## Water Supply By-Law No. 2

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement by the Council—

- (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which, if charged at 21 cents per kilolitre for any meter year, would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 22 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.

4. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at 21 cents per kilolitre.

5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at \$35.00.

6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven (7) days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the Office of the Council during normal business hours.

7. The provisions of clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Council under a special agreement pursuant to section 215 of the *Water Act 1958*.

2. Wholesale sales are those from a processor to a delivery dairyman.
3. Semi-wholesale sales are those from a dairyman to a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person.
4. An Institutional Sale is a sale by a dairyman to:
  - (a) a charitable institution or benevolent society which is registered under the Hospitals and Charities Act and subsidised by the Health Commission of Victoria for maintenance purposes; or
  - (b) an institution which is operated under the Community Welfare Services Act.
5. Vendor sales are those by dairymen to milk vendors who do not operate licensed dairy premises. This category of sale applies only in the Border Milk District.
6. In accordance with the Milk Board Act, "Retail" means:
  - (a) when referring to the sale or distribution of milk by a dairyman or a milk vendor—sale or distribution to a person of not more than ten litres on any one day; and
  - (b) when referring to the sale of milk from a milk shop—any sale.
7. Retail Sales are sales by a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person to consumers. This category does not include sales to consumers from Automatic Vending Machines or Public Venue Sales.
8. Vending Machine sales are those retail sales from an automatic vending machine.
9. Public Venue sales are sales made by an individual or organisations holding a catering concession for a function, event or display at a public venue. Such sellers must have prior written approval of the Authority before public venue prices can be charged. Such approval will stipulate whether Class A or Class B public venue prices will apply. Class A and Class B prices are those charged by the dairyman to the individual or organisation holding a catering concession.
10. Ex-plant sales are those where milk is collected from the premises of the dairyman by the purchaser or his agent. Ex-plant sales require the prior written approval of the Authority. Ex-plant sales do not include sales to Licensed Milk Vendors.
11. Delivered sales are those where milk is delivered to the premises of the purchaser by the seller or his agent.
12. Central Warehouse Purchases are those by an organisation operating a warehouse providing storage and delivery services to retail food outlets.
13. Inter-processor sales of UHT plain milk will be made at the Ex-plant Wholesale price from the premises of the UHT processor.

PART 2

Clause 4 (3) of the contract between the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority and dairy farmers provides that the Authority shall be entitled to deduct from the price of the milk purchased under such contract, such amount per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost incurred in transporting the said milk from the farm of the vendor to the point of sale by the Authority.

The prices prescribed in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above, make provisions for the cost of transport of the said milk from the premises of the Authorized Agent of the Authority to the premises of the dairymen to whom such milk is normally sold by the Authority, but from each of such prices the Authority shall be entitled to deduct such sum per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost of transport of the milk from the farm of the vendor to the premises of the Authorized Agent.

In respect of any milk, additional to its normal requirements which the Authority may purchase from a dairy farmer to meet a demand in an area other than that in which the said dairy farmer's milk is normally marketed, the Authority shall also be entitled to deduct from the appropriate price herein prescribed, such further sum per litre as it may determine in respect of any cost (in excess of that for which allowance has already been made in this determination) of transporting such milk from the premises of its Authorized Agent to the premises of the dairyman purchasing such milk.

In respect of payments for milk made by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to dairy farmers, the Authority shall deduct the amount prescribed as a levy on wholemilk pursuant to the provisions of the *Dairying Industry Research and Promotion Levy Act 1976* of the Commonwealth of Australia.

