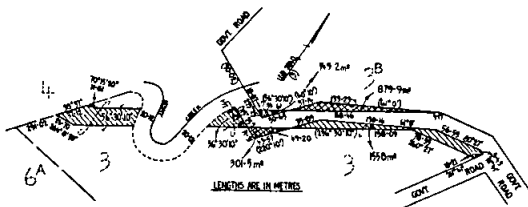

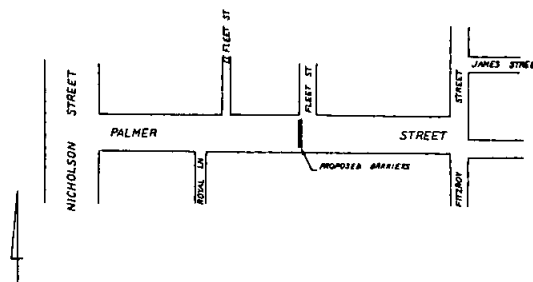

The area which extends to a distance of five hundred metres measured from a branch valve known as the Marlin pipeline tee junction, situated at or about Latitude 38 deg. 14 min. 24 sec. south, Longitude 148 deg. 14 min. 05 sec. east and located by means of a well head marker buoy described hereunder.

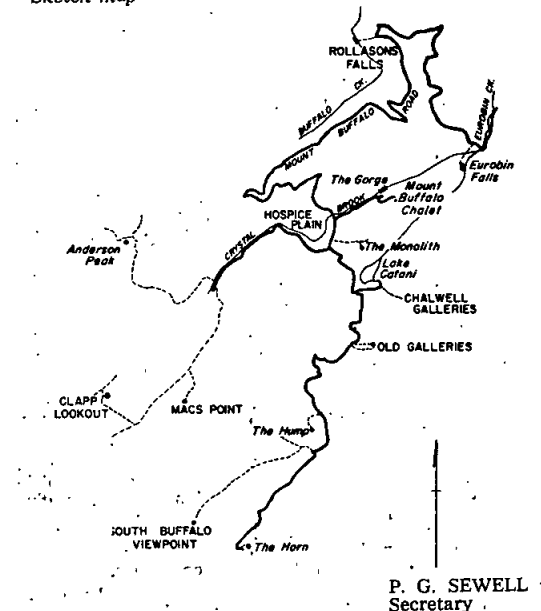

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION ACT 1958,  
No. 6377STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION (AMENDMENT)  
ACT 1979, No. 9296

Pursuant to the Sixth Schedule of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1958* as amended the State Electricity Commission of Victoria hereby gives notice of the tariffs and the terms and conditions on which the State Electricity Commission of Victoria supplies electricity to domestic customers.

## A—ORDINARY CONDITIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY

1. The supply will be made available at the point where the lines through which the electricity is brought from public supply mains meet the boundary of the Customer's land.

## 2. The Commission—

- (a) shall not be liable in damages because of any irregularity of voltage or frequency unless such be due to wilful negligence on the part of the Commission or its officers;
- (b) may at any time remove any tree, limb or other thing on the Customer's premises which may endanger the safety or efficiency of any service lines or apparatus;
- (c) reserves the right to erect overhead subtransmission lines in Underground Residential Distribution areas, if it becomes essential for the development of the electricity supply system at some future date.

## 3. The Customer—

- (a) shall pay for the service and supply of electricity and for ancillary matters related thereto, according to the relevant scale of charges as from time to time determined by the Commission;
- (b) shall not use the supply nor permit it to be used at any premises other than those referred to in his application;
- (c) shall not use for lighting purposes electricity supplied through a meter which is used solely to measure the supply for power purposes, or for any purpose or during any hours electricity supplied through a meter which is used solely to measure the supply used for another purpose or during other hours for which the charge is lower.

4. The Commission's duly authorized officers or agents shall have access to a Customer's premises at all reasonable hours for any purpose usually associated with the supply of electricity provided always that the Customer may refuse admittance to any officer or agent of the Commission unless his official identification is produced on request.

The Customer shall provide and maintain on his premises such support fencing ways construction and other facilities as the Commission in conformity with its standard practice requires him to provide to allow of safe and convenient access by the Commission's officers to the meters and any other equipment or property of the Commission installed at his premises in connection with or for the purposes of the supply of electricity.

