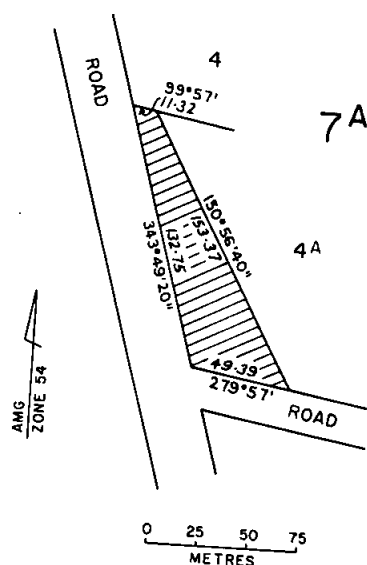

"Chief Pilot" means the pilot designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot and who is approved by the Department of Aviation to perform the duties and responsibilities associated therewith in addition to flying duties.

"Pilot" means a member attached to the Police Air Wing who is the holder of Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilot's Licence and who is performing duty as a pilot.

"Senior Pilot" means a pilot designated by the Chief Commissioner as Senior Pilot and who is required to carry out duties associated therewith in addition to flying duties.

"Training Pilot" means a pilot other than a Check Pilot who is appointed to perform route endorsing and/or training duties.

"Year of Service" means year of service as a pilot in the Air Wing.

(B) *Flying Allowance*

There shall be paid to a member, appointed or seconded by the Chief Commissioner to the Air Wing to perform the duties of a pilot (Fixed wing) and whilst occupying that position, an allowance (inclusive of any other Special Duties Allowance) equivalent to the amount by which the salary for the appropriate classification as



specified and as fixed from time to time by the Award exceeds the base salary and allowances, except the allowance for uniform, prescribed or hereafter to be prescribed for the rank of such member by any Determination of the Police Service Board.

*(C) Additional Allowances*

In addition to the salary and allowances referred to in paragraph (B) above, the following allowances shall be paid to the member as applicable:

- (i) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Class One, Class Two, Class Three or Class Four Instrument Rating—an allowance as prescribed for that Rating by the Award.
- (ii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Senior Commercial Pilot's Licence—an allowance as prescribed by the Award.
- (iii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Training Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Training Pilot.
- (iv) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check Pilot.
- (v) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot.
- (vi) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Chief Pilot.
- (vii) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Senior Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Senior Pilot.
- (viii) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and who is also Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a pilot who is a Check and Training Pilot and who is also a Chief Pilot.
- (ix) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and who is also Senior Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a pilot who is Check and Training Pilot and who is a Senior Pilot.

Provided that:

- (a) No pilot shall at any time, receive in addition to the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (i) and (ii) above, more than one of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (iii)—(ix) inclusive above; and
- (b) Each of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (iii)—(ix) inclusive, above, shall be calculated upon the sum of the salary prescribed in the Award for the highest classification of aircraft the member is usually required to pilot and his year of service plus the additional allowance referred to in paragraphs (C) (i) and (ii) above.

12 (d) (II) (2) *Rotary Wing Aircraft (Helicopter)*

(A) *Definitions*

For the purposes of paragraph 12 (d) (ii) (2) of this Determination, unless the context otherwise requires:

“Award” means the Helicopter Pilots’ (General Aviation) Award of the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission as amended from time to time.

“Check Pilot” means a pilot who is approved by the Department of Aviation to conduct and who does so conduct flight proficiency tests for the issue and renewal of pilots’ licences and ratings and who certifies to the competency of pilots so tested.

“Chief Pilot” means the pilot designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot and who is approved by the Department of Aviation to perform the duties and responsibilities associated therewith in addition to flying duties.

“Instrument Rating Examiner” means a member who is a Check Pilot and is approved by the Department of Aviation, and is required by the Chief Commissioner to conduct flight proficiency tests for the issue and renewal of Instrument Ratings and who certifies to the competency of the pilots so tested.

“Pilot” means a member attached to the Police Air Wing, who is the holder of a Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilot’s Licence and who is performing duty as a pilot.

“Pilot in Charge” means the Senior Pilot, other than the Chief Pilot, who, at the direction of the Chief Commissioner supervises the duties of other pilots in addition to his regular duties.

“Training Pilot” means a pilot other than a Check Pilot who is appointed to perform training duties.

“Year of Service” means year of service as a pilot in the Air Wing.

(B) *Flying Allowance*

There shall be paid to a member appointed or seconded by the Chief Commissioner to the Air Wing to perform the duties of a pilot (helicopter) and whilst occupying that position, an allowance (inclusive of any other Special Duties Allowance) equivalent to the amount by which the salary for the appropriate classification as

specified and as fixed from time to time by the Award exceeds the base salary and allowances, except the allowance for uniform, prescribed or hereafter to be prescribed for the rank of such member by any Determination of the Police Service Board.

