

The area proclaimed is the catchment to a dam constructed by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on Tullaroop Creek within Crown Allotments 14 and 17c, Parish of Moolort.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of sections 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a), (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.



The area proclaimed is the catchment to an offtake weir constructed by the Yarra Junction Waterworks Trust on Britannia Creek within the Parish of Warburton.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of sections 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a), (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.


PROCLAMATION

Films Act 1971

EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 11 (2) Whereas:

- 1. Section 11 (2) of the Films Act 1971 provides that the Governor in Council may in any particular case by direction in writing under his hand exempt any film from the operation of Part II. of the Act to the extent specified in the direction.
- 2. It is expedient that the films set out in the Schedule hereto be exempted from the provisions of Part II. of the said Act as would require:

the films to be examined and classified;

advertising relating to the films on display classification or classification symbols;

applications for the registration of films to be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

Subject to the following conditions:

- (i) the films will be exhibited only at the "Week of Chinese Films" Season between the period commencing on 5 May 1980 and expiring on 31 May 1980 (both dates inclusive);
- (ii) the films will be exhibited not more than twice;
- (iii) persons under the age of 18 years shall not be admitted to screenings of the films; and
- (iv) the films be exported at the conclusion of the Season.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Films Act 1971, do direct that the films set out in the Schedule hereto be exempted from the provisions of Part II. of the Films Act 1971, subject to the conditions set out in Item 2 above.

Liquor Control (Orderly Marketing) Act 1976 NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A FURTHER DETERMINATION OF PRICE OF PACKAGED BEER

Take notice that the Liquor Control Commission pursuant to the authority conferred upon it by the Liquor Control Act 1968 (as amended by the Liquor Control (Orderly Marketing) Act 1976) intends to make a further determination of the price at which licensed persons may sell and dispose of packaged beer to unlicensed persons in the State of Victoria.

For the purpose of making such further determination the Commission proposes to investigate written requests from the Australian Hotels Association and the Retail Liquor Merchants Association of Victoria to the Commission to determine a new minimum price for packaged beer based on the most recent increases in wholesale prices of packaged beer, produced by Carlton and United Breweries Limited and Tooth Brewery (Victoria) Pty. Ltd.

Any person may make a submission in writing to the Commission in relation to such particular proposals or as to the intention generally. Such submissions are required to be forwarded to the Secretary of the Commission at its offices 232 Victoria Parade, East Melbourne, 3002, not later than noon on Friday, 27 June 1980.

Before making any determination the Commission shall consider any submission or submissions received by it and shall give such weight thereto as it considers appropriate.

Any person or body of persons desiring to produce evidence before the Commission and be heard on the matters under investigation or as to the intention generally should notify the Commission in writing of such desire. Such notification is required to be forwarded to the Secretary of the Commission at its offices 232 Victoria Parade, East Melbourne, 3002, not later than 27 June 1980.

The Commission shall in making its determination endeavour to determine prices which shall so far as possible ensure the interests of the public generally.







 - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 9.9 cents per kilolitre for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect to the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
 - (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this Clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 9.9 cents per kilolitre.
- 3. Subject as in hereafter provided, the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 9-9 cents per kilolitre.
- 4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the minimum Annual Charge imposed by the Trust for any land or tenement.
- 5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the Owners or Occupiers at the Office of the Trust during normal business hours.
- 6. The provisions of Clauses 4, 5 and 6 of this By-law shall not apply to any land, tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a Special Agreement pursuant to section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereunder (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves") in lieu of all previous Regulations relating to the said lands which are hereby rescinded:—

SCHEDULE

- (a) The land in the Parish of Narree Worran permanently reserved as a site for a Mechanics' Institute ann Free Library by Order in Council dated 2 October 1894 (vide Government Gazette of 5 October 1894)—(Rs.1735).
- (b) The remaining portion of the land in the Parish of Narree Worran temporarily reserved as a site for a Mechanics' Institute and for Public Recreation by Order in Council datel 25 May 1886 (vide Government Gazette of 28 May 1886). This land now reserved for Public Recreation only by Order in Council dated 18 June 1894 (vide Government Gazette of 22 June 1894)—(Rs.5163).

