PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, together with the short titles, that is to say:

No. 9951. "An Act to make further provision in relation to shop trading hours and for that purpose to amend the Labour and Industry Act 1958 and for other purposes." (Labour and Industry (Shop Trading) Act 1983.)

No. 9952. "An Act to amend the Zoological Parks and Gardens Act 1967 to enable the appointment of an additional Member to the Zoological Board of Victoria, to vary the requirements relating to Borrowing, Investment and Financial Reporting by that Board and with respect to Penalties for Breaches of Regulations under that Act and for other purposes." (Zoological Parks and Gardens (Amendment) Act 1982)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

Whereas by an Act of Parliament in the State of Victoria passed in the thirty-second year of the reign of Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God Queen of Australia and Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth, entitled the Labour and Industry (Shop Trading) Act 1983, it is amongst other things enacted that the Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by Proclamation or successive Proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix 21 October 1983 as the day on which all of the provisions of the Act shall come into operation.

SHOP TRADING ORDER No. 1

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 80 of the Labour and Industry Act 1958, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order declare:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Trading Order No. 1.
- 2. Sub-sections (1), (2), (2B) and (2E) of section 80 do not apply to—
 - (a) shops of the following classes or kinds throughout Victoria:

Eating houses and restaurants

Newsagents' shops

Undertakers' establishments

Shops for the sale of boats, caravans or other trailers or spare parts or accessories that are designed, made or adapted especially for installation, application or fitting to a boat, caravan or trailer or especially for use in connection with a boat, caravan or trailer

Chemists' shops

Shops for the sale of swimming pools, swimming pool equipment or supplies for swimming pools;

(b) shops of the following classes or kinds throughout Victoria which do not sell during a relevant period goods of a kind or description mentioned in the Sixth Schedule to the Act:

Confectionery and pastry shops Booksellers' shops; (c) retail plant nurseries throughout Victoria which do not sell during a relevant period goods of a kind or description mentioned in the Sixth Schedule to the Act except for goods of the following kinds or descriptions:

Agricultural pipes

Bird and animal repellants, bird netting
Concrete slabs, edgings, tree surrounds and
gutter bricks, and packages of ready-mixed
dry concrete and mortar; lime and cement

Fish ponds and lily ponds

Flower pots and garden tubs

Garden fertilisers, insecticides, fungicides, weed-killers, and composts

Garden stakes, labels, binding twines and tapes Garden ornaments, trellis and ti-tree fence rods Garden soils, sand and stones

Garden tools, namely—spades, shovels, forks, hoes, rakes, watering cans, turf edgers, shears, pruning tools, hoses and hose fittings, sprinklers, atomisers, sieves, scarifiers, weed lifters, trowels, yard brooms and wheelbarrows

Gloves, gardening Mastic, grafting Polythene sheeting, plastic shade cloth Wire baskets;

- (d) bread shops at—
 Shop 85A, Highpoint West Shopping Centre, Rosamond Road, Maribyrnong
 Shop 17, Altona Gate Shopping Centre, Millars Road, Altona
 217 Hampshire Road, Sunshine
 59 Main Road West, St. Albans; and
- (e) a fruit and vegetable shop at 59 Dorset Road, Ferntree Gully.

And the Honourable John Hamilton Simpson, Her Majesty's Minister of Labour and Industry for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
