No. 10197. "An Act to ratify, validate, approve and otherwise give effect to an Agreement between the Premier for and on behalf of the State of Victoria and BP Australia Limited relating to the refinery at Crib Point and for other purposes." (Westernport (Oil Refinery) (Further Agreement) Act 1985.)

  - (b) The layout of the site and the size of the proposed buildings and works as shown on the endorsed plan, shall not be altered or modified (whether or not in order to comply with any Statute, Statutory Rule or By-law or for any other reason) without the consent of the Responsible Authority.
  - (c) The area set aside for the parking of vehicles and so delineated on the endorsed plan shall be made available for such use and shall not be used for any other purpose and at all times in conformity with such plan there shall be clearly indicated on the ground the boundaries of all such car spaces and access lanes and direction in which vehicles should proceed along the access lanes.
  - (d) A plan showing the location and details of pavement signs and overhead directional signs within the car park and associated vehicular access lanes shall be submitted to and approved by the City Engineer, such signs to be installed to the satisfaction of the City Engineer prior to the opening of the premises.

#### Rural Water Commission of Victoria By-Law No. 6035 URBAN DISTRICTS

Fixing Charges for Water Supplied by Measure and Revoking By-Law No. 6020 of the Rural Water Commission of Victoria

The Rural Water Commission of Victoria under the provisions of the Water Act, hereby makes the following By-Law:

- 1. By-Law No. 6020 of the Rural Water Commission is revoked.
- This By-Law shall apply within the urban districts named in the schedule hereunder and shall take effect as hereinafter provided notwithstanding the provisions of any previous By-Law.
- 3. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any property within the said urban districts shall be read once in every financial year as near as practicable to the same date and the quantity so measured as having been supplied during the period (hereinafter called the "meter year") between any two successive such readings shall be the basis of charges payable under this By-
- 4. In respect of any property rated or supplied with water by the Commission—
  - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without additional charge, except where a special agreement with the Commission applies, shall be the quantity which, if charged at—
    - (i) 32-0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at 1 January 1986;
    - (ii) 34-2 cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after 1 January 1986;

would give an amount equal to:

- (i) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the previous financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1 July to 30 September, both dates inclusive; or
- (ii) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the current financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1 October to 30 June, both dates inclusive: and
- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause, the charge shall be—
  - (i) 32-0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at 1 January 1986; or
  - (ii) 34-2 cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after 1 January 1986.

- 5. The charges, as set out in clause 4 of this By-Law, shall be payable on demand at the office of the Rural Water Commission at the place mentioned in column 2 opposite the name of the respective urban district in column 1 of the schedule hereunder.
- 6. Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of three months from the date they become payable.
- 7. Such person or persons as the Rural Water Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said charges for water.

#### RECOGNITION OF UNIONS UNDER THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 1985

The definition of Trade Union contained in section 4 of the Act sets out three categories of organizations of employees given rights and functions under Part IV of the Act (relating to health and safety representatives). These are:

(1) "an association of employees which is a recognized association under Part V of the

Industrial Relations Act 1979".

- (2) "an organization or branch of an organization registered under the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904 as amended and in force from time to time".
- (3) "an association of employees . . . which is approved by the Governor in Council for the purposes of this Act".

For the purposes of the Occupational Health and Safety Act the procedure to be adopted by the Department of Employment and Industrial Affairs for identifying these organizations shall be as follows:

(1) Associations recognised under Part V of the Industrial Relations Act.

Associations of employees are recognized "with respect to any trade or trades for which a Board has been constituted under this Act". (Section 53 Industrial Relations Act).

Recognition follows a hearing before the Industrial Relations Commission (Section 54) and recognised associations are provided with a certificate (Section 56)

Recognised associations with certificates issued pursuant to Section 56 of the Industrial Relations Act will be entitled to exercise the rights conferred by the Occupational Health and Safety Act in respect to their members working in the particular trade(s) for which the association is recognised by the Industrial Relations Commission.

