ON RATES AND OTHER MONEYS

PROCLAMATION

Whereas it is provided by section 386 of the *Local Government Act 1958* that, for the purposes of sub-section (1) of that section, the prescribed rate of interest is 10 per centum per annum until varied by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and, where the prescribed rate is varied by Proclamation, the variation shall apply only as from such date as is specified in the Proclamation and interest payable in respect of rates or other moneys which became payable before the variation shall be payable at the rate or rates that were in force from time to time.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation vary the rate of interest prescribed by sub-section (1) of section 386 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and prescribe 12 per centum per annum to be the rate of interest which shall apply on and from 1 October 1980.

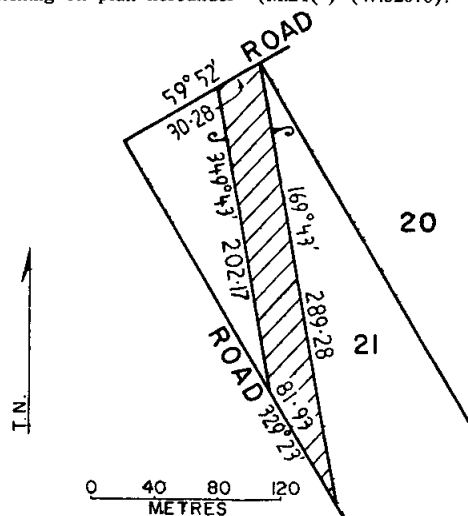

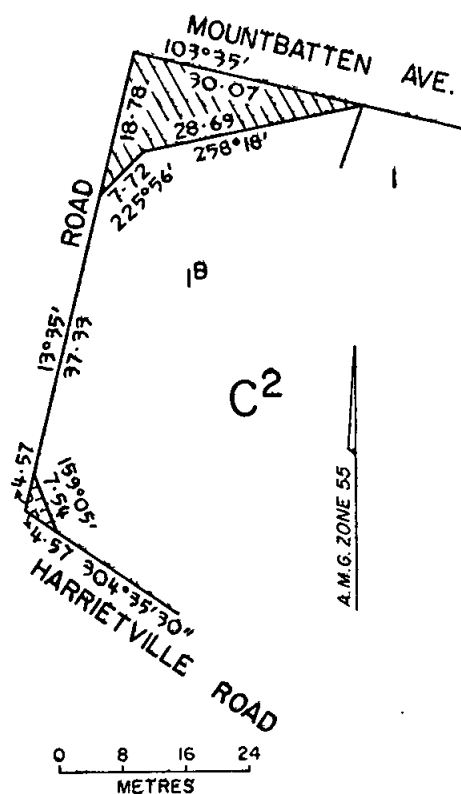

EXEMPTION REQUEST No. 2 OF 1980

On 22 July 1980 the Equal Opportunity Board considered a request by Childcare International Baby Services of 71 Queens Road, Melbourne for a temporary exemption under section 34 (1) of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1977* to enable the organisation to advertise for and employ women exclusively as child care consultants in Victoria.

Having heard detailed evidence of the role of child care consultants which includes advising new and expectant mothers on the use of a range of pharmaceutical products some of which are of a personal and intimate nature, the Board hereby grants an exemption from section 18 (1) (a) and section 18 (1) (c) of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1977* in relation to the offer of employment for such consultants.

