ORDER OF EXEMPTION ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 80F

Labour and Industry Act 1958

ORDER OF EXEMPTION ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 80F

MELTON COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTRE

The Tambo River Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1958*, doth hereby make the By-law following:

1. The following rate to be called the "Tambo River Improvement District River Improvement Rate" is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or Owners of all properties within the Tambo River Improvement District which are rateable to any Municipality.

MITCHELL RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST
Rating By-law No. 28

The Mitchell River Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1958* doth hereby make a By-law following:

1. The following rate to be called the "Mitchell River Improvement District River Improvement Rate" is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all properties within the Mitchell River Improvement District which are rateable to any municipality:

A Rate of 1.0 cents in the dollar on the Net Annual Municipal value of all those properties within the First Division as determined by Order in Council made on 14 January 1964, being those lands shown coloured green on the plan titled "Mitchell River Improvement Trust Proposed Ratings Divisions" approved by the Governor in Council and deposited at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Melbourne—(Corr. 60/263/25).

Provided that the sum of Two Dollars shall be the minimum amount payable in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said Division.

A rate of 0.75 cents in the dollar on the Net Annual Municipal value of all these properties within the Second Division, being those lands shown coloured brown on the said plan.

Provided that the sum of Two Dollars shall be the minimum amount payable in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said Division.

A Rate of 0.5 cents in the dollar on the Net Annual Municipal value of all properties within the Third Division being those lands shown coloured yellow on the said plan.

Provided that the sum of Two Dollars shall be the minimum amount payable in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said Division.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning on 1 January 1986 and ending with 31 December 1986 and shall be payable on 28 February 1986.

Such persons as the Mitchell River Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Mitchell River Improvement Trust on 28 January 1986, and the common seal of the said Trust was hereunto affixed, 28 January 1986.

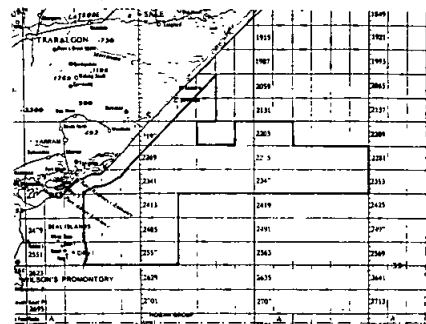

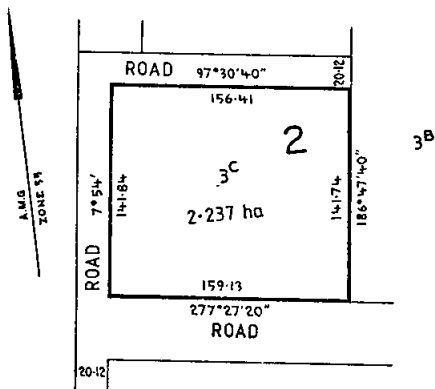

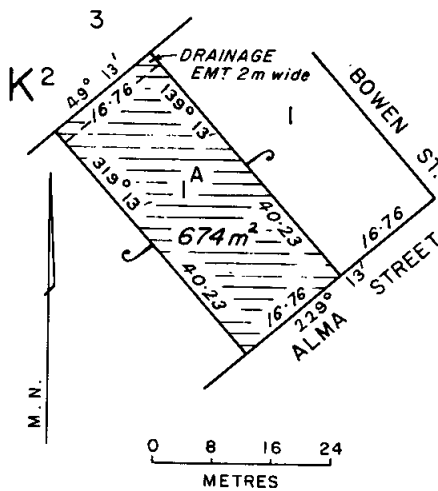

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 41) 1986

The Minister for Community Services became responsible for the administration of certain non-government organizations under the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1958* on 1 October 1985.

The Governor in Council makes this Order under section 3 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act 1983* and under every other available power:

1. This Order is called the Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 41) 1986.
2. This Order takes effect on and after 1 March 1986.
3. In respect of each item in the Schedule a reference to the Old Body in any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 or in any statutory or other instrument made under any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 shall be construed as a reference to the New Body.
4. Where:
 - (a) Before this Order takes effect a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body,
then
 - (b) This Order does not affect the validity or continuity of the transaction, and the transaction shall continue and maybe completed in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have been continued and may have been completed in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.