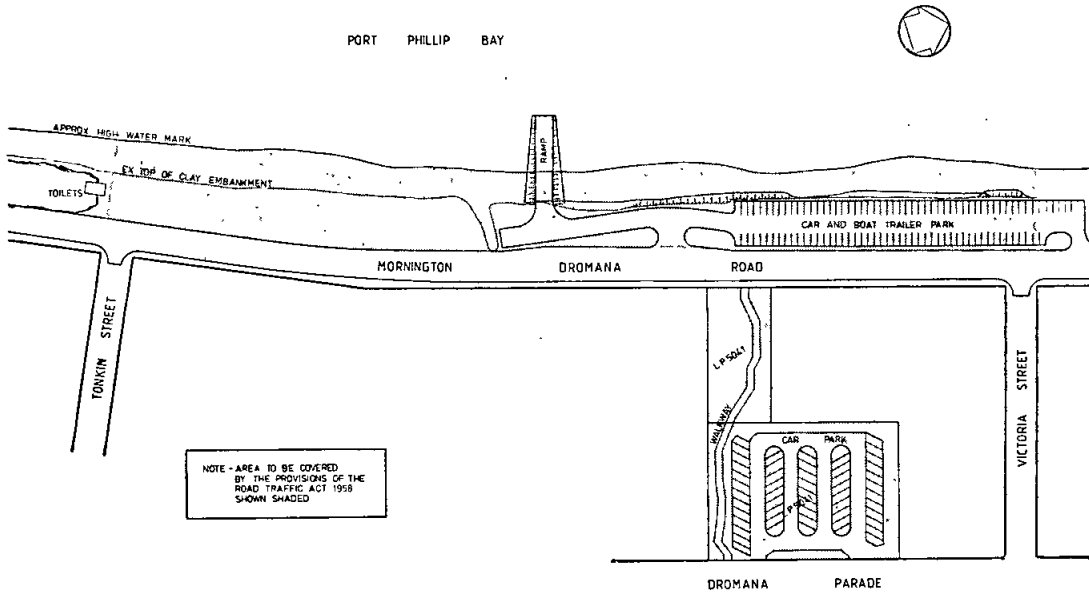

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY

By-Law No. 316

*Animals, Birds, Reptiles and Bees By-law*

A By-law of the City of Footscray made under section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and Division 1 of Part VII of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 316 for—

- or with respect to the regulating of the keeping of any animals (including birds) and the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or the storage of any things which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous;
- providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases;
- controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times;
- suppressing nuisances;
- regulating the keeping of animals, birds, reptiles and bees with power to limit the number of animals, birds and reptiles kept on any property within any area within the municipal district set forth in this By-law and declared herein to be a populous or residential area and to prohibit the keeping of any specified kind of animal, bird or reptile in such area; and
- prohibiting or regulating the sale or purchase or the exposing for sale of animals or birds in any street, road or public place.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray orders as follows:

*Commencement*

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, and is divided into parts as follows:

- Part I— Noise of animals, birds or reptiles clause 5.  
Part II— Sale of animals or birds in streets or roads clause 6.  
Part III— Cattle clauses 7-9.  
Part IV— Goats and sheep clauses 10-12.  
Part V— Horses clauses 13-23.

- Part VI— Cats and dogs clauses 24–26.  
 Part VII— Birds clauses 27–29.  
 Part VIII— Poultry clauses 40–41.  
 Part IX— Reptiles clauses 42–43.  
 Part X— Bees clauses 44–46.  
 Part XI— Storage of food for animals, birds or reptiles clause 47.  
 Part XII— Contagious or infectious diseases in animals, birds or reptiles clause 48.  
 Part XIII— Applications for permits clauses 49–51.  
 Part XIV— Revocation of permits clause 52.  
 Part XV— Enforcement of By-law clause 53.  
 Part XVI— General clause 54.

*Repeal*

2. By-laws Nos. 289 and 307 of the City of Footscray are hereby repealed.

*Interpretation*

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:

*“Animal”*

“Animal” includes every species of quadruped.

*“Battery laying cage”*

“Battery laying cage” means a wire and metal mesh cage or system divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept and includes a battery laying cage system.

*“Bird”*

“Bird” means bird other than poultry.

*“Cat”*

“Cat” means a domestic cat more than 3 months of age.

*“Carcass”*

“Carcass” includes each and every part of the carcass of an animal.

*“Cattle”*

“Cattle” includes bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules and swine.

*“City”*

“City” means the City of Footscray.

*“Council”*

“Council” means the council of the City of Footscray.

*“Dog”*

“Dog” means a dog more than 6 months of age.

*“Footway”*

“Footway” includes every footpath, lane or other place within the City habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.

*“Health Surveyor”*

“Health Surveyor” means the Health Surveyor of the City of Footscray or the person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of Health Surveyor of the City.

*“Hive”*

“Hive” means a hive prescribed by the Bees Act 1971.

*“Horse”*

“Horse” includes mare, gelding, colt, filly and foal.

