#### MOLLISON CREEK (PYALONG) WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT

#### **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 5 (1) (b) of the Land Conservation Act 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Mollison Creek (Pyalong) Water Supply Catchment, in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 (1) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372).

The area proclaimed in the catchment to an offtake weir managed by the Pyalong Water Board on Mollison Creek adjacent to Crown allotment 5, section C, Parish of Pyalong.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 22 (2) and section 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The area described is indicated in Plan No. S-1415 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.



#### **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 10A of the Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by proclamation prescribe any substance to be a prohibited constituent of any agricultural chemical used or intended to be used for any prescribed purpose:

And whereas by section 6A of the said Act the Governor in Council may revoke, amend or vary any proclamation made under the Act.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this my proclamation:

- 1. Revoke the proclamations prohibiting constituents of agricultural chemicals used or intended to be used for prescribed purposes made on:
  - (a) 4 August 1981 and published in the Government Gazette of 12 August 1981.
  - (b) 10 March 1982 and published in the Government Gazette of 10 March 1982.
  - (c) 20 December 1983 and published in the Government Gazette of 21 December 1983.
  - (d) 14 February 1984 and published in the Government Gazette of 15 February 1984.
  - (e) 25 September 1984 and published in the Government Gazette of 26 September 1984.
- 2. Define the following terms used in this Proclamation:

"Closed fumigation chamber" means a fumigation chamber which is sealed after insertion of the product to be fumigated, and into which the fumigant is thereafter admitted for fumigation and subsequently purged at completion of fumigation before the chamber is opened.

"Closed soil application system" means a soil application system, consisting of a manifold with metering equipment, pressurized at less than 200 kpa, receiving ethylene dibromide (EDB) through a gas-tight joint directly from the container of ethylene dibromide (EDB) and delivering it through tubes leading into the seed row behind the tines and prior to covering the seed with soil.

"Misting Machine" means a machine or piece of equipment used for agricultural spraying which uses an air blast or air stream for dispersing the spray.

"Urban and semi-urban area" includes:

- (a) land used for residential, industrial or commercial purposes;
- (b) vacant land sub-divided for residential, industrial or commercial purposes;
- (c) open space predominantly surrounded by land described in paragraphs (a) or (b) hereof; and
- (d) roads, railways or watercourses passing through or abutting land described in paragraphs (a), (b) or (c) hereof as the case may be.
- 3. Prescribe the substances set out in column 1 of the Schedule hereto to be prohibited constituents of any agricultural chemical used or intended to be used for any of the purposes set out in column 2.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958
DECLARATION OF PROCLAIMED AREAS

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 25 of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of insects of the

family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area and prohibit subject to regulations the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or from any place in the proclaimed area to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit fly and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the prevention of the introduction or spread of fruit fly as is specifed in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

- 1. Declare the portions of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be proclaimed areas.
- 2. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed areas to give access to such land at all times to an Inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or placing on such land any lures or traps and/or applying on such land any spray material or bait and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an Inspector are necessary for the prevention of the introduction or spread of fruit fly.
- 3. Prohibit subject to regulations the removal from any place within the proclaimed areas to any place outside those areas or to any other place in those areas of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species grown within the proclaimed areas and named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit or vegetables passing through the proclaimed areas may leave the proclaimed areas without such instruction if the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within the proclaimed areas except as required by traffic regulations.
- 4. Require owners and occupiers of land in the proclaimed areas, on instructions from an Inspector, to remove fallen fruit each day from the land and to dispose of such fruit as directed by an Inspector.
- 5. Require owners and occupiers of land in the proclaimed areas to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in a Notice served on the owner/occupier of such land by an Inspector under the provisions of sections 26 and 27 of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958.