(2) Organisations registered under the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act.

Organisations of employees listed in the Register of Organisations kept and maintained by the Office of the Industrial Registrar for the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission will be entitled to exercise the rights conferred by the Occupational Health and Safety Act in respect to their members employed in Victorian workplaces.

(3) Associations approved by the Governor in Council

This category was included in the definition in order to provide unions not coming within the other two categories with a mechanism for proving their entitlement to exercise the rights conferred on unions by the Act. It is designed to apply only to bona fide associations of employees and is not designed to interfere with established industrial coverage.

The procedure for seeking approval of the Governor in Council is as follows:

- Applications shall be made in writing to the Minister in accordance with the attached form.
- (ii) Details of all applications shall be published in the Government Gazette.
- (iii) Any association of employees, or the Victorian Trades Hall Council, may within one month of publication of details of an application write to the Minister objecting to the approval of the applicant association as a union for the purposes of the Act.
- (iv) Officers making an objection on behalf of an association shall include in the letter to the Minister their authority for doing so, the reasons for the objection and their association's interest in the matter.
- (v) Upon receiving any application the Minister may refer the application to the Industrial Relations Commission. Following such a referral the President of the Commission shall constitute the Commission as appropriate. The Commission shall hear submissions regarding the application and make a report to the Minister as to whether approval should be given.

- (vi) The Minister shall consider all applications and recommendations in relation thereto and recommend to the Governor in Council whether approval under the Act be granted.
- (vii) In recommending the approval of an association the Minister shall have regard to whether—
  - (a) the association is a bona fide association of employees with an established governing structure, recognized coverage and membership:
  - (b) any tribunal or board exists before which the association is entitled to appear in relation to the determination of conditions of employment; and
  - (c) approval under the Occupational Health and Safety Act will interfere with existing industrial entitlements or coverage.





- 27-0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after 1 January 1986would give an amount equal to:
  - (i) the amount of the rate of minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the previous financial

- year if the meter year ends at any time from 1 July to 30 September both dates inclusive; or
- (ii) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the current financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1 October to 30 June both dates inclusive; and
- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause, the charge shall be-
  - (i) 25-2 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at 1 January 1986; or
  - 27-0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after 1 January 1986.
- The charges, as set out in clause 4 of this By-Law, shall be payable on demand at the office of the Rural Water Commission at Red Cliffs.
- 6. Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of three months from the date they become payable.

  - (i) 25.2 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at 30 September 1985;
- (ii) 27.0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year beginning after 30 September 1985;

would give an amount equal to-

- (i) the amount of rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the financial year 1985-86 if the meter year ends at any time from 1 October 1985 to 30 September 1986, both dates inclusive;
- (ii) the amount of rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the financial year 1986-87 if the meter year ends at any time from 1 October 1986 to 30 September 1987, both dates inclusive;
- (b) for all water supplied in a meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge shall be-
  - (i) 25.2 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at 30 September 1985;
  - (ii) 27-0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year
- (c) The following rebates shall apply within the Coliban Urban System to all consumers engaged in manufacturing or processing or to primary producers raising stock confined at all times to pens or buildings

beginning after 30 September 1985;

- (i) a 10% rebate on all consumption in excess of 5 megalitres per annum;
- (ii) all consumption between 4-5 and 5 megalitres to be taken as 4.5 megalitres;

provided that in no case shall the total amount charged be less than the amount of the rate or the agreed minimum annual charge as the case may be;

- (d) the rebates specified in (c) shall not apply—
- (i) where the consumer's ratio of peak hourly to annual average hourly demand exceeds 10 to 1 and an approved on-site storage has not been provided;
- (ii) where water is supplied from the channel system in addition to the pipe reticulation system;
- (iii) to market gardens, hotels and sporting bodies and consumers receiving concessions under the Commission's Schedule of Special Charges for properties exempt from rating or under the provisions of the Cultural and Recreational Lands Act.
- 5. The charges set out in clause 3 of this By-Law shall be payable on demand at the Bendigo Office of the Rural Water Commission.
- 6. Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of three months from the date they become payable.
- 7. Such person or persons as the Rural Water Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said charges