5. Subject to the Commission's usual practice (the terms whereof shall be communicated upon request) as to the testing of and rectifying of the record of meters the register of the meter or meters supplied and fixed by the Commission shall be *prima facie* evidence of the electricity consumed. Where the Customer's premises are a unit in a building to which electricity is supplied for bulk heating of water the electricity supplied for heating of water for the Customer will be calculated in accordance with the Commission's current practice from the quantity of water consumed by the Customer as measured on a meter installed by the Commission in the hot water reticulation to the Customer's premises and the consumption of electricity so calculated shall be deemed to have been consumed by the Customer for the purposes of water heating and the charges therefor shall be included in accounts rendered by the Commission.

Money owing to the Commission (whether for electricity consumed for meter rental or for other charge) shall be due without further demand on the rendering of the

account, and shall be payable at an office of the Commission, or other place as may from time to time be notified by the Commission to the Customer.

Any account will be taken to have been duly rendered or any notice properly served if left at or posted to the Customer at the address where electricity is required or given.

Where a final account has been rendered and remains unpaid after the expiration of thirty days it shall become payable at the Commission's office, 15 William Street, Melbourne.

6. The Commission may without notice discontinue the supply of electricity if—

- (a) the Customer should use or deal with the electricity supplied to him in such manner as might interfere with the efficient supply of electricity to other Customers supplied by the Commission;
- (b) the Customer should refuse to allow any officer or agent of the Commission who produces his official identification, safe, convenient and proper access to the Customer's premises at any reasonable time for any purpose set out in clause 4 hereof;
- (c) the Customer should commit or allow any breach or offence under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1958* or the *State Electricity Commission Acts* or any regulation or by-laws gazetted under these acts;
- (d) the Customer's electric lines or installation are in any way in the opinion of the Commission's responsible officer unsafe or defective;
- (e) the Customer should commit a breach of these conditions and/or the agreement.

If the Commission should discontinue the supply for any of the above reasons, or at the Customer's request, a reconnection fee as from time to time determined by the Commission shall be paid by the Customer to the Commission prior to reconnection.

7. Either party may cancel the supply of electricity by giving three clear days' notice in writing to the other notwithstanding any payment made in advance by the Customer.

B—DOMESTIC TARIFFS APPLICABLE THROUGHOUT THE STATE  
WITH EFFECT FROM 5 MARCH 1980

## TARIFFS APPLICABLE TO PRIVATE HOUSES AND FLATS

## General Domestic: Tariff GB

This tariff is applicable for the general electricity requirements where the installation does not qualify for Tariff GC—see below.

For electricity consumed between two consecutive quarterly meter readings:

- For the first 90 kilowatt hours—15.46 c/kWh\*
- For the next 450 kilowatt hours—4.91 c/kWh\*.
- For all further consumption—4.00 c/kWh\*

## General Domestic: Tariff GC

This tariff is available for the general electricity requirements where the installation includes—

- (1) a permanently wired electric range consisting of both an electric oven and electric hotplate(s), including those installed as separate oven and hotplate units; and
- (2) a permanently wired electric water heater, including solar-electric, used for general domestic hot water service requirements; and
- (3) An electric refrigerator.

NOTE—"Permanently wired" means connected to fixed wiring as required by the *Wiring Regulations 1976* and excludes plug-in appliances connected to a power point.

"Water heater" includes off-peak, continuous or instantaneous (where permissible) water heaters and excludes wash boilers, coppers or the like.

The Commission retains the right to withdraw the tariff from an installation for which it is not satisfied that the required appliances are installed or the conditions fulfilled.

For electricity consumed between consecutive quarterly meter readings:

- For the first 90 kilowatt hours—15.46 c/kWh\*
- For the next 450 kilowatt hours—4.91 c/kWh\*
- For all further consumption—3.54 c/kWh\*

**Domestic Storage Water Heating (Night Rate): Tariff I**

This tariff is applicable only to permanently wired storage water heaters, including solar-electric, which conform to the following conditions:

1. The heater(s) must be of a type and design for which the Commission has issued a test certificate indicating compliance with specified requirements of AS.1056 in regard to performance. Such approved water heaters carry a registered Testing Stamp affixed by the manufacturer.

2. Where only one water heater is installed, it must have a rated delivery of not less than 160 litres. Where additional or multiple heaters are installed in a premises the total of the individual rated deliveries of heaters supplied through a single meter shall be not less than 160 litres.

For electricity consumed through a separate meter by heating elements which are switched on only during prescribed hours by means of a time switch or other form of control arranged and provided by the Commission:

All consumption—1.77c/kWh\*

**Domestic Storage Space Heating: Tariff J**

This tariff is applicable only where one or more approved permanently wired storage space heaters are installed.

Where approved storage water heaters are also installed both will be served under this tariff.

