## **MURDER**

## REWARD

The co-operation of the general public is sought with a view to establishing the identity of a murder victim whose body was found at Kinglake West on 30 October 1979, and to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of the victim.

The deceased person is described as aged approximately 20–22 years old, short fair to brown hair, 170 cm (5' 7") in height and of slight to medium muscular build, with a thick neck and thick thighs. The body had a full set of natural teeth with dental restoration to nine teeth. The bone structure of the deceased person suggests that he was probably of Polynesian origin.

Some of the clothing worn by the deceased person was made in Auckland, New Zealand, and not exported out of that country by the manufacturers.

A reward of fifty thousand dollars (\$50 000) will be paid at the discretion of the Chief Commissioner of Police by the Government of Victoria, for information leading to the identification of the victim and to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for this crime.