5. In this Order and the Schedule to this Order—

“The Act” means the *Administrative Arrangements Act 1983*.

“Body” means Minister, Administrative Unit or Officer.

“Community services” means services which provide social support, care and development, and assist with maintaining individuals and families, including those who suffer from disease or disability, in the community, and includes:

- (a) services provided by visiting Child Health Nurses, Early Childhood Development Program Co-ordinators and Infant Welfare Service;
- (b) family planning services;
- (c) administrative support for organizations which provide services for the physically, intellectually or sensorily disabled; and
- (d) administrative support for organizations which provide domiciliary care including home help, day centres, senior citizens centres, home handy person and Welfare Officers for the Aged.

“Instrument” includes contract and agreement.

“Old Body” and “New Body” mean respectively the Body specified in Column 1 and Column 3 of each item in the Schedule.

“Schedule” means the Schedule to this Order.

“Transaction” includes:

- (a) Agreement, bond, contract, deed or other consensual arrangement whatsoever;
- (b) Action, appeal, arbitration, prosecution or other legal proceeding whatsoever;
- (c) Assignment, charge, lease, mortgage, transfer or other dealing with property whatsoever;
- (d) Loan, guarantee, indemnity or other dealing with money whatsoever;

(e) Approval, consent, delegation, direction, licence, Order, permit, requirement or other authority whatsoever;

(f) Notice; and

(g) Any other act, entitlement or liability in the law whatsoever.

The Premier shall be responsible for carrying out this Order.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 42) 1986

The Minister for Community Services became responsible for the administration of the Office of Intellectual Disability Services on and from 1 October 1985.

In relation to the Mayday Hills Training Centre Beechworth, the Aradale Training Centre Ararat and the Brierly Training Centre Warrnambool, the arrangements effected by this Order will continue pending the outcome of a review of the management arrangements for these centres.

The Governor in Council makes this Order under section 3 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983 and under every other available power:

1. This Order is called the Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 42) 1986.
2. This Order takes effect on and after 1 March 1986.
3. If an earlier Order under section 3 of the Act required a reference to an Old Body to be construed as a reference to some other Body then this Order does not effect the operation of the earlier Order.
4. Subject to Clause 5 of this Order, in respect of each item in the Schedule a reference to the Old Body in any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 or in any statutory or other instrument made under any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 shall be construed as a reference to the New Body.
5. (1) Nothing in this Order shall affect the existing functions, powers or duties of the Minister for Health, the Department of Health, the Chief General Manager, Department of Health or Officers and employees of the Department of Health in relation to the provision, operation or administration of intellectual disability services at the Mayday Hills Training Centre Beechworth, the Aradale Training Centre Ararat and the Brierly Training Centre Warrnambool.
(2) The Minister for Community Services shall, however, be responsible for the development and direction of broad policy and program matters relating to the management and administration of the three Training Centres specified in Clause 5 (1) of this Order.
6. Where—
 - (a) before this Order takes effect a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body;
 then
 - (b) this Order does not affect the validity or continuity of the transaction, and the transaction shall continue and may be completed in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have continued and may have been completed in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.
7. In this Order and the Schedule to this Order—

“The Act” means the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983.

“Body” means Minister, Administrative Unit or Officer.

“Instrument” includes contract and agreement.

“Intellectual disability services” means services to people who are “intellectually defective” as defined in section 3 of the *Mental Health Act* 1959, and includes the provision, operation or administration of those services.

“Old Body” and “New Body” means respectively the Body specified in Column 1 and Column 3 of each item in the Schedule.

“Transaction” includes:

 - (a) Agreement, bond, contract, deed or other consensual arrangement whatsoever;
 - (b) Action, appeal, arbitration, prosecution or other legal proceeding whatsoever;
 - (c) Assignment, charge, lease, mortgage, transfer or other dealing with property whatsoever;

- (d) Approval, consent, delegation, direction, licence, Order, permit, requirement or other authority whatsoever;
- (e) Notice; and
- (f) Any other act, entitlement or liability in the law whatsoever.
- The Premier shall be responsible for carrying out this Order.