*(C) Additional Allowances*

In addition to the salary and allowances referred to in paragraph (B) above, the following allowances shall be paid to the member as applicable:

- (i) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Class One, Class Two, Class Three or Class Four Instrument Rating—an allowance as prescribed for that Rating by the Award.
- (ii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Senior Commercial Pilot's Licence—an allowance as prescribed by the Award.
- (iii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, the Senior Pilot and is required to supervise up to 3 helicopter pilots—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for Pilot in Charge.
- (iv) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, the Senior Pilot and is required to supervise more than 3 helicopter pilots—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for Pilot in Charge.
- (v) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot.
- (vi) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and Instrument Rating Examiner—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot who is an Instrument Rating Examiner.
- (vii) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Chief Pilot.
- (viii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and who is also the Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the award for a Check and Training Pilot who is also the Chief Pilot.

Provided that:

- (a) No pilot shall at any one time, receive in addition to the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (i) and (ii) above, more than one of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (iii)–(viii) inclusive above;

- (b) Each of the additional allowances prescribed in paragraphs (C) (iii)–(viii) inclusive above, shall be calculated upon the salary prescribed by the Award for the eighth year of service and the additional allowance referred to in paragraphs (C) (i) and (ii) above; and

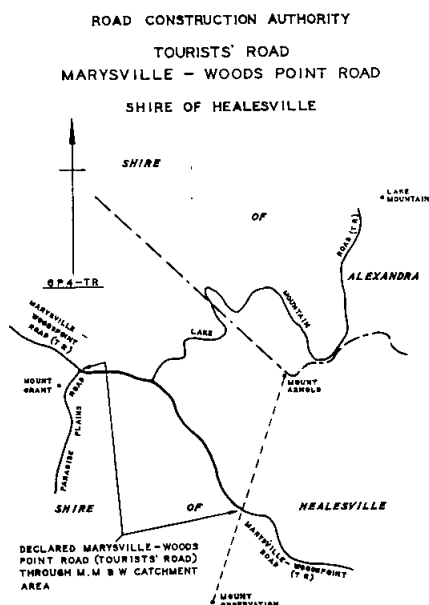

#### Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304)

#### THE VICTORIAN EGG MARKETING BOARD

By Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* No. 79 dated 31 July 1985, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, provided and declared on 30 July 1985, that all eggs, (with certain exceptions), coming into existence within a period of two years from 16 August 1985, shall become vested in and be delivered by producers to The Victorian Egg Marketing Board or its authorized agents.

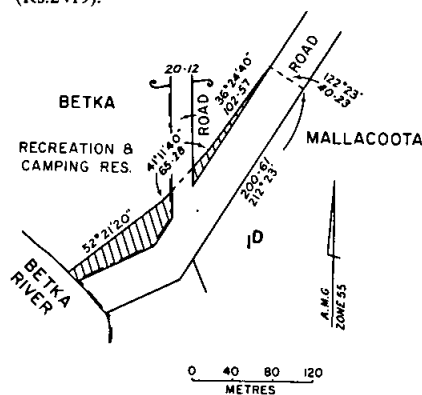

#### UNION OF DISTRICTS LATROBE RIVER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND THOMSON RIVER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

### CAMPBELL-TURNBULL LIBRARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

#### By-Law

A By-Law of the Campbell Turnbull Library Management Committee numbered 1 made under section 799D of the *Local Government Act 1958* for the proper management and control of the Campbell Turnbull Library belonging to the City of Brunswick and City of Coburg and under the management of the Campbell Turnbull Library Management Committee.



In pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958, the Campbell Turnbull Library Management Committee makes the following By-Law which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal districts of Brunswick and Coburg.

#### Definitions

1. In these Regulations unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—

- (a) "Book" includes any and every book, periodical, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, gramophone, gramophone record, cassette player, cassette video player, video tape, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, film, slide, manuscript, tape player, reel to reel tape recording, toy or any other article of the like nature forming part of the contents of the Library, whether or not the property of the City of Brunswick and the City of Coburg.
- (b) "Management Committee" means the Campbell Turnbull Library Management Committee.
- (c) "Librarian" means the person for the time being in charge of the Library service generally, or any portion or section thereof, and in respect of ensuring compliance by members or any other person with this By-Law, members of the Library staff or any security officer employed by the Council.
- (d) "Library" means the Campbell Turnbull Library belonging to or under the control of and under the management of the City of Brunswick and City of Coburg and includes the buildings, rooms, offices, passages, staircases, entrances, adjacent thereto and sanitary facilities of the Campbell Turnbull Library.
- (e) "Registered member" and "member" means a person to whom a membership card is issued in accordance with this By-Law.
- (f) "Membership Card" means a current and valid Membership Card so entitled and issued by the Librarian in accordance with this By-Law.
- (g) "Municipalities" means the municipal districts of the City of Brunswick and the City of Coburg.
- (h) "Voters' Roll" means the voters' rolls of the City of Brunswick and City of Coburg.
- (i) "User" means any person, whether or not a member, who visits a library for the purpose of reading or having reference to books and facilities on the premises.