EXEMPTION No. 5 OF 1980

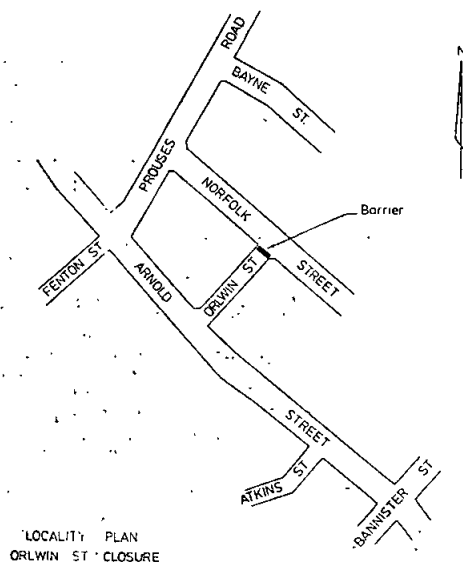

ORLWIN ST CLOSURE

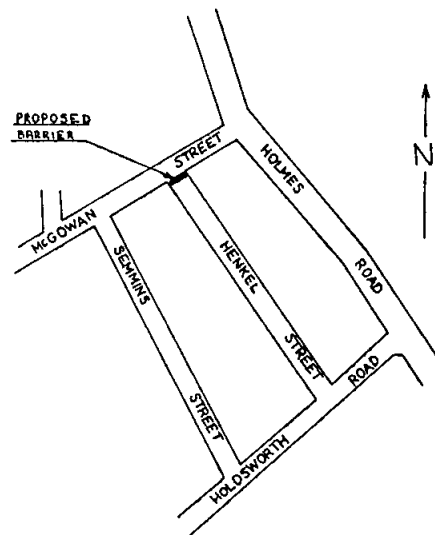

The Public Bodies Review Committee which was established in March this year to review those public bodies referred to it by either House of Parliament or the Governor in Council, wishes to advise that it will hold a Public Hearing in Portland on 8 August 1980 on the following reference:

"That the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission and each constituted water, sewerage, drainage and river improvement trust or authority, except the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works be referred to the Public Bodies Review Committee for review."

When reviewing the activities of a public body (there are 377 such organizations in the above reference) the Committee is obliged by its Act to consider, *inter alia*, the following matters:

- (a) Whether or not the objects of the body are worth pursuing in contemporary society;
- (b) whether or not the body pursues its objects efficiently, effectively and economically;
- (c) whether or not the structure of the body is suited to the activities it performs;
- (d) whether or not the body duplicates the work of another person or body;
- (e) the financial and other liabilities and obligations of the body;
- (f) the extent to which the body seeks information as to the effect of its activities and acts on the information it receives;
- (g) the extent to which the body considers the public interest when performing its activities;
- (h) the extent to which the body encourages public participation in its activities;
- (i) the manner in which the body handles complaints about its activities; and
- (j) the extent to which the body is prepared to improve its structure, composition or procedures.

In order to consider these matters, the Committee may hear evidence from organizations and individuals. Those wishing to give evidence should indicate their intention to do so and provide a written submission outlining areas to be covered to the Committee's Secretary not later than Friday, 1 August 1980. Upon receipt of submissions the Committee will confirm the Hearing arrangements.

The venue for this Hearing will be the Supper Room, Portland Civic Hall, Bentinck Street, Portland, commencing at 10.00 a.m.

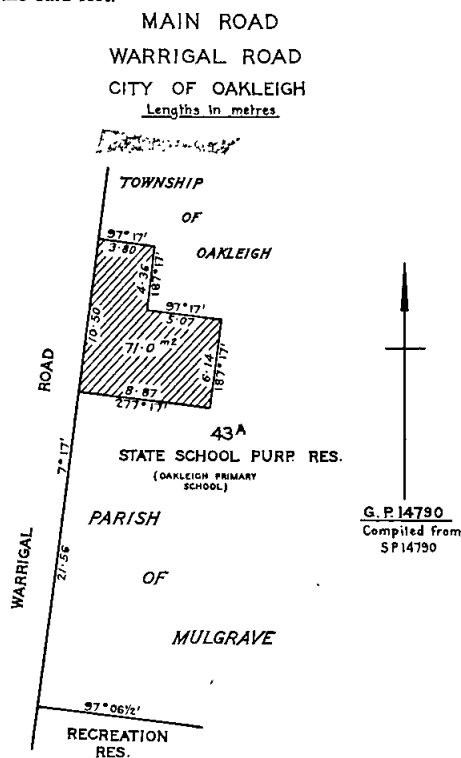

REGULATIONS

STATE SWIMMING CENTRE—FRANK BEAUREPAIRE POOL, CITY OF MELBOURNE

I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Acting Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown land in the City of Melbourne, Parish of Melbourne North (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") temporarily reserved for Recreation Purposes by Order in Council dated 8 May 1979 (vide *Government Gazette* of 16 May 1979).