REGULATIONS

- 1. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows or performances in or upon the Reserves or hall building thereon and to make a charge for admission thereto.
- 2. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserves or hall building thereon to any club, association, person or society for the purposes of holding cricket, tennis, football or other matches, bicycle or other races, ceremonies, entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject on the payment of such fees and on such terms as may be deemed to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and to authorise any club, association, society or person to make a charge for admission thereto.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves or hall building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 4. No male person shall enter or use any place, room, building or lavatory set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room, building or lavatory set apart for the use of males. The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to male or female persons under the age of seven years under the supervision of their respective parents or other responsible person.
- 5. No person other than the players, performers, competitors or exhibitors, shall enter into or upon or remain in or upon any room, building, structure, enclosure set apart for players, performers, competitors or exhibitors at any games, sports, entertainments, competitions, shows, fetes or exhibits.
- 6. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserves, nor light any fires therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 7. No person shall jump or climb over or under the fences or gates in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on any fences, trees or seats or damage them in any way, no roll or throw stones, sticks or other missiles in the Reserves.
- 8. No person shall climb on any buildings, rooms, gates or structures in the Reserves, nor force any doors or windows of such buildings, rooms or structures, or in any way deface, damage or injure any such buildings, rooms or structures in the Reserves or hall building thereon.
- 9. No person shall camp in the Reserves or in any room, building or structure thereon, nor shall any person erect any building, hut or attachment without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 10. No person shall remain in the Reserves or hall building thereon at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee or member of the Committee to leave the same.
- 11. No person shall buy, sell or offer for sale in the Reserves or hall building thereon any goods, wares, articles or other merchandise without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

- 12. No person shall bet or wager in the Reserves or hall building thereon without the permission of the Committee.
- 13. No person shall expectorate or otherwise commit any nuisance in any part of the Reserves or in any room, building, structure or enclosure therein.
- 14. No person shall disturb, obstruct, interrupt or annoy any officer, employee or authorised agent of the Committee in the execution of his duty or work in the Reserves, nor disturb, obstruct, interrupt or annoy any hirers of the Reserves or hall building thereon.
- 15. No person shall bring into the Reserves or hall building thereon any horse or any motor vehicle, cycle, carriage, cart or other vehicle except into such places as may be set apart for the purpose.
- 16. Any person committing on any part of Reserves or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:
 - (a) Assaulting or threatening any other person or persons.
 - (b) Being under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
 - (c) Entering, crossing, being on or trespassing on any playing ground, area, enclosure, course or any building, room or any part thereof whilst any games, sports, races, competitions, entertainments or amusements are being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such events without the consent of the Committee.
 - (d) Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words,
 - (e) Using profane, indecent, obscene or unseemly language.
 - (f) Behaving improperly, offensively or riotously.
 - (g) Interfering with or interrupting any games, sports, competitions, entertainments or amusements.
 - (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserves or hall building thereon when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.
 - Consuming alcoholic liquor contrary to the provisions of the Liquor Control Act 1968 and/or without the permission of the Committee.
- 17. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorised by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserves or hall building thereon.
- 18. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organised game or sport or take part in any public entertainment, meeting or organised gathering in the Reserves or hall building thereon without the permission of the Committee first obtained—(Rs.1735, Rs.5163).

By-Law No. 207

By-Law of the City of Brunswick numbered 207 made under section 197 (1) of the Local Government Act 1958 for the proper management and control of libraries belonging to or under the control and management of the Brunswick City Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brunswick make the following By-Law which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Definitions

- 1. In these Regulations unless the context of subject matter otherwise indicated or requires—
 - (a) "Book" includes any and every book, periodical, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, gramophone, gramophone record, cassette, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, film, slide, manuscript, tape, tape recording or any other article of a like nature forming part of the contents of the Library, whether or not the property of the City of Brunswick.
 - (b) "Council" means the Council of the City of Brunswick.
 - (c) "Librarian" means the person for the time being in charge of the Library service generally, or any portion or section thereof, and, in respect of ensuring compliance by members or any other person with this By-Law, members of the Library staff or any security officer employed by the Council.
 - (d) "Library" means a library belonging to or under the control or management of the City of Brunswick and includes the buildings, rooms, offices,

