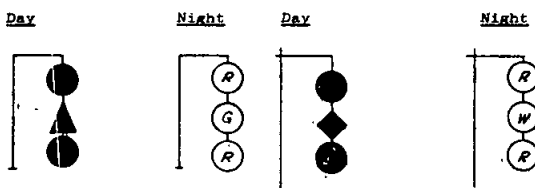

The attendant and blasting vessels may also display any of the following signals by International Code flags:—

Signal; Meaning

"A"; I have a diver down. Keep well clear at slow speed.

"B"; I am carrying dangerous goods.

"U"; You are running into danger.

"IR"; I am engaged in submarine survey work (underwater operations). Keep clear of me and go slow.

"OW"; Underwater mining operations are in progress. You should stop your vessel and wait for instructions.

The attendant and blasting vessels may also make the International Code signal "U" by daylight signalling lamp.

Caution—No vessel shall approach the attendant or blasting vessels engaged in blasting work nearer than one mile and a warning will be given by prolonged siren blasts from the blasting vessel when a charge is about to be exploded.

Every vessel shall obey any directions received from the attendant or blasting vessels or by radio from Point Lonsdale Signal Station. No vessel shall operate any radio transmitter within 300 metres of the blasting vessel.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM

By-Law No. 217

A By-Law of the City of Sandringham made under the provisions of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 217 for prohibiting or regulating the keeping storing or repairing of heavy vehicles in the residential areas hereinafter declared.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and any other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows—

1. This By-Law may be known as the Heavy Vehicle By-Law 1979.

2. No person unless he is the holder of a current permit pursuant to this By-Law shall keep store or repair any heavy vehicle upon any land within the residential areas within the municipal district of the City of Sandringham as hereinafter declared and defined.

3. The areas described in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be residential areas for the purposes of this By-Law.

4. Any person may apply in writing to the Council pursuant to this By-Law for a permit to keep store or repair any heavy vehicle or vehicles upon land within any residential area, stating the location of the land upon which it is desired to keep store or repair any such vehicle, the number and description thereof and shortly setting out the reasons the permit is sought. Such permit may be granted or may be refused at the discretion of the Council without giving reasons for such refusal.

5. Any permit pursuant to this By-Law shall be issued in writing and may impose such terms conditions and restrictions as to the duration place or time or such other restriction as the Council thinks fit. No such permit shall be transferable by the holder to any other person. No permit shall be issued for a term exceeding twelve months.

6. Any person who does or omits to do any act matter or thing in contravention to this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable:

(a) to a penalty of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100); and

(b) in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10) for each day on which the offence continues after a conviction or order in respect thereof by any Court.

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing and without prejudice to the provisions contained in Clause 6 hereof, the Council being satisfied that a contravention of this By-Law or of the terms of any permit issued hereunder has taken place may revoke the same and may require the holder of such permit to deliver the same up for cancellation.

8. In this By-Law the term "heavy vehicle" means any motor vehicle having a load capacity of three (3) tonnes or more, an unladen weight of five (5) tonnes, or an overall length of more than six (6) metres or having a height of two point four four (2.44) metres or more.

9. The By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts of the municipal district which are declared to be residential areas pursuant to Clause 3 hereof.

All those areas within the Municipal District of the City of Sandringham zoned Residential "C" under the Melbourne Metropolitan Planning Scheme, as the Planning Scheme stands when this By-Law is made or as the Planning Scheme may be amended from time to time.

"Dog" includes a dog of either sex over the age of three months.

"Dwelling" includes a living room, sleep-out or tent and all rooms for sleeping, living and cooking.

"Person" includes the owner or occupier or person in charge of any premises.

"Property" includes any allotment of land on a plan of subdivision other than a stratum subdivision, an allotment on which a residence is situated on a plan of stratum subdivision and a residential unit on a plan of strata subdivision.

4. No person shall keep more than one (1) dog on any property having an area of less than 400 square metres.

5. No person shall keep more than two (2) dogs on any property having an area of 400 square metres or more unless the written consent of the Council has been obtained.

6. No person shall on any property keep any dog tethered at a less distance than 8 metres from any dwelling on any adjoining property.

7. No person shall keep any dog or dogs on any property in such a manner to be, in the opinion of the Council, offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

8. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than \$100 and in the case of continuing offence after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than \$10.

9. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Sandringham which is hereby declared to be a populous area.

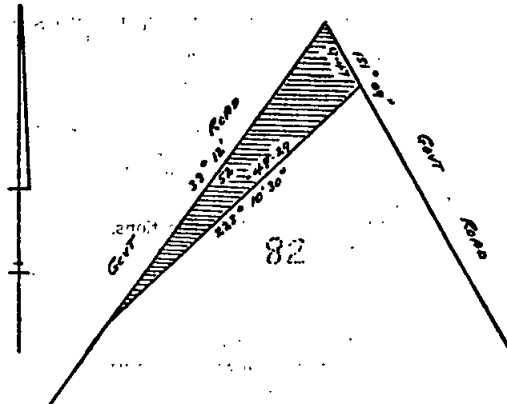

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council

2. Other matter

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matters for publication will be accepted by telephone.