*“Land”*

“Land” includes messuages, buildings, lands and hereditaments of every tenure; also rivers, streams, wells and waters of every description; and also easements of every description in respect of the foregoing particulars.

*“Municipal district”*

“Municipal district” means the municipal district of the City of Footscray.

*“Offensive”*

“Offensive” includes noxious.

*“Offensive matter”*

“Offensive matter” includes dust, sludge, mud, soil, ashes, rags, waste matter, filth, blood, offal, dung, manure or any other material which is offensive or likely to become offensive.

*“Poultry”*

“Poultry” includes a domestic fowl, guinea-fowl, pheasant and partridge.

*“Poultry House”*

“Poultry house” means a poultry house prescribed by this By-law.

*“Premises”*

“Premises” includes messuages, buildings, lands and hereditaments of every tenure; and also any machinery, plant, appliance or vehicle used in connection with any trade carried on at any premises.

*“Public Highway”*

“Public highway” includes any inland lake whether natural or artificial, and any navigable water vested in the municipality or the Council upon which boats are used to ply for hire.

*“Public place”*

“Public place” has the same meaning as in paragraph 197 (4) (b) *Local Government Act 1958*.

*“Receptacle”*

“Receptacle” means a receptacle prescribed by this By-law.

*“Refuse” and “rubbish”*

“Refuse” and “rubbish” respectively include offensive matter.

*“Reptile”*

“Reptile” includes snake, lizard, alligator, crocodile, turtle and tortoise.

*“Stable”*

“Stable” means a stable prescribed by this By-law.

*“Street” and “road”*

“Street” and “road” respectively means a street or road being a public highway, and includes every public highway.

*“In writing”*

“In writing” includes in printing or partly in printing and partly in writing.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

*Municipal district a populous or residential area*

4. The whole of the municipal district is hereby declared to be a populous or residential area.

## PART I—NOISE OF ANIMALS, BIRDS OR REPTILES

*Noise of animals, birds or reptiles*

5. A person shall not on a street, footway or land or in premises permit an animal, bird or reptile to make a noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort of a person on a street, footway or land or in premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

## PART II—SALE OF ANIMALS OR BIRDS IN STREETS OR ROADS

*Sale of animals or birds in streets or roads*

6. A person shall not sell, purchase or expose for sale an animal or bird in a street, road or public place.

## PART III—CATTLE

*Keeping of cattle which are offensive*

7. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises cattle which are offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of cattle*

8. Subject to clause 9 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit to suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than one head of cattle.

*Permit to keep cattle*

9. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 8 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises cattle.

## PART IV—GOATS AND SHEEP

*Keeping of goats or sheep which are offensive*

10. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a goat, sheep, ewe, whether, ram or lamb which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of goat or sheep*

11. Subject to clause 12 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a sheep, ewe, wether, ram or lamb.

*Permit to keep goat or sheep*

12. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 11 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises a goat, sheep, ewe, wether, ram or lamb.

## PART V—HORSES

*Keeping of a horse which is offensive*

13. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a horse which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of more than one horse*

14. Subject to clause 15 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than one horse.

*Permit to keep more than one horse*

15. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 14 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or any premises more than one horse.

*Keeping of a horse on land or in premises or in a stable*

16. (1) Subject to sub-clause (2) of this clause, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a horse unless:

- (a) (i) the unrestricted area of the land on which each horse is kept or the premises in which each horse is kept is not less than 750 square metres;
  - (ii) there is an adequate supply of water to the land or premises;
  - (iii) the land or premises is enclosed with a substantial fence constructed in such manner as to prevent the horse coming closer than 3 metres from the boundary of the land or premises and 9.5 metres from a dwelling;
  - (iv) there is a proper provision for the storage of feed and the dispensing thereof;
  - (v) there are adequate and proper drains on the land or in the premises; and
  - (vi) the Council is of the opinion that the keeping of the horse on the land or in the premises will not be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous; or
- (b) the horse is to be kept in a stable constructed on the land or in the premises.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause, the Council may on the written application of a person modify or waive the requirements of subparagraphs (i), (ii) and (v) of paragraph (a) thereof.

*Construction of a stable*

17. Every stable shall:

- (a) comply with the provisions of the Uniform Building Regulations 1974; or
- (b) in every other case, be approved in writing by the Council.

