MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas pursuant to Section 2 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council has by proclamation dated 27 January 1965, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 3 February 1965, appointed the Council of the Shire of Wimmera to be the Authority over the whole of the waters of Green Lake for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas pursuant to Section 4 of the said Act the Governor in Council has by proclamation dated 27 September 1966, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 October 1966, (hereinafter referred to as the "said proclamation") set aside or prohibited certain parts of Green Lake for all or certain classes of boating or similar activity:

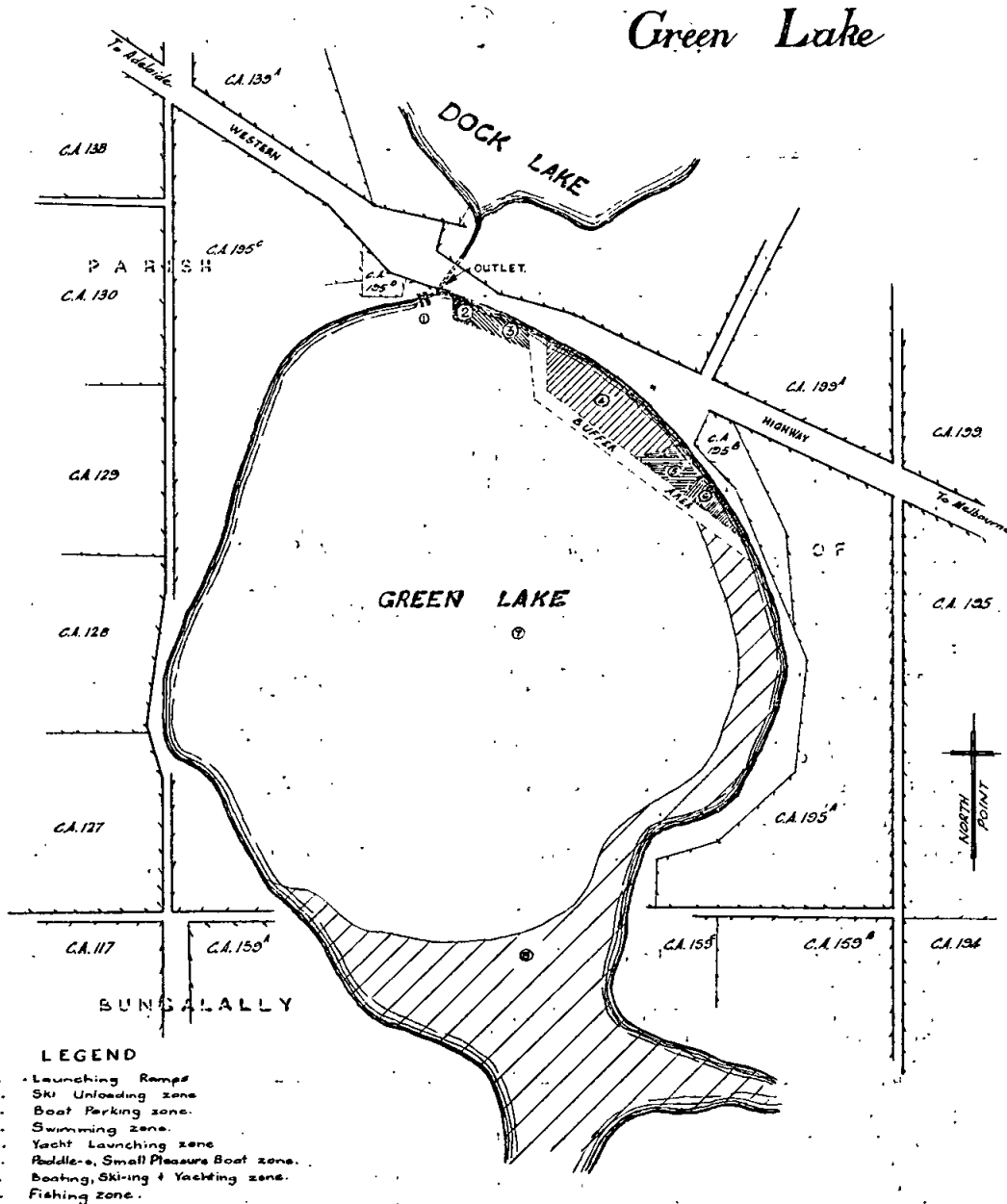
And whereas pursuant to Section 4 of the said Act the Governor in Council has by proclamation dated 3 October 1967, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 11 October 1967, amended the said proclamation in certain respects:

And whereas the Authority has recommended that pursuant to Section 4 of the said Act the said proclamation be further amended in certain respects:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my proclamation further amend the said proclamation as follows:

1. In paragraph 1 for the expression "35½ chains" there shall be substituted the expression "715 metres".
2. In paragraph 3—
 - (a) for the expression "two chains" (where twice occurring) there shall be substituted the expression "40 metres"; and
 - (b) for the expression "one and one half chains" there shall be substituted the expression "30 metres".
3. In paragraph 4—
 - (a) for the expression "four chains" there shall be substituted the expression "80 metres";
 - (b) for the expression "seven and one half chains" there shall be substituted the expression "150 metres"; and
 - (c) for the expression "one and one half chains" there shall be substituted the expression "30 metres".
4. In paragraph 5—
 - (a) for the expression "fourteen chains" there shall be substituted the expression "282 metres";
 - (b) for the expression "eighteen chains" there shall be substituted the expression "362 metres";
 - (c) for the expression "one chain" there shall be substituted the expression "20 metres"; and
 - (d) for the expression "five chains" there shall be substituted the expression "100 metres".
5. In paragraph 6—
 - (a) for the expression "thirty-two chains" there shall be substituted the expression "644 metres"; and
 - (b) for the expression "three chains" there shall be substituted the expression "100 metres".
6. In paragraph 8 for the expression "five chains" (where twice occurring) there shall be substituted the expression "100 metres".
7. In paragraph 10 for the expression "in drawing No. G.L.A.I." there shall be substituted the expression "in the drawing".

8. For the drawing contained in the Schedule there shall be substituted the following drawing—

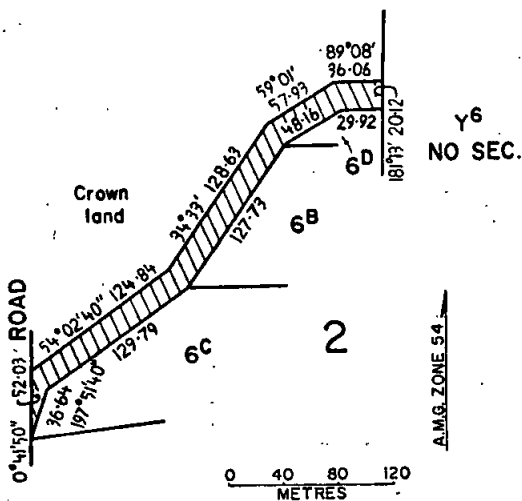

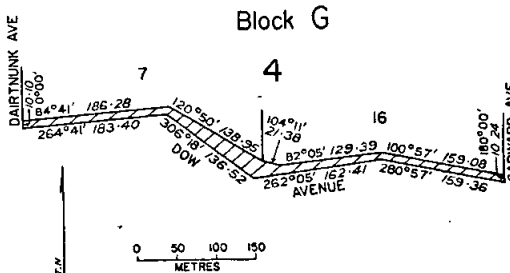

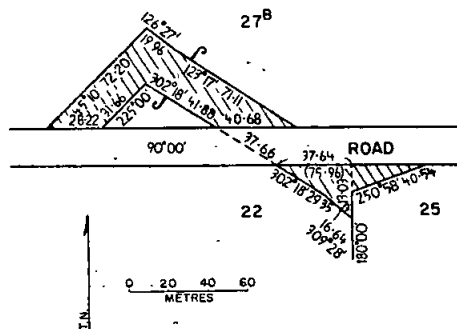

Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my proclamation amend the Schedule to the abovementioned proclamation by adding thereto the diseases in relation to the processes or occupations set out hereunder:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY—CITY OF MELBOURNE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane, or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made

or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force;

And whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for streets be so declared to be public highways:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this proclamation declare that Tyrone Street lying between Wreckyn and Blackwood Streets being part of Crown Allotments 3, 4, 15 and 16, Section 11, Parish of Jika Jika at North Melbourne, and Oxford Street lying between Wreckyn and Blackwood Streets being part of Crown Allotments 5, 6, 13 and 14, Section 11 Parish of Jika Jika at North Melbourne shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

DECLARING AREAS TO BE PASTEURIZED MILK DISTRICTS

INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY ADVISORY COMMITTEE
REVIEW OF AUSTRALIAN PATENT SYSTEM

The Industrial Property Advisory Committee is undertaking a comprehensive review of the Australian patent system. The broad thrust of the inquiry is to study, from the viewpoint of the Australian national interest, whether the Australian patent system as presently operating sufficiently advances Australia's technological development and whether there are ways in which it may be made to do so more effectively.