### CITY OF KNOX

By-Law No. 41

Incinerator By-Law

A By-Law of the City of Knox made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1985 and numbered 41 for preventing and extinguishing fires, suppressing nuisances, and regulating the times during which incinerators may be used on property used wholly or partly for residential purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958 the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Knox order as follows:

- 1. By-Laws Nos. 38 and 39 of the City of Knox are hereby repealed.
- 2. No person shall burn or cause or allow to be burned on any property other than in a properly constructed internal fireplace any matter whatsoever so as to cause a nuisance by the emission of offensive smoke, fumes, ash, grit, soot or odours.
- 3. The Municipal Fire Prevention Officer of the City of Knox appointed pursuant to the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 shall have power to grant a permit to any applicant for the removal by burning of any matter he considers constitutes a fire hazard in the Municipal District. Such officer shall grant any such permit subject to conditions which he considers are necessary to ensure the safety of persons and property in the vicinity of the fire hazard.
- 4. No person shall burn or cause or allow to be burned any matter on property used wholly or partly for residential purposes save:
  - (i) in a properly constructed internal fireplace;
  - (ii) in a barbeque constructed in accordance with the provisions of this By-Law;
- (iii) in an incinerator constructed in accordance with the provisions of this By-Law between the following times:
  - (a) between the hours of 12 noon and 7 in the afternoon on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays;
  - (b) between the hours of 7 in the forenoon and 7 in the afternoon on Sundays;
- (iv) where the Municipal Prevention Fire Officer of the City of Knox appointed pursuant to the County Fire Authority Act 1958 has granted a permit for the removal by burning of any matter he considers to constitute a fire hazzard, but only in accordance with the conditions of such permit.
- 5. No person shall, in connection with any demolition or building project on any property which is adjacent to any other property used wholly or partly for residential purposes, burn any matter or cause or allow the same to be burned on such first mentioned property so as to cause a nuisance whether by the emission of offensive smoke, fumes, ash, grit, soot or odours. No person shall burn or cause or allow to be

burned such matter except between the hours of 7 in the forenoon and 5 in the afternoon on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

- 6. (a) No person shall use or construct or erect on any land or premises owned or occupied by him, any incinerator or barbeque:
  - (i) within a distance of 3 metres from any fence or wall forming the boundary between his land or premises and any adjoining land or premises;
  - (ii) within a distance of 3 metres from the alignment of any street or road;
- (iii) within a distance of 3 metres from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.
- (b) Every barbeque or incinerator constructed or erected after the commencement of this By-Law shall be made of brick or some other fire-resistant material and shall be so constructed or covered as to prevent the emission of sparks or the spread of fire therefrom.

7. No person shall store any combustible material within 1.5 metres of any incinerator at any time when a fire is burning in the said incinerator.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 6 (a) of this By-Law, an incinerator may be constructed appurtenant to Flats or Apartments subject to the design and location being approved by the Building Surveyor and the design incorporating a chimney conforming to the provisions of the Victoria Building Regulations.

No person shall use in any barbeque fuel which may cause sparks to emit or fire to spread therefrom.

- 10. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than four penalty units. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten dollars for each day on which offence against this By-Law is continued after conviction or order against him in respect thereof by any Court.
- 11. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context:
  - "Barbeque" includes any fixed device or contraption used or adapted for use for cooking food in the open air.
  - "Building Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor to the City of Knox.
  - "Council" means the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Knox.
  - "Incinerator" includes any fireplace contruction or container used for the purpose of burning any inflammable material whatsoever not being housed inside a building but does not include a barbeque.
  - "Municipal District" means the municipal district of the City of Knox.

Resolution for passing this By-Law agreed to by the Council of the City of Knox 10 September 1985 and confirmed 8 October 1985.
