\$50 000

The co-operation of the general public is sought with a view to establishing the identity of the persons responsible for the death of Brian Raymond Kane, who was shot dead in the lounge bar of the Quarry Hotel, Lygon Street, Brunswick at about 9.30 p.m. on 26 November 1982.

A reward of fifty-thousand dollars (\$50 000) will be paid, at the discretion of the Chief Commissioner of Police, by the Government of Victoria, for information leading to the arrest and subsequent conviction of the persons responsible for this crime.

In addition, His Excellency the Governor will be advised to extend a free pardon to any person involved in the commission of the offence, not being a principal or a person who has aided or abetted, counselled or procured any such principal, and who first gives such information.

Any information, which will be treated as confidential, may be given at any time of the day or night, to the Officer in Charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Russell Street, Melbourne (Telephone 667 1911) or the Officer in Charge of any Police Station.