#### Administration

2. The Librarian has general charge of the Library and is responsible for the safe custody of books and all other property belonging thereto. The Librarian

has power to refuse to issue books to deny the use of a Library to any person who neglects or refuses to comply with Paragraph 15 hereof and any part thereof and may require such person to forthwith quit the Library premises. Failure by a person to forthwith leave the Library premises upon being required to do so by the Librarian is an offence against this By-Law.

#### Hours of Opening

3. The Library shall be open during such hours as the Management Committee determines from time to time.

#### Access and Use of Library

4. Any person may have access to the Library for the purpose of reading or having reference to books and facilities on the premises.

5. Members have access to the Library for the purpose of borrowing books and their representatives will be admitted for that purpose at the discretion of the Librarian. Children under the age of six (6) years may only be admitted to the Library if in the care of an adult who will be responsible for their good behaviour and who shall ensure that they do not interfere with the books, catalogues or other facilities of the Library.

6. Persons, except members of the Library Staff or other Officers duly authorized by the Management Committee or persons authorized by the Librarian, the Executive Officer or by the Management Committee shall not enter or remain in the Library except during the hours of opening.

#### Membership

7. Subject to the approval of the Librarian, the following persons are eligible to become members and are entitled to borrow books:

- (a) Any person whose name appears on the current Voters' Rolls of the Municipalities or who can show eligibility for inclusion on the current Voters' Rolls.
- (b) Any person resident in the municipalities.
- (c) Any non-resident attending an educational establishment in the municipalities.
- (d) Any person who is in employment in the municipalities.
- (e) Any person who is eligible to join another Victorian subsidised public library.
- (f) Any person who is visiting the municipalities and is a guest of a resident of the municipalities.

#### Borrowing

8. A person shall not take away from the Library premises any book unless he has—

- (a) completed and signed the appropriate form provided for application for a Membership Card and been registered as a member;
- (b) satisfied the Management Committee by such evidence as the Committee may require that he is a fit and proper person to be so registered;

- (c) signed an undertaking in a form prescribed by the Management Committee or, if he is under 18 years of age, presented such an undertaking signed on his behalf by a parent or guardian giving the undertaking on his behalf that he will—

- (i) make good the loss of or damage to any book whilst in his use or possession or whilst borrowed in his name and pay any charges incurred under the *Local Government Act 1958* or this By-Law;
- (ii) notify the Library of any change in his address;
- (iii) not transfer to any other person any book of the library;
- (iv) not aid or abet any person in the use of the Library in his name except as his agent;
- (v) obey all regulations and rules which may apply to the Library and any reasonable directions of the Librarian.

9. The Librarian may suspend or cancel the membership of any member who habitually retains books beyond the loan period or who habitually loses or damages books.

10. (a) A member who damages or permits damage to a book or other borrowed item while in his possession shall on demand by the Librarian pay the amount of the damage, such to be assessed by the Librarian.

(b) A member may reserve a book at the Librarian's discretion by filling in a reservation card and paying a fee to be prescribed by the Management Committee from time to time and advertised by notice in the Library.

(c) A member who loses and/or damages a book, a membership card, a plastic lending bag, a cassette or any other article borrowed from the Library or of which he has possession pursuant to a borrowing from the Library or removes a book or other object or article from the Library without permission shall on demand by the Librarian pay the replacement value of the book or other article or object as aforesaid and associated processing costs. The Management Committee may at any time after the borrowing time has elapsed commence legal proceedings for recovery of the book or other article or object or its value. All lost, damaged or stolen books and other articles remain the property of the Municipal Council which provided them.

(d) The Management Committee may make rules from time to time as to the number of books which may be borrowed at any one time. The Management Committee may also fix fees payable in respect of overdue books where the Librarian has not granted an extension of time but such extension shall not be granted where the book has been reserved by another

member. Such rules and fees shall be advertised in the Library and shall be observed and paid by members.

(e) Each book borrowed must be returned by the borrowing member within the time specified by the Librarian and may not be lent to any other member or person. A member shall not exchange books with another member.

#### *Membership Cards*

11. A membership Card shall not be issued until the necessary steps have been taken to ensure that the applicant is eligible for Membership and is not currently a Registered Member.

12. All Membership Cards, unless previously surrendered or cancelled, shall remain in force for such period as shall be determined by the Management Committee.

