

A Statement of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as the Church of England in the Diocese of Wangaratta in Victoria, pursuant to the provisions of the Act to provide for the abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance of His Excellency the Governor (the same was allowed by him on 25 November 1980) and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTS

Description of Land—Site for Church of England purposes temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 18 December 1865 (see Government Gazette dated 29 December 1865), 626 square metres, Township of Wandiligons, Parish of Bright, County of Delatite, being Crown allotment 35E.

Commencing at a point bearing 185 deg. 11 min. 51-50 metres from the south-western angle of Crown allotment 35c; bounded thence by lines bearing 91 deg. 27 min. 17-90 metres, 181 deg. 27 min. 35 metres and 271 deg. 27 min. 17-90 metres; and thence by a road bearing 1 deg. 27 min. 35 metres to the point of commencement—(L.8-1595).

Name of Trustee—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Wangaratta of Wangaratta aforesaid.

Power of Disposition—Power to sell lease mortgage or exchange all or any part of such land subject to the approval of the Bishop of Wangaratta for the time being or during the absence of the Bishop from the Diocese or the vacancy of the See to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof. The land until otherwise disposed of to be held for the purpose for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by:

- (1) The Bishop or during his absence from his See or during the vacancy thereof by the person or persons for the time being administering the affairs of the Diocese.
- (2) The Trustees of the Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Wangaratta.

 (3) The Minister entitled to occupy the aforesaid land.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1958 PETITION TO INCORPORATE DONCASTER COMMUNITY CARE AND COUNSELLING CENTRE

It is notified in accordance with the provisions of sections 46 and 64 of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1958, that the Health Commission of Victoria has received a petition signed by thirty-five contributors, to an organization known as the Doncaster Community Care and Counselling Centre praying that the organization be incorporated as a Benevolent Society under the provisions of the said Act.

The organization will have for its objects:

To establish a community service principally for the residents and workers in and visitors to the City of Doncaster and Templestowe—

- (i) to direct people needing help to the most appropriate resource and where appropriate, to help make necessary arrangements to obtain the help and guidance sought;
- (ii) to provide (and promote) readily available comprehensive sources of information, pertaining to community and welfare services and amenities on a wide variety of matters not requiring direct delivery of service;
- (iii) to co-operate closely with social and community welfare organizations with a view to using avail-able services most effectively;
- (iv) to engage and co-operate in community education programmes;
- to provide relief of poverty, distress, sickness and helplessness for persons in needy circumstances coming to the Centre for help and advice;
- (vi) to provide a counselling service by trained and accredited counsellors for people with personal, family or marital problems;
- (vii) to initiate research and community action of matters of individual and communal welfare;
- (viii) to borrow and raise any moneys required for the objects and purposes of the Centre in such manner and on such terms and securities as may be lawfully determined;

- (ix) to raise money for such purposes by subscription, public appeal or other legal means;
- to purchase, take on lease or exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any property, rights or privileges necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Centre and to do all other such lawful things, including the hiring of paid staff as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the foregoing;

If a counter petition signed by an equal or greater number of contributors is not lodged with the aforesaid Commission at 555 Collins Street, Melbourne, within one calendar month of publication of this notice, the Governor in Council may, by Order pursuant to the Hospitals and Charities Act 1958, declare the contributors for the time being to the Doncaster Community Care and Counselling Centre to be a body corporate by the name set forth in such Order.



DEPARTMENT OF MINERALS AND ENERGY
POLICY STATEMENT BY THE HONOURABLE J. C. M.
BALFOUR, MP, MINISTER FOR MINERALS AND
ENERGY

On 6 May 1976 I issued a statement setting out in broad terms the Victorian Government's policy with regard to the exploration for and utilization of coal deposits within this State. In general terms this policy indicated that the grant of rights for exploration or production of coal would be restricted pending further evaluation of Victoria's coal resources.

This policy recognized the rights of International Oil Proprietary to continue investigation at Gelliondale where this company had a long-standing interest.

On 30 June 1977 the policy was amended so that the restriction on receipt of exploration applications would be applied to the Gippsland and South Gippsland areas only.

applied to the Gippsland and South Gippsland areas only. Since these policies were announced studies to determine the limits of economically winnable coal in Gippsland have been undertaken and finalized. As a matter of policy two areas containing approximately 18 000 million tonnes of coal at Yallourn, Morwell and Loy Yang have been reserved for State Electricity Commission of Victoria purposes. The balance of the area of known economically winnable coal which contains a similar quantity is to be reserved together with suitable buffer areas for other purposes including coal to oil conversion.

As all of this coal is now protected from unsatisfactory development under the various planning schemes administered by the respective municipalities it is no longer necessary to restrict coal exploration in other parts of Gippsland and the State in General.