Storage water heaters shall comply with the conditions set out under Tariff I. Storage space heaters shall—

1. Comply with S.E.C. requirements with regard to type and design, and with regard to total element wattage in relation to thermal storage capacity.
2. Have a total storage element wattage of not less than 2 kW.

For electricity consumed between two consecutive quarterly meter readings through a separate meter by heating elements which are switched on only during prescribed hours by means of a time switch or other control arranged by the Commission for either—

- (a) storage space heaters alone; or
- (b) storage space heaters and storage water heaters.

For the first 1200 kilowatt hours—1.77c/kWh\*

For all further consumption—1.60c/kWh\*

**Minimum Charge**

For each account rendered—\$12.99 a quarter or *pro rata* for portion of a quarter, with an absolute minimum of \$1.00.

**Tariff Conditions**

1. The Commission retains the rights to—

- (a) require customers to enter into agreements, including conditions deemed appropriate by the Commission in special cases;
- (b) at its discretion, fix or vary from time to time the prescribed hours applicable to Tariffs I and J with respect to any customer or any locality;
- (c) read meters at other than quarterly intervals and, in the case of Tariffs GB, GC and J to adjust the number of kilowatt hours chargeable at each rate accordingly;
- (d) record meter readings and charge in multiples of 10 up to 5000 kilowatt hours, in multiples of 100 from 5000 to 10 000 kilowatt hours and in multiples of 1000 over 10 000 kilowatt hours in a normal billing period.

2. The Commission requires the customer to give adequate security by way of a deposit or otherwise for payment of all sums which may be or become payable to it.

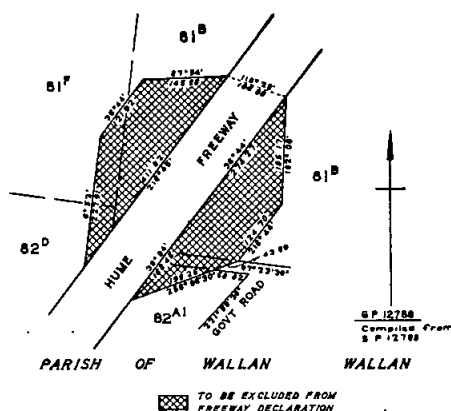

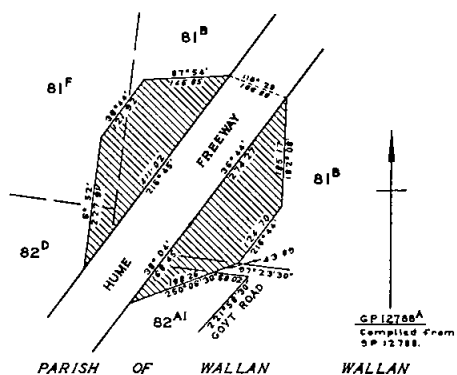

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST—  
SHEPPARTON EAST URBAN DISTRICT**

**By-Law Fixing Charges for Water Supplied by Measure**

The Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-Law for the Shepparton Urban District as follows:—

(1) The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter Year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

(2) In respect of any property rated by the Trust:—

- (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge shall be the quantity which if charged at 7.5 cents per Kilolitre would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the property for the financial year in which the meter year ended; and,

##### SOLICITORS' (SHARING OF REMUNERATION) RULES

In pursuance of the authority in that behalf conferred on the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria, pursuant to sections 88 and 94 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* and all other provisions in that behalf enabling, the Council hereby makes the following Rules of the Institute:

1. These Rules may be cited as the "Solicitors' (Sharing of Remuneration) Rules 1979" and shall come into operation on the date the same are published in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

2. In these Rules the Solicitors' (Sharing of Remuneration) Rules 1947 are called "the Principal Rules".

3. There shall be inserted in Rule 2 of the Principal Rules:

(a) immediately before the definition of "legal work" the following paragraph:

"'Child' includes a person adopted by a solicitor and legally dependent on him, and a person to whom the solicitor stands in *loco parentis*;"

(b) immediately after the definition of "retired practitioner" the following paragraph:

"'Spouse' includes a person who lives with the solicitor as a spouse on a permanent and *bona fide* domestic basis, although not legally married to him."

4. After paragraph (c) of Rule 3 of the Principal Rules there shall be inserted the following paragraph:

"(d) He may share those receipts with the spouse, child grandchild of the solicitor or one or more of them in accordance with an arrangement or agreement whereby any one or more of them being the spouse, a child or a grandchild of the solicitor, but not any other person, acquires a beneficial interest in or benefits from a share of or part of those receipts."