13. Every member on being issued with a Membership Card—

- (a) is responsible for safe custody of the same;
- (b) must produce the same to the Librarian when asked whenever a book is borrowed.
- (c) is responsible for the safe custody, return and care of every book borrowed on the production of such card;
- (d) must report the loss of the same to the Librarian immediately such loss is discovered and after a lapse of one week a duplicate Membership Card may then be issued upon such payment as may be levied. Notwithstanding such replacement, the member is responsible for any book borrowed on the original Membership Card;
- (e) must surrender the same to the Librarian for cancellation on ceasing to be eligible to be a member;
- (f) must notify any change of address to the Librarian;
- (g) must not permit his Membership Card to be used by any other person.

14. The Librarian may refuse to issue books to a person who cannot produce his Membership Card or who produces the Membership Card other than his own.

#### *Conduct in the Library*

15. A person shall not—

- (a) behave in the Library in such a manner as to cause in the opinion of the Librarian any inconvenience to any other person or interfere with their comfort;
- (b) enter or remain in the Library while offensively unclean in person or clothing;
- (c) except with the permission of the Librarian not to bring any animal other than a guide dog for the blind into the Library;
- (d) eat, drink or commit any nuisance in the Library;

- (e) make any noise which in the opinion of the Librarian is excessive;
- (f) wilfully, carelessly or negligently break, injure or improperly interfere with any portion of the Library building, furniture, fittings or books therein or otherwise behave in an improper, offensive or riotous manner;
- (g) enter or remain in the Library whilst suffering from any contagious or infectious disease;
- (h) deface, mutilate or mark by cutting or tearing or by writing or by improper folding or otherwise any part of any book belonging to the Library, or use in the Library any writing, drawing or painting materials or trace on or from any book without permission of the Librarian;
- (i) misplace or secrete a book or any record of a book in the Library with intent to hold its use from others;
- (j) bring into the Library or any part thereof any closed bag (other than a ladies' handbag, briefcase or like receptacle) or any other wheeled vehicle or conveyance (other than a invalid's chair) save that bags, baby carriages or shoppers may be left in the entrance hallway whilst their owners are using the Library but the Management Committee is not responsible for any loss or damages to any bag, case or other article of equipment so left;
- (k) distribute handbills or advertising matter or deliver a public address within the Library without the consent of the Librarian or the Management Committee;
- (l) enter into any part of the Library not set apart for public use, except by permission of the Librarian;
- (m) remain in the Library beyond the hours fixed for the closing of the Library;
- (n) smoke, strike a light, or spit in any part of the Library;
- (o) enter into remain in the Library whilst intoxicated by alcohol, drugs or any other means.

#### *Name and Address*

16. Any person who is in the Library shall give his name and address to the Librarian on being requested to do so.

A person shall permit the Librarian to inspect any handbag, case, bag or other container brought into a Library to enable the Librarian to satisfy himself that a book is not being removed from the Library without authority.

#### *Members and Users' Rights*

17. (a) Users have access to all books in the Library for consultation on the premises with the exception of such books as the Librarian or the Management Committee may from time

to time place on restricted access for reasons of rarity, physical condition or embargo set by donors or by Legislation. Persons under the age of 18 years, if restricted from using any particular section or sections of the Library by written direction of their parent or guardian shall not be permitted access to books contained in the section or sections of the Library so specified;

- (b) All members have access on equal terms to all lending collections for borrowing purposes but excluding for the purpose of this Clause persons under the age of 18 years if restricted by parental direction or by direction of a guardian;
- (c) Any member or user may suggest to the Librarian that consideration be given to the purchase of any book which is not in the stock of the Library;
- (d) Any member or user has the right to comment to the Librarian on the performance of the Library service or on the interpretation of this By-Law and through the Librarian to the Management Committee. Any complaint to the Management Committee shall be made in writing;
- (e) Information required for membership registration purposes and for loans by members shall not be made available to outside enquirers except in response to a Court order, or be used by Library staff for any purposes other than follow-up of unreturned books, or for statistical purposes. Membership and circulation statistics shall not be produced in such form as will identify individual members;
- (f) Circulation records and records relating to materials requested or borrowed from the Library shall be destroyed after the current transaction is completed. Such provision shall not apply where in the opinion of the Librarian the retention of any record is necessary for the proper management and control of the Library or the efficient performance of any service provided by the Library.

#### *Offences*

18. Any person who commits any offence against this By-Law shall, on being requested by the Librarian to do so, forthwith leave the Library and shall not thereafter without the permission of the Librarian enter or use the Library.

19. Any person who commits an offence against this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one penalty unit.

#### *Application of By-Law*

20. This By-Law applies to and has operation throughout the Campbell Turnbull Library belonging to and under the control and management

of the Councils within the municipal districts of the City of Brunswick and the City of Coburg.

Resolution for passing this By-Law was agreed to by the duly constituted Committee of Management of the Campbell Turnbull Library on 25 November 1985.
