

ECONOMIC AND BUDGET REVIEW COMMITTEE

Whereas the Parliamentary Committees Act 1968 as amended by the Parliamentary Committees (Joint Investigatory Committees) Act 1982 provides, among other things, for the

establishment of a Joint Investigatory Committee of the Legislative Council of Victoria and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria to be called the Economic and Budget Review Committee.

And therefore I His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State doth by this Order require the said Economic and Budget Review Committee to inquire into, consider and report to the Parliament on the following proposals, matters or things, that is to say:

- 1. To enquire into, report and recommend on the structure, organization and management of the Royal Southern Memorial Hospital, with particular reference to:
 - (a) procedures relating to selection, appointment, supervision and review of personnel establishment, as well as rates of remuneration of non-medical staff;
 - (b) rates of remuneration, methods of payment and hours worked by all medical personnel;
 - (c) methods by which reports are prepared, the contents of reports and the execution and reporting back of decisions to the Board of Management;
 - (d) standards and effectiveness of internal and external auditing procedures; and
 - (e) methods of reporting and the contents of reports made to the Health Commission of Victoria.
- 2. To make recommendations if necessary concerning any incorrect payment to any officer or employee of the Royal Southern Memorial Hospital.
- 3. To enquire into, report and recommend on the role of the Health Commission of Victoria in monitoring the activities of Public Hospitals with particular reference to:
 - (a) information systems;
 - (b) reporting:
 - (c) budgeting controls; and
 - (d) comparisons with appropriate monitoring systems developed elsewhere.

The Committee is required to report to Parliament on Items 1 and 2 of the Terms of Reference by 31 December 1983 and Item 3 by 30 June 1984, respectively, if Parliament is then sitting or if the Parliament is not then sitting within seven days after the next meeting of Parliament.

VICTORIAN DAIRY INDUSTRY AUTHORITY ACT AND MILK BOARD ACT

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority Act 1977 and the Milk Board Act 1958 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke as from 1 October 1983 the determinations of milk prices published in the Victoria Government Gazette, No. 51 dated 19 May 1982 and No. 71 dated 11 July 1982 and No. 106 dated 3 November 1982 and doth hereby approve of the following determination of milk prices by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to take effect from 1 October 1983.

DETERMINATION Part 1 PRICES PAYABLE FOR SALES OF MILK

The prices payable for sales of milk and milk products in all Milk Districts other than the Border Milk District, and other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 1. The prices payable for sales of packaged milk in the Border Milk District, other than sales at Public Venues, shall be as shown in Schedule 2.

The prices payable for sales of packaged Ultra Heat Treated Milk in all Milk Districts shall be as shown in Schedule 3.

The prices payable for sales of milk at approved Public Venues in all Milk Districts shall be as shown in Schedule 4.

The prices payable for sales of New Products in all Milk Districts other than the Border Milk District shall be as shown in Schedule 5.

The prices payable for milk and milk products in the package types as shown in column 1 of the attached Schedules shall be as indicated in the appropriate columns according to the category of sale.

The categories of sale are defined as:

- 1. Inter-processor sales are those from a processor to another processor.
- 2. Wholesale sales are those from a processor to a delivery dairyman.
- 3. Semi-wholesale sales are those from a dairyman to a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person.
- 4. An Institutional Sale is a sale by a dairyman to:
 - (a) a charitable institution or benevolent society which is registered under the Hospitals and Charities Act and subsidised by the Health Commission of Victoria for maintenance purposes; or
 - (b) an institution which is operated under the Community Welfare Services Act.
- 5. Vendor sales are those by dairymen to milk vendors who do not operate licensed dairy premises. This category of sale applies only in the Border Milk District.
 - 6. In accordance with the Milk Board Act, "Retail" means:
 - (a) when referring to the sale or distribution of milk by a dairyman or a milk vendor sale or distribution to a person of not more than ten litres on any one day; and
 - (b) when referring to the sale of milk from a milk shop any sale.
- 7. Retail Sales are sales by a milk shop, house-trade dairy, or other approved person to consumers. This category does not include sales to consumers from Automatic Vending Machines or Public Venue Sales.
 - 8. Vending Machine sales are those retail sales from an automatic vending machine.
- 9. Public Venue Sales are sales made by an individual or organisations holding a catering concession for a function, event or display at a public venue. Such sellers must have prior written approval of the Authority before public venue prices can be charged. Such approval will stipulate whether Class A or Class B Public Venue prices will apply. Class A and Class B prices are those charged by the dairyman to the individual or organisation holding a catering concession.
- 10. Ex-plant sales are those where milk is collected from the premises of the dairyman by the purchaser or his agent. Ex-plant sales require the prior written approval of the Authority. Ex-plant sales do not include sales to Licensed Milk Vendors.
 - 11. Delivered sales are those where milk is delivered to the premises of the purchaser by the seller or his agent.
- 12. Central Warehouse Purchases are those by an organisation operating a warehouse providing storage and delivery services to retail food outlets.
- 13. Inter-processor sales of UHT plain milk will be made at the Ex-plant Wholesale price from the premises of the UHT processor.