*Application for approval of stable—First Schedule*

18. An application for approval of a stable shall be in writing in the form or to the effect of the First Schedule hereto.

*Application to be brought before the Council*

19. An application for approval of a stable shall be brought before the Council which may in its absolute discretion grant the application, grant the application subject to such conditions as it thinks proper or refuse the application.

*Form of approval of stable—Second Schedule*

20. An approval of a stable shall be in writing in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule hereto and signed by the Health Surveyor or some other person authorized by the Council in that behalf.

*Revocation of approval of stable*

21. The Council may at any time revoke an approval of a stable if in the opinion of the Council:

- (a) the holder commits an offence against this By-law;
- (b) the holder does not comply with a condition of the approval; or
- (c) the keeping of a horse in the stable is offensive injurious to health or dangerous.

*Cleaning of stable*

22. The owner and the occupier of the land on which the stable is constructed or the premises in which the stable is constructed shall:

- (a) cleanse or cause to be cleansed the stable in such manner and so often as is necessary to prevent it from becoming offensive, injurious to health or dangerous;
- (b) keep the stable in good order and repair at all times;
- (c) keep the area of land within 1.5 metres of the stable free from dry grass, weeds, refuse, rubbish and other matter capable of harbouring vermin;
- (d) provide, keep and maintain at all times in the stable a separate receptacle for the deposit and collection of manure, refuse and rubbish or so many thereof as may be necessary to contain all manure, refuse and rubbish from the stable;
- (e) provide, keep and maintain at all times in the stable such additional receptacle or receptacles for the deposit and collection of manure, refuse or rubbish as the Health Surveyor may from time to time direct in writing; and
- (f) cleanse and disinfect or cause to be cleansed and disinfected the receptacle or receptacles in such manner and so often as is necessary to prevent it or them from becoming offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Receptacle*

23. Every receptacle shall:

- (a) be constructed with brick walls not less than 20 centimetres in thickness or concrete walls not less than 10 centimetres in thickness, a brick or concrete floor not less than 15 centimetres in thickness and lined internally with cement rendering composed of 2½ parts of sand to 1 part of cement so as to prevent any leakage therefrom or the escape of any of the contents thereof;
- (b) be provided with a fly-proof and vermin-proof lid;
- (c) be kept covered at all times (except when manure, refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or removed therefrom); and

- (d) be kept at all times in good order and repair and in a clean and sanitary condition and be fly-proof and vermin-proof.

## PART VI—CATS AND DOGS

*Keeping of a cat or dog which is offensive*

24. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a cat or dog which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of more than 2 cats or 2 dogs*

25. Subject to clause 26 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than two cats or two dogs.

*Permit to keep more than 2 cats or 2 dogs*

26. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 25 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises more than two cats or two dogs.

## PART VII—BIRDS

*Keeping of birds which are offensive*

27. A person shall not keep on land or in premises a bird which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of more than 10 pigeons*

28. Subject to clause 29 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than 10 pigeons more than ten weeks of age.

*Permit to keep more than 10 pigeons*

29. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 28 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises more than 10 pigeons more than ten weeks of age.

## PART VIII—POULTRY

*Keeping of poultry which are offensive*

30. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises poultry which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of more than 20 poultry*

31. Subject to clause 32 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than 20 poultry.

*Permit to keep more than 20 poultry*

32. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 31 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises more than twenty poultry.

*Keeping of poultry in a poultry house*

33. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises poultry other than in a poultry house.

*Poultry house*

34. Every poultry house shall:

- (a) be constructed not less than:
  - (i) 18 metres from the street or road upon which the land or premises front;
  - (ii) 3 metres from any other street or road;
  - (iii) 1.5 metres from the boundary of adjoining land or premises; and
  - (iv) 17 metres from a dwelling;
- (b) have a roof constructed of galvanized iron or other material approved by the Council;
- (c) have external walls constructed of a vermin proof material approved by the Council;
- (d) have a floor constructed of an impervious material the surface of which shall be not less than 10 centimetres above the level of the ground;
- (e) have galvanized iron, bricks or concrete placed around the foundation thereof to a depth of not less than 50 centimetres;
- (f) be constructed so as to be capable of holding litter to a depth of not less than 20 centimetres;

- (g) have an adequate supply of water;
- (h) have adequate and proper drains; and
- (i) have proper provisions for the storage of feed and the dispensing thereof.