The terms of reference for the review, which was referred to the Committee by the Minister for Productivity in October 1979, are to examine:

- how the patent system can best contribute to the efficiency and progressiveness of the Australian economy and the adequacy of the system in meeting the needs of Australia with respect to the development and exploitation of new and existing technology.

- any changes required to legislation and administrative procedures to make the patent system less complex and more responsive to needs.
- how patent legislation can be co-ordinated with other industrial and economic policy measures.
- whether there are restrictive practices in the exercise and licensing of patents in Australia, whether it is desirable in the public interest to prohibit by law such practices, and whether the present legislation is adequate for that purpose.
- the conditions necessary for Australia to maximise benefit from participation in the international development of patent systems.
- the ways to maximise access to and utilisation of patent information including an assessment of how information sources can be co-ordinated with other sources of technological and business information.

Interested persons, organisations and associations are invited to make written submissions on any matter within the above terms of reference before 31 December 1980. It is probable that the Committee will invite comments on particular topics, possibly from specific persons or bodies, at some later stage of its investigations. Submissions should be forwarded to:—

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST

By-Law No. 145

Amending Water Supply By-Law No. 143

The Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust pursuant to the powers conferred upon it by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958*, the *Water Act 1958* and every other power enabling it in that behalf orders as follows—

1. For clause 4 of By-Law No. 143 substitute the following:

4. Where pursuant to any Act having application to the Trust or any By-Law of the Trust now or hereinafter made thereunder the Trust is empowered to charge for water by measure, the amounts to be so charged for the supply of water by measure shall be as follows—

- (a) To the Geelong Harbor Trust for use in shipping other than that owned by the said Trust at the rate of 19.0 cents per kilolitre.
- (b) For parks (but excluding areas used as football or cricket ovals or sports grounds) gardens and rockeries under municipal control or the control of the Geelong Harbor Trust at the rate of 6.0 cents per kilolitre provided that the minimum charge in any one year for a supply shall in no case be less than thirty dollars.
- (c) For sports grounds, football and cricket ovals to which no charge for admission is made at the rate of 6.0 cents per kilolitre provided that the minimum charge in any one year for a supply shall in no case be less than thirty dollars.
- (d) For swimming pools under municipal or public control at the rate of 7.2 cents per kilolitre for the first 2200 kilolitres consumed, 3.6 cents per kilolitre for the next 6800 kilolitres consumed and 7.2 cents per kilolitre for all consumption above 9000 kilolitres in any one year.
- (e) To public benevolent institutions not conducted for private profit but maintained for the charitable care of diseased, aged, infirm, incurable or delinquent persons at the rate of 7.2 cents per kilolitre for such quantity of water consumed in any one year as shall exceed an agreed allowance free of charge.
- (f) For churches at the rate of 7.2 cents per kilolitre provided that the minimum charge in any one year for a supply shall in no case be less than thirty dollars.

(g) In all cases other than the foregoing and those dealt within clauses 5 and 9 at the rate of 14.0 cents per kilolitre.

5. (b) For the purpose of calculating the amount payable for water supplied by measure for industrial, commercial and rural purposes a deduction shall be made from the amount of water used in any one year of 1 kilolitre for each 14.0 cents of water rate paid in respect of that year. The charge for water used in excess of any such deduction shall be 14.0 cents for each kilolitre.

For clause 9 of By-Law No. 143 substitute the following:

(a) Water Supplies for Rural Purposes

The Trust may grant supplies of water to rural properties for the filling of troughs only for which the following minimum annual charges shall be payable

(i) For properties exceeding 0.4 hectares and less than 12 hectares	40.00
(ii) For properties exceeding 12 hectares and less than 24 hectares	70.00
(iii) For properties exceeding 24 hectares	95.00

(d) Standpipes

The Trust may grant supplies of water for standpipes to municipalities within its water supply area for which a charge of 12.0 cents per kilolitre with a minimum annual charge for a supply of thirty dollars shall be payable.

