

PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, TOWNSHIP OF KATAMATITE

 - (c) disturb, interfere with or destroy any animal or bird or its lair or nest in the Reserve;
 - (d) interfere with, mark, deface or damage any buildings, gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or any other improvement in the Reserve;
 - (e) leave or deposit any glass bottle, tin can, waste paper refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose in the Reserve:
 - (f) permit any dog to be in the Reserve unless such dog is at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash
- 3. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the managing body—
 - (a) interfere with, mark, deface, damage, pick or injure any tree, shrub, flower, plant or any other vegetation within the Reserve;
 - (b) remove any soil, sand, gravel or rock from the Reserve;
 - (c) light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserve except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for that purpose;

- (d) drive any vehicle off any formed road or parking area provided within the Reserve or in contravention of any authorized sign therein;
- (e) put or allow to remain in the Reserve any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals except as hereinbefore provided;
- (f) organize or take part in any public entertainment, game or sport in the Reserve;
- (g) camp on the Reserve;
- (h) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity while on the Reserve or from any building thereon—(Rs.11675).

Interpretation

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Avon.

"Municipality" means the municipality of the Shire of Avon.

"In writing" includes in printing or partly in printing and partly in writing.

REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL

DIVISION 1—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ORDINARY MEETINGS OF COUNCIL

Business

1. No business shall be conducted at an ordinary meeting of the Council unless it is business of which notice has been given either by inclusion in the agenda or in any report accompanying the same or as provided for in clauses 5 and 6 hereof.

Agenda

2. Copy of the agenda of business for any ordinary meeting of the Council shall be posted or delivered to every councillor of the Shire not later than 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

 - (iii) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meetings.
 - (iv) Dealing with the correspondence referred to in clause 4 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (v) Reception and reading of petitions, joint letters and memorials.
 - (vi) Presentation of reports and the authorizing of payments.
 - (vii) Business not elsewhere included.
 - (viii) Orders of the day including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 - (ix) Reports from delegates appointed by the Council to other bodies.
 - (x) Other motions of which previous notice has been given,
 - (xi) Urgent business.

Correspondence

4. Unless otherwise directed by the Council, the municipal clerk shall determine what inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the Council for its decision or information.

Notice of Motion

5. No Councillor shall propose a motion initiating a subject for discussion at an ordinary meeting of the Council (being a matter not listed in the agenda) except by giving notice as prescribed in clause 6 hereof.

Provided that the Council may resolve by a two-thirds majority of those present to admit (without such notice) an item considered to be urgent business, not being a matter where the law otherwise requires that notice shall be given.

- 6. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing and dated and be given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of a meeting or at such other times as will permit the municipal clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for a special meeting.
- (b) A notice of motion to revoke a previous resolution of the Council:
 - (i) shall be given to the municipal clerk as provided in section 185 of the Local Government Act 1958 and in sufficient time to enable him to give two clear days notice to all councillors;
 - (ii) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn if the motion is not moved at the next meeting of the Council at which such business may be transacted;
 - (iii) if it is a second or subsequent notice to revoke an earlier resolution, shall not be accepted by the municipal clerk until a period of one month has elapsed after the date of the meeting at which the first or last motion of revocation was dealt with.
- 7. The municipal clerk shall number notices of motion when received and enter them in a notice of motion book in the order in which they have been received.
 - 8. Should a councillor who has given notice of motion:
 - (a) be absent from the meeting; or
 - (b) fail to move the motion when called upon by the

chairman—
then any other councillor may himself move the motion forthwith, or move to defer consideration thereof.

9. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out

Petitions

- 10. A petition or joint letter:
 - (i) shall be in any legible and permanent form of writing, typing or printing;
 - (ii) shall not be defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or substance; and
 - (iii) shall not relate to a matter beyond the powers of the Council.
- 11. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request.
- (b) Any signature appearing on a page which does not bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request shall not be considered by the Council.
- (c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper and shall not be pasted, stapled, pinned or otherwise affixed to any piece of paper other than another page of the petition.
- 12. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter, a signature purporting to be that of any other person or in the name of any other person is guilty of an offence.
- 13. (a) No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover at some previous meeting has submitted a draft of same.
- (b) No motion, except that of receiving same shall be made on any petition, memorial or like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented. Provided that this restriction shall not apply where the Council determines by a two-thirds majority of those persent that the matter is one of urgency and should be dealt with at the meeting at which it is presented.
- (c) No petition shall be presented after the Council has proceeded to the orders of the day.
- 14. Every councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall state the names of the persons from whom it comes, the number of signatures attached to it, the material allegations contained in it and the prayer thereof. He may also speak to the petition.