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

Admission To and Use of the Reserve

1. For the purpose of maintaining good order the attendant or person in charge of the Reserve may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

2. The Committee shall have the power from time to time to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for admission to the Reserve and the use of its facilities and the times during which the Reserve will be open to the public.

3. No person shall enter the Reserve or use any facility therein without having first paid the appropriate fee in the manner prescribed by the Committee.

4. No person shall pay and no attendant, officer or employee of the Committee shall receive any fee for admission to the Reserve or the use of its facilities in any manner other than as prescribed by the Committee.

5. (1) No club, association, or person shall, without written authority of the Committee, hold any entertainments, performances, sports or ceremony in any part of the Reserve.

(2) Any activity authorized under clause 5 (1) may only be conducted subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as the Committee deems to be reasonable, and the Committee may authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

Behaviour in the Reserve

6. (1) Every person attired for swimming in the Reserve shall wear a suitable swimming costume.

(2) No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her swimming costume in any part of the Reserve open to public view or in any part of the Reserve except places specifically set apart or appropriated for such purpose.

(3) No male person over the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be designated for the use of female persons or any separate passage or approach thereto so designated; Provided, however, that a male person under the age of six years may only enter such areas whilst under the supervision of a responsible adult female.

(4) No female person shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be designated for the use of male persons or any separate passage or approach thereto so designated.

(5) No person shall enter any part of the Reserve unless properly attired so as to preserve public decency.

7. No person shall—

- (1) enter the Reserve whilst in an unclean condition;
- (2) enter the Reserve whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and such person shall retire from the Reserve immediately upon being requested to do so by an attendant on duty in the Reserve;
- (3) enter the Swimming Pools within the Reserve until he or she has first used the showers provided.

8. No person shall—

- (1) expectorate in or upon any part of the Reserve;
- (2) improperly foul or pollute the water in the Swimming Pools or shower baths in the Reserve;

- (3) improperly soil or defile any towel or swimming costume or any part of the Reserve;
- (4) wilfully or negligently break, injure, or interfere with any lock, tap or fitting within the Reserve;
- (5) wilfully or negligently damage any furniture, towel or other article supplied for use in the Reserve;
- (6) wilfully or negligently mark or deface any part of the Reserve or any article or furniture therein or attached thereto;
- (7) interfere with any rope or apparatus within the Reserve;
- (8) bring into or place in any part of the Reserve any chemical substance, liquid or powder;
- (9) throw or cause to be thrown any ball or missile of any kind within the Reserve without the consent of the Committee;
- (10) at any time within the Reserve use indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner;
- (11) loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance within the Reserve;
- (12) bring any rubbish or offensive matter into the Reserve or deposit any rubbish therein except in a receptacle provided for the purpose;
- (13) interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Reserve by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the Reserve when requested to do so by any attendant in charge;
- (14) Run or take part in any game or activity to the danger, inconvenience or annoyance of any other person in the Reserve;
- (15) climb or jump over the walls of the Reserve or remain in or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or structure unless authorized by the attendant in charge;
- (16) enter any plant room, store room, or other enclosure within the Reserve unless authorized by the attendant in charge;
- (17) distribute or place within the Reserve any handbill, dodger or advertising matter without the permission in writing of the Committee;
- (18) hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or services without the permission in writing of the Committee;
- (19) bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or to remain within the Reserve, with the exception of a Seeing Eye dog in the charge of a blind person and with the knowledge of the attendant in charge;
- (20) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (21) bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee;
- (22) damage or remove any placard or notice board within the Reserve;
- (23) bring into the Reserve any firearm, diving stand, apparatus, spear fishing gun, boat, tin, drum or other structure without the consent of the Committee;
- (24) smoke within the Reserve except in areas designated by the Committee;
- (25) obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant or any person employed within the Reserve or any officer of the Committee in the performance of his or her duty;
- (26) no person shall light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserve.

