NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1983

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the significant accounting policies adopted by Ballaarat General Cemeteries in the preparation of the accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1983. In preceding years the two entities of the Ballarat Cemetery and Ballarat Crematorium were accounted for separately. As from 1st January, 1983 these have been amalgamated into one accounting entity therefore creating new accounting policies.

(a) Basis of accounting

The accrual basis of accounting has been applied whereby costs for the period are matched with income from the same period, liabilities are recognised at the time they are incurred and receipts are recognised as income when earned by the entity.

(b) Depreciation

Fixed assets are depreciated on the straight line basis so as to write off the cost of the asset over its estimated useful life. All assets have been valued at Trustees valuations as at 1st January, 1983.

(c) Long service leave

Long service leave is provided for on the completion of ten years of service at current pay rates. The provision is disclosed as a current portion (expected to be paid within 12 months) and a non-current portion.

(d) Holiday pay

Holiday pay is provided for all employees pro rata holiday entitlements as at 31st December, 1983.

(e) Reservations

Funds received in advance for the reservation of crematorium memorials and lawn graves are held as liabilities pending death or refund. Funds are transferred from this account to income during the year of death.

(f) Investment income

Income earned on investments up to balance date has been accrued regardless of whether or not it has been received.

(g) Stock of hand

Stock of cemetery vaults is valued at cost using the FIFO method of valuation.

(h) 1982 Comparatives

Due to the amalgamation of the two entities, it is not practicable to include 1982 comparative figures in these accounts.

We have been unable to satisfy ourselves that this amount is adequate to meet the expected liabilities because the records for that Cemetery are incomplete before 27th September, 1978 and prior to the Trustees of The Necropolis becoming responsible for the administration of the Cemetery as on and from the 1st January, 1980.
3. With this exception we have received the information and explanations we required and in our opinion the balance sheet and statements of accounts give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and results of the Trusts.
4. In our opinion the accounting records required by the Cemeteries Act 1958, except for the matter referred to in paragraph 2, have been properly kept. The balance sheet and statements of accounts are in accordance with those books.

THE ROLE AND MANDATE OF THE TRUSTEES

The Necropolis Springvale is a corporate body responsible for providing burial and cremation facilities for the community of metropolitan Melbourne in particular and Victoria in general.

The Trustees authority is from the Cemeteries Act 1958 No. 6217. The Act was amended in 1968 to include St. Kilda General Cemetery as a responsibility of the Trust. A further amendment in 1979 provided that Melbourne General Cemetery be administered by the Trustees of The Necropolis. Both amendments provided that the cemeteries be administered as if they were different parts of The Necropolis.

MANAGEMENT

The Management of The Necropolis has been vested in six Trustees appointed by the Governor in Council. All six members are part-time with one being elected as Chairman.

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TRUSTEES - 1983

The summary for 1982 accompanying the Trustees' statements of accounts for that year referred to an application made by the Trustees to the former Minister of Health for a grant for renovation works at Melbourne General Cemetery, and quoted the following passage from a letter dated 19th November, 1982 received in reply from the Honourable Tom Roper, Minister of Health:

"... However, because of an acute shortage of available funds in almost every area of Government administration, and there being no immediate likelihood of improvement, I am unable to recommend a high priority listing for funding the proposed capital works (roads, drainage, water reticulation) out of the budget allocations. . ."

Upon receiving this advice, the Trustees, being convinced of the pressing necessity for the work and having no other source of available funds, resolved to proceed with the renovation of Melbourne General Cemetery utilising funds accumulated for the on-going maintenance of Springvale, St. Kilda and Melbourne.

The 1982 summary stated also that the planning carried out during 1982 for 1983 gave particular emphasis to the restoration of Melbourne General Cemetery and the creation there of a passive recreational park. Analysis of the expenditure for 1983 demonstrates that the Trustees have directed substantial effort and resources towards the achievement of these objectives.

In 1983, a contract for \$194,882 was signed for the replacement of water mains at Springvale, St. Kilda and Melbourne. Of this amount \$139,529 was in respect of Melbourne General Cemetery. Also, a contract was entered into for the replacement and/or upgrading of the drainage at Melbourne and the reconstruction there of Tenth Avenue and portion of North Avenue. The total tender amount for this contract was \$348,249.

An application to the Minister of Health for a grant to reimburse exceptional expenses (that is expenses considered not to be normal day to day operational costs) in the operation of Melbourne General Cemetery was successful. An amount of \$88,954 was received for the period 1st January, 1980 to 31st May, 1983 with advice that consideration would be given to similar applications on an annual basis. As a result of an amendment to the Regulations under the Cemeteries Act 1958 which, subject to the approval of the Health Commission, permits burial depths of less than one metre, it is expected that grants requested in the future will be proportionately less. Notwithstanding this grant, however, the deficit for Melbourne General Cemetery transferred to the Net Revenue Appropriation Account was \$134,849 compared with \$49,222 in 1982.

In the situation of a cemetery such as Melbourne General Cemetery which is closed to the sale of Rights of Burial where the main sources of revenue are interest on investments, interment fees, monumental application fees and upkeep charges, the limited funds bearing interest are eroded by recurring deficits. Therefore, the annual deficit must be expected to increase.

The Trustees' investments as at 31st December, 1983 totalled \$6,006,100, an increase of \$229,700 over the total as at 31st December, 1982. These include Trust Funds (monies held for prepaid services to be provided in future by the Trustees) of \$1,670,914. The increase of \$229,700 includes an increase in Trust Funds of \$168,715. The increase in the Trustees' interest bearing investments, therefore, was \$60,985.