Division 2—Regulations Applying to Special Meetings Only

Business

- 15. (a) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.
- (b) Officers of the Council and persons engaged by the Council to advise it and members of the public may attend a special meeting of the Council, unless the Council otherwise resolves.
- (c) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Division 3—Regulations Applying Only to Meetings of Committees of the Council

First Committee Meeting

16. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or any other time thereafter by order of the Council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or any two members of the committee.

Attendance at Meetings

17. Members of the public shall not be admitted to meetings of any committee of the Council, unless the committee otherwise resolves. Subject to any direction of the Council the municipal clerk, where practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

Correspondence

18. Unless otherwise directed by the committee, the municipal clerk shall determine whether any items of inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the committee for its information or recommendation.

DIVISION 4—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL ORDINARY AND SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETINGS AND TO ALL COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Procedure

19. In all cases not otherwise provided for herein, resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the Council and its committees.

Minute.

- 20. The minutes of any meeting of the Council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.
- 21. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council the first item of business thereat shall be:
 - (a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each councillor at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or
 - (b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and the putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Motions to be in Writing

- 22. (a) Where so required by the chairman, the mover of any motion at any meeting of the Council or a committee of the Council shall reduce such motion into writing.
- (b) Every motion shall be so worded that the meaning is clear and unambiguous and shall not be defamatory or objectionable in language or nature.

Addressing Meeting

23. Any Councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman and subject to clauses 24 and 30 hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question or order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Moving Motions or Amendments

- 24. (a) Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the meeting thereon.
- (b) Before the proposer speaks to a motion or amendment the chairman shall call for a seconder. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until it be seconded except that a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by drawing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- (c) By proposing or seconding a motion or amendment a councillor shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion or amendment.
- (d) Upon the seconding of any motion or amendment the chairman shall call upon the mover to address the meeting. Thereafter the seconder shall be entitled to speak after which the chairman shall call upon any councillor who wishes to speak in opposition and, if no councillor speaks in opposition, the chairman may put the motion. If the motion is not then put, any other councillor may be called upon to speak.

Debate

25. Any councillor, except the mover or seconder of the original motion may propose or second an amendment. Any councillor may address the meeting on an amendment whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

Right of Reply

26. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair, however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

Amendments

- 27. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 28. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
- 29. If an amendment be negatived or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at any time.
- 30. Except by the express leave of the meeting in any particular case to grant an extension of time, no councillor shall speak to any question for a longer time than:

The mover of a motion for five minutes.

Any other councillor for three minutes.

The mover of a motion where entitled to a right of reply for two minutes.

31. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

Withdrawal of Motions

32. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

Use of Titles

33. The councillors and officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

Order of Speaking

34. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman May Speak

35. The Chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

Speaking Twice

36. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion, except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, or as provided for in clauses 25 and 26 hereof.

Points of Order

37. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Speaking to Subject Matter

38. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to clause 41.

Call to Order

39. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

Disorderly Expressions

- 40. Wherever any councillor makes use of any expression that is disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the meeting.
- 41. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language and having been twice called to order or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers Disorderly Conduct

42. Any person not being a councillor who, having been admitted to a meeting of the Council and who is guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when requested by the chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Removal

43. Any person referred to in clause 42 who being requested by the chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any member of the police force or any person requested by the chairman so to do, may remove such person.

Adjournment

44. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting; but if on being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Lapsed Question

45. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded or a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may at the next meeting be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Demand Documents

46. Any councillor may of right demand at a meeting the production of any of the documents of the municipality applying to the motion under discussion.