Accordingly, the Victorian Government's coal policy is amended so that applications for exploration licences will be received for areas outside the limits of known economically winnable coal. (More specifically the following graticular blocks shown on the attached plan are not available for exploration—Melbourne 1827–1838, 1899–1910, 1971–1982, 2043–2045, 2050–2052, 2115–2116, 2121–2124, 2188–2194, 2260–2266, 2332–2338 and 2406–2408.)

As from the date of gazettal on 3 December 1980 I will be prepared to receive applications for coal exploration in graticular areas which are not listed above. All applications from established exploration companies will be considered on the basis of the exploration program submitted and the expenditure commitment proposed.

The Victorian Brown Coal Council will continue to advise the Victorian Government on development proposals for coal deposits in non-SEC areas.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority Act 1977 and the Milk Board Act 1958 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke as from 1 December 1980 all parts of the determination of milk prices published in the Victoria Government Gazette, No. 61 dated 23 July 1980, and doth hereby approve of the following determination of milk prices by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to take effect from 1 December 1980.

DETERMINATION

PART 1

PRICES PAYABLE FOR SALES OF MILK

The prices payable for sales of milk and milk products in all milk districts other than the Border Milk District, and other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 1. The prices payable for sales of packaged milk in the Border Milk District, other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 2.

The prices payable for milk and milk products in the package types as shown in column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 shall be as indicated in the appropriate columns according to the category of sale.

The categories of sale are defined as:

- 1. Inter-processor sales are those from a processor to another processor.
- Wholesale sales are those from a processor to a delivery dairyman. 2.
- Semi-wholesale sales are those from a dairyman to a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person.
- Charitable Institution Sales are sales by a dairyman to a Charitable Institution or benevolent society which is registered under the Hospitals and Charities Act and subsidised by the Health Commission of Victoria for maintenance
- Vendor sales are those by dairymen to milk vendors who do not operate licensed dairy premises. This category of sale applies only in the Border Milk District.
- 6. In accordance with the Milk Board Act, "Retail" means-
 - (a) when referring to the sale or distribution of milk by a dairyman or a milk vendor—sale or distribution to a person of not more than ten litres on any one day; and
 - (b) when referring to the sale of milk from a milk shop—any sale.
- Retail Sales are sales by a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person to consumers. This category does not include sales to consumers from Automatic Vending Machines or Public Venue Sales.
- Vending Machine sales are those retail sales from an automatic vending machine.
- Public Venue Sales are sales made by an individual or organisations holding a catering concession for a function, event or display at a public venue. Such sellers must have prior written approval of the Authority before public venue prices can be charged. Such approval will stipulate whether Class A or Class B public venue prices will apply. Class A and Class B prices are those charged by the dairyman to the individual or organisation holding a catering concession.
- 10. Ex-plant sales are those where milk is collected from the premises of the dairyman by the purchaser or his agent. Ex-plant sales require the prior written approval of the Authority. Ex-plant sales do not include sales to Licensed Milk Vendors.
- 11. Delivered sales are those where milk is delivered to the premises of the purchaser by the seller or his agent.
- 12. Central Warehouse Purchases are those by an organisation operating a warehouse providing storage and delivery services to retail food outlets.

Clause 4 (3) of the contract between the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority and dairy farmers provides that the Authority shall be entitled to deduct from the price of the milk purchased under such contract, such amount per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost incurred in transporting the said milk from the farm of the vendor to the point of sale by the Authority.

The prices prescribed in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b), above, make provisions for the cost of transport of the said milk from the premises of the Authorised Agent of the Authority to the premises of the dairymen to whom such milk is normally sold by the Authority, but from each of such prices the Authority shall be entitled to deduct such sum per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost of transport of the milk from the farm of the vendor to the premises of the Authorised Agent.

In respect of any milk, additional to its normal requirements which the Authority may purchase from a dairy farmer to meet a demand in an area other than that in which the said dairy farmer's milk is normally marketed, the Authority shall also be entitled to deduct from the appropriate price herein prescribed, such further sum per litre as it may determine in respect of any cost (in excess of that for which allowance has already been made in this determination) of transporting such milk from the premises of its Authorised Agent to the premises of the dairyman purchasing such milk.

In respect of payments for milk made by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to dairy farmers, the Authority shall deduct the amount prescribed as a levy on wholemilk pursuant to the provisions of the Dairying Industry Research and Promotion Levy Act 1976 of the Commonwealth of Australia.

- use the public conveniences, structure or any part thereof for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed;
- ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, or on any area other than an area specifically set aside by the Committee for that particular purpose.
- No person shall, without consent in writing of the Committee and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine—
 - (a) bring into for sale or distribute in the Reserve, any intoxicating liquor;
 - (b) do anything whatsover in the Reserve for the purpose of financial gain;
 - (c) bring onto the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals, except as hereinafter provided, nor permit the same to enter, otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee, and all dogs must be at all times controlled by a chain or leash;