Lost Property

9. (1) Any person finding any article in the Reserve shall immediately thereafter deliver it to one of the attendants in charge who shall thereupon register a description of and all particulars relating to it in a book kept for the purpose and any owner losing such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof thereof receive such article from

the attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address and signing a receipt for the article in such book.

(2) The Committee shall not be responsible for any article lost or stolen from any person whilst in the Reserve.

General

10. The foregoing Regulations shall not restrict any servants, agents, attendants or workmen of the Committee in the proper execution of their duty or work in the Reserve—(Rs.10842).

CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN

By-Law No. 146

A By-Law made pursuant and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended) and numbered 146 for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of Council.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended) and of any other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the said city for the purposes of carrying the said Act into operation within its jurisdiction makes the following By-Law that is to say:

By-Law No. 90 of the City of Williamstown is hereby repealed.

1. This By-Law shall be known as the Meeting Procedure By-Law and numbered 146.

DIVISION 1—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ORDINARY MEETINGS OF COUNCIL

Business

2. No business shall be conducted at an ordinary meeting of the council unless it is business of which notice has been given either by inclusion in the agenda or in any report accompanying the same or as provided for in clauses 6 and 7 hereof.

Agenda

3. A copy of the agenda of business for any ordinary meeting of the council shall be posted or delivered to every Councillor not later than 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

Order of Business

4. After confirmation of the minutes and the signing thereof the business of an ordinary meeting of the council shall be in accordance with the order determined by council. Such order shall be determined by resolution of council, notice of which shall have been given as for extraordinary business. Permanent change thereto shall be proposed by notice of motion, notice of which shall have been given as for extraordinary business. Provided that the Council may at any particular meeting for its greater convenience by resolution alter the order.

Correspondence

5. Unless otherwise directed by council, the municipal clerk shall determine what inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the council for its decision or information.

Notice of Motion

6. No councillor shall propose a motion initiating a subject for discussion at an ordinary meeting of the council (being a matter not listed in the agenda) except by giving notice as prescribed in clause 7 hereof.

Provided that the council may resolve by two-thirds majority of those present to admit (without such notice) an item considered to be urgent business, not being a matter where the law otherwise requires that notice shall be given.

7. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing and dated and be given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of a meeting or at such other times as will permit the municipal clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for a special meeting.

(b) A notice of motion to revoke a previous resolution of the council—

(i) shall be given to the municipal clerk as provided in section 185 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and in sufficient time to enable him to give notice to all councillors in accordance with that section;

(ii) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn if the motion is not moved at the next meeting of the council at which such business may be transacted; and

(iii) if it is a second or subsequent notice to revoke an earlier resolution, shall not be accepted by the municipal clerk until a period of one month has elapsed after the date of the meeting at which the first or last motion of revocation was dealt with.

8. The municipal clerk shall number notices of motion when received and enter them in a notice of motion book in the order in which they have been received.

9. Should a councillor who has given notice of motion—

(a) be absent from the meeting; or

(b) fail to move the motion when called upon by the chairman—then any other councillor may himself move the motion forthwith, or move to defer consideration thereof.

10. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

Petitions

11. A petition or a joint letter—

(i) shall be in any legible and permanent form of writing, typing or printing;

(ii) shall not be defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or substance; and

(iii) shall not relate to a matter beyond the powers of the council.

12. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request.

(b) Any signature appearing on a page which does not bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request, shall not be considered by the council.

(c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper and shall not be pasted, stapled, pinned or otherwise affixed to any piece of paper other than another page of the petition.

13. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter, a signature purporting to be that of any other person or in the name of any other person is guilty of an offence.

14. (a) No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover at some previous meeting has submitted a draft of same.