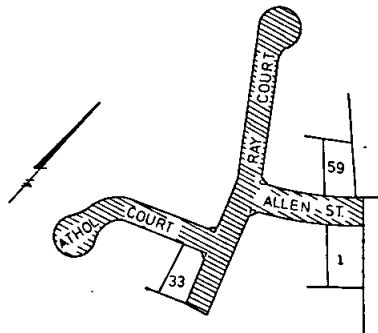
And whereas the works of road pavements, culvert and drainage construction have now been carried out in accordance with the said Agreement between the Housing Commission and the Shire of Donald.

BOILERS AND PRESSURE VESSELS ORDER OF EXEMPTION No. 12

Whereas by section 8 of the *Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act 1970* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* specify particular welding processes to be exempted welding processes either unconditionally or when terms and conditions stated in the Order are complied with and may in the like manner revoke or vary any such Order.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 8 of the *Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act 1970* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:

1. This Order may be cited as the "Boilers and Pressure Vessels Order of Exemption No. 12".

2. In this Order, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the *Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act 1970*.

"AS.1210-1977" means the Australian Standard Rules for Unfired Pressure Vessels (known as the SAA Unfired Pressure Vessels Code) published by the Standards Association of Australia on 1 May 1977, as amended by Amendment No. 1—May 1979 (known as Amendment No. 1 to AS.1210-1977 SAA Unfired Pressure Vessels Code) published by the Standards Association of Australia on 1 June 1979.

"Class 1 unfired pressure vessels" means Class 1 (as classified by AS.1210-1977) unfired pressure vessels.

"Class 2 unfired pressure vessels" means Class 2 (as classified by AS.1210-1977) unfired pressure vessels.

3. The welding process known as manual arc welding and the welding process known as automatic arc welding are hereby specified to be exempted welding processes within the meaning of section 8 (2) of the Act if—

- (a) the welding processes are carried out on Class 1 or Class 2 unfired pressure vessels;
- (b) the welding processes are carried out in the course of the manufacture of Class 1 or Class 2 unfired pressure vessels;
- (c) the requirements of AS.1210-1977 relating to Class 1 or Class 2 unfired pressure vessels are complied with;
- (d) a welder engaged in the welding process is supervised in accordance with any instruction given by the Chief Inspector to the manufacturer;
- (e) a welder engaged in the welding process is under the supervision of only one supervisor at any one time; and
- (f) the number of welders supervised by one supervisor at any one time does not exceed—
 - (i) the number specified in the following Table; or
 - (ii) the number the Chief Inspector directs by notice in writing to the manufacturer—whichever number is less.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Victorian Dairy Industry Authority Act 1977* and the *Milk Board Act 1958* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke as from 1 August 1980 the determinations of milk prices published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 29 dated 23 April 1980 and No. 49 dated 25 June 1980, and doth hereby approve of the following determination of milk prices by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to take effect from 1 August 1980.

DETERMINATION

PART 1

PRICES PAYABLE FOR SALES OF MILK

The prices payable for sales of milk and milk products in all milk districts other than the Border Milk District, and other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 1. The prices payable for sales of packaged milk in the Border Milk District, other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 2.

The prices payable for sales of packaged Ultra Heat Treated milk in all Milk Districts shall be as shown in Schedule 3.

The prices payable for milk and milk products in the package types as shown in column 1 of Schedules 1, 2 and 3 shall be as indicated in the appropriate columns according to the category of sale.

The categories of sale are defined as:

