (2) Any person who enters the Inner Shrine after he has been refused admission by the Trustees, Secretary, official custodians, or members of the Victoria Police Force, or who fails or refuses to leave the Inner Shrine after being required to so leave shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 5. No person shall at any time, unless he is authorised in writing by the Trustees, sell or offer for sale or advertise for sale any article whatsoever, or carry on any trade or business or offer any services for remuneration in the Reserve.
- 6. (1) No person shall damage, deface, or impair or do anything likely to damage, deface, or impair any property of the Trustees, whether the monument or the memorial referred to in the Shrine of Remembrance Act 1978 or any part thereof, or any fixture, erection, structure, building, decoration, or other improvement or any part thereof on the Reserve, or obstruct or interfere with any drain or sewer or fixture thereon so as to impair its usefulness for the transmission, conveyance, supply or use of water, gas, electricity or other agency or service.
- (2) No person shall enter the enclosure in the Reserve surrounding the Eternal Flame or interfere in any way with the operation of the said flame.
- 7. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower or bird in the Reserve, or throw any stone or other missile or leave any litter as defined in the Litter Act 1964, or light a fire anywhere in the Reserve or engage in any sport or game therein.

- 8. No vehicle, motor car, motor cycle, or cycle, other than perambulators, go-carts and children's cycles shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 9. No person shall cause or allow any horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserve or be ridden or exercised in any part thereof except on a road (if any) expressly made available by the Trustees for horse traffic
- 10. (1) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- (2) No person shall create or take part in any disturbance in the Reserve or commit any nuisance therein.
- (3) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve in a state of intoxication.
- 11. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve after he has been lawfully ordered to keep off or to leave the Reserve by any member of the Police Force or by any person generally or specially authorized by the Trustees to lawfully order or keep persons off the Reserve.
- 12. No public meeting or assembly for a fête, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve except within the hours and for the particular purpose and under the charge of the persons which the Trustees have consented to in writing.
- 13. (1) No person shall stand on or jump on or over any seat, gate, fence, or other structure in the Reserve or climb any tree therein, or lie on any seat or on the grass in an objectionable attitude, or cut names, letters, or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post, or fence or write thereon or otherwise deface the same or any property of the Trustees.
- (2) No person shall stick bills on any structures in the Reserve or display placards or advertisements of any type therein.
- 14. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve by or with the authority of the Trustees, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs or for other purposes without the consent of the person having charge thereof.
- 15. Infant children shall not be allowed in the Reserve unless accompanied by and in the direct charge of an adult.
- 16. No person shall offer any chair or seat for hire in the Reserve, or solicit or collect money or other valuable thing therein without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.

The common seal of the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees was hereunto affixed, by authority of the Trustees, this 27th day of March, 1979, in the presence of—



TEACHING SERVICE—PRIMARY SCHOOLS DIVISION (CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES, AND ALLOWANCES) REGULATION

AMENDMENT No. 478 (PRIM. C.S. & A.6)

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act* 1958, hereby amends the Teaching Service—Primary Schools Division (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation as follows:—

- 1. Rescind clauses 4 and 5 and substitute therefor the following clauses:
 - "4. (a) This Regulation provides for the following classes: Principal; Interim Special; Interim Senior Teacher; Senior Teacher; Teacher.

Provided that for salary purposes throughout this Regulation the Interim Special and Interim Senior Teacher Classes collectively shall be known as the Provisional Principal Class.,

(b) Within these classes specified positions shall be available as follows:

Principal, Grade A School; Principal, Grade B School;

Deputy Principal, Grade A School.

Vice-Principal, Special (Interim Special

Class);

Principal, Grade C School; Assistant Teacher in receipt of a respon-

sibility allowance; Head Teacher, Grade D School; Assistant Teacher.

5. Schedule of Rates.

(a) Salaries.

The several classes and positions set out in clause 4 shall be paid in accordance with the salaries specified in Section I of Schedule "A", Part I.

(b) Allowances. 10.

- (i) An allowance as specified in Section 1 (a) of Schedule "A", Part II., shall be paid on a yearly basis to the senior Senior Teacher in a Grade A School for carrying out the duties of Senior Co-ordinator, provided that the position is not being temporarily filled by a member of the Provisional Principal Class.
- (ii) A member of the Teacher Class who is appointed to one of the positions detailed in Section 1 (b) of Schedule "A", Part II., shall receive, in addition to his salary, the allowance or allowances specified in that Section.

Provided that, except where prescribed by way of higher, duties allowances in sub-clause 14 (d), the responsibility allowance shall be paid only to permanent members eligible to proceed to subdivision 12 or higher.