Clause 4 (3) of the contract between the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority and dairy farmers provides that the Authority shall be entitled to deduct from the price of the milk purchased under such contract, such amount per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost incurred in transporting the said milk from the farm of the vendor to the point of sale by the Authority.

The prices prescribed in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above, make provisions for the cost of transport of the said milk from the premises of the Authorised Agent of the Authority to the premises of the dairymen to whom such milk is normally sold by the Authority, but from each of such prices the Authority shall be entitled to deduct such sum per litre as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost of transport of the milk from the farm of the vendor to the premises of the Authorised Agent.

In respect of any milk, additional to its normal requirements which the Authority may purchase from a dairy farmer to meet a demand in an area other than that in which the said dairy farmer's milk is normally marketed, the Authority shall also be entitled to deduct from the appropriate price herein prescribed, such further sum per litre as it may determine in respect of any cost (in excess of that for which allowance has already been made in this determination) of transporting such milk from the premises of its Authorised Agent to the premises of the dairyman purchasing such milk.

In respect of payments for milk made by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority to dairy farmers, the Authority shall deduct the amount prescribed as a levy on wholemilk pursuant to the provisions of the Dairying Industry Research and Promotion Levy Act 1976 of the Commonwealth of Australia.



Conditions of Contract for General Stores

- 1. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.
- 2. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule, the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.
- Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.
- 4. Supplies must be of the kind ordered and of the particular manufacture accepted under contract. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within Australia or within any other part of the British Commonwealth, all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.
- 5. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 6. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule all orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorised to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.
- 7. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) and, for the purposes of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 32 km from the Elizabeth Street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free or free on rails at Flinders Street or Spencer Street Railway Stations as required.
- 8. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.
- 9. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the specified delivery date shown on the order, it will be competent, after obtaining approval of the Tender Board, for the officer named in clause 8, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned. otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 9.

- 11. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 12. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorised to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case, he must, within twenty-four hours after the objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 13. The members of Boards of Survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service. will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 9
- 14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 16 and 17 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding five hundred dollars as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 9. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or not less than twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 15. All goods forwarded under this contract outside the Melbourne District shall, where railway facilities are available, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.
- 16. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth he shall obtain a receipt for the goods on a Victorian Railways consignment note as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Department as shall be named therein. In all instances the contractor shall consign goods at Railways' Risk and state the order number and description of goods on the consignment note. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods for which service the Department must not be charged any additional freight costs. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 14.
- 17. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with the conditions of clause 16 the contractor will be held responsible and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 9.
- 18. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that the goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners, under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

- 19. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.
- 20. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.
- 21. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-71, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the

- calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.
- 22. The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.
- 23. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 21, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
- 24. Every person engaged in the service tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such labour conditions as are or may be determined by any Federal Arbitration Court Award or any State Wages Board determination.
- 25. The contractor will be held liable for any damage to Government property occasioned by the contractor or any person engaged by the contractor during the performance of any service required under the contract.

AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLIES.

As numerous contracts are subject to Force Majeure, or other special conditions regarding availability of stocks, raw materials, etc., the penal provisions of clause 9 of the Conditions of Contract are not to be enforced by Departments without reference to the Tender Board.

AGREEMENTS.

Where the name of the supplier opposite any item is shown with the sign (A), no contract has been executed: requirements of such items are to be purchased from the supplier named, under Tender Board Agreement.