Voting

47. When called upon the councillors present at any meeting shall vote by a show of hands and any councillor present and not voting, not being debarred by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Questions How Determined

- 48. (a) The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- (b) Questions shall be decided by open voting and, unless otherwise specifically provided, by the majority present.

Casting Vote

- (c) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the Chairman at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a councillor, have a second or casting vote, except in the case of any election of the chairman of the municipality or of any meeting.
- (d) A decision on a motion to revoke or alter a resolution of the Council shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 185 of the Local Government Act 1958.

Division

49. Wherever a division is demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands and the result be declared by the chairman

Suspension of Regulations

- 50. Any one or more of these regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the meeting.
- 51. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this Schedule he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding \$100.

Seal

- 52. (a) The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in safe custody by the municipal clerk and shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of the Council.
 - (b) The affixing of the seal shall be witnessed by:
 - (i) the chairman of the municipality and any other councillor or in the absence of the chairman, by two councillors; and
 - (ii) the municipal clerk or some other officer authorized by the Council to act in the absence of the municipal clerk.

SHIRE OF AVON By-Law No. 37

- A By-Law of the Shire of Avon made under section 197
 (1) of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 37 for the purpose of:
 - (a) regulating the management and control of library services provided by the council jointly with the Central Gippsland Regional Library Committee;
 - (b) imposing penalties not exceeding \$100.00 for breaches of this By-law.

Pursuant to the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avon order as follows:

A. Title

1. This By-law shall be known as the Library By-law.

B. Operation

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Avon.

C. Definitions

- 3. In this By-law unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—
 - (a) "Book" includes any and every book, magazine, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, gramophone record, video recording, audio-tape recording, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, film, slide, manuscript, toy or any other article forming part of the contents of the library available for borrowing reference or perusal whether or not the property of the Shire of Avon Council.
 (b) "Council" means the Council of the Shire of
 - (b) "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Avon.
 - (c) "Committee" means the Central Gippsland Regional Library Committee as constituted under an agreement dated 30 September 1975 and any subsequent agreement amending or replacing it for library services between the City of Sale, Shire of Avon, Shire of Alberton, Shire of Maffra and the Shire of Rosedale.
 - (d) "Library Service" means all the library facilities, resources and activities provided by the Committee.
 - (e) "Librarian" means the person for the time being in charge of the library service generally, or any section or portion thereof.
 - (f) "Library" means all or any library outlet under the management and control of the Committee and includes without limiting the generalities of the foregoing, all buildings or portions thereof, mobile libraries, and other areas, facilities and vehicles used in connection with the provision of the library service.
 - (g) "Member" means a person or institution holding a current and valid membership card issued in accordance with this By-law.
 - (h) "Membership Card" means a current and valid card issued to a member by the Librarian in accordance with this By-law as an authority to borrow books.
 - (i) "Library Service Area" means the whole of the municipal districts of the City of Sale, Shire of Avon, Shire of Alberton, Shire of Maffra and Shire of Rosedale.
 - (j) "User" means any person making use of the library service.

D. Administration

- 4. The Librarian is responsible for the management and administration of the library service in accordance with the policies and directions of the Committee as shall be determined from time to time.
- 5. Any person using the library service shall obey the lawful directions of the Librarian.

E. Access and Use

- 6. The Committee shall determine the hours the library will be open for use by the public. These hours will be prominently displayed in the library and advertised by other methods as shall be determined from time to time.
- 7. Subject to the provisions of this By-law any person shall have access to the library for the purpose of using the services and facilities on the premises during the hours it is open to the public.
- 8. Subject to the provisions of this By-law, members shall have access to the library for the purpose of borrowing books and their representatives will be admitted for that purpose at the discretion of the Librarian.
- 9. No charges shall be made for the registration of members, except as provided in clauses 12 (e) and 12 (f) of this By-law, or for the borrowing of books for use on or off the premises, or for reference and information services, including those provided from computer data bases, provided that charges may be made for reservation of books, including those borrowed from other libraries on behalf of a member, or for photo—or other copies which will remain the property of the member.
- 10. No person other than library staff or persons duly authorized by the Librarian or the Committee shall enter or remain in the Library except during the hours of opening.