- passages, staircases, entrances adjacent thereto and sanitary facilities and includes any branch libraries, depots or bookmobiles.
- "Registered member" and "member" means a person to whom a membership card is issued in accordance with this By-Law.
- "Membership Card" means a current and valid Membership Card so entitled and issued by the Librarian in accordance with this By-Law.
- (g) "Municipality" means the municipal district of the City of Brunswick.
 (h) "Voters' Roll" means the voters' roll of the City
- of Brunswick,

Administration

Administration

2. The Librarian has general charge of every library and is responsible for the safe custody of books and all other property belonging thereto. The Librarian has power to refuse to issue books to deny the use of a library to any person who neglects or refuses to comply with paragraph 13 hereof or any part thereof and may require such person to forthwith quit the library premises Failure by a person to forthwith leave the Library premises upon being required to do so by the Librarian is an offence against this By-Law.

Hours of Opening

 \cdot 3. The Library is open at such times as the Brunswick City Council determines from time to time.

Access and Use of Library

- 4. Any person may have access to the Library for the purpose of reading or having reference to books and facilities on the premises.
- 5. Members have access to the Library for the purpose b. Members have access to the Library for the purpose of borrowing books and their representatives will be admitted for that purpose at the discretion of the Librarian. Children under the age of six (6) years may only be admitted to the Library if in the care of an adult who will be responsible for their good behaviour who shall ensure that they do not interfere with the books, catalogues or other. facilities of the library.
- 6. Persons, except members of the Library Staff or other Officers duly authorised by the Brunswick City Council or persons authorised by the Librarian, the Town Clerk or by the Brunswick City Council shall not enter or remain in the Library except during the hours of opening

Membership

- 7. Subject to the approval of the Librarian, the following persons are eligible to become members and are entitled to borrow books:
 - (a) Any person whose name appears on the current Voters' Roll of the Municipality or who can show eligibility for inclusion on the current Voters'
 - (b) Any person resident in the municipality who is recommended in writing by a person on such Voters' Roll.
 - Any non-resident attending an educational establishment in the municipality who is approved by
 - (d) Any person who is in employment in the munici-pality and is approved by the Librarian.
 - (e) Any member of a public municipal library located in the State of Victoria who presents a letter of accreditation from the Librarian of that municipal control of the co

Borrowing

- 8. A person shall not take away from the Library premises any book unless he has: ÉITHER
 - (a) Completed and signed the appropriate form pro-vided for application for a Membership Card and been registered as a member.
 - Satisfied the Brunswick City Council by such evidence as the Council may require that he is a fit and proper person to be so registered.

- (c) Signed an undertaking in a form prescribed by the Brunswick City Council or, if he is under 14 years of age, presented such an undertaking signed on his behalf by a parent or guardian giving the undertaking on his behalf and will—
 - (i) Make good the loss or damage to any book whilst in his use or possession and pay any charges incurred under the Local Government Act 1958 and Library Rules.
 - (ii) Notify the Library of any change in his
 - (iii) Not transfer to any other person any book of the Library.
 - (iv) Not aid or abet any person in the use of the Library in his name except as his agent.
 - (v) Obey all regulations and rules which may apply to the Library and any reasonable directions of the Librarian.
- (d) Presented a current and valid Membership Card of a Library operated by any other municipality in Victoria and presented a Reciprocal Membership Card stamped and endorsed by the Library of which he is a Member and satisfied the Librarian that he is the person to whom the Reciprocal Membership Card was issued.
- 9. (a) A member who damages or permits damage to a book or other borrowed item while in his possession shall on demand by the Librarian pay the amount of the damage such to be assessed by the Librarian.
- (b) A member may reserve a book at the Librarian's discretion by filling in a reservation card and paying a fee to be prescribed by the Council from time to time and advertised by notice in the library.