While total investments may appear to be adequate, they must be considered in the light of what would be required to maintain the cemeteries had the gates closed on 31st December, 1983. On that assessment, the amount required to maintain the cemeteries in their present condition, without improvement, is estimated to be \$7,524,000 at an interest rate of 12.4% per annum, the average interest rate received for 1983. After allowing for Trust Funds, an amount of \$3,200,000 additional to present investments is required to reach this estimated amount.

The Trustees believe that the expenditure required for on-going maintenance at Melbourne and St. Kilda will be reflected in the future fees that will have to be charged for cremation and interment at Springvale.

The Memorial Gardens Account, Springvale, for 1983 shows a deficit of \$513,665. In 1955, some memorials had a tenure of 25 years and others had a tenure of 50 years. From 1980 onwards a number of memorials has become available for lease and it is expected that, by 2005, either a larger number of memorials will become available for lease or it will be possible to redevelop some areas. Since 1976 all periods of tenure have been for 25 years. In these circumstances it will be possible to limit the deficit. Such is not the case, however, with cemetery areas.

In view of limitations on the period of tenure, the Trustees have introduced a new form of memorial at Springvale, being an inscription in a memorial book. The memorial books, one for each month of the year, will be displayed in four buildings in a separate garden. It is considered that this form of memorial will provide a lower cost memorial without limitation of tenure thus keeping down memorial charges to the community.

The year 1983 was one of renovation. The renovation at Melbourne while being commended by many, received adverse publicity from some sections of the community.

The Trustees' plans for 1984 include the continuation of the renovation programme at Melbourne General Cemetery, the raising of the standard of maintenance at St. Kilda and the completion of the maintenance, renovation or replacement of the cremation chamber and flue system at Springvale.

The Trustees are of the opinion that the large expenditure required for upgrading the cemeteries administered by them (in particular Melbourne General Cemetery) over the next two to four years will facilitate economical maintenance in the future. However, unless an adequate grant can be obtained for Melbourne General Cemetery, increasing on-going maintenance costs will cause substantial deficits which will have to be met by increases in cremation and interment fees.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER 1983

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Set out hereunder are the significant accounting policies adopted by the Trust in the preparation of the accounts for the year. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention which has not regard to changes in the level of prices. The accounts are prepared on the accrual basis which recognises liabilities at the time they are incurred and recognises receipts as income when the Trust is entitled to the amount. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) PROVISIONS FOR PRESERVATION

Fees received in respect of memorial gardens and cemetery include amounts for maintenance to be carried out by the Trust in future years. Such amounts are transferred to the relevant provisions for preservation, and released to revenue in equal amounts over the periods for which the maintenance has been contracted.

(b) DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the net cost of the various classes of fixed assets during their average effective working lives. The principal annual rates in use are:-
 Building and grounds 2%-4%
 Roads and improvements 5%
 Plant, equipment and furnishings 5%-33½%

(c) STOCK VALUATION

Stocks of maintenance stores are valued at the lower of cost or replacement value. Stocks of precast concrete lining for graves are valued at average cost.

(d) LONG SERVICE LEAVE

The pro-rata entitlement to long service leave of all employees with service in excess of five years is set aside in the accounts.

(e) PROVISION FOR ANNUAL LEAVE

The provision for annual leave has been increased by \$18,606 to recognise the actual liability for annual leave existing at 31st December, 1983. (This compares with an increase of \$27,575 in 1982.)

(f) PROVISION FOR MAINTENANCE

This provision has been created to provide for the future expense of maintaining assets such as furnaces, flue and roads and to carry out survey and maintenance works at St. Kilda and Melbourne.

(g) BALANCE SHEET AND STATEMENTS OF ACCOUNT

The balance sheet and statements of account incorporate the assets and liabilities of The Necropolis Springvale, St. Kilda Cemetery and the Melbourne General Cemetery.

(h) INVESTMENTS

The Trust values all investments at cost.

A grant of \$88,954 covering the period 1st January, 1980 to 31st May, 1983 was received from the Department of Management and Budget, being costs incurred by the Trust in providing alternatives to holders of certain rights of burial and other amounts incurred over and above normal day to day operating costs of Melbourne General Cemetery.

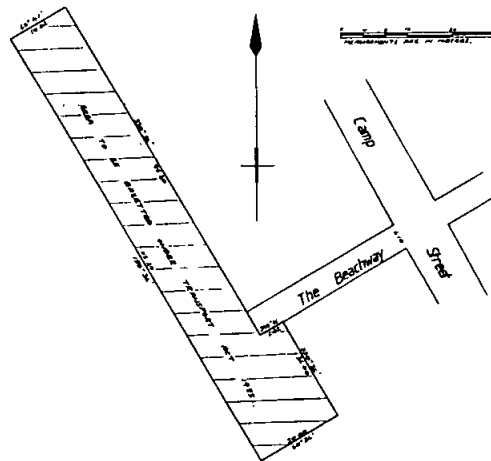

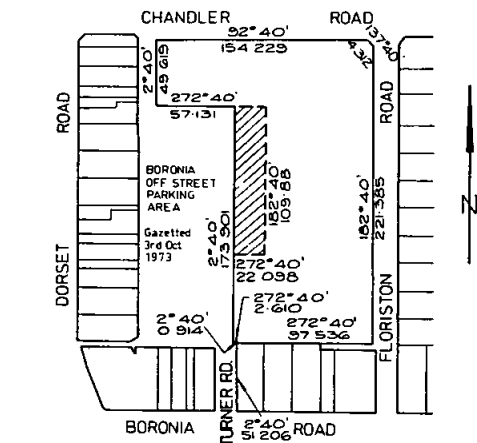