(This proviso should be read in conjunction with sub-clause 1 (c) of Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.)"

- 2. In clauses 6, 8, and 10 for the expression "Assistant Class" wherever appearing substitute the expression "Teacher Class".
- 3. In sub-clauses 6 (a) and 6 (d) for the expression "Section 1 (c)" substitute the expression "Section 1 (d)".
- 4. In sub-clause 14 (d) for the expression "sub-clause 5 (b)" substitute the expression "paragraph (ii) of sub-clause 5 (b)" and for the expression "Grade III." substitute the expression "Grade D".

- 5. Rescind paragraph (i) of sub-clause 14 (f) and substitute therefor the following paragraph:-
 - "(i) Positions in respect of which Senior Co-ordinator, Responsibility, Head Teacher, or Principal allowances are paid:

Allowances appropriate to the position in addition to the salary of the assignee.

Provided that a member of the Teacher Class shall not be assigned the duties of a Senior Co-ordinator."

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS

AMENDMENT No. 477 (T.T. 66)

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Teaching Service Act 1958, hereby amends Regulations 3, 4, 7, and 14 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations as follows:

REGULATION 3

1. Rescind sub-clause 2 (a) and substitute therefor the following sub-clause :-

"(a) Primary Schools Division-

Principal Class. Senior Teacher Class. Teacher Class.

Provided that members who at the 31st December, 1979, occupied positions of Vice-Principal, Special Grade School, in the Special Class and members who at that date occupied positions of Principal, Grade I. School, in the Senior Teacher Class, shall be included in an Interim Special Class and an Interim Senior Teacher Class respectively."

2. After clause 2 add the following clause:-

"2A. (a) The Classified Roll of Teachers in the Primary Schools Division (including the Promotion List) as at the 31st December, 1979, shall determine the initial order of seniority of members of the Principal, Interim Special, and Interim Senior Teacher Classes.

(b) For purposes of entry into and seniority order within the Principal Class, Primary Schools Division, in respect of any member who was employed on the 31st December, 1979, and who continues to have unbroken service, relative seniority as at the 31st December, 1979, in and between the Principal, Interim Special, Interim Senior Teacher, and Senior Teacher Classes, and the former Special Class shall be maintained until the 31st December, 1984."

REGULATION 4

1. After sub-clause 1 (a) insert the following sub-clause:-

"(aa) In the Primary Schools Division, no teacher shall be eligible for appointment as a Deputy Principal, Grade A School, in the Senior Teacher Class unless he has served at least three years in that class.

Provided that this requirement shall not apply to a teacher occupying the position of Deputy Principal in a school which has been re-classified from Grade B to Grade A."

- 2. In sub-clause 1 (b) delete the expression "Special Class or ".
- 3. Rescind clause 2 and substitute therefor the following clause: --

"2. (a) In the Primary Schools Division the transfer of members within the several classes shall be subject to the conditions set out in the following sub-clauses.

Provided that in exceptional circumstances, the Tribunal after considering recommendations by the Committee of Classifiers, may, prior to the making of appointments, approve the eligibility for transfer of members with less than the prescribed period.

Provided further that members who continue to occupy the positions which they held prior to 1st January, 1980, shall retain the rights of transfer to which they were entitled prior to that date.

- - (i) A member shall not be transferred to a position of similar or lesser responsibility or salary without having served at least five years in his present position.
 - (ii) Notwithstanding the second proviso to sub-clause 2 (a), the principal of a school which has been reclassified from Grade A to Grade B who has elected to retain his position shall not be transferred to a position of similar or lesser responsibility or salary without having served a total period of five years as principal of that school.
- (c) Senior Teacher Class

A member shall not be transferred to any position without having served at least three years in his present position. Provided that, subject to the provisions of sub-clause 1 (aa), a member not occupying a position of deputy principal may be transferred to a position of deputy principal irrespective of the period of service in his present position.

(d) Teacher Class

A member shall not be transferred to a position of similar responsibility or salary range without having served at least three years in his present position. This requirement includes transfer between the positions of Assistant Teacher and Head Teacher, Grade D School.

Provided that a member occupying the position of Principal Grade C School, shall not be transferred to another Principal, Grade C School position without having served at least five years in his present position."

REGULATION 7

1. Rescind clause 1 and substitute therefor the following clause:-

- (d) may appoint to any class other than the Principal Class a teacher who has Certificate C and holds the highest efficiency mark for not less than five years in the teacher's present class and who has satisfied the Tribunal that special circumstances have prevented the attainment of the necessary number of points prescribed for the next higher class."