1. Inter-processor sales are those from a processor to another processor.
2. Wholesale sales are those from a processor to a delivery dairyman.
3. Semi-wholesale sales are those from a dairyman to a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person.
4. Charitable Institution sales are sales by a dairyman to a Charitable Institution or benevolent society which is registered under the Hospitals and Charities Act and is subsidised by the Health Commission of Victoria for maintenance purposes.
5. Vendor Sales are those by dairymen to milk vendors who do not operate licensed dairy premises. This category of sale applies only in the Border Milk District.
6. In accordance with the Milk Board Act, "Retail" means—
 - (a) when referring to the sale or distribution of milk by a dairyman or a milk vendor—sale or distribution to a person of not more than ten litres on any one day; and
 - (b) when referring to the sale of milk from a milk shop—any sale.
7. Retail sales are sales by a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person to consumers. This category does not include sales to consumers from Automatic Vending Machines or Public Venue Sales.
8. Vending Machine Sales are those retail sales from an automatic vending machine.
9. Public Venue Sales are sales made by an individual or organisations holding a catering concession for a function, event or display at a public venue. Such sellers must have prior written approval of the Authority before public venue prices can be charged. Such approval will stipulate whether Class A or Class B public venue prices will apply. Class A and Class B prices are those charged by the dairyman to the individual or organisation holding a catering concession.
10. Ex-plant sales are those where milk is collected from the premises of the dairyman by the purchaser or his agent. Ex-plant sales require the prior written approval of the Authority. Ex-plant sales do not include sales to Licensed Milk Vendors.
11. Delivered Sales are those where milk is delivered to the premises of the purchaser by the seller or his agent.
12. Central Warehouse Purchases are those by an organisation operating a warehouse providing storage and delivery services to retail food outlets.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority Act 1977 and the Milk Board Act 1958 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke as from 11 August 1980 all determinations of cream prices heretofore made pursuant to the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority Act 1977 and the Milk Board Act 1958 and doth hereby approve of the following determination of cream prices by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to take effect from 11 August 1980.

Determination

1. This determination may be cited as the "Cream Prices Determination 1980 (No. 2)".

2. For the purpose of this determination "cream" shall mean cream as defined in the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1966.

3. For the purposes of this determination "table cream" shall mean cream used or prepared or intended to be used or prepared for human consumption as cream and "industrial cream" shall mean all other cream.

4. This determination shall apply to all milk and/or cream or other butterfat used or prepared or intended to be used or prepared as cream.

5. This determination shall be binding on every person carrying on the business of buying or selling milk or butterfat, which or part of which is to be used or may be used in the preparation of cream.

6. The principal officer or his authorised representative of each factory or authorised milk depot in the State of Victoria that receives milk from dairy farmers shall ascertain (a) the total fat content of all milk received by it from dairyfarmers, and either used by it for the production of cream or supplied by it as milk to a cream processor or packager or otherwise and used for the production of cream and (b) the total butterfat content of all separated butterfat supplied by it to a cream processor or packager or otherwise for use as cream or for the production of cream.

7. Such principal officer or his authorised representative shall (subject to paragraph 8 below) apportion the total butterfat thus ascertained over the total intake of butterfat in choice grade milk supplied by dairyfarmers at that factory, net of the butterfat in standardised market milk despatches. The butterfat thus apportioned shall, within

30 days after the month of supply, be paid for in accordance with the prices payable to dairyfarmers as set out in paragraph 11 below.

8. As an alternative to the procedure described in paragraph 7 such principal officer or his authorised representative may increase the factory/depot rate of payment each month for butterfat used for manufacturing purposes to reflect both the manufacturing payment and the determined cream prices payable as set out in paragraph 11 below. If a factory/depot adopts this alternative, the proportion of butterfat reflecting cream sales in previous month and the rate of payment must be identified to its suppliers each month.

9. Such principal officer or his authorised representative shall ensure that payment for the solids-not-fat content of all milk used for the production of cream shall be returned to dairyfarmers in accordance with normal factory/depot paying arrangements for manufacturing milk.

10. The prices payable to dairyfarmers set out hereunder are minimum prices so as not to preclude a factory/depot paying to dairyfarmers supplying butterfat used or intended to be used for table cream or industrial cream, any winter or other incentive payments.

Prices Payable to Dairyfarmers

11. (a) The price payable to dairyfarmers at the farm gate for butterfat in milk delivered to, and accepted by, an authorised milk depot or factory and used, or intended to be used, for table cream, shall be a minimum of 2.70 dollars per kilogram of butterfat.

(b) Subject to the conditions as prescribed by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority, the price payable to dairyfarmers at the farm gate for butterfat in milk delivered to, and accepted by, an authorised milk depot or factory and used, or intended to be used, for industrial cream shall be a minimum of 2.34 dollars per kilogram of butterfat.

Prices Payable to Factory or Authorised Milk Depot

12. (a) The price payable to a factory or authorised milk depot by cream processors and packagers for butterfat in milk and/or cream used for the production of table cream shall be a minimum of 2.76 dollars per kilogram of butterfat delivered.

(b) Subject to the conditions as prescribed by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority, the price payable to a factory or authorised milk depot by users of industrial cream shall be a minimum of 2.40 dollars per kilogram of butterfat delivered.