F. Membership

- 11. Subject to clause 15 of this By-law members shall be entitled to borrow books from the library.
- 12. Subject to the approval of the Librarian the following persons shall be eligible to become members:
 - (a) any ratepayers of the City of Sale, Shire of Avon, Shire of Alberton, Shire of Maffra and Shire of Rosedale;
 - (b) any resident of the library service area;
 - (c) any non-resident who is employed in or who attends an educational institution in the library service area;
 - (d) any person eligible to join another Victorian subsidised public library;
 - (e) any temporary visitor to the library service area from outside Victoria. These persons may be admitted to temporary membership for a period to be determined by the Librarian and may be required to pay a monetary deposit to be determined by the Committee from time to time;
 - (f) any Victorian resident who does not qualify for membership under (a)-(d) above on payment of an annual fee to be determined from time to time by the Committee.
- 13. All persons in the categories listed in clause 12 of this By-law shall provide such proof of eligibility as shall be required by the Librarian.
- 14. Institutional Membership may be extended to any association, society, institution, business or agency at the discretion of the Librarian, provided that such body's premises, predominant area of service of activity, or normal place of meeting is within the library service area.
 - 15. Persons wishing to borrow books shall:
 - (a) complete and sign the appropriate application form, which shall include an undertaking to comply with the provisions of this By-law;
 - (b) satisfy the Librarian that he or she is eligible for membership.
- 16. Persons under the age of 18 may be required by the Librarian to have a guarantee to make good the loss or damage to any book whilst in the member's use or possession signed by an adult.

- 17. Every member on being issued with a membership card shall:
 - (a) be responsible for the custody of the card;
 - (b) produce the card to the Librarian whenever a book is borrowed;
 - (c) report the loss of the card to the Librarian immediately such loss is discovered;
 - (d) notify any change of address to the Librarian;
 - (e) surrender the card to the Librarian on ceasing to be eligible for membership.
- 18. The Librarian may suspend or cancel the membership of any member who habitually retains books beyond the loan period or who loses or damages books.
- 19. Membership shall be current for a period of three years unless previously surrendered or cancelled. Persons whose membership has lapsed may be required by the Librarian to re-register before borrowing books.
 - 20. Membership cards are not transferable.

G. Conditions of Borrowing

- \cdot 21. The Committee shall make rules from time to time stating the maximum number of books which may be borrowed at any one time.
- 22. The time allowed for retaining a book shall be 14 days, and the date of return of each book shall be clearly indicated to the member.
- 23. A member is responsible for the safe care of every book borrowed on his or her membership card and for its return to the library by the due date.
- 24. A member may be required to pay a charge for retaining a book beyond the time allowed. The amount of such charge shall be advertised by notice in a manner to be determined by the Committee. The Library shall have no obligation to send any notice of charges incurred and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of such charges. Liabilities incurred by a member under this clause shall be discharged before any other book is issued.
- 25. A member may apply by telephone, post or in person for extension of the time allowed for retaining a book by describing the book in such terms as fully identify it to the Librarian. Such extension will only be granted if the original loan period has not expired or the book has not been reserved by another member.
- 26. Any book in the lending stock of the library may be reserved for a member on completion of a form prescribed by the Librarian. The Librarian may notify the member when the book is available. The member may be required to pay the cost of postage involved.
- 27. A member may recommend that consideration be given to the purchase of any book which is not in the stock of the library, or may request the Librarian to borrow a book from another library for him or her. A fee which shall be determined from time to time by the Committee may be levied where a book is borrowed from another library.
- 28. Where a book is designated for reference use only, it shall not be borrowed except at the discretion of the Librarian.
- 29. A. member is responsible for reporting to the Librarian any damage discovered in any book on loan to him or her. This damage shall be reported at the time of issue or immediately on return.
- 30. If a book is lost or damaged beyond repair, or it is stolen from a member he or she shall replace it or pay to the Committee the full replacement value of such books plus such amount for processing costs as shall be determined by the Committee from time to time.
- 31. Additional charges to be determined from time to time by the Committee shall be made for the loss or damage of membership cards, library stationery or other items. issued with a book. These charges will be displayed by notice in the library.
- 32. No book shall be deemed to have been returned to the library unless it has been handed to the Librarian, or left in a place or receptacle designated for the return of books, or dispatched to the library by post or by a means previously approved by the Librarian.