(b) No motion, except that of receiving same shall be made on any petition, memorial or like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council, after that at which it has been presented. Provided that this restriction shall not apply where the council determines by a two-thirds majority of those present that the matter is one of urgency and should be dealt with at the meeting at which it is presented.

(c) No petition shall be presented after the council has proceeded to the orders of the day.

15. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall state the names of the persons from whom it comes, the number of signatures attached to it, the material allegations contained in it, and the prayer thereof. He may also speak to the petition.

DIVISION 2—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO SPECIAL MEETINGS ONLY

Business

16. (a) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

(b) Officers of the council and persons engaged by the council to advise it and members of the public may attend a special meeting of the council, unless the council otherwise resolves.

(c) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

DIVISION 3—REGULATIONS APPLYING ONLY TO MEETINGS OF COMMITTEES OF THE COUNCIL

First Committee Meeting

17. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or any two members of the committee.

Attendance at Meetings

18. Members of the public shall be admitted to meetings of any committee of the council, unless the committee otherwise resolves. Subject to any direction of the council the municipal clerk, where practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

Correspondence

19. Unless otherwise directed by the committee, the municipal clerk shall determine whether any items of inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the committee for its information or recommendation.

DIVISION 4—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL ORDINARY AND SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETINGS AND TO ALL COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Procedure

20. In all cases not otherwise provided for herein, resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the council and its committees.

Minutes

21. The minutes of any meeting of the council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the council.

22. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the council the first item of business thereat shall be—

- (a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each councillor at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or
- (b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and the putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Motions to be in Writing

23. (a) Where so required by the chairman, the mover of any motion at any meeting of the council or a committee of the council shall reduce such motion into writing.

(b) Every motion shall be so worded that the meaning is clear and unambiguous and shall not be defamatory or objectionable in language or nature.

Addressing Meeting

24. Any councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman and, subject to clauses 25 and 31 hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question or order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Moving Motions of Amendments

25. (a) Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the meeting thereon.

(b) Before the proposer speaks to a motion or amendment the chairman shall call for a seconder. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until it be seconded except that a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by drawing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

(c) By proposing or seconding a motion or amendment, a councillor shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion or amendment.

(d) Upon the seconding of any motion or amendment, the chairman shall call upon the mover to address the meeting. Thereafter the seconder shall be entitled to speak after which the chairman shall call upon any councillor who wishes to speak in opposition and, if no councillor speaks in opposition, the chairman may put the motion. If the motion is not then put, any other councillor may be called upon to speak.

Debate

26. Any councillor, except the mover or seconder of the original motion, may propose or second an amendment. Any councillor may address the meeting on an amendment whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

Right of Reply

27. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair; however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

Amendments

28. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

29. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

30. If an amendment be negatived or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at any time.

31. Except by express leave of the meeting in any particular case to grant an extension of time, no item shall take longer than 30 minutes to decide.

32. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

Withdrawal of Motions

33. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

Use of Titles

34. The councillors and officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

Order of Speaking

35. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman May Speak

36. The chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

Speaking Twice

37. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion, except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, or as provided for in clauses 26 and 27 hereof.

Points of Order

38. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Speaking to Subject-matter

39. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to clause 42.

Call to Order

40. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

Disorderly Expressions

41. Wherever any councillor makes use of any expression that is disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the meeting.

42. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers Disorderly Conduct

43. Any person not being a councillor who, having been admitted to a meeting of the council and who is guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when requested by the chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Removal

44. Any person referred to in clause 43 who being requested by the chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any member of the police force or any person requested by the chairman so to do, may remove such person.

Adjournment

45. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting; but if on being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Lapsed Question

46. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded or a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may at the next meeting be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Demand Documents

47. Any councillor may of right demand at a meeting the production of any of the documents of the municipality applying to the motion under discussion.

Voting

48. When called upon the councillors present at any meeting shall vote by a show of hands and any councillor present and not voting, not being debarred by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Questions How Determined

49. (a) The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

(b) Questions shall be decided by open voting and, unless otherwise specifically provided, by the majority present.