*Cleansing of poultry house*

35. The owner and occupier of land on which a poultry house is constructed or the premises in which a poultry house is constructed shall:

- (a) cleanse or cause to be cleansed the poultry house in such manner and so often as is necessary to prevent it from becoming offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.
- (b) keep the poultry house in good order and repair at all times; and
- (c) keep the area of land within 1.5 metres of the poultry house free from dry grass, weeds, refuse, rubbish and other matter capable of harbouring vermin.

*Number of poultry kept in poultry house*

36. A person shall not in a poultry house keep a number of poultry greater than the number produced by multiplying the area of the poultry house in square metres by 3.5.

*Keeping of poultry in a battery laying cage*

37. Subject to clause 38 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises poultry in a battery laying cage.

*Permit to keep poultry in battery laying cage*

38. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 37 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises poultry in a battery laying cage.

*Keeping of a duck, goose, gander or turkey which is a nuisance*

39. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a duck, goose, gander or turkey which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of more than 2 ducks, 2 geese, 2 ganders or 2 turkeys*

40. Subject to clause 41 of this By-law, a person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises more than 2 ducks, 2 geese, 2 ganders or 2 turkeys.

*Permit to keep more than 2 ducks, 2 geese, 2 ganders or 2 turkeys*

41. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 40 of this By-law, the Council may grant a permit to keep on land or in premises more than 2 ducks, 2 geese, 2 ganders or 2 turkeys.

## PART IX—REPTILES

*Keeping of a reptile which is offensive*

42. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a reptile which is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of a snake, alligator or crocodile*

43. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises a snake, alligator or crocodile.

## PART X—BEES

*Keeping of bees which are offensive*

44. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises bees which are offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

*Keeping of bees in a bee hive*

45. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises bees other than in a hive.

*Keeping of hive in good order and repair*

46. The owner and occupier of land on which a hive is constructed or premises in which a hive is constructed shall keep the hive in good order and repair at all times.



PART XI—STORAGE OF FEED
Storage of feed

47. A person shall not keep or cause or permit or suffer to be kept on land or in premises feed for the consumption of an animal, bird or reptile other than in a vermin-proof building or a vermin-proof receptacle.

PART XII—CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASES IN ANIMALS, BIRDS OR REPTILES

Contagious or infectious diseases in an animal, bird or reptile

48. The owner and occupier of land or premises shall forthwith destroy or cause to be destroyed an animal, bird or reptile on the land or in the premises suffering from a contagious or infectious disease and dispose of the carcass thereof as directed by the Health Surveyor or some other person authorized by the Council in that behalf.

PART XIII—APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS

Form of application for permit—Third Schedule

49. An application for a permit under clauses 9, 12, 15, 26, 29, 32, 38, and 41 of this By-law shall be in writing in the form or to the effect of the Third Schedule hereto. Application for a permit to be brought before the Council

50. An application for a permit under clauses 9, 12, 15, 26, 29, 32, 38 and 41 of this By-law shall be brought before the Council which may in its absolute discretion grant the permit, grant the permit subject to such conditions as it thinks proper or refuse the permit.

Form of permit—Fourth Schedule

51. A permit under clauses 9, 12, 15, 26, 29, 32, 38 and 41 of this By-law shall be in writing in the form or to the effect of the Fourth Schedule hereto and be signed by the Health Surveyor or some other person authorized by the Council in that behalf.

PART XIV—REVOCATION OF PERMITS

Revocation of permits

52. The Council may at any time revoke a permit under clauses 9, 12, 15, 26, 29, 32, 38 and 41 of this By-law if in the opinion of the Council:

- (a) the holder commits an offence against this By-law;
(b) the holder does not comply with a condition of the permit; or
(c) the cattle, goat, sheep, ewe, wether, ram, lamb, horse, cat, dog, pigeon, poultry, battery laying cage, duck, goose, gander or turkey in respect of which the permit has been granted is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

PART XV—ENFORCEMENT OF BY-LAW

Offence

53. A person who wilfully acts or defaults contrary to a provision of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence.

PART XVI—GENERAL

Application

54. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