 (c) A member who loses a book which he has borrowed or loses a membership card, a transaction card, a plastic lending bag, a cassette or any other article borrowed from the library or of which he has possession pursuant to a borrowing from the library or removes a book or other object or article from the library without permission shall on demand by the Librarian pay the replacement value of the book or other article or object as aforesaid and associated processing costs. The Council may at any time after the borrowing time has elapsed commence legal proceedings for recovery of the book or other article or object or its value. or object or its value.
- (d) The Council may make rules from time to time as to the number of books which may be borrowed at any one time. The Council may also fix fees payable in respect of overdue books where the Librarian has not granted an extension of time but such extension shall not be granted where the book has been reserved by another member. Such rules and fees shall be advertised in the library and shall be observed and paid by members.
- (e) Each book borrowed must be returned by the borrowing member within the time specified by the Librarian and may not be lent to any other member or person. A member shall not exchange books with another member.

Membership Cards

- 10. A Membership Card shall not be issued until the necessary steps have been taken to ensure that the applicant is eligible for Membership and is not currently a Registered Member.
- 11. All membership cards, unless previously surrendered or cancelled, shall remain in force not more than four years from the date of issue.
- 12. Every member on being issued with a Membership
 - (a) Is responsible for safe custody of the same.
 - (b) Must produce the same to the Librarian when asked whenever a book is borrowed.
 - (c) Is responsible for the safe custody, return and care of every book borrowed on the production of such card.
 - Must report the loss of the same to the Librarian immediately such loss is discovered and after a lapse of one week a duplicate Membership Card may then be issued upon such payment as may

be levied. It is an offence against this By-Law to use this duplicate Membership Card if the original Membership Card is recovered. Not withstanding such replacement, the member is responsible for any book borrowed on the original Membership Card.

- (e) Must surrender the same to the Librarian for cancellation on ceasing to be eligible to be a member.
- (f) Must notify any change of address to the Librarian.
- (g) Must not permit his Membership Card to be used by any other person.
- 13. The Librarian may refuse to issue books to a person who cannot produce his Membership Card or who produces a Membership Card other than his own.

Conduct in the Library

- 14. A person shall not-
 - (a) Behave in the Library in such a manner as to cause in the opinion of the Librarian any inconvenience to any other person or interfere with their comfort.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Library while offensively unclean in person or clothing.
 - (c) Except with the permission of the Librarian not to bring any animal other than a guide dog for the blind into the Library.
 - (d) Eat, drink or commit any nuisance in the Library.
 - (e) Make any noise which in the opinion of the Librarian is excessive.
 - (f) Wilfully, carelessly or negligently break, injure or improperly interfere with any portion of the Library building furniture, fittings or books therein or otherwise behave in an improper offensive or riotous manner.
 - (g) Enter or remain in the Library whilst suffering from any contagious or infectious disease.
 - (h) Deface, mutilate or mark by cutting or tearing or by writing or by improper folding or otherwise any part of any book belonging to the Library. Use in the Library any writing, drawing or painting materials or trace on or from any book without the permission of the Librarian.
 - Misplace or secrete a book or any record of a book in the Library with intent to hold its use from others.
 - (j) Bring into the Library or any part thereof any closed bag (other than a ladies' hand bag, brief case or like receptacle) or any other wheeled vehicle or conveyance (other than an invalid's chair) save that bags, baby carriages or shoppers may be left in the entrance hallway whilst their owners are using the Library but the Council is not responsible for any loss or damages to any bag case or other article or equipment so left.
 - (k) Distribute handbills or advertising matter or deliver a public address within the Library without the consent of the Librarian and/or the Council.
 - Enter into any part of the Library not set apart for public use, except by permission of the Librarian.
- (m) Remain in the Library beyond the hours fixed for the closing of the Library.
- (n) Smoke, strike a light, or spit in any part of the Library.
- (o) Enter into or remain in the Library whilst intoxicated by alcohol, drugs or any other means.

Name and Address

15. Any person who is in the Library shall give his name and address to the Librarian on being requested to do so.

A person shall permit the Librarian to inspect a handbag, case, bag or other container to enable the Librarian to satisfy himself that a book is not being removed from the library without authority.

Offences

- 16. Any person who commits any offence against this By-Law shall, on being requested by the Librarian to do so, forthwith leave the Library and shall not thereafter without the permission of the Librarian enter or use the Library.
- 17. Any person who commits an offence against this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred dollars.

Application of By-Law

- 18. This By-Law applies to and has operation throughout the Libraries belonging to and under the control and management of the Council within the municipal district of the City of Brunswick.
- 19. By-Law Number 202 of the City of Brunswick is hereby revoked.