Casting Vote

(c) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the chairman at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a councillor, have a second or casting vote, except in the case of any election of the chairman of the municipality or of any meeting.

(d) A decision on a motion to revoke or alter a resolution of the council shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 185 of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

Division

50. Wherever a division is demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands and the result be declared by the chairman.

Suspension of Regulations

51. Any one or more of these Regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the meeting.

52. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence of misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this By-law he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding \$100.00.

Seal

53. (a) The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in safe custody by the municipal clerk and shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of the council.

(b) The affixing of the seal shall be witnessed by—

(i) the chairman of the municipality and any other councillor or, in the absence of the chairman, by two councillors; and

(ii) the municipal clerk or some other officer authorized by the council to act in the absence of the municipal clerk.

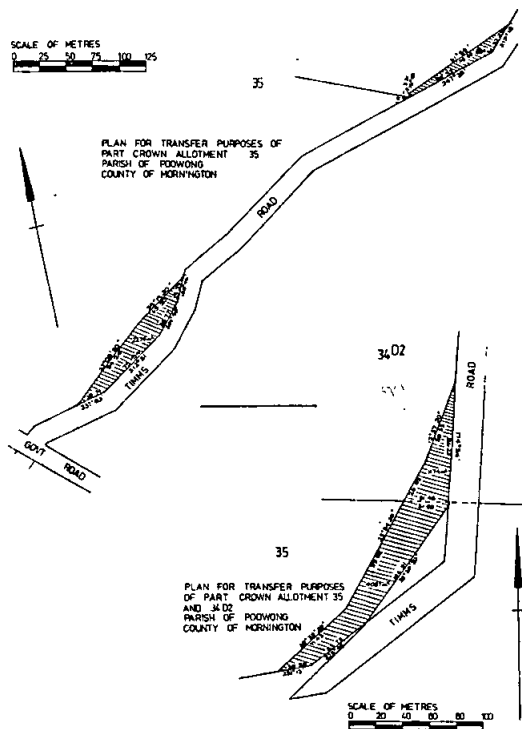
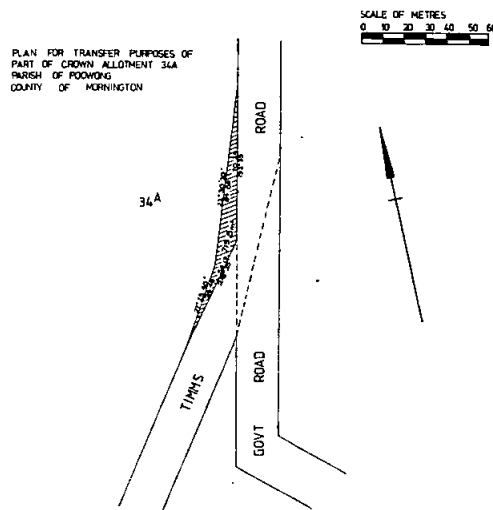

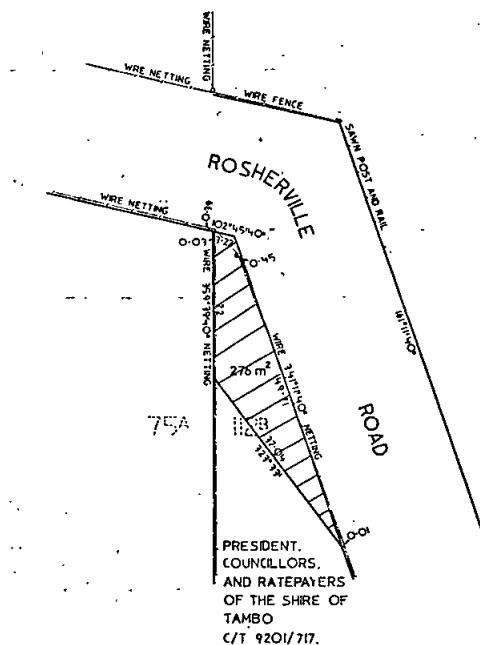