- 33. The Committee may take such action as it deems necessary for the recovery of a book or the value thereof at any time after the book becomes overdue.
- 34. Books may be lent at the discretion of the Librarian to other library services in accordance with the Rules for Inter-Library Lending issued by the Municipal Inter-Library Committee (Victoria).
- 35. Books stolen or lost shall remain the property of the Committee although replaced or paid for.

H. Conduct in the Library

- 36. Users shall not behave in the library in such a manner as may, in the opinion of the Librarian cause serious inconvenience or discomfort to any other person in the library.
- 37. The Librarian's permission is required to bring any animal, other than a guide dog accompanying a blind person into the library.
- 38. Users may eat, drink or smoke only in areas which may be designated for such purposes.
- Users shall not wilfully or negligently break, damage or interfere with the library furniture or fittings.
- 40. Users shall not deface, mutilate or mark by writing or otherwise any part of any materials belonging to, or in the care of, the library service.
- 41. Users shall not misplace or hide books or any library records with the intention to withhold their use from others.
- 42. Users may bring into the library reading and writing materials, a handbag or briefcase, an invalid's chair or baby carriage. Large bags or parcels, or shopping jeeps may be left in designated areas while their owners are using the library. The Committee takes no responsibility for loss or damage to any bag or other article so left.
- Any container or receptacle brought into the library shall be opened for inspection on the request of the Librarian as the user leaves the Library.
- 43. Persons may distribute or display handbills or literature, or deliver a public address in the library only with the consent of the Librarian.
- 44. Users shall enter only those parts of the library open for public use, except with the permission of the librarian.
- 45. Users shall leave the library at the time fixed for closing the library or at the request of the Librarian.

I. Offences

- 46. Any person who commits an offence against this By-law shall:
 - (a) give his or her name and address to the Librarian if requested to do so, and $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$
 - (b) leave the library immediately upon being requested by the Librarian to do so.
- 47. Any person who commits an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.00.

J. Users Rights

- 48. All users shall have access to all books in the library for consultation on the premises except that some books may be on restricted access because of rarity, physical condition, embargo on use set by donors, or by legislation. Persons under the age of 14 years shall if restricted from using some section of the library by written direction of parent or guardian, be excluded from the definition of user for the purpose of this clause.
- 49. All members shall have access on equal terms to all lending collections for borrowing purposes but excluding for the purpose of this clause persons under the age of 14 years unless authorized in writing so to do by their parent or guardian.
- 50. Every user may suggest to the Librarian that consideration be given to the purchase by the library service of any book which is not in the stock of the library.

- 51. Every user shall have the right to comment to the Librarian on the performance of the library service or on the interpretation of this By-law, and through the Librarian to the Committee. Complaints to the Committee shall be made in writing.
- 52. Information including information held in files outside the library and in computer files required for membership registration purposes shall not be made available to outside enquirers except in response to a Court order, or be used by library staff for any purpose other than follow-up of unreturned books, or for statistical purposes. Membership and circulation statistics shall not be produced in such form as will identify individual members.
- 53. Circulation records and records relating to materials requested from the library shall not be kept after the current transaction is completed. Exceptions may be made with services such as housebound services where selection is done by library staff and the record of past reading is essential to the success of the service.
- 54. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Notice of Intention to Borrow the Sum of \$40 000 for Permanent Works and Undertakings

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Shire of Kyneton proposed to borrow the principal sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40 000) secured by a charge over the General Rates of the Municipality such sum to be raised by the Grant of a Mortgage in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1958.



- (2) at the rate of 30.0 cents per kilolitre supplied to lands and tenements primarily used otherwise than for any industrial, commercial or like
- (3) to any non-rateable property the amount which equals 75 per centum of the amount which would have been payable in respect of the water so supplied had the property been a rateable property; and
- to any recreational lands as defined in the Cultural and Recreational Lands Act 1963, as amended, at the rate of 30.0 cents per kilolitre."
