
Whereas by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 for Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958 or a corgonding previous enactment to be a public highway that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from a date of such proclamation become and be absolutely

.3 date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the City of Coburg has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a road laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that road has been sealed with the seal of the municipality

under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria now inference, i, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this proclamation declare that the road, shown by hatching on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958

PRESCRIBED STANDARDS FOR AGRICULTURAL CHEMICALS HOUSEHOLD INSECTICIDES

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 4 of the Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation prescribe a standard for any agricultural chemical:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation:

- Prescribe as standards for specified agricultural chemicals being household insecticides, the standard constituted by the requirements set out in column 2 of the Schedule hereto opposite the respective type of product set out in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- Define the following terms used in this Proclamation:
 - "Aerosol" means a household insecticide enclosed in a container from which the contents may be expelled under pressure in the form of liquid or solid particles.
 - "Bait" means a household insecticide in the form of a solid or semi-solid substance formulated with materials to attract insects or similar pests.
 - "Dusting Powder" means a household insecticide in powder form or in the form of a block which breaks down to a powder on application.
 - "Fumigant" means a household insecticide which acts by vaporization.
 - "Personal Insect Repellent" means a household insecticide which is sold principally or partly for use for repelling insects or other similar pests by application to the skin of a person.
 - "Repellent" means a household insecticide which is sold principally or partly for use for repelling insects or other similar pests.
 - "Smoke Generator" means a household insecticide which acts by the production of smoke.
 - "Space Spray" or "Insect Spray" or "Fly Spray" means a household insecticide suitable for killing flying insects by spraying into the air or suitable for killing any insect by direct spraying.
 - "Residual Spray" or "Insecticidal Paint" means a household insecticide with residual action suitable for controlling insects by application to surfaces either directly or after dilution but does not include paints containing an insecticide intended for use as protective or decorative coatings.
 - "Thermal Vaporizer" means a device which may be used for the vaporization of a household insecticide by the

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE OF THE VICTORIA AMATEUR TURF CLUB (INCORPORATING THE MELBOURNE RACING CLUB)

 - (i) \$200 per day (permanent positions)
 - (ii) \$150 per day (all other positions)

\$75 per day
