Crimes (Criminal Investigations) Act 1984 DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the thirty-third year of the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen of Australia, entitled the Crimes (Criminal Investigations) Act 1984, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, 5 June 1984, as the day upon which the whole of the provisions of the said Act shall come into operation.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid at Melbourne this fifth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighty-four and in the thirty-third year of the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen of Australia.
